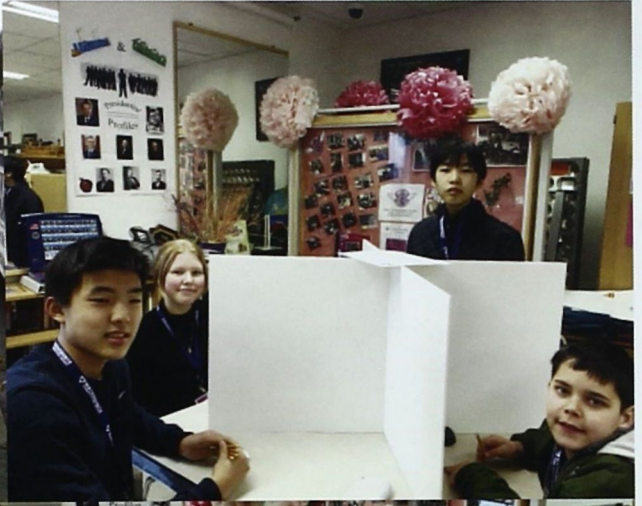

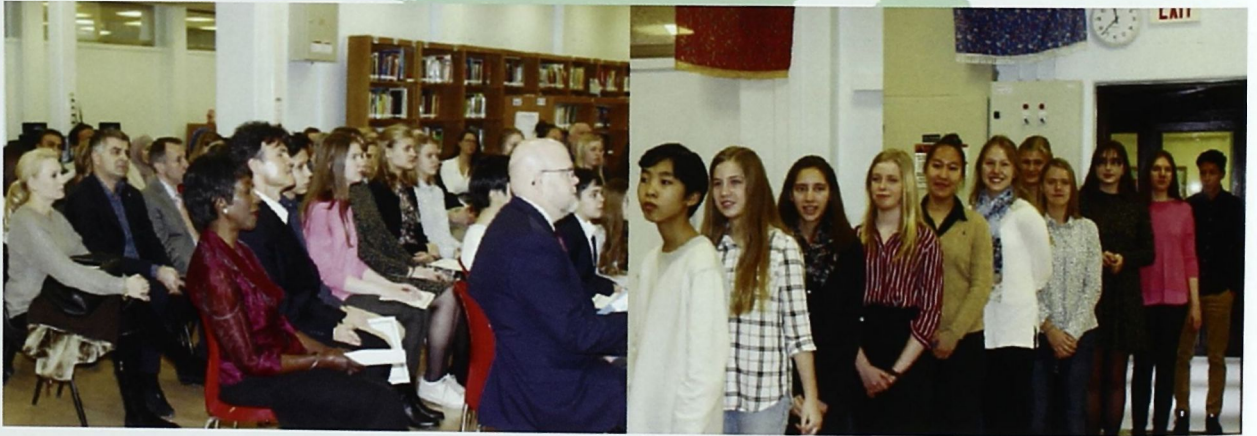




# STRAIGHT A
