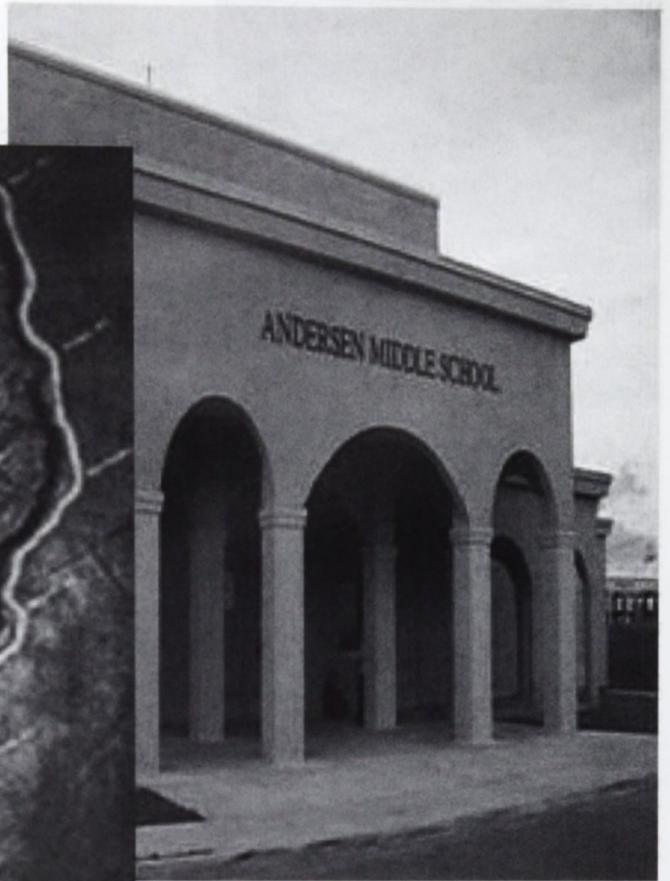

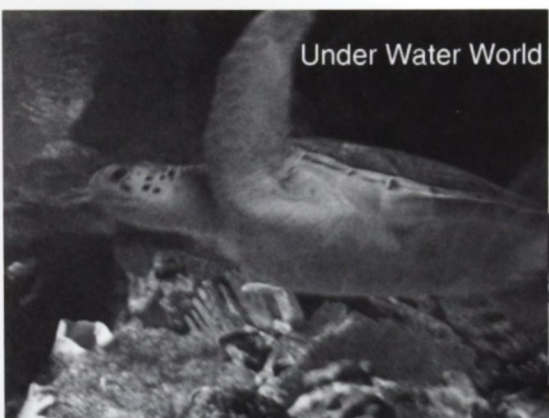

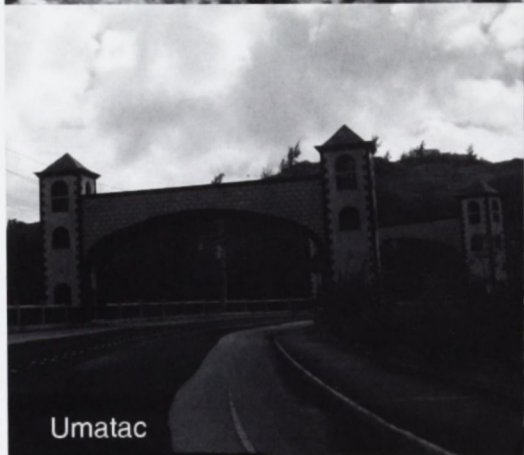
Guam is the westernmost territory of the USA. We are west of the International Date Line making it one day ahead of the U.S.

Andersen Middle School opened its doors in 1997. We moved into our new building in 2001.

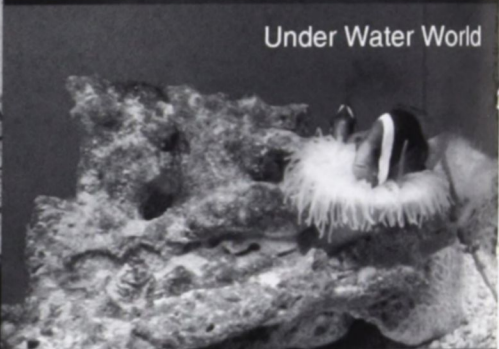

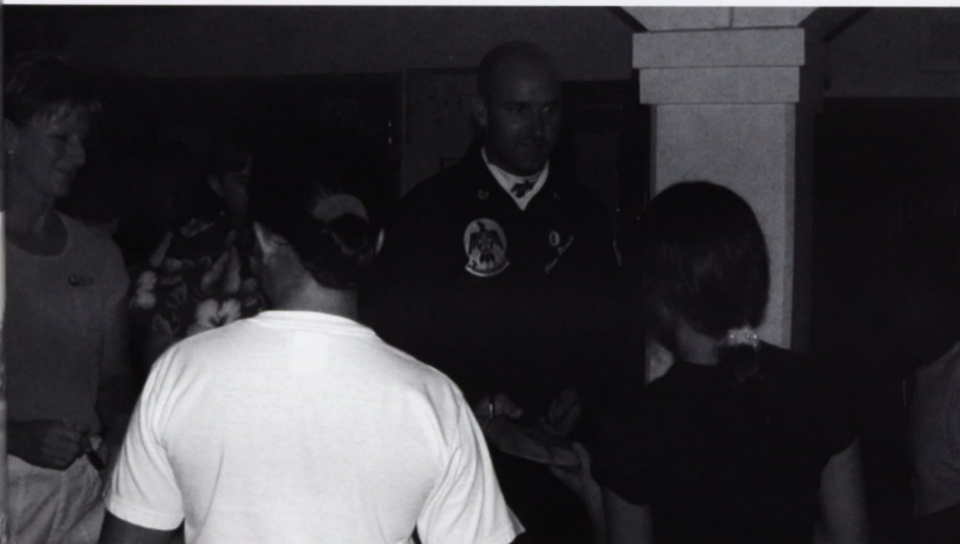


THUNDERBIRD VISIT



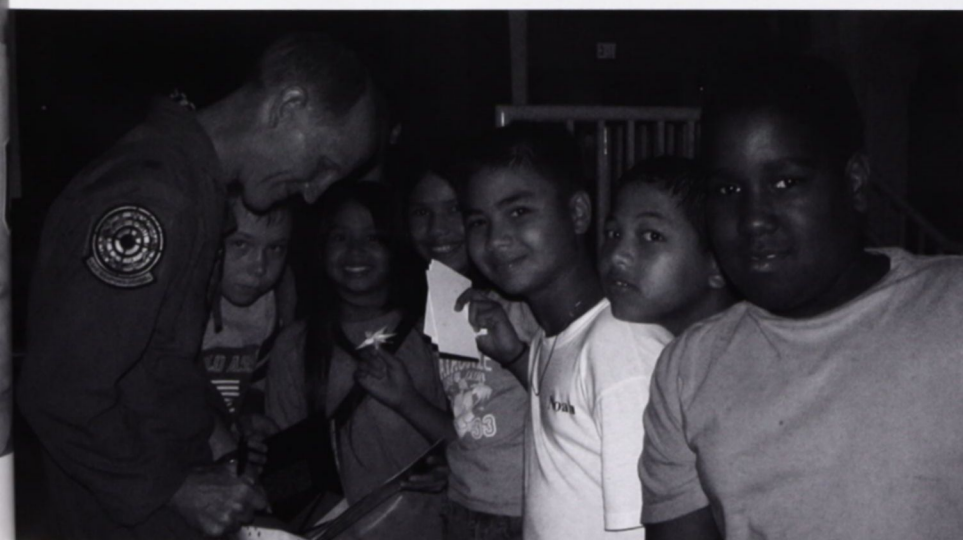

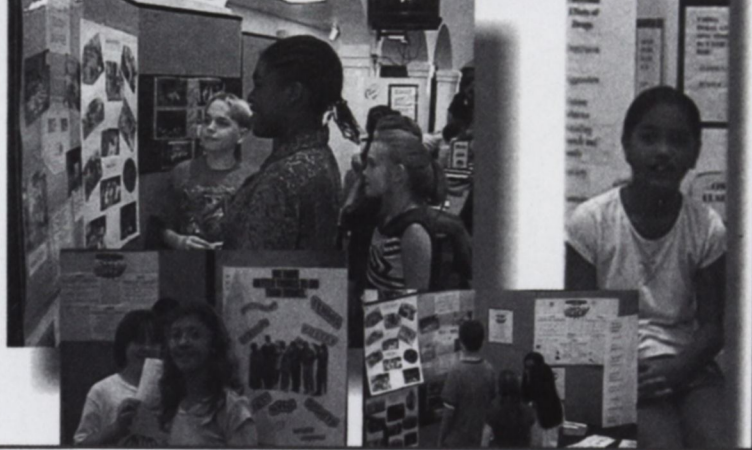
Parent Teacher Student Organization

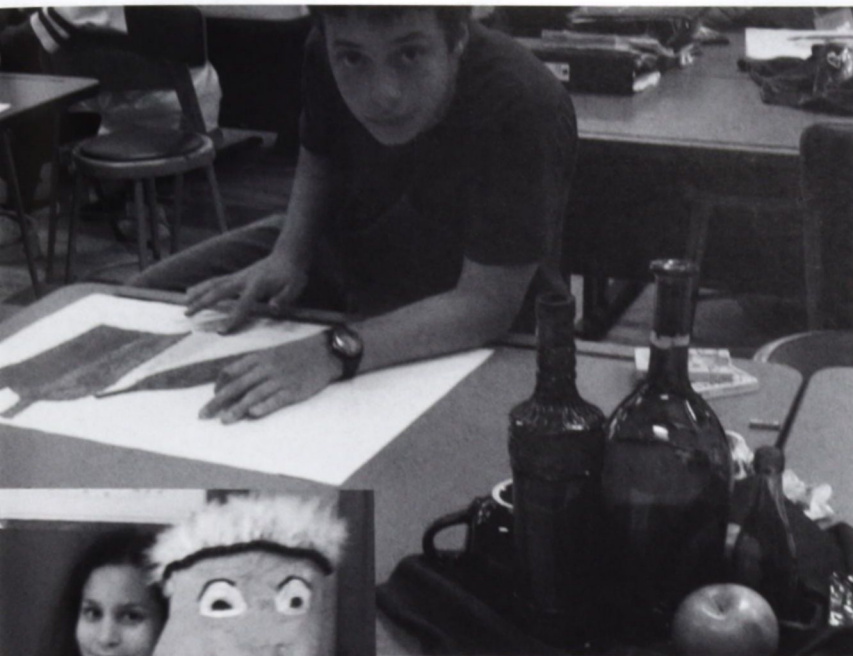

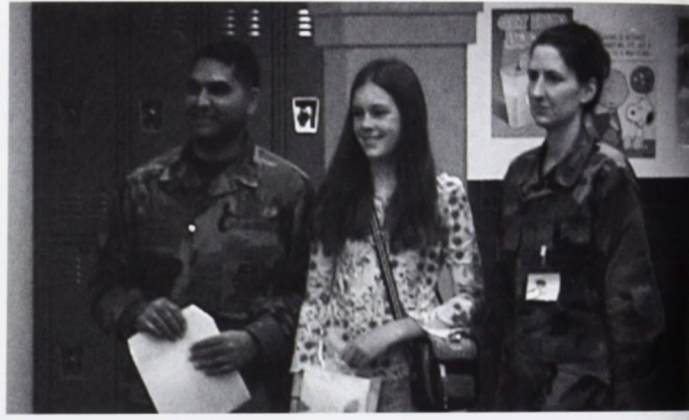

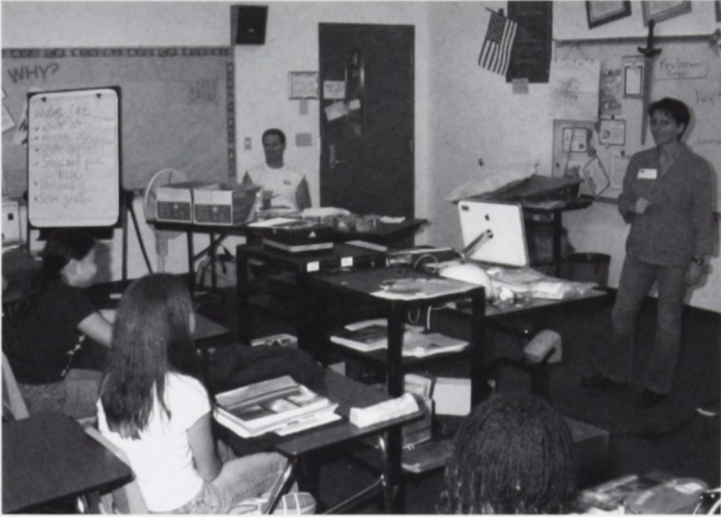

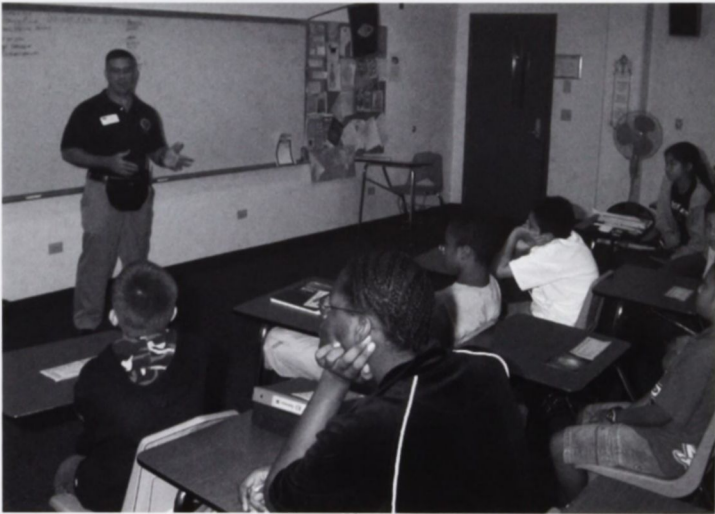

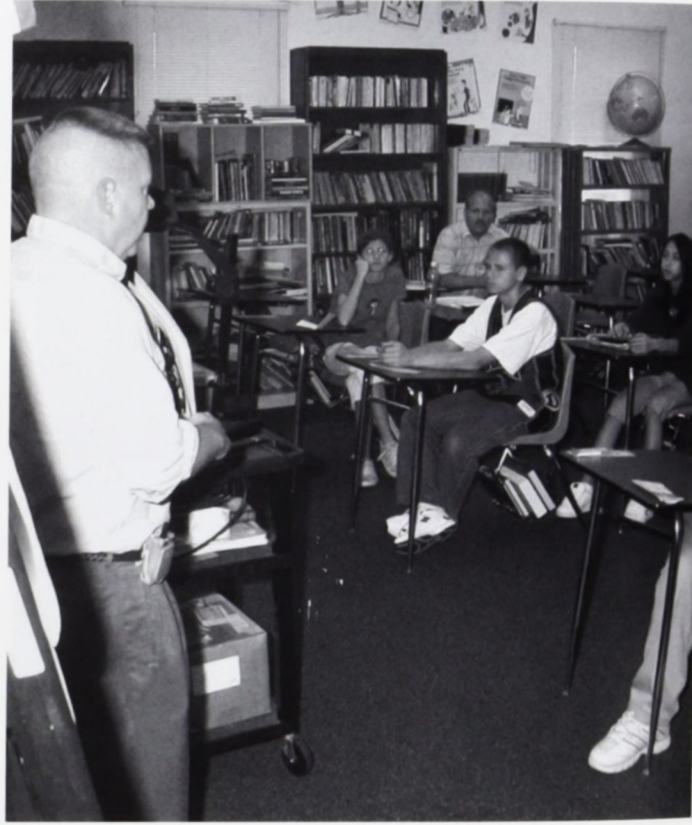

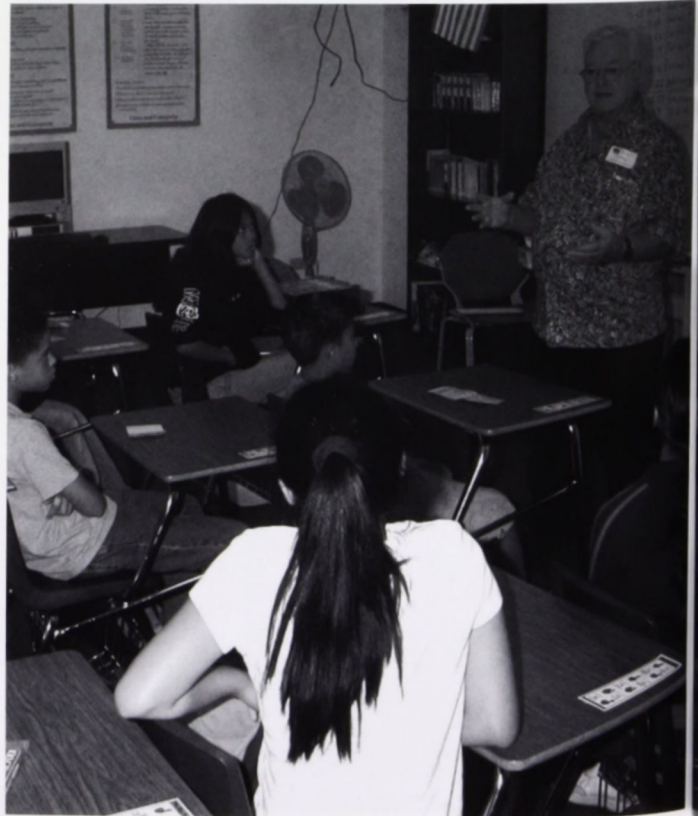

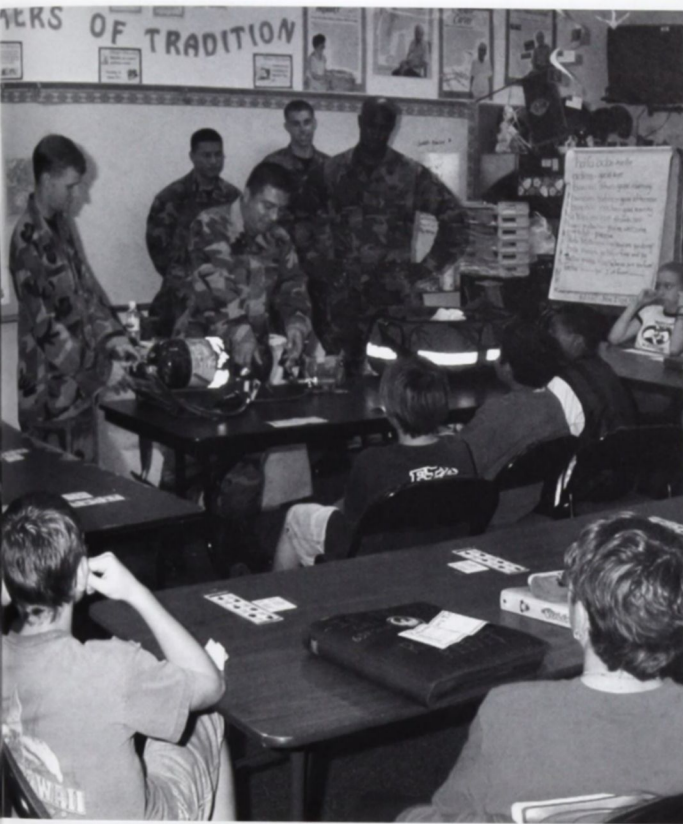

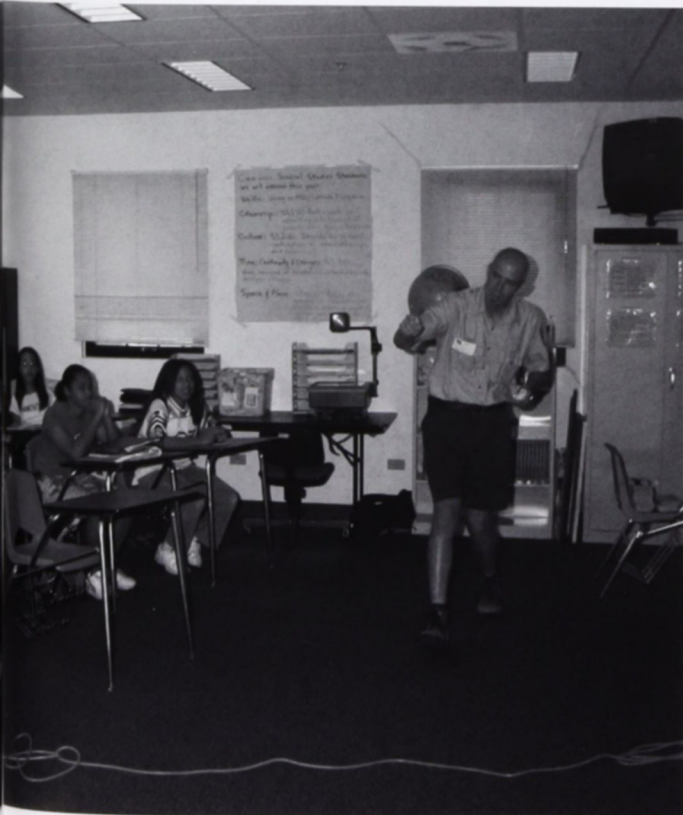

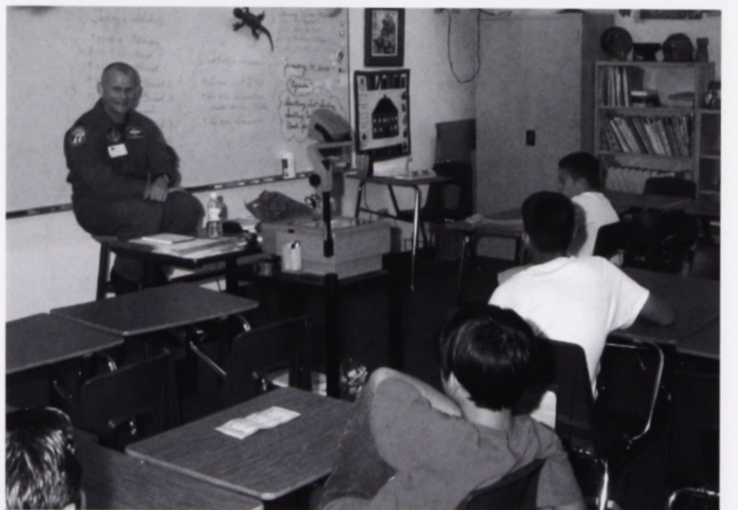

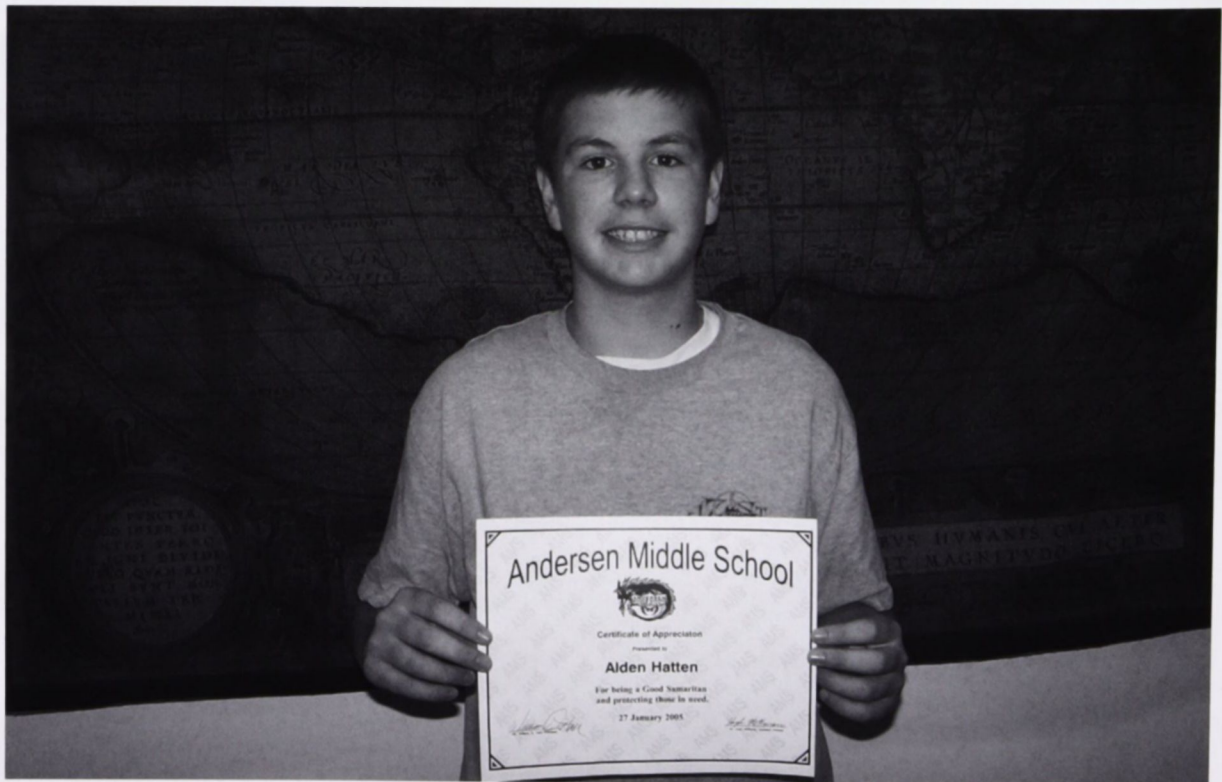


TEACHER OF THE YEAR

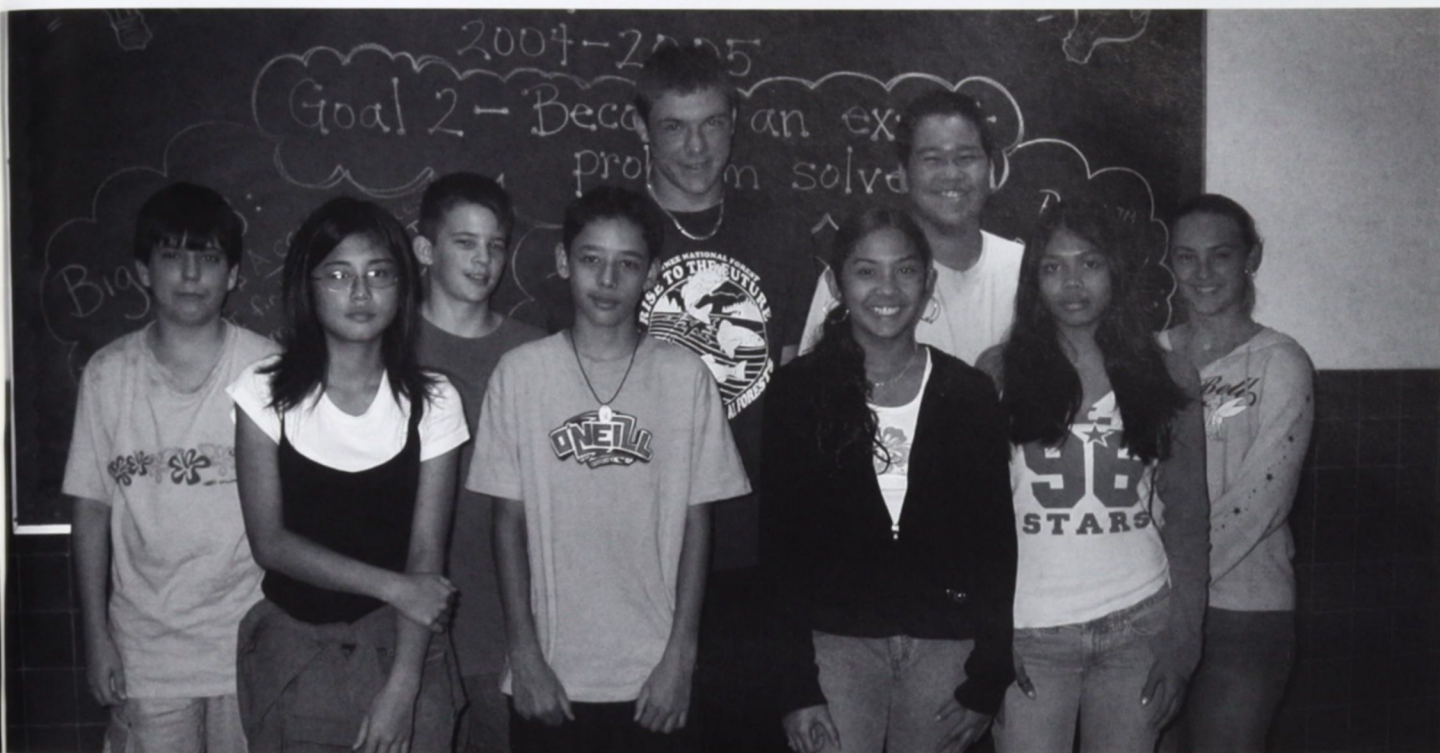
