



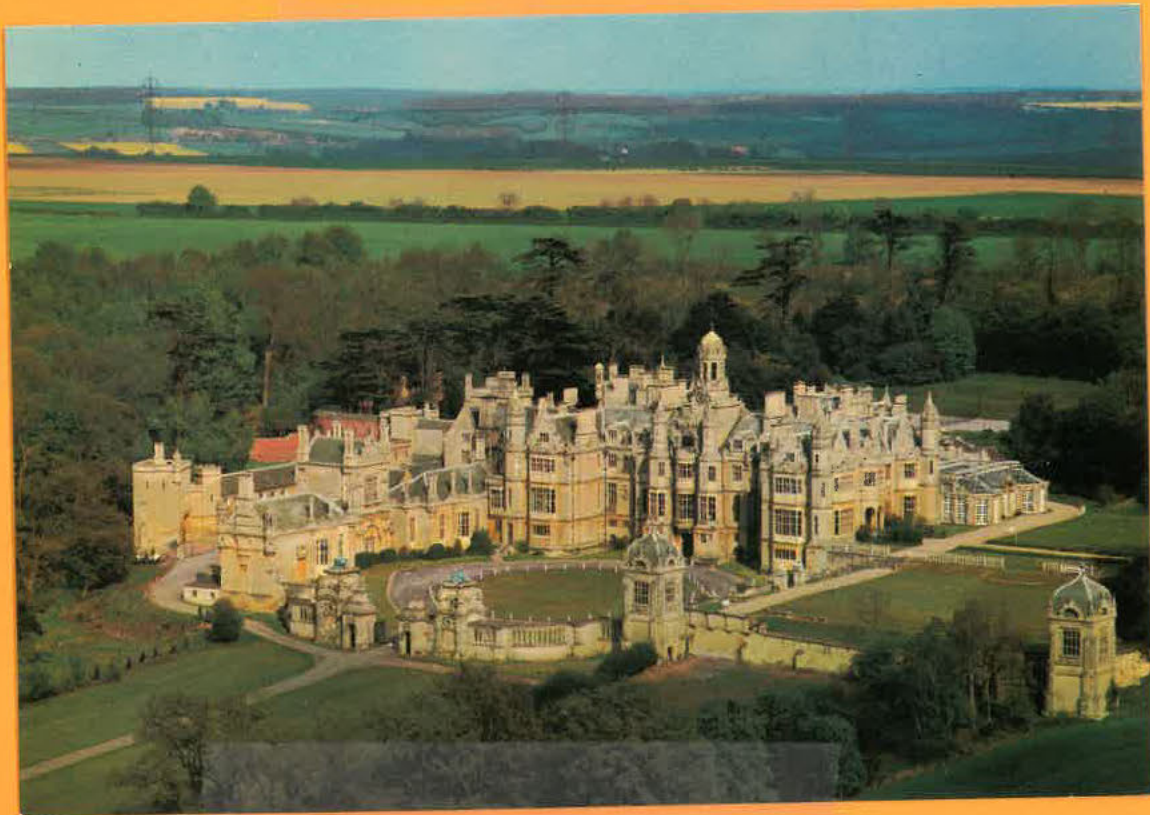

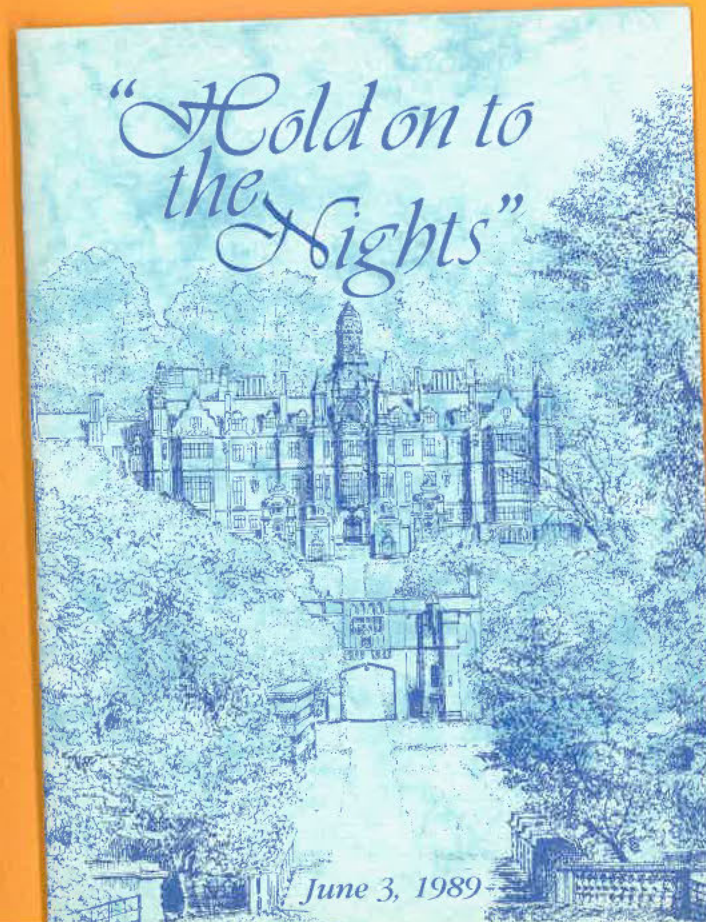

schedule, other changes and the many new faces.

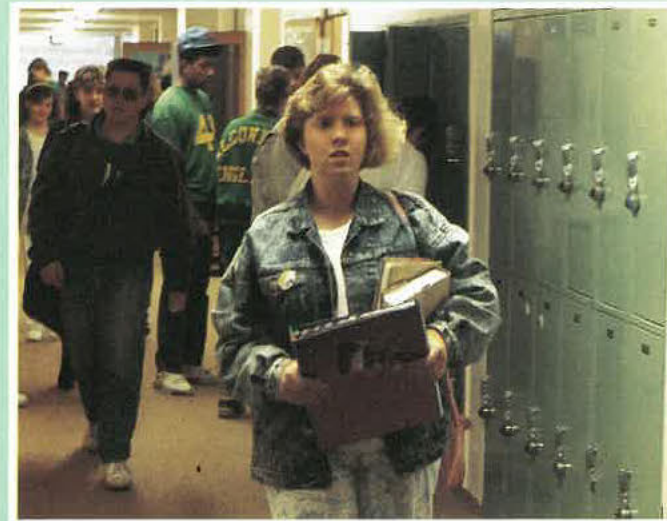
Even with all the confusion, sports and organizations began without delay. Many fall sport teams held practices before the school year started and the clubs settled into a pattern of regular meetings.

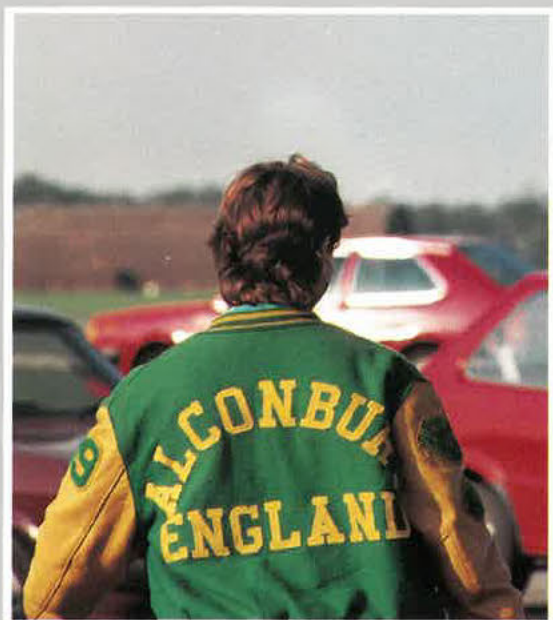

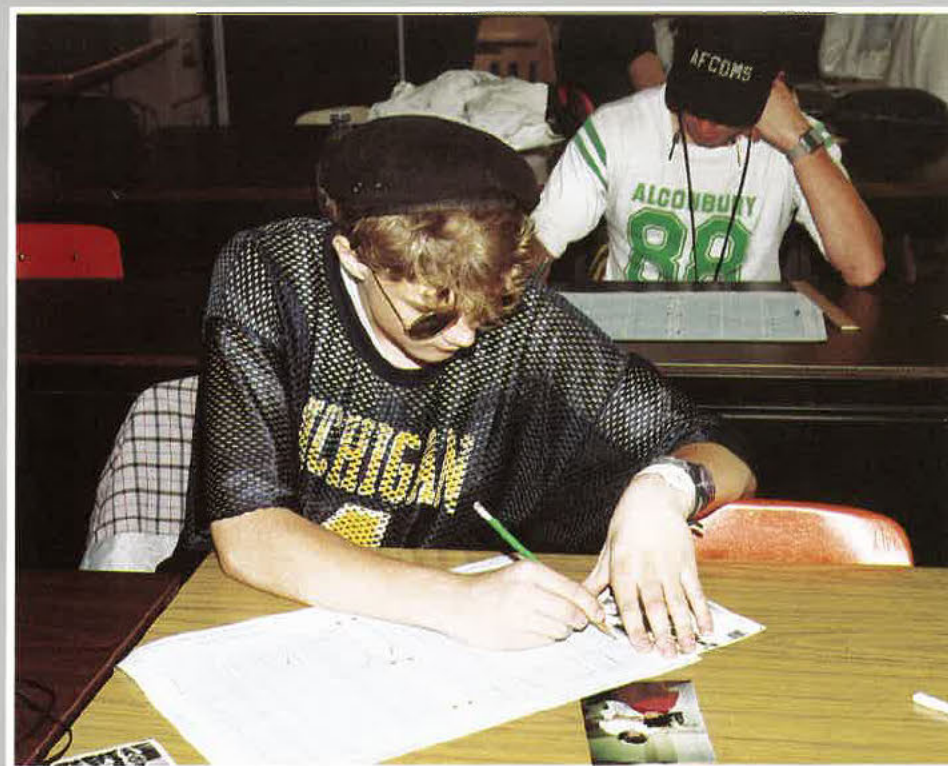

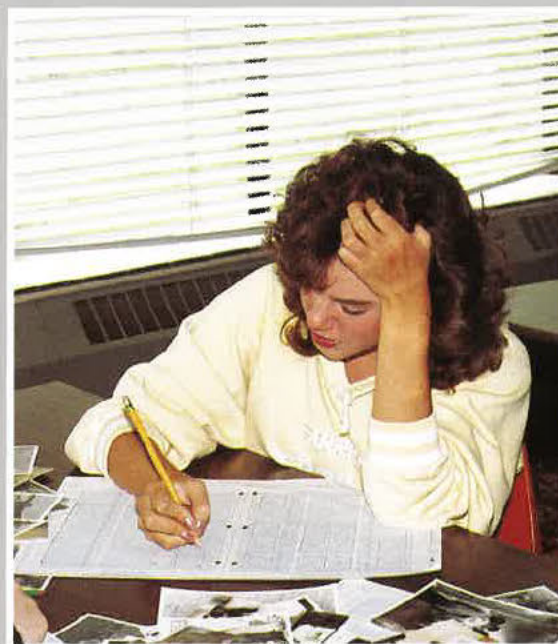

The week will be a time to remember for the football players and homecoming court, as well as everyone who participated in it.



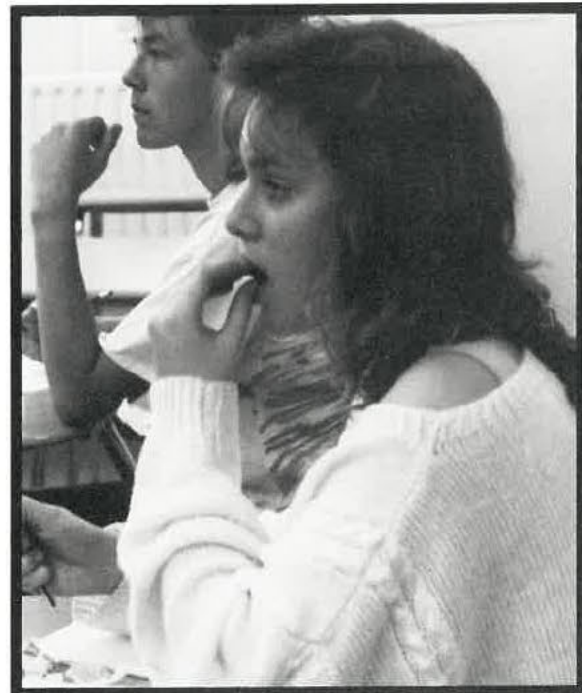

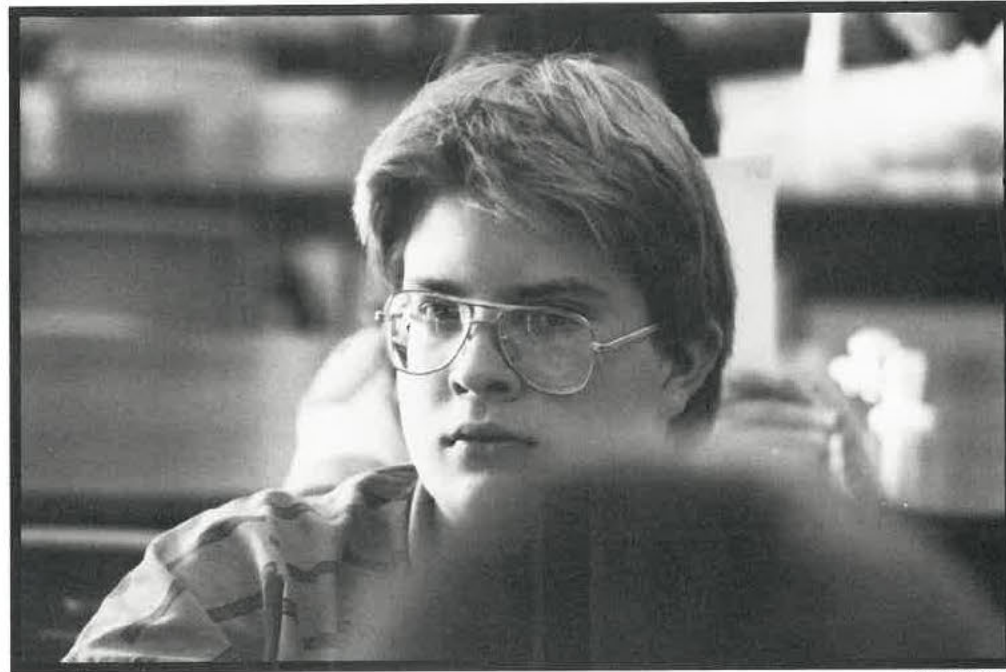

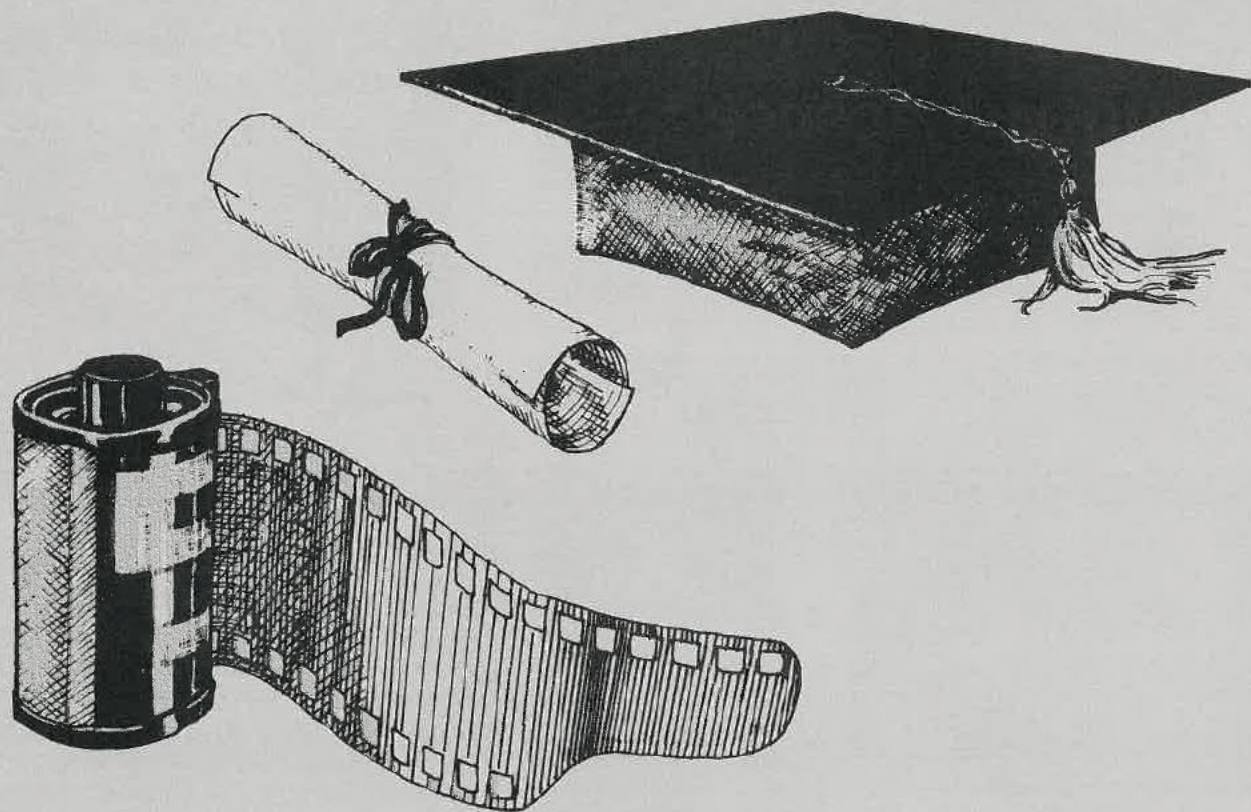

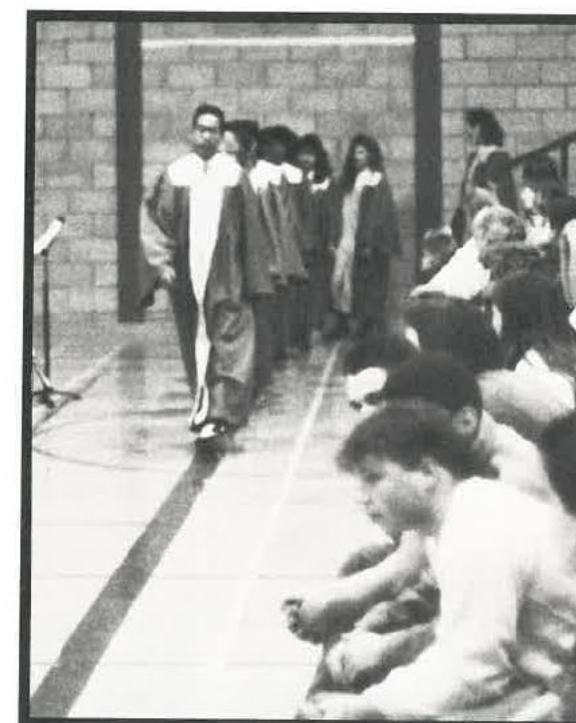

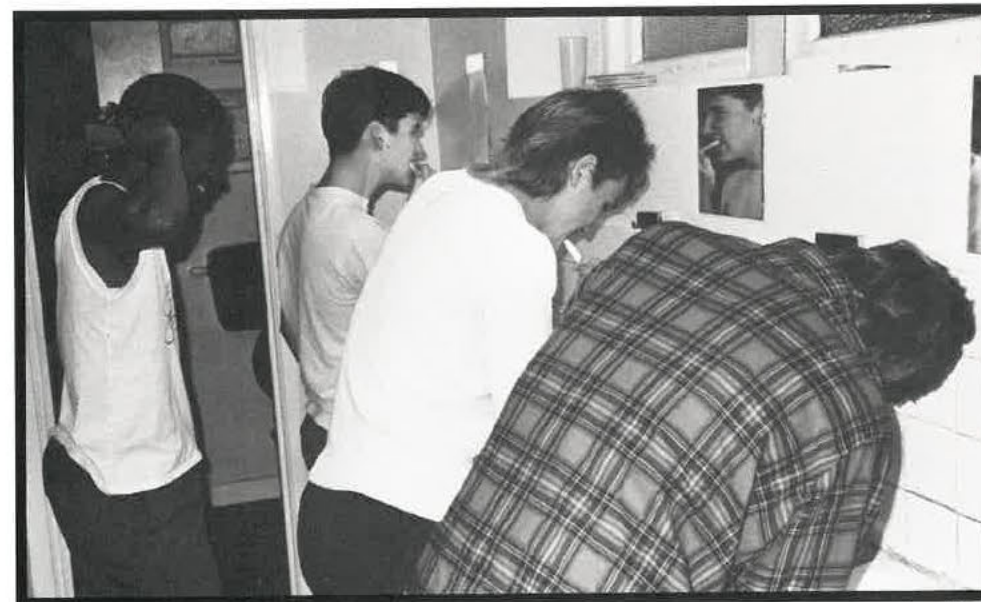
The Duke of Edinburgh award scheme is for students aged between 14 and 25. Participants acquire new skills, experience adventures and help serve others.
