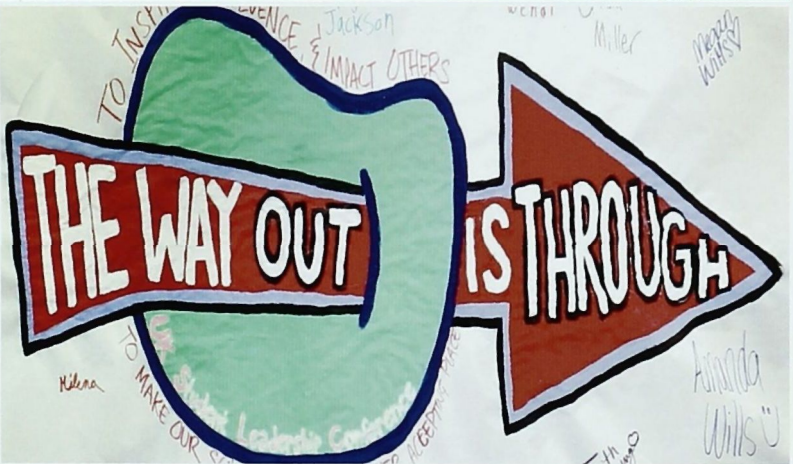

### A Year Like No Other

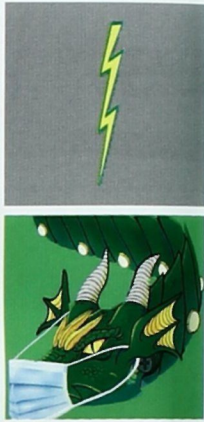

# COVID-19 TIMELINE

March 23

With almost every country reporting cases, the World Health Organization reports more than 300,000 cases globally. When an emergency stimulus package is rejected by the US Senate, stocks plunge and the Federal Reserve's efforts to inject cash into the national economy fail to stave off market declines.

January 21

The United States confirms its first coronavirus case — a man in Washington state who recently returned from a trip to the Wuhan area.

March 11

When Utah Jazz center Rudy Gobert tests positive for COVID-19, the NBA suspends all basketball games.



January 9

The death of a 61-year old man in Wuhan, China is the first known fatality from an illness caused by the novel coronavirus.



February 11

The virus is given a name — COVID-19. The disease caused by the coronavirus is announced by World Health Organization Director-General Tedros Adhanom.



March 13

Across the U.S., schools begin the process of ending the academic year early amid concerns about the spread of coronavirus.



January 7

Officials in China identify a novel coronavirus to be the cause of dozens of cases of pneumonia in Wuhan in December 2019.

January 31

Foreign nationals who had traveled to China within the last 14 days are banned from entering the United States.



March 16

Americans are advised to limit gatherings to no more than 10 people, to avoid dining in at restaurants and to refrain from traveling unless absolutely necessary. Household necessities like toilet paper, bread, trash bags, cleaning supplies and hand soap become extremely hard to find in stores and online.



### April 20

Global demand drops and oil prices bottom out reaching negative numbers. A \$500 billion coronavirus bill is passed by the Senate and includes money for the small business loan program, hospitals and testing.

### May 14

Schools, churches, businesses, restaurants and other organizations are given guidelines for safely re-opening from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.

### March 27

As coronavirus cases in the U.S. surpass 100,000, the most in the world, President Trump signs the \$2.2 trillion coronavirus aid package bill. More than 1,500 deaths are also reported nationwide.

### December 2

While the U.S. counts its 14 millionth COVID-19 case, the United Kingdom becomes the first country to officially approve the Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 vaccine.

### December 8

The first person in the world to receive a dose of a clinically-approved COVID-19 vaccine is 90-year old Margaret Keenan of Britain.



### March 31

As a result of the pandemic, Wall Street closes one of the worst quarters in stock market history which is seen as an indication of the toll the pandemic is taking on the national economy.

### May 10

The global death toll is nearly 280,000 and Johns Hopkins University reports that coronavirus cases pass the four million mark. In the U.S. more than 80,000 deaths are reported. New York, New Jersey, Massachusetts, Pennsylvania, Louisiana, Michigan and California are among the states hit hardest by the pandemic.



### December 11

Pfizer's COVID-19 vaccine is authorized by the FDA for emergency use.

### March 30

The Tokyo 2020 Olympic Games are rescheduled for July 2021.

### November 18

Drug company Pfizer announces they're just days away from submitting a COVID-19 vaccine to the FDA for approval. This comes days after Moderna announces its vaccine, saying it's 94.5 percent effective.

### December 14

Widespread rollout of the vaccine begins in the U.S., with healthcare workers and residents of long-term care facilities among the first recipients. The country's COVID-19-related death toll exceeds 300,000.

### April 3

With the death toll in the US exceeding 7,000 and the number of confirmed cases surpassing 275,500, leading health officials recommend the wearing of cloth face coverings to prevent the spread of the virus.



### October 29

More than nine million cases are confirmed in the U.S., contributing to a global total of more than 40 million.

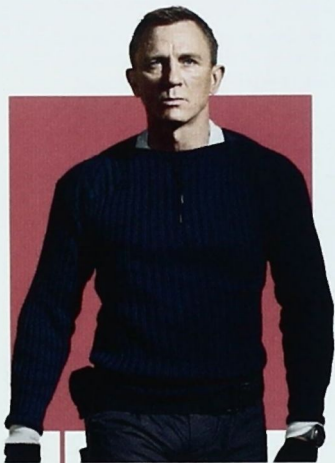

The entertainment industry is hit hard by the pandemic. Studios are forced to shut down or delay production of TV shows and films in many countries. Movies already slated for release are stymied by closed theaters and ordinances against crowds. The only saving graces are streaming services who add millions of subscribers. But even they can't sustain an industry that relies on an audience.

The film's release date is initially pushed from April 2020 to November 2020, then April 2021 with speculation that it could fall victim to further delays.

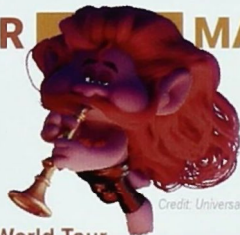

The Los Angeles native was requested by Dr. Jill Biden after hearing Gorman at a poetry reading. “The Hill We Climb” was written during the weeks after the election, with some passages influenced by the storming of the US Capitol just two weeks prior on Jan. 6, 2021.

## The Swearing In of Joe Biden and Kamala Harris

On Jan. 20, 2021, Joseph R. Biden is sworn in and becomes the 46th president of the United States. In his inaugural address, the president recalls the challenges facing the country and calls for unity. Kamala Harris is the first woman, African American and person of South Asian descent to be sworn in as Vice President of the United States. The theme of the inauguration of the Biden/Harris administration is “America United”.

## Protest Takes Violent Turn

Angry protesters storm the US Capitol building on Jan. 6, 2021 in an attempt to stop a joint session of Congress from confirming Joe Biden’s victory. The Senate and House of Representatives are evacuated as rioters occupy and ransack the empty chamber, posting videos to social media all the while, making it easy for the FBI to arrest more than 200 people within two weeks of the riot. Five people die from the event, and dozens are injured.

## Let’s Get This Show Off the Road

The usual pomp and circumstance of a presidential inauguration are re-imagined for a nation enduring a pandemic. The traditional Capitol Hill Luncheon and Inaugural Ball are canceled. Biden and Harris receive a military escort to the White House, and the Inaugural Parade is replaced by a virtual made-for-TV event hosted by Tom Hanks and featuring celebrity performances and everyday heroes like healthcare workers and educators.

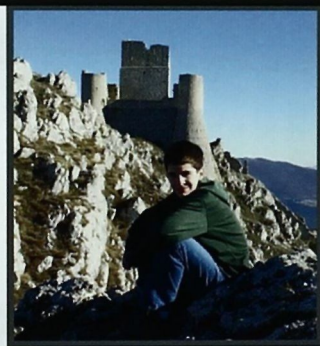






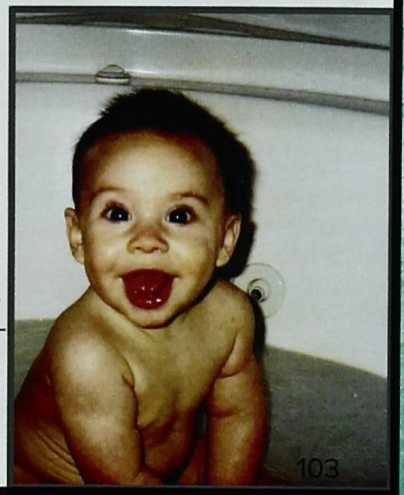
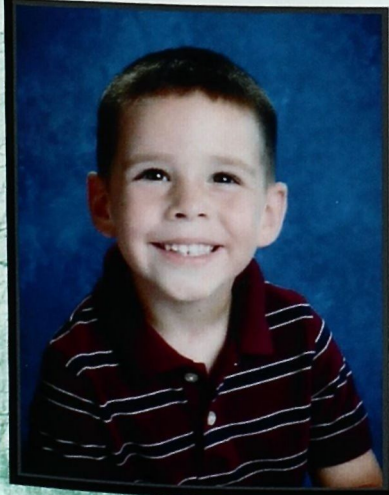
