

QUILT SIZE GUIDE HOW MUCH FABRIC DO I NEED?

This chart should help you estimate the amount of fabric you will need for the block size you choose to make. The first measurement will tell you what size to pre-cut your fabric to completely cover the block

plus seam allowance. The second number tells you how many pieces you can cut from one yard of fabric (45" x 36"). The number of cuts was calculated using a quilting calculator.

^{*}Folded fabric blocks use 2 ½" strips from a jelly roll. If you wish to make your own jelly roll strips cut 2 ½" wide stripes from the length of the fabric. You should get approximately 14 strips per yard. Each folded fabric block is different and may require a different number of strips.
