The 1988 Fall sports took off with a great start. All of the teams had a better season than last year, but most apparent was the football team.





To Our Friend, Carolyn Britt . . .

Time and time again, we've all heard about accidents happening within the world, but the one which touched our hearts was the tragedy of Carolyn E. Britt.

On August seventeenth, two summer-hire students and one military personnel were running an errand to Molesworth. On the way back to Alconbury, the driver, fearing he was late for football practice, was in a rush. At the time of the accident the driver tried to pass a car on a curve and drove in the path of an oncoming vehicle. The driver slammed on the brakes and Carolyn was thrown out the front window. The truck rolled over a few times and was halted by a tree. If it weren't for that tree, Carolyn would have been crushed.

Carolyn spent several weeks in the Sheffield Hospital before her family moved her back to the states. Ever since the day of the accident, people have been praying and thinking about her. Those prayers have helped a great deal because Carolyn, having originally been paralyzed from the neck down, has regained feeling to her waist. Carolyn is determined that she will someday walk again ... we pray that her dream comes true,




# Class of '92: Working Their Way Up

Adding additional pages and colored pictures to this year's edition made the load a lot heavier, but producing a quality book made all the hard work worthwhile.




he Duke of Edinburgh award scheme is for students aged between 14 and 25. Participants acquire new skills, experience adventures and help serve others.


