Over things that were dumb,


At break where'd I hang, Who hung out there with me,

Habitat for Humanity



On a Tuesday morning in December 2000, Mr. Blake, Tracy-Lei, Chandriel, Brittany, Liz, Betina, Brett, Sarah and Aaron, went on a trip to London where they spent an entire day working with Habitat for Humanity. Habitat for Humanity International is a nonprofit, nondenominational Christian housing organization. Habitat welcomes all people to join in building simple, decent, affordable, houses in partnership with those in need of adequate shelter. Since 1976, Habitat has built more than 100,000 houses in more than 60 countries, including some 30,000 houses across the United States. Habitat houses are purchased by the homeowner families. Three factors make Habitat houses affordable to low-income people worldwide: 1. Houses are sold at no profit, with no interest charged on the mortgage. 2. Homeowners and volunteers build the houses under trained supervision. 3.Individuals, corporations, faith groups and others provide financial support.

On their trip the group of AHS seniors along with their class sponsor, got the chance to help with the finishing touches of two different houses. During the whole day the class got the chance to scrape and paint walls, unfortunately though while the class did get a lot of work done they sadly got more paint on themselves then on the walls, but hey that's fine the whole class got a lot of work done for other people and they still had lots of fun.

Math Counts

Math Counts is an annual competition for middle school students who have talents for math, geometry, and algebra. Brenden Best, Kate Noll, Alex Deuitch and Brad Riley were the official team and an alternate team was chosen to represent our school in the Chapter competition at Lakenheath. A Math Counts competition is tense and nerve wracking. It comprises of four separate rounds. The first is the Sprint Round, where each "Mathlete" is given a booklet of 30 questions in which to answer in 40 minutes. The second is the Target Round, when each Mathlete does two of eight math problems together and has a set limit of time, then the next sheet of two problems is passed out and completed. Next, the Team Round is where the entire team of four Mathletes works together on a set of 10 problems. Once the time is up, there is a break before the final round, the Countdown Round. The Countdown Round is a competition where the top 10 scorers from the Sprint and Target round go one on one answering problems projected onto a board. At the end of the entire competition, awards are given out for each round. The Team Round in Chapter decides if a team goes to State or not. The other teams across the state area send scores in and they are compared. The top 14 Team Round scorers go to the State competition. The DoDDS state competition was held in Meinz Kastel, Germany. We traveled by plane to arrive at Frankfurt, then on the second day of the trip we competed. After the scores were added up, our team placed third overall. The top four individuals from State form the team to Nationals. I managed to get myself into 3rd place as an individual, and earned my place in the National competition in Washington, DC.
