Students got to hang with friends, eat some great food, and listen to some awesome music. From dance-offs to limbo, there was something for everyone.


The fiesta theme got everyone in the mood. Thanks to the student council for decorating the gym and also thanks to the seniors for the great food.





We Are Creative Connections

Creative Connections is a week-long event, held in Oberwesel, Germany, that gives students a chance to focus on the arts. Students choose from 11 workshops, focusing on various arts forms, which end with an exhibit and performance.

Students Gavin Maltais (music arranging), Imogen Weaver (dance), Nichole Pisierra (show choir), Christiana Crowder (strings) and Ashley Steele (drawing) all took something different away from their classes.

"It's a free environment to explore and draw," says Ashley, who was working with charcoal and erasers.

"I thought it was frustrating at first, but as I'm doing more, it's starting to click."

This year's theme was "Inspiration" and, according to Ms. Mitchell, "The most amazing part of Creative Connections was that I was the one who was inspired by the students. It is such an amazing opportunity for students who share a common interest to come together and feed off of each other's creativity.




Cyber Patriot!





We are the Football Bam!









The Alconbury Model United States Senate team faced off against 12 other DoDDS schools in Raunheim, Germany from


March 24-27.
