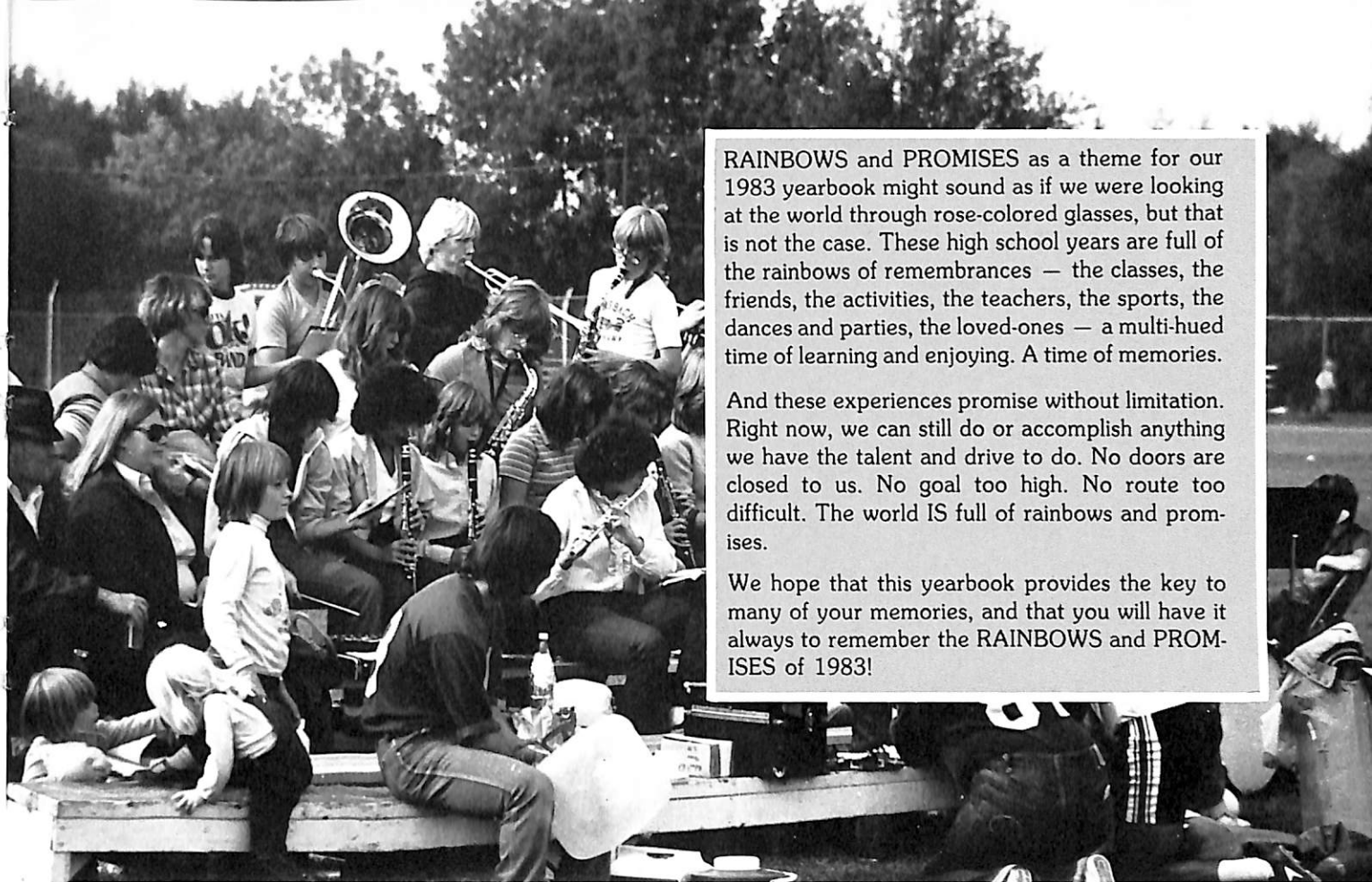

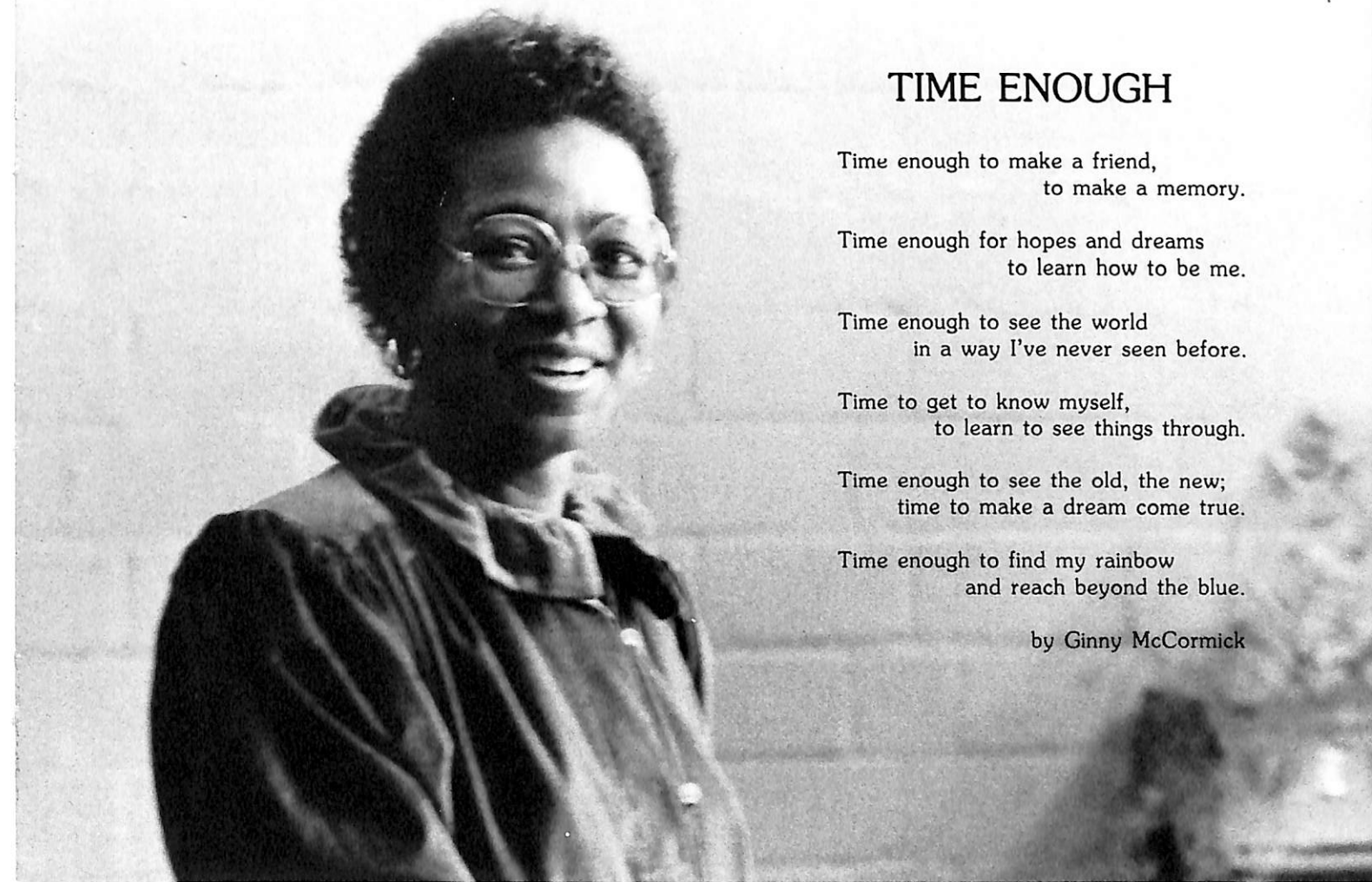
We hope that this yearbook provides the key to many of your memories, and that you will have it always to remember the RAINBOWS and PROMISES of 1983!

Ansbach Scores Again!

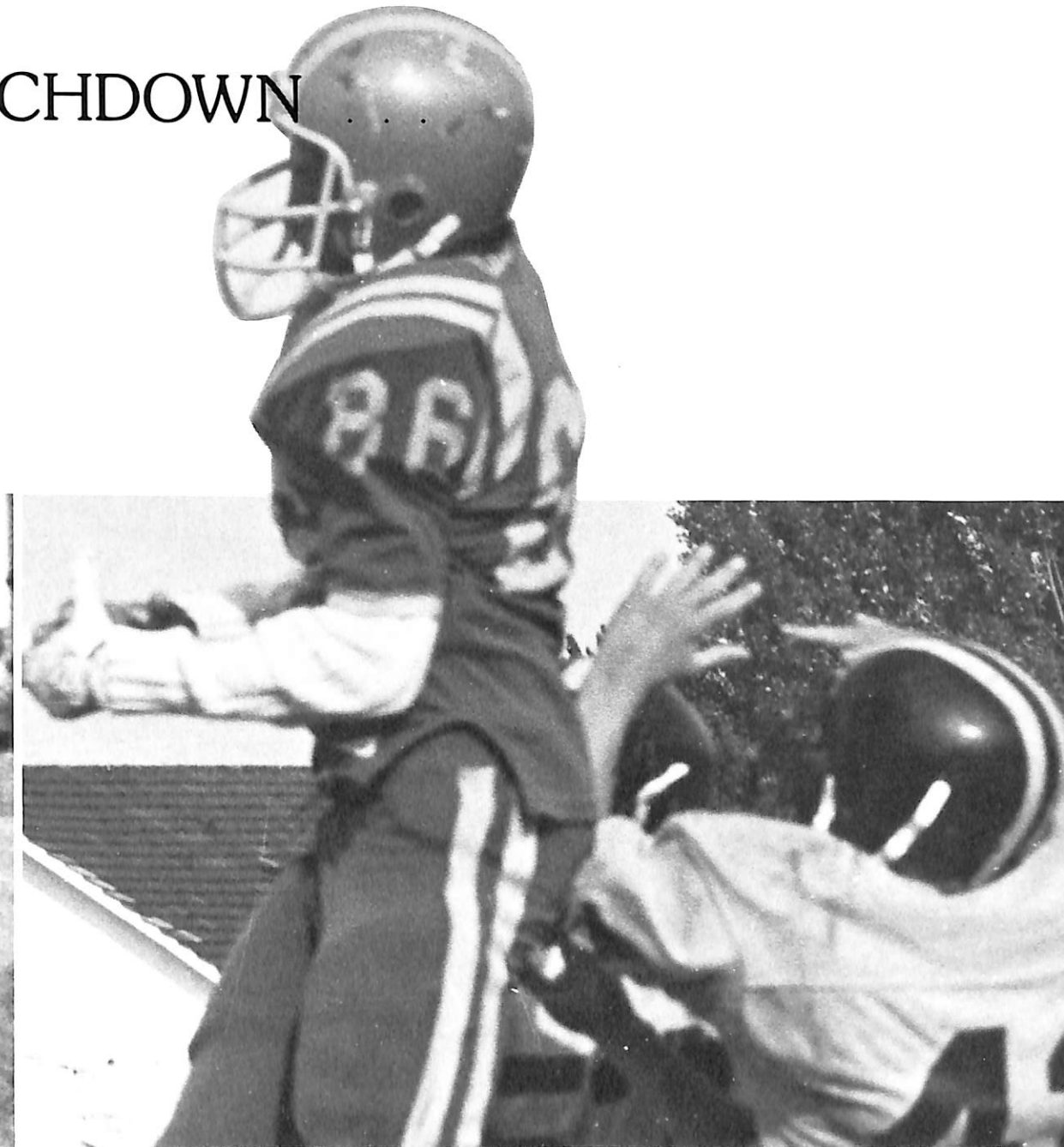
A PASS . . . A CATCH . . .

## Mustangs Maximize Cougar Mistakes

In the first regularly scheduled game of the season the Cougars fell to the Mustangs from Munich. After being held to six points in the first half by a stubborn Ansbach defense, a fourth quarter full of mistakes allowed the Mustangs to score two more touchdowns plus extra points and a safety. "Our offense just never got it together," Coach Schwartz was quoted as saying, "and the defense was great for three quarters. But it takes four to win."

Coach Schwartz' comments on the game were: "The defense was excellent — tough and aggressive. And the offense was awesome when no mistakes were made.

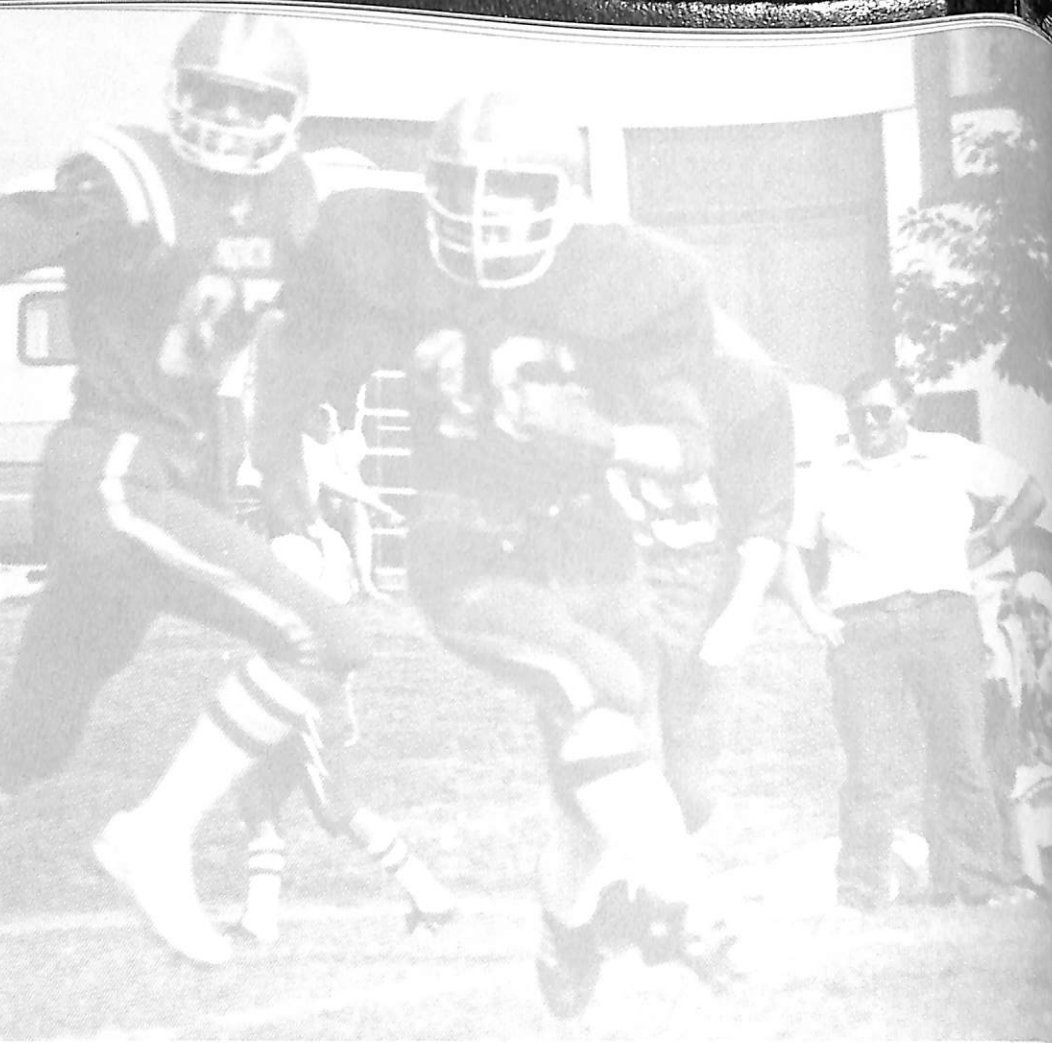
