Wade Conrad is the Youth Leader, helped by his wife Dana and their two children, Sydney and Bryce. This family dedicates much of their time to host activities for teens, making their lives a bit more fun.

Club Beyond meets every Wednesday from 6:30pm-8:00pm and Sundays from $3: 30 \mathrm{pm}-5: 00 \mathrm{pm}$. Wednesdays are "fun clubs" where they serve dinner; it could be anything from breakfast foods to Mexican. They also play games and sing songs. Sundays are when they go "a little farther", singing worship songs and having Bible Study.

Every Spring Break, Club Beyond takes a group of youth to a different place for a Service Project. This year the teens are going to Slovakia where they will spend a week building a playground for a needy school.

The Cross Country Team had a fantast cally successful season. The boys' team, which consisted of Randy Gilliland, Dominick Sherenco, Chris Olsen, Ben Jaskoski, Landon Kemp, Brian Keitz, and Tyler Keitz, performed well at all of their meets. The girls' team had only one member, Karen Thrasher, who also did remarkably well.

Alconbury did extraordinarily well at Europeans held on October 30th in Heidleberg, Germany. Landon Kemp won the Division 3 European Cross Country Title, finishing the 5 k ( 3.1 miles) course in 17:59, a full 40 seconds in front of the second place finisher. Randy Gilliland finished in 12 th, a few seconds away from the Top 10, though he managed to beat many of his closest competitors from throughout the season. Dominick Sherenco finished in 25th, Ben Jaskoski finished in 38th, and Chris Olsen finished a few places behind in 44th.

Karen Thrasher, the "only one," finished in 23:31, earning 7th place. She also attended Europeans last year, which was held on the same course, and ran nearly two minutes faster than last year, which set her personal best. "We had an excellent season this year," Karen remarked." I am really proud of all my teammates."

Coach Bell stated that, "This was one of the best seasons we have ever had." He was very pleased with the team's unity and motivation. "This is the first time we've taken a team to Europeans," he commented with pride. Alconbury has sent individual members to Europeans but never a complete team.

Mrs. Bell, who is a superb team supporter, stated that, "All the kids on the team were friendly and fun to be with. This was one of the most motivated teams we have ever had. I really enjoy traveling with the team." Mrs. Bell made punch and cookies for the team on Thurdsays when they ran to Coach Bell's house to sit in the hot tub. She also said with a smile, "I think that this is the first season we have only had one girl who stayed all season and did so well."

## Math Analysis

## Scienee

Chemistry is what happens before, during, and after molecules collide.
This theme is carried throughout the entire course which emphasizes atomic structure, molecules, chemical reactions, thermochemistry, acids and bases, electrochemistry (including batteries), and organic chemistry. This course helps to answer questions like, "How do chemicals react?" and "How are reactions related to the way the universe works?" This class is taught by Mr. Gay.

## Jhysics

Physics tries to answer the question, "How are matter, energy, time, and space related?" The course emphasizes investigations into Newtonian and modern physics to show how forces are unified. Applications of the major concepts are related to ordinary experience and technology to answer questions like, "What do we need to travel to another world?" This class is taught by Mr. Gay.
Biology

Biology is defined as "The science of life and of living organisms, including their structure, function, growth, origin, evolution, and distribution." Biology students study these principles and do dissections to further their studies. This class is taught by Mrs. Potus.
Anatomy

Anatomy is defined as "The science of the shape and structure of organisms and their parts." Anatomy students study these principles and do a number of dissections. This class is taught by Mrs. Potus.

## Foreign Language

Alconbury offers two foreign languages, French and Spanish. French is taught by Mrs. White. Spanish is taught by Mrs. Zitka and Mrs. Taggart. Our foreign language department teaches up through the higher levels of each language, with some of our students taking Spanish 4, taught by Mrs. Taggart. The students do many activities with their new-found language skills, like putting on a "Spanish fashion show" in Mrs. Zitka's Spanish 1 class, or the French class taking a fieldtrip down to London to see "Les Miserables." Learning a new language has been made fun and easy by the teachers at Alconbury.
