The answer to this very simple question is SPIRIT WEEK!! For one week, folks wore their worst, tried their hardest, and were generally wild.

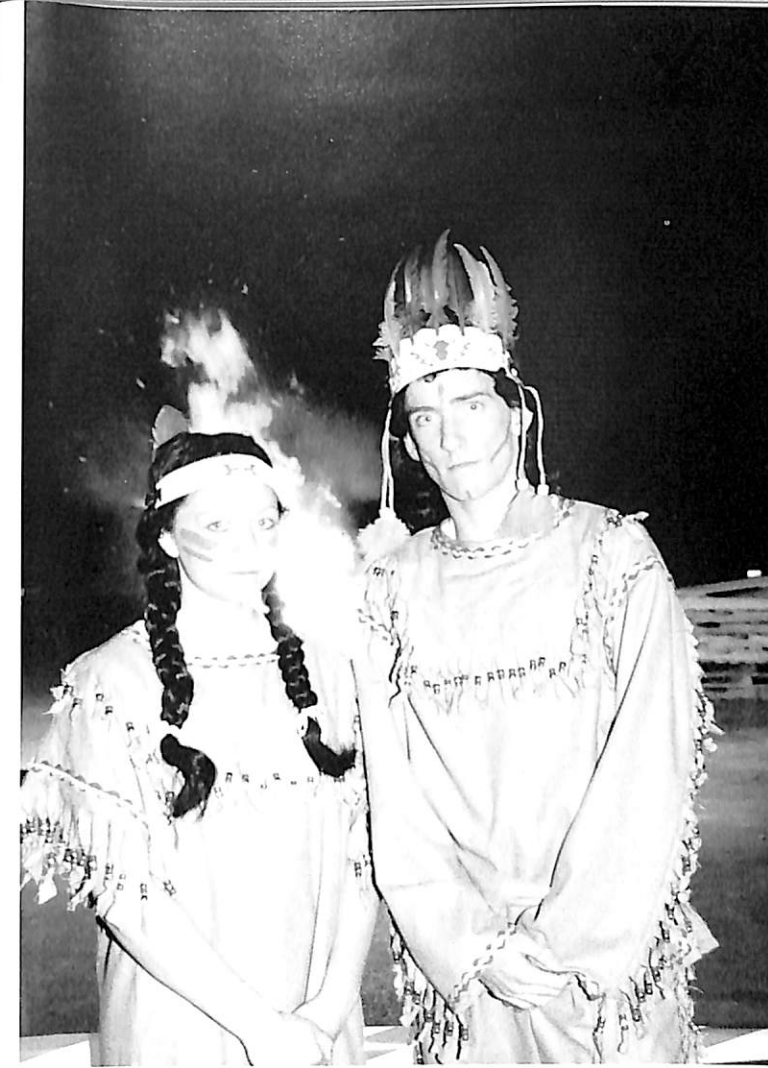
Here's a guide map for all of you who got slightly confused over what were the different days and what was happening at lunch:

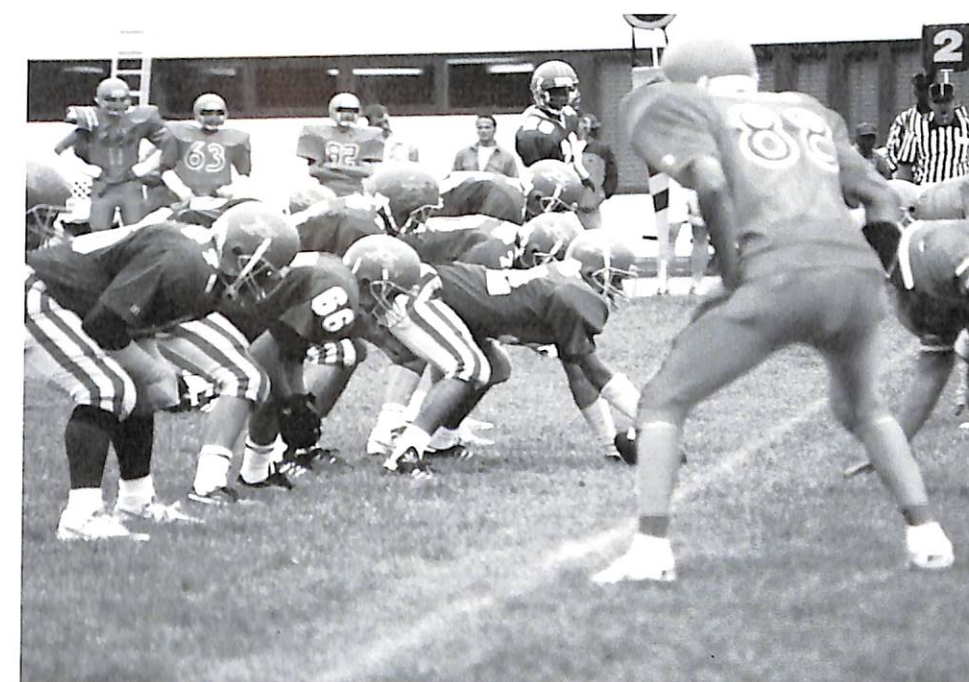


Small Schools Champ

A Picture Perfect 10-0

The 1991 football season opened with a nailbiting 30-26 victory over future playoff opponent Bad Kreuznach. From then on the Apaches experienced a picture perfect 10-0 season with a 13-12 victory over Woodbridge in the European Small Schools Final. This year's team, over the course of three months, became almost like a family. The team members would sacrifice almost anything to win games and stay unbeaten. Terry Austin sacrificed more for the team than anyone else. Due to the military his parents were rotated to Hanau, yet Terry stayed on in Augsburg to finish a picture perfect season and his last year in High School. Terry Austin led the Apache three-pronged running attack of Rodney Anderson, Marcus Jones, and Terry in rushing yards, and touchdowns scored. Seniors Seth Davidson, Chad Madsen, and Mikko LaValley were the anchors that secured the offensive line and opened holes for the backfield attack. Quarterback, Bryan Hagar, was a calm and consistent member of the offense who always seemed to conjure up the big plays. In the Small Schools Final he threw 3-4 completions to steer the

Apaches to their 13-12 victory over Woodbridge. Placekicker Mikko LaValley missed only two extra points all season and hit field goals of 22,



24, and 27 yards. Tight end Bryan Weber threw devastating blocks for the Apache backfield and he caught three touchdown passes, one of which gave Augsburg the lead in the Small Schools Final. On the defensive side of things Donald Gardner and Ciaran Harris led the defense in tackles. Linebacker Terry Austin

and Mikko LaValley bottled up the middle. Sophomore safety Robert Taylor saved the game in Ansbach, and refused to allow any long touchdown passes. Cornerbacks James Kennison and Tony Davis were stingy in their pass defense and relished sticking the opposing running backs in the open field. The Cowboy Jason Shawky starred on the defensive line with his infamous hog-tie. This is a year that no one will forget. Not many teams get a Picture Perfect 10-0.
