


MEMORIES



When I agreed to be the yearbook editor, I was excited to undertake the task of documenting this school year's history. I had a desire to capture the memories of the year, but, like many other people, merely "wanting" to do it was not enough. While many people might take on the all-important task of developing a yearbook, sometimes they find that they lack the direction or insight to begin. At times their efforts have exhausted all local resources, and they don't quite know how to continue.

Consequently, many well-intentioned yearbooks fall short of really capturing the many memories a student has of a year in his/her life. As I looked at previous yearbooks and debated how to begin, I had numerous ideas. I realized my job was to provide the reader with an outline--not a narrative, because I understood that I could not capture the memories for you....for you have your own memories.

Hopefully, this yearbook, which we called MEMORIES, will be that.....a picture review of school year 2004-2005. The aim was that when you look at this yearbook it will be your memories that breathe life into the still images. It will be your memories that permit you to hear that friend yell at you across the hallway or permit you to hear the music of the Holiday Concert. Your memories will bring back that smile from a friend or that note passed secretly in class. . .

A yearbook is not a collection of memories for today, but a collection of memories for tomorrow—for those quiet times in your future, when you might open your yearbook and be transported back into time. Hopefully, this issue of MEMORIES will do that for you. The staff and I have collected the pictures and placed them for you. As you leaf through this book, it will be your memories, good and bad, that will bring life to the pages and transport you back in time.

We have pages of still images of our school. Each person will see these images differently. As you see the picture of the entrance to George C. Marshall, an image of an empty hallway, a picture of a remembered friendit will be the memories of your time here that will bring that picture to life. A folk singer from the 60' and 70's once sang, "Love is mainly just memories, and everyone has but a few...." And it is with this issue of MEMORIES that I hope you have more than a few memories of your life at George C. Marshall School for school year 2004 and 2005.







Ataturk

Mustafa Kemal Ataturk is considered to be one of the most significant people of the 20th century. He is better remembered for his social, economical, and political reforms that changed the country of Turkey forever. With his brilliance and courage as a military leader, Ataturk was able to overthrow the Ottoman regime and create the Republic of Turkey. Because of such contributions, Ataturk was admired and respected by all, and not only the Turks. John F. Kennedy once said:

"Ataturk's name reminds us the historical achievements of one of the greatest men of this century, his inspirational leadership for the Turkish nation, his vision in understanding the modern world, and his power and courage as a military leader."

This quote sums up the qualities of Ataturk that made him so great and the things that he accomplished for the good of the nation of Turkey. But what sorts of things did he accomplish in order to gain such a magnitude of respect?

When Ataturk was born on March 12, 1881, he was given the single name Mustafa, as was the Turkish custom during the reign of the Ottoman Empire. Born and raised in Selanik, it was evident that young Mustafa would one day do great things. He was enrolled in a military school where he excelled in all his classes, especially math. Because of his intelligence, his math teacher decided to add Kemal to his name, meaning "perfection". As a military leader, Mustafa Kemal had a great vision of a democratic republic that was free of the theocratic government of the Ottoman Empire. In order to fulfill his dream, he overthrew the Ottoman sultanate and put a stop to European colonization in Turkey. As a result, the Republic of Turkey was founded on October 29, 1923, and Mustafa Kemal became its first president.

He set up a series of cultural reforms that created drastic changes in all aspects of the Turkish people's lives. In order to create the democracy that he dreamed of, Mustafa Kemal overthrew the Caliphate, which was a religious title given to the sultans, and removed all religious aspects in government to create a secular country. In order to create his democracy, he created a Parliament to help govern the country. The Sharia Law of Islam was substituted for a law code based on the code of Switzerland. He liberated women by giving them social and political rights, such as the right to vote, the right to hold a seat in Parliament, and allowed women to enter the work force. He also changed the attire of the public by banning the fez, a hat worn by the men during the reign of the Ottoman Empire, and the veil for the women. Both men and women were introduced to the western style of clothing. He made significant changes in education by adopting the modified Latin alphabet instead of Arabic script. This made it easier for children to learn how to read and write and for the teachers to teach. Every citizen from the age of 6 to 40 was forced to attend school and receive an education. He opened new schools where the students could learn art, which was banned during the Ottoman Empire. He also made changes to the Turkish language by removing words from the Arabic and Persian languages and replacing them with newly created words. He adopted the western calendar, time and measurement, and set up the surname law, which stated that all citizens must have a surname. Because of this new law, the Parliament gave Mustafa Kemal the last name of Ataturk, meaning the father of the Turks. Along with all of these reforms, Ataturk built new highways and created historical societies. The ideology of Ataturk soon became Kemalism and had six principles, republicanism, nationalism, populism, statism, secularism, and revolutionist. Sadly, Mustafa Kemal Ataturk passed away on November 10, 1938 due to a liver condition. His remains are buried at a memorial here in Ankara and hundreds of people flock there to honor this exceptional man.

In a period of twenty years, Ataturk accomplished many cultural reforms that took other countries centuries to achieve, all during a period of unrest in Europe. These reforms permanently changed the political, social, and economical aspects of Turkey and created a country free from theocratic rule. The impact this man had on the people of Turkey is evident in the respect that they show him by honoring his memory in paintings, memorials, pictures, and sculptures. If you go to any office building or school, you will find a picture of Ataturk hanging on the wall. This picture reminds the people of the great things that Ataturk did for them and the country, and makes them realize that if it weren't for him, the Republic of Turkey wouldn't exist.
