





Our school motto this year was *Dragon P.R.I.D.E. starts Inside*. The motto inspired us to develop habits and character traits that would help us become successful young adults.






















From our loving principal ...





There are two major military bases on the island, Andersen Air Force Base on the northern tip and Naval Base, Guam, to the south.


NHD (National History Day)






















The top students with NHD topics related to the history of Guam competed in the regional competition against other middle schools around the island.


















Advancement Via Individual Determination


National Junior Honor Society






