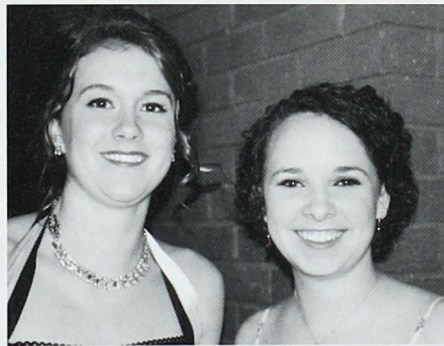

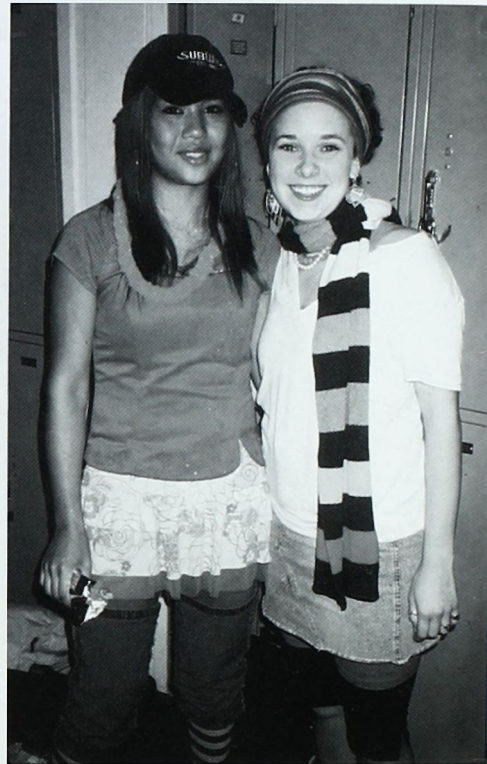

Wade Conrad is the Youth Leader, helped by his wife Dana and their two children, Sydney and Bryce. This family dedicates much of their time to host activities for teens, making their lives a bit more fun.

Club Beyond meets every Wednesday from 6:30pm-8:00pm and Sundays from 3:30pm-5:00pm. Wednesdays are "fun clubs" where they serve dinner; it could be anything from breakfast foods to Mexican. They also play games and sing songs. Sundays are when they go "a little farther", singing worship songs and having Bible Study.

Every Spring Break, Club Beyond takes a group of youth to a different place for a Service Project. This year the teens are going to Slovakia where they will spend a week building a playground for a needy school.

Each summer, Club Beyond brings a bigger group to Camp Derby in Italy, where teens spend a week touring Cinque Terra, Pisa, and, of course, the beach.

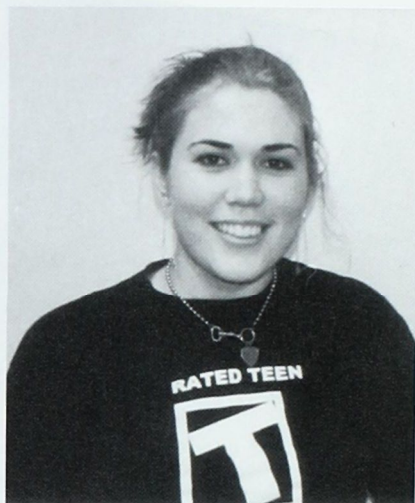

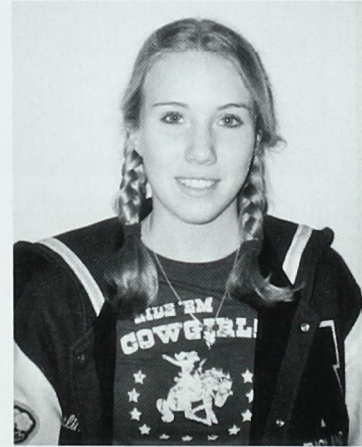

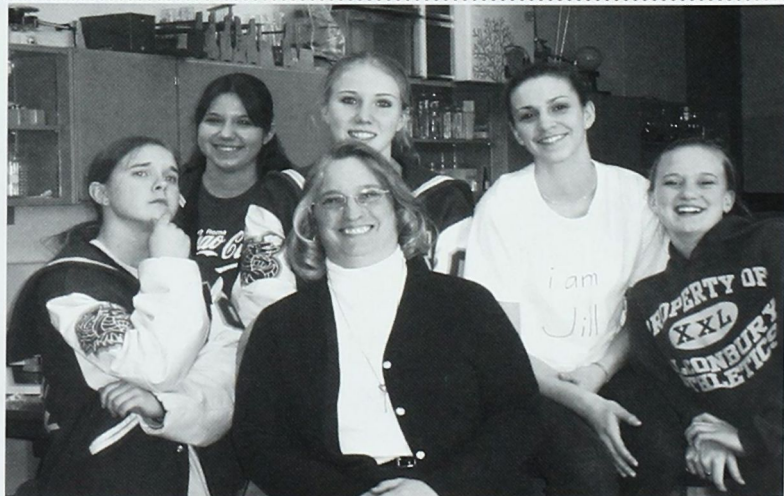

into this year's season, but they struggled through the last five games.

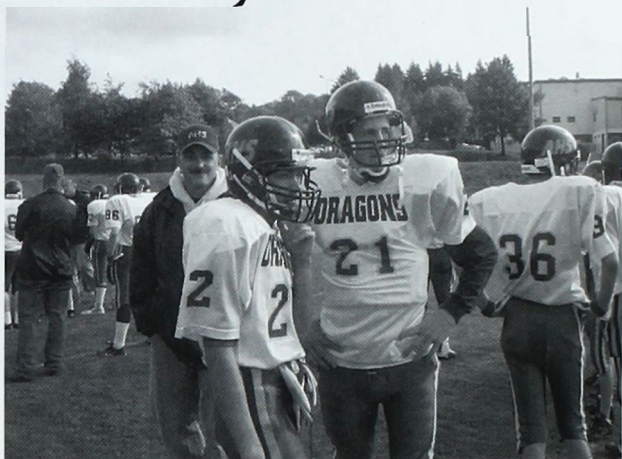

The lack of depth on Alconbury's bench was one weakness that kept the dragons from winning some of the games. Many of the players stayed in the whole game, playing both offense and defense.

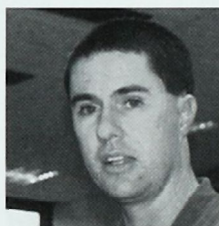
This year's managers were Shannon Buxton, Liz Eastman, and Krissy Cates.

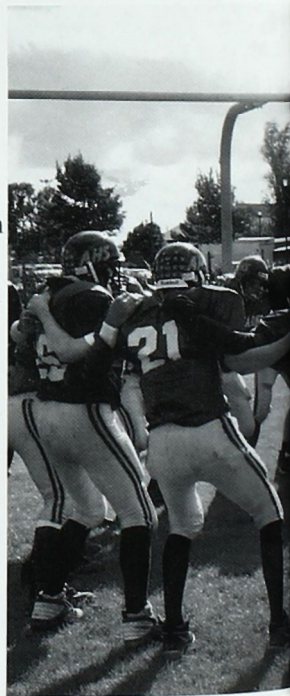

The Cross Country Team had a fantastically successful season. The boys' team, which consisted of Randy Gilliland, Dominick Sherenco, Chris Olsen, Ben Jaskoski, Landon Kemp, Brian Keitz, and Tyler Keitz, performed well at all of their meets. The girls' team had only one member, Karen Thrasher, who also did remarkably well.

Alconbury did extraordinarily well at Europeans held on October 30th in Heidleberg, Germany. Landon Kemp won the Division 3 European Cross Country Title, finishing the 5k (3.1 miles) course in 17:59, a full 40 seconds in front of the second place finisher. Randy Gilliland finished in 12th, a few seconds away from the Top 10, though he managed to beat many of his closest competitors from throughout the season. Dominick Sherenco finished in 25th, Ben Jaskoski finished in 38th, and Chris Olsen finished a few places behind in 44th.

Karen Thrasher, the "only one," finished in 23:31, earning 7th place. She also attended Europeans last year, which was held on the same course, and ran nearly two minutes faster than last year, which set her personal best. "We had an excellent season this year," Karen remarked. "I am really proud of all my teammates."

Coach Bell stated that, "This was one of the best seasons we have ever had." He was very pleased with the team's unity and motivation. "This is the first time we've taken a team to Europeans," he commented with pride. Alconbury has sent individual members to Europeans but never a complete team.

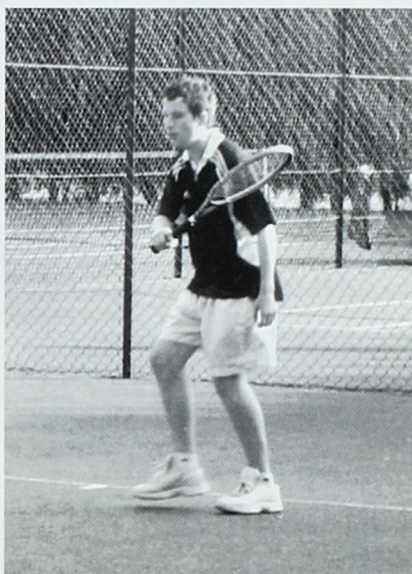
The Dragons' tennis team ended their season at Europeans. At Europeans that had outstanding matches by all six of the players selected to go and were Division IV champions for the second year in a row.

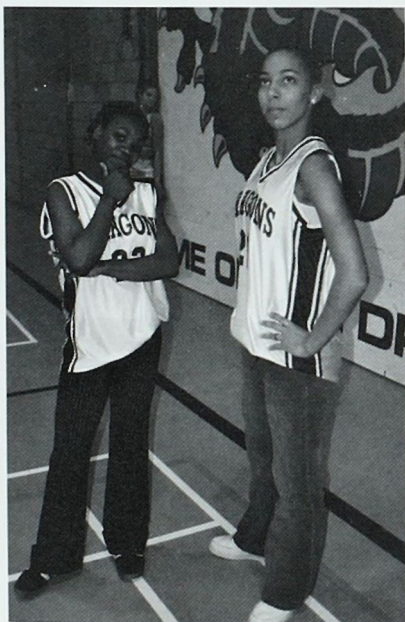
I SPY with my Victorious eye... Lady Dragons Basketball

Algebra II

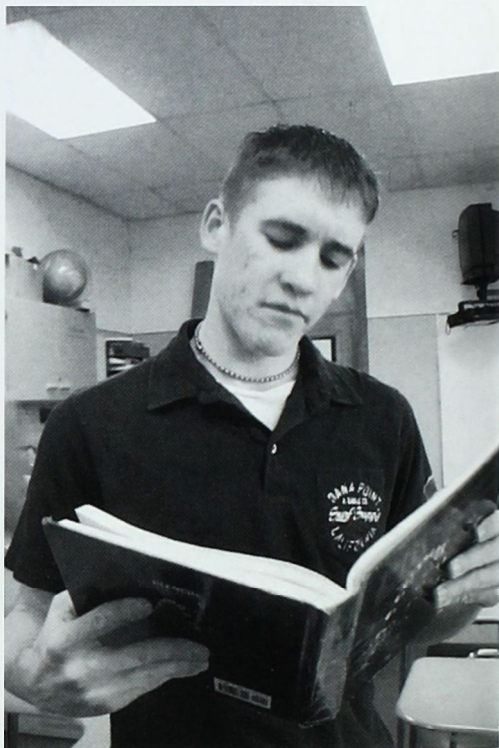

Geometry

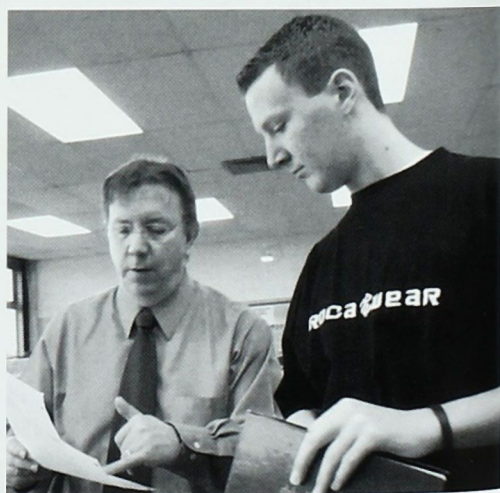

Physics

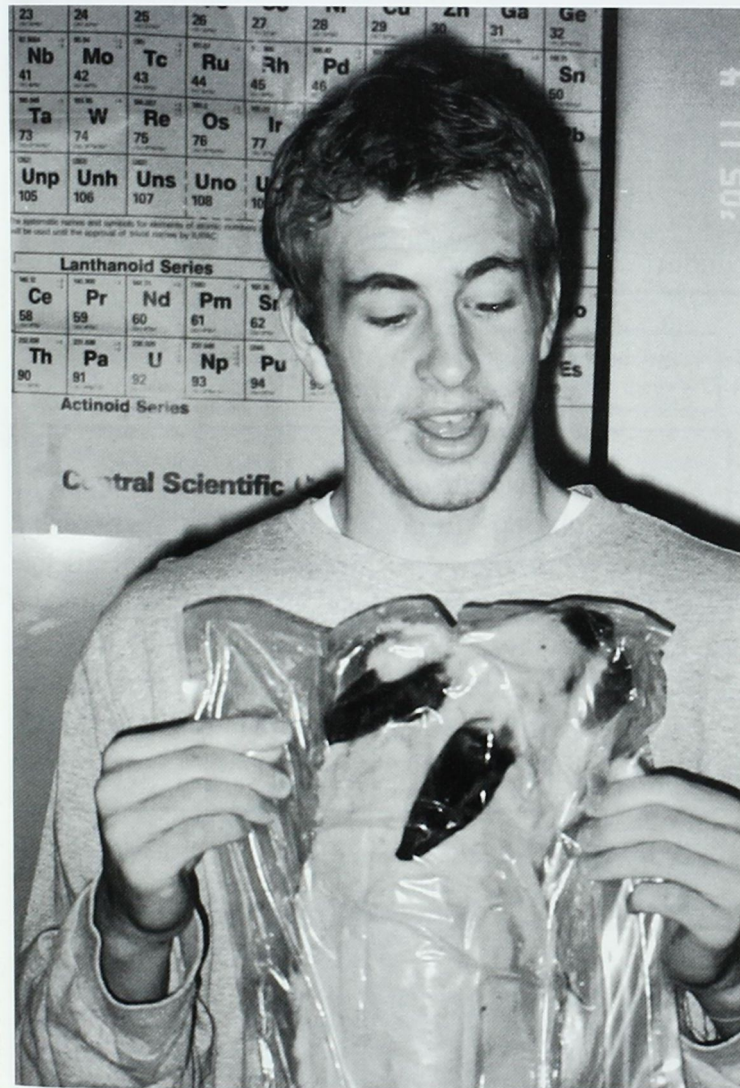

Anatomy

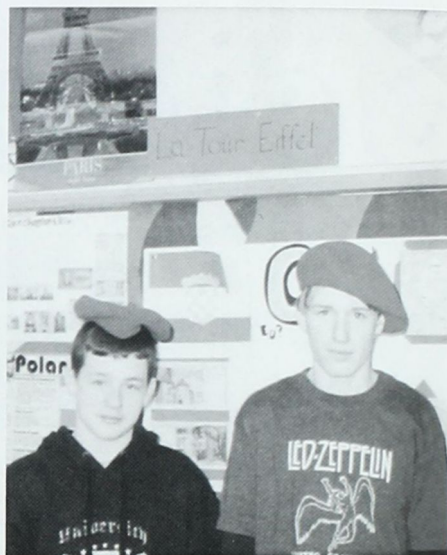

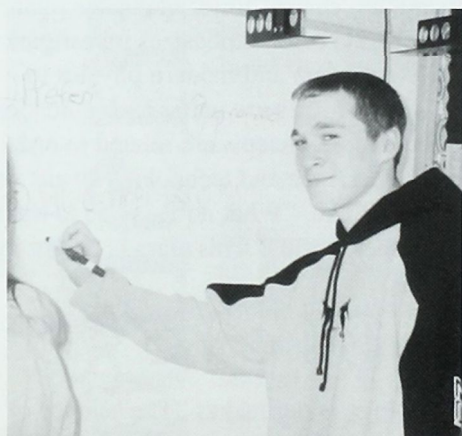
Foreign Language

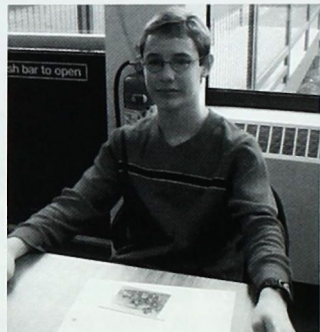

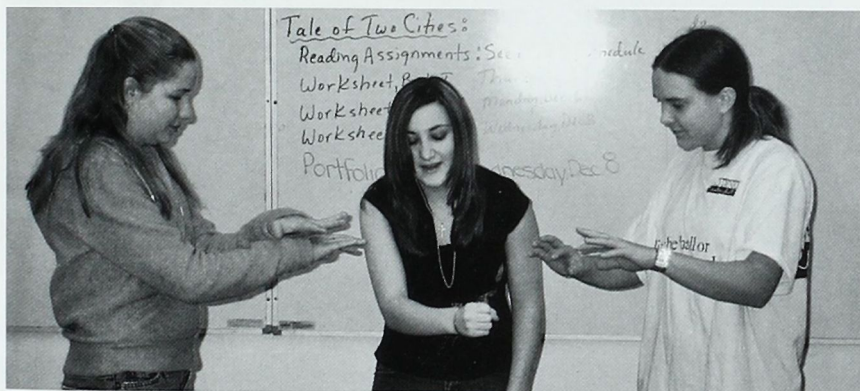

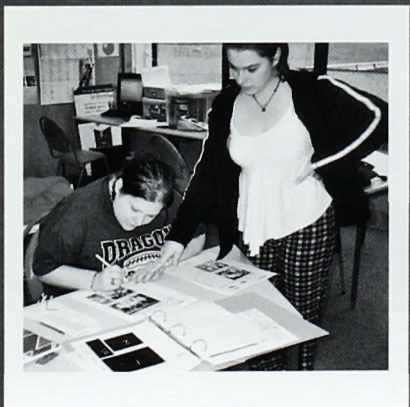
Drama

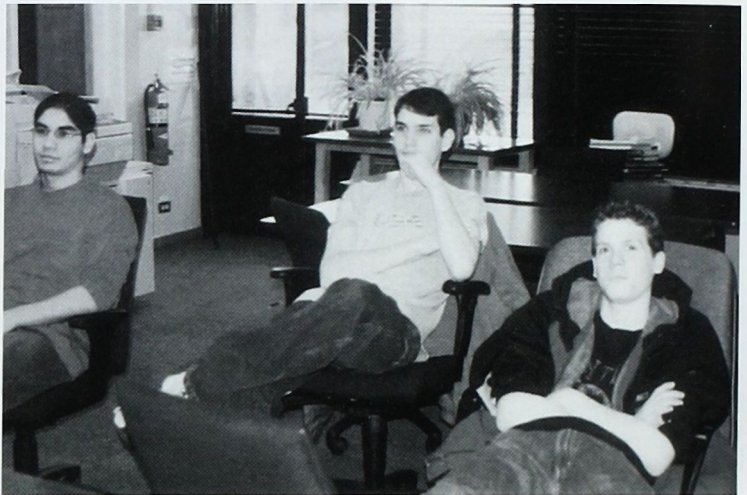

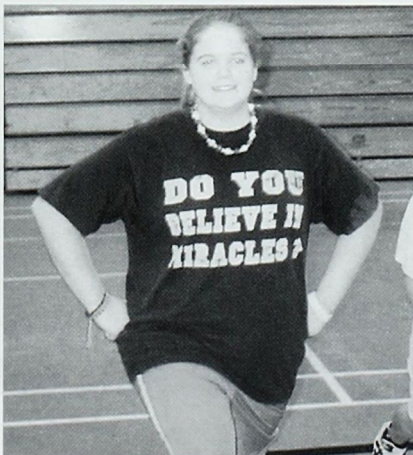

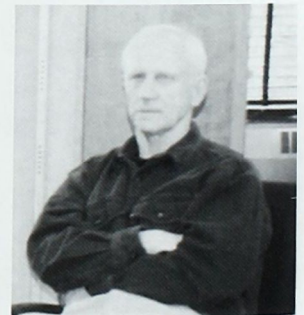

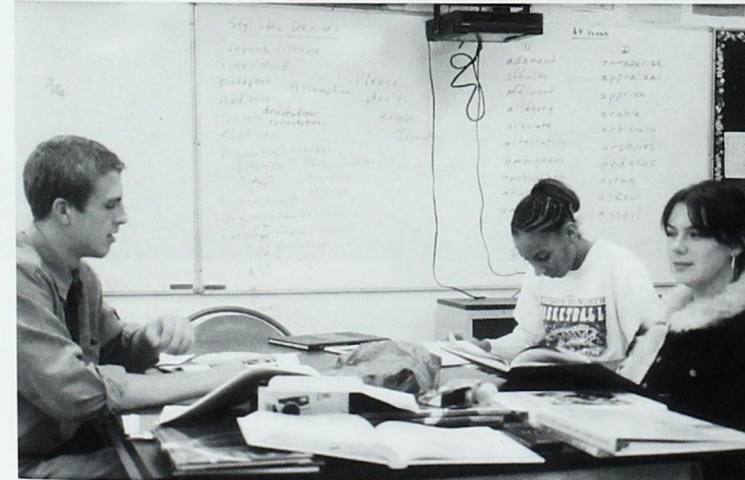

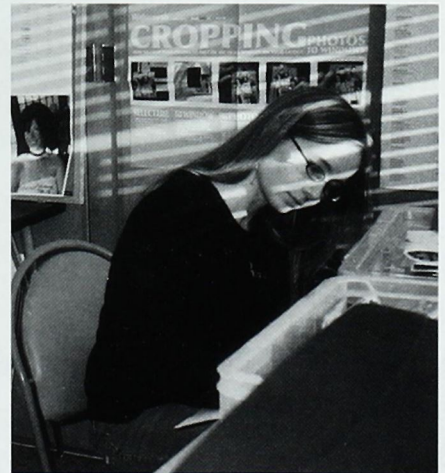
