Duke of Edinburgh

The Duke of Edinburgh's Award is a voluntary, non-competitive program of activities open to all between the ages of fourteen and twenty-five. It offers an individual challenge and encourages young people to undertake exciting, constructive, challenging, and enjoyable activities in their free time.

The Award is a four-section program with three progressive levels: Bronze, Silver, and Gold. The Sections involve Service (helping the community); Skills (a hobby, skill or interest); Physical Recreation (sports, dance, fitness); Expedition (on foot, cycle, horseback, or water); and a Presidential Project--at Gold level only (a week-long enterprise with people not known to the participant).

In October two Alconbury students traveled to Slovenia where they worked with six students from Tehnisk Center, Kranj (The Technical College in Kranj, Slovenia) to complete their Silver assessed expedition.

The students, who had corresponded by e-mail, met just a couple of days prior to the expedition to complete their final preparations for a three-day, physically and technically demanding journey through the mountains and forests of Osilnica, Southern Slovenia.

Links between the two schools have been strengthened and have paved the way for future exchange visits.

The Duke of Edinburgh Award is internationally recognized (it is offered in over 110 countries) and aims to be the best personal development program for young people.

Megan Camero and Shatsta Oglesbee were two students from Alconbury who were able to participate extensively in this program, going on several trips in England and one to Slovenia.

Megan Camero shares a little about her trip: "It was a once-in-a-lifetime chance to go to a different country, visit a different school, and experience a different culture. Upon arrival in Klagenfurt, Austria, Mrs. Dani, the Slovenian DOE teacher, picked us up and took us to the boys' school. The next morning we climbed up a mountain. But about 3/4 of the way up, we lost our path, the path wasn't even there. The maps we were using were old. Eventually we got back down and got a ride back to our campsite, where we put up our tents and cooked our dinner.

"The next day the trek was difficult. We came to one spot where our path was completely gone or covered with rubble.

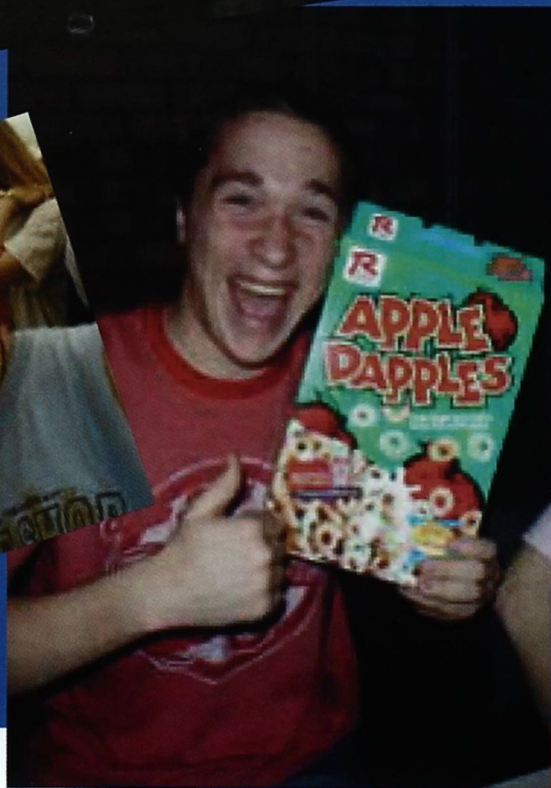
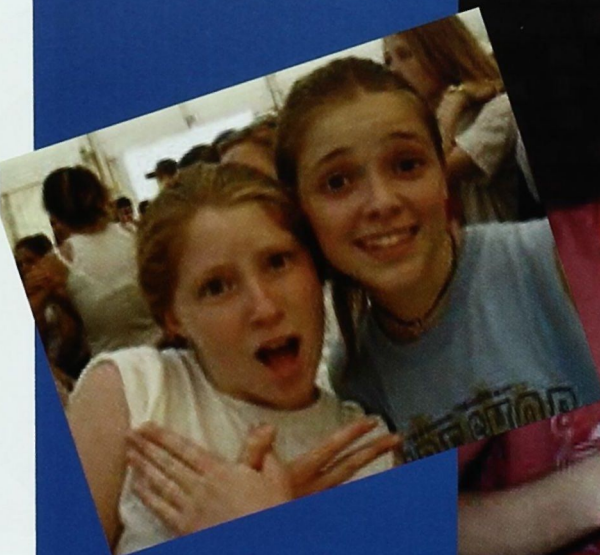
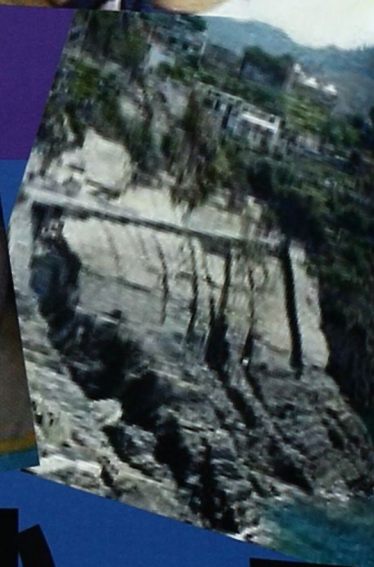
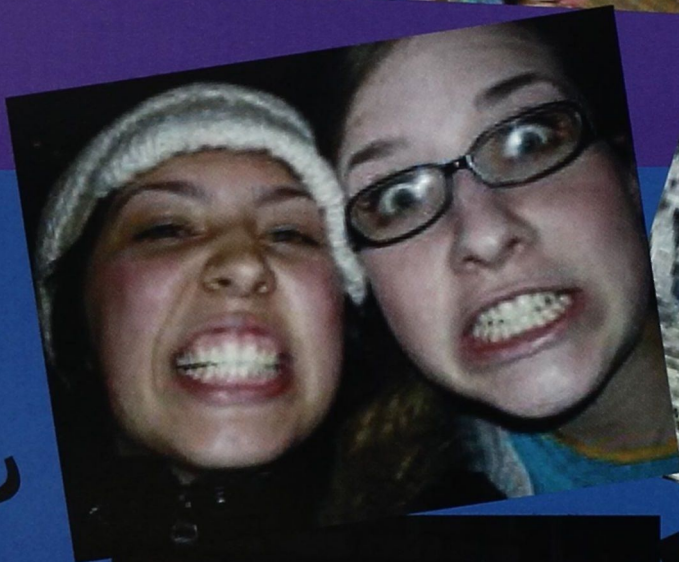
"We got to our next camp at about one in the afternoon, the only bad thing was that Ms. Hudson and Mrs. Dani couldn't get the key to the bungalow, so we ended up sleeping on the loft part of the dining area so bears wouldn't eat us.

"The walk back to the hotel was a little over two hours, and we were rewarded for our hard work with a trip to the local store for some real food, and a hot shower.

"From there we went to the airport and caught our plane back to England. Both Shasta and I were very happy to return home, but we know for a fact that we had the time of our lives in Slovenia."

The Alconbury Dragons Football team played many tough games this year. They ended their season with a 1-4 record, and were one win from qualifying for the playoffs. The dragons played in many close games where they had opportunities to win against all of their opponents. The captains for the Dragons were Sophomore Kyle Lucas, Juniors Andrew Hunt and Doug Bagnall, and Senior Ben Davis.

In their season opener against the Menwith Hill Mustangs the Dragons played a great first half and for the first time in at least 3 years the dragons went into halftime with a one touchdown lead. They struggled through the rest of the game, however, losing the lead and ending up short in the end. Even though the season opened with a loss, this dragon football team knew that this season would be different from previous ones. They showed the ability to put up some points and stay in the game that they lacked in the previous winless seasons.

In the second and third games they suffered losses from a good AF North team and a close game against the Rota Admirals. They then needed to win their final two games to qualify for the playoffs. The team played the Brussel Brigands for homecoming. With their season on the line, they came out to win. The Dragons struggled early and were down 30-14, going into halftime.

During halftime the coaches explained the importance of this game. During the second half of play the Dragons looked like a new team. They came out with intensity and the determination it took to win. In the second half the Dragons dominated the game and came back to put up a 52-36 victory over the Brigands.

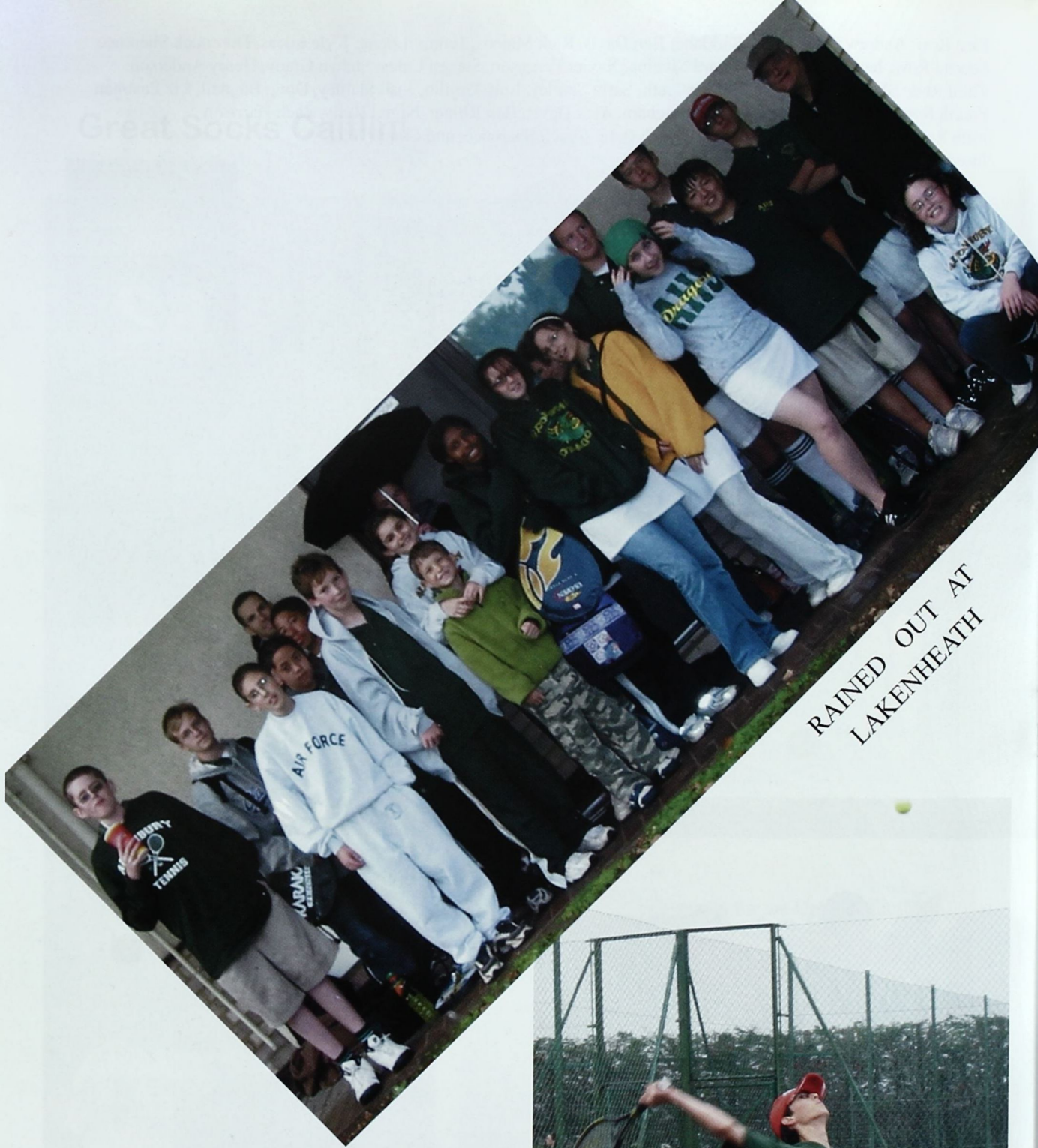

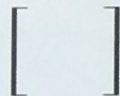


Dance Team!!

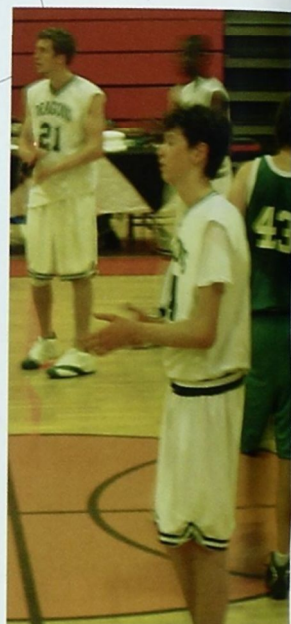
