OUR LEADERSHIP TEAM

Lee University President: Dr. Phil Cook



Dr. Phil Cook began his term as the eighteenth president of Lee University on July 1, 2025. Cook brings over 30 years of experience in higher education, most recently serving as President and CEO of the North American Coalition for Christian Admissions Professionals (NACCAP) beginning in 2021.

Of his experience in higher education, the lion's share is with a specific focus on enrollment management, as NACCAP is an association for enrollment professionals, and his prior experience was in service at Lee University in the enrollment sector. From 1997 to 2021 he held every administrative position in the unit from Assistant Director of Admissions to Vice President for Enrollment Management. He led the enrollment team during an extended period of consistent, dramatic growth that revolutionized the university's profile on the landscape of Christian higher education.

During his long stint as a Lee employee, Cook also gained a familiarity with other aspects of university life, as he served as a resident director and as Director of Student Events and also found time to serve as a sponsor of the men's social service club Alpha Gamma Chi, as an instructor in both the School of Religion and the Office of First Year programs, as moderator of Dixon Center chapel services, and even as the public address announcer for Lee University home basketball games. This track record not only speaks of a significant long-term commitment to Lee University, but also an investment into the day-to-day lives of its students.

Cook holds a PhD in higher education administration from the University of Tennessee, Knoxville, a Master of Divinity from the Church of God School of Theology, and a Bachelor of Science in Business from Lee.

An ordained bishop in the Church of God, he is married to Tonya Cook, and they have three children and two grandchildren.

Lee University Chancellor: Dr. Charles Paul Conn



Charles Paul Conn remains as chancellor of Lee University after serving as president and chancellor for the past year. Conn served that institution as president for thirty-four years, becoming president in 1986, after fifteen years as a member of the psychology faculty at the same institution. During his administration, the university saw significant growth: enrollment increased from 1000 to over 5000, the physical campus was enlarged substantially, and the school's reputation as a regional leader was firmly established.

EDUCATION: Conn earned the Ph.D. degree in psychology from Emory University in 1974. Subsequently, he has spent three years at Harvard University as a postdoctoral student, studying with Lawrence Kohlberg (1978), David Breneman (1993), Derek Bok (1998), Suarez Orozco (2003), Robert Kegan (2008), and Rick Weissbourd and Nancy Hill (2018). He was a Visiting Scholar at Harvard Divinity School in 1982 and 2023. He did his undergraduate work at Lee College and Georgia State University, and earned a M.A. degree at Emory.

LEADERSHIP: He has served on the Board of Directors of numerous higher ed organizations, including the Council of Independent Colleges, and chairman of the President's Council of the Southern States Athletic Conference. He served six years as a Commissioner of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools, including two years on the Executive Committee of the Commission on Colleges. He has served on the Executive Committee of the Appalachian Colleges Association, on the board of the Tennessee Independent Colleges and Universities Association, and on the national board of the Council for Christian Colleges and Universities. Conn served nine years (2015-2024) on the Board of Commissioners for the Chattanooga Airport Authority.

PERSONAL: Conn is married to Darlia McLuhan; together they have three children and ten grandchildren.

Athletic Director: John Maupin


John Maupin is in his third year as the Lee University Athletic Director. He was named as the Athletic Director in June of 2023 after an outstanding coaching career as the Director of Golf with Lee, including winning the first NCAA D2 National Championship in school history in 2022.

In his first two seasons as the Athletic Director, Maupin saw the Flames and Lady Flames win an unprecedented fourth and fifth straight GSC All Sports Trophy. The Lee 2024-25 athletic teams ranked 28th out of over 300 NCAA DII schools in the final Learfield Director's Cup Standings.

Maupin came to Lee in 2008 as the men's golf coach after a decorated playing career with Berry College from 2003-2007. He served as a team captain and was named to the Dean's List in 2007. Maupin was selected to multiple All-Conference and All-Region teams and guided the Vikings to three National Tournament appearances.

As a coach, Maupin led his Flames and Lady Flames to a dominating run of success over his 15 years as head coach. After several conference titles and national tournament appearances in the NAIA, Maupin's teams continued their run of excellence in the NCAA and the Gulf South Conference. The Lady Flames won three GSC titles and made two National Championship appearances while the Flames capped off an amazing 2022 postseason run by winning the NCAA DII National Championship, the first team title in any sport for Lee since joining the NCAA. The Flames won the South Region title in 2021 and are the only program to make three straight appearances in NCAA National Championship Match Play, after a quarterfinal berth this past season.

DEREK POTTEIGER

Coach Potteiger enters his ninth year as head coach of Lee men's soccer. Before the 2024 season Potteiger's Flames had never encountered a losing campaign. His program remains highly respected in the powerful GSC and NCAA Division II after the 4-7-6 overall mark and 3-4-4 in the GSC. The Flames were beaten by top-seeded West Florida 1-0 in the GSC Tournament. Potteiger's eight-year Lee record stands at 62-41-27.

Potteiger was a two-time All-American at Penn State University and former first assistant for the United States Naval Academy (2009-13). During his tenure at Penn State, Potteiger was selected as All-Big 10 four times and captained the soccer team for three seasons, graduating with a 3.5 GPA.

He played professionally in the USL for several years and served as the top assistant under legendary coach Dave Brandt at the Naval Academy. Navy was a bottom 10 program in 2008 and rose to a Top 25 program by 2013 under Brandt's leadership.

Coach Potteiger began his head coaching career at NCAA Division III Gordon College (Wenham, Massachusetts) and for four years his teams posted an impressive 61-18-3 record. He took over a Gordon team that won only six games prior to his arrival in 2012 to 19 wins in 2013 and was named conference coach of the year. He directed the Gordon squad to its first two NCAA tournament wins.

Derek, and his wife Jennifer have four daughters, Alexis, Rylee, Abigail, Reese and a son, Myan.





CODI CRIPPEN

ASSISTANT COACH | 1ST SEASON

Codi Crippen comes to Lee from Tennessee Wesleyan University where he was head coach for last two seasons and served as an assistant coach from 2019-23.

Before joining the TWU staff, Crippen spent three seasons as an assistant coach at Thomas University, ending his time with the program as the interim head coach. During his three seasons with Thomas, he helped lead the team to The Sun Conference Men's Soccer Tournament each season, including winning the 2018 The Sun Conference Regular-Season Championship along with a runner-up finish in the conference tournament that same season.

Crippen made a coaching stop at NCAA Division III school Huntingdon College from 2014-2017, where he served as an assistant coach and goalkeeper coach. While at Huntingdon, he had a goalkeeper named USA South Player of the Week four times. Crippen served as a graduate assistant for the women's soccer program at Bethel (TN) University from 2012-2014.

The Zanesville, Ohio, native played at the University of Rio Grande where he earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Sport and Exercise Studies in 2011 and a Bachelor of Science degree in Physical Education in 2012. While playing for Rio Grande, Crippen helped the team advance to the NAIA National Tournament all four years he played, finishing in the Round of 16 twice, as the

national runner-up in 2008 and in the semifinals in 2009, compiling a 69-13-8 overall record. He served as a volunteer assistant at Rio Grande from 2010-2012.

Crippen holds a United States Soccer Federation National C and D Licenses along with a Premier Diploma, Advanced National Diploma, and Goalkeeping Level one and two from the United Soccer Coaches.



ADAM CHRISTENSEN

VOLUNTEER ASSISTANT COACH | 1ST SEASON

Prior to joining the Flames, Adam Christensen served as the Director of Recruiting and Analytics at Trine University in Angola, Indiana, during the 2024 season. While at Trine, he played a key role in helping the program achieve its first-ever regular-season conference championship. The team went undefeated in conference play and secured the top seed in the MIAA Tournament.

In 2023, Christensen was the Head Women's Soccer Coach at West Virginia Wesleyan College. In his lone season, he successfully transformed the program's culture and emphasized academic excellence. Under his leadership, the team's average semester GPA rose from 3.3 to 3.65, earning 17 Academic All-MEC selections and 9 MEC Commissioner's Honor Roll honors. Christensen spent the 2021-2023 seasons in Conference Carolinas (NCAA D2) as a consultant with the men's program at Francis Marion University and as an assistant with Barton College.

Before coaching at the NCAA Division II level, Adam gained valuable experience as both a head coach and assistant coach at the college club levels. He served as the head coach for the University of Florida Women's Soccer Club (U23) and as an assistant coach for the men's U23 team. During his two years at The University of Florida, he accumulated an impressive 23-6-3 overall record securing three tournament championships.

At the high school level, Christensen was the girls head coach at Freedom High School for two seasons, the head boys coach at Oak Hall High School (Fla.) for two seasons, and head boys coach at The Rock School (Fla.) for one season. While at The Rock School in 2019, Christensen led the Lions to a 15-0 overall record while outscoring their opponents 87-16 on their way to a FCAPPS State Championship. He also served as the assistant coach for Santa Fe High School in Alachua, FL, in 2017.

Christensen is also a published author in the field of analytical chemistry, he has co-founded three companies. In 2020 he was the Democratic Nominee for Florida's Third Congressional District becoming the youngest national nominee for congress in 2020 at the age of 25. Adam is married to Kristen Christensen and the two of them have two dogs, Buster and Pummel.

As an athlete, Christensen competed in three sports at the collegiate level. He ran track and cross country for Lee University, played soccer and ran track at Trevecca Nazarene University and ended his career playing soccer at Hampden-Sydney College, where he graduated with a bachelor's degree in biology and a minor in Chemistry in 2016. He earned a master's in Sports Administration (2024) from Arkansas State University.

RAY CONN SPORTS COMPLEX



The Ray Conn Sports Complex, which opened in the spring of 2021, is home to the Lee men's and women's soccer, track & field and women's lacrosse teams.

During the long strange summer and fall of 2020, a massive new student sports facility took shape on the north end of the Lee campus. The multisports complex was originally envisioned as a home venue for Lee's track and field teams, which have been highly successful over the last few years, despite the lack of a home facility for practice and competition.

The main feature of the complex is the track itself. The oval meets the standard to be certified by the NCAA, so that records which might be set at the venue will qualify for recognition at the Olympic level. The track is an eight-lane oval for sprints, hurdles, and distance events. The events of high jump, pole vault, and steeplechase will also occur inside the oval. The location of field events (shot put, discus, javelin, and hammer throw), as well as the long jump and triple jump, is outside the oval.

The university considered multiple bids for the track surface itself, finally contracting with Beynon, a national company which installs certified tracks at some of the largest universities in the country. The result is a three-layer poured-rubber surface that required over a month for installation.

Inside the oval lies an athletic field large enough to accommodate NCAA

events in soccer, lacrosse, or football. As Lee officials made the decision to move from a bare-bones track and field venue to a comprehensive athletic site, it became clear that the installation of synthetic turf would significantly increase the usefulness of the field. Natural grass fields are the primary venues for soccer and lacrosse, but the number of "lost days" due to bad weather and wet playing fields is a major problem for Lee's fall and spring sports programs.

The addition of a synthetic turf field somewhere on campus has been a dream for years, and it has now been added in the new facility. As with the track surface, Lee decided to go "top of the line" with a superior product. The chosen surface is the same turf which is used in several NFL and NCAA D1 fields, including Mercedes Benz Stadium and Gillette Stadium, home to the Atlanta Falcons and New England Patriots, respectively. The vendor/installer was FieldTurf, who installed the field with permanent markings for soccer and lacrosse.

In addition to the primary field and track, the new facility includes a million-dollar Multi-Sports Complex and Plaza with locker rooms, coaches offices, restrooms, concessions area for the general public, and a 110-car parking lot.


