






High School Homecoming




Ansbach Baseball



Stemposium is a convention where 9th-11th graders get together to solve a simulation about a real world problem. It involves teamwork and the collaboration of civil, environmental, biotechnology, robotic, green tech, and computer simulation engineers. There were around 180 students from all of DoD Europe. We were divided into teams of five engineers and an adult to guide us. We had seminars everyday where an actual engineer would give us lessons about each of our fields.

This year we had to build an Ebola Treatment Center and prevent Ebola from spreading. I was a civil engineer and I had to survey for an appropriate location that was secluded from society and I had to build the building for seventy-five patients and a water tower. One of our problem was that the environmental engineer and I had to face was having a source of water running into the facility and having a sewage system that would not contaminate any fields or nearby rivers. I had to give my designs to the computer simulation engineer so we could have a visual design. When I was surveying I had to communicate with the green tech




