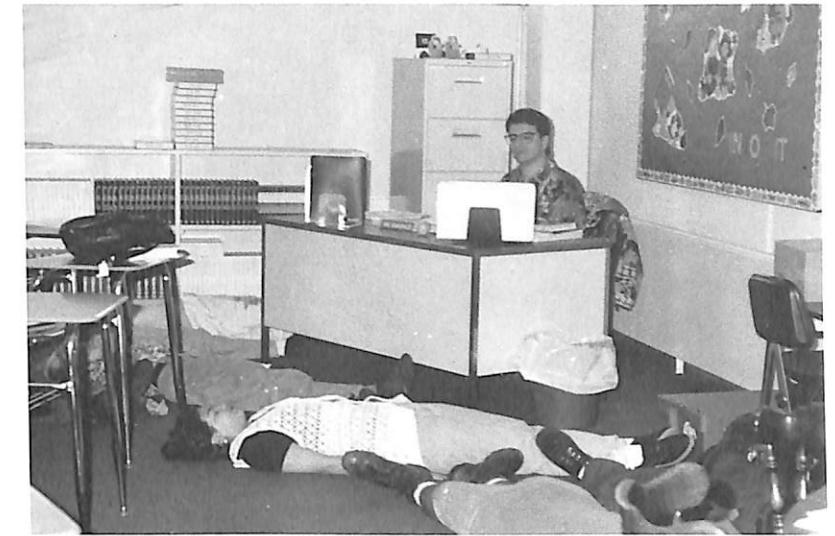
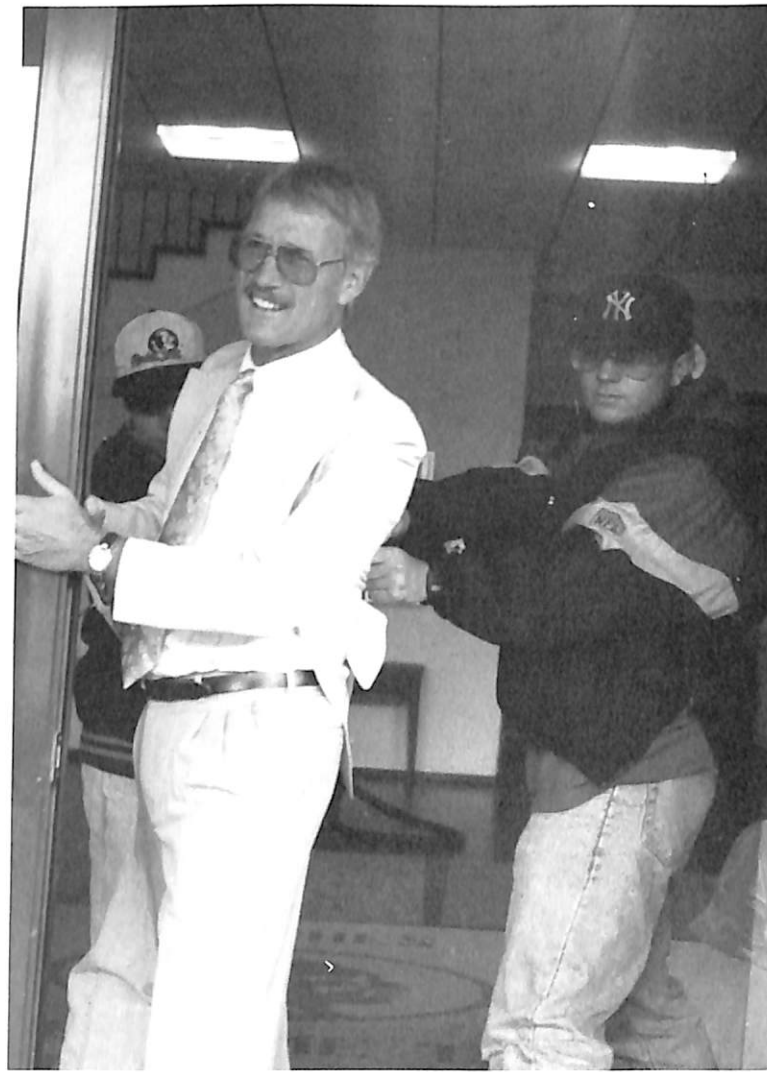
The chaperones, also enjoying themselves, were impressed by the maturity and formal attire of the student body. Homecoming 1993 will be one that AHS will remember fondly.

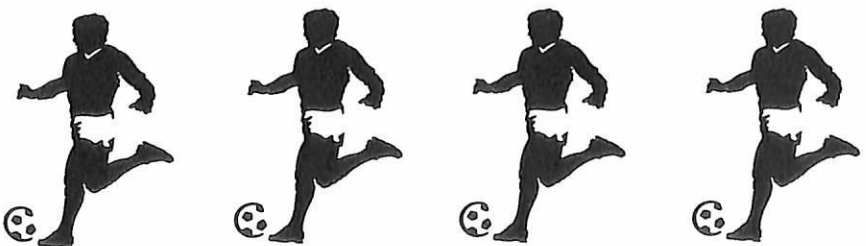
MENS' SOCCER

WOMENS' SOCCER

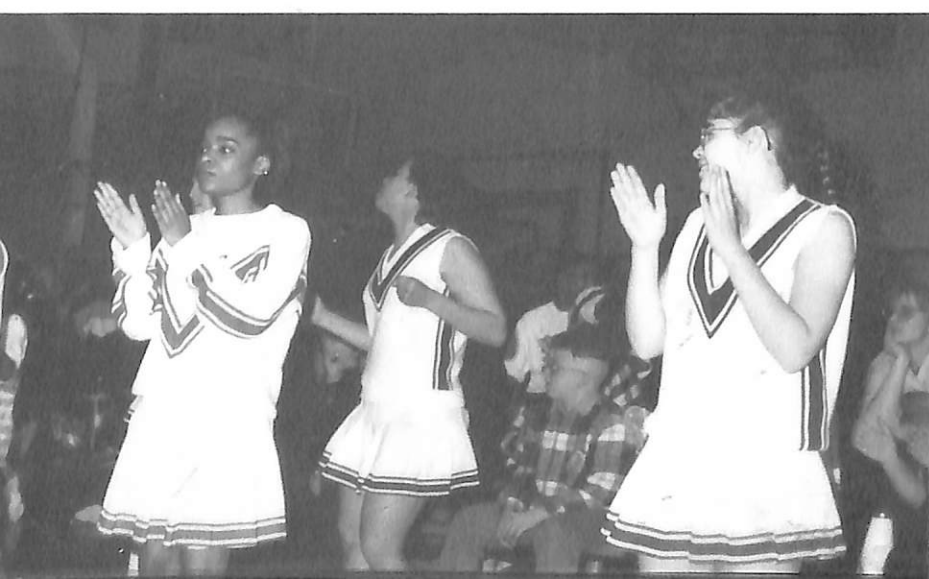

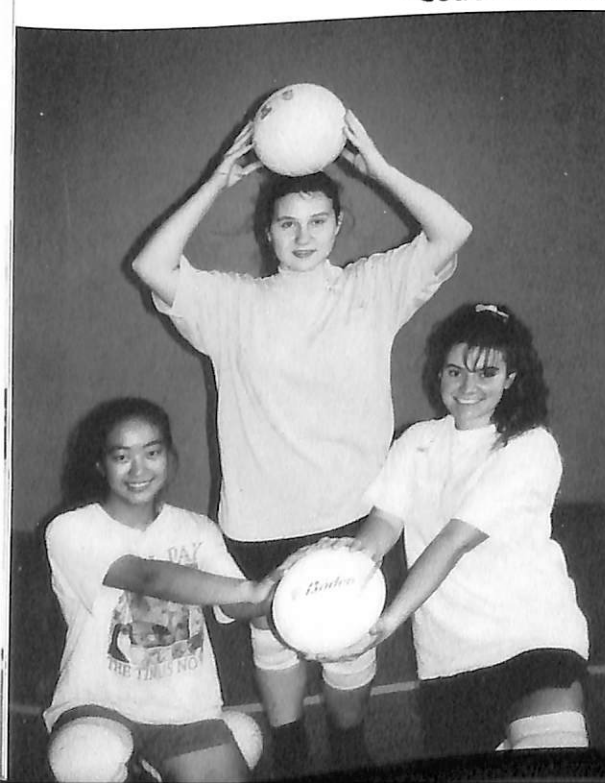
93 VOLLEYBALL 94

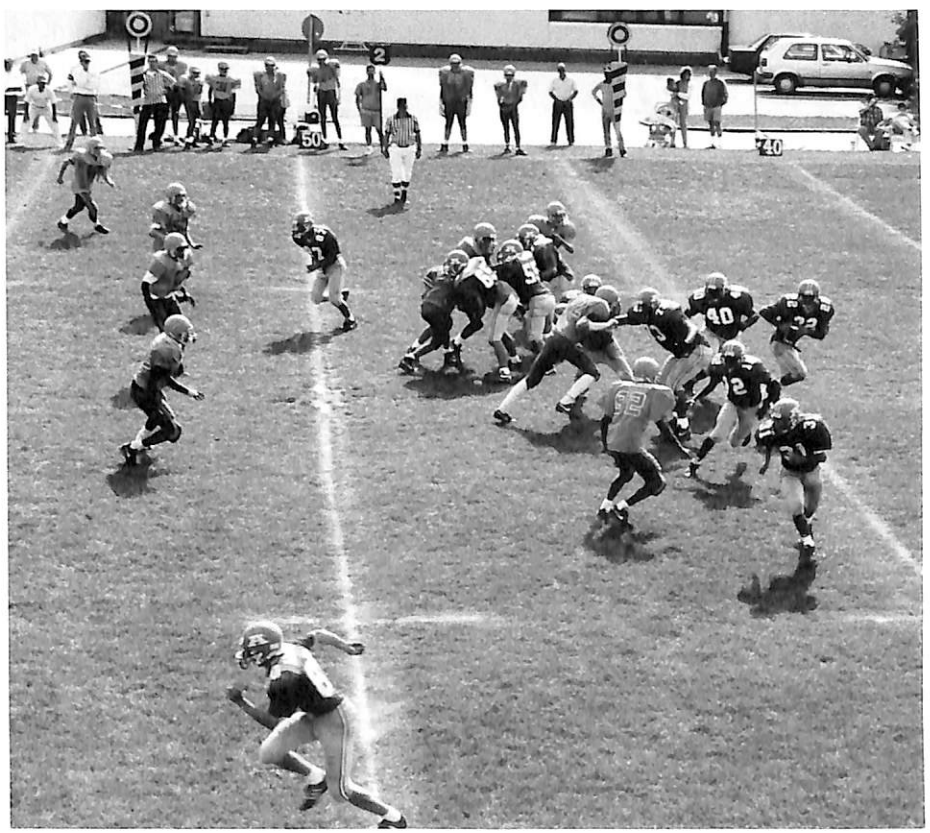

Scientists have proven that in ten years all of this I have told you will happen and everything will change. Nothing will be how it is nowadays. Times are changing!

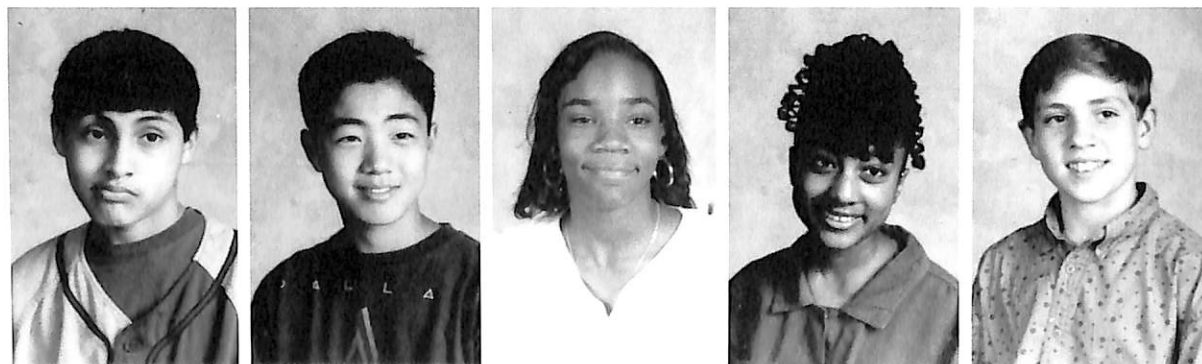

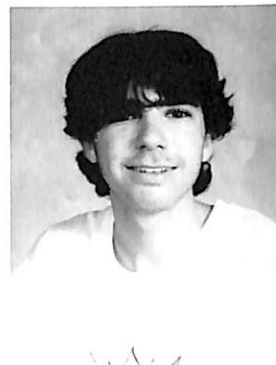
"TIMES ARE CHANGING"

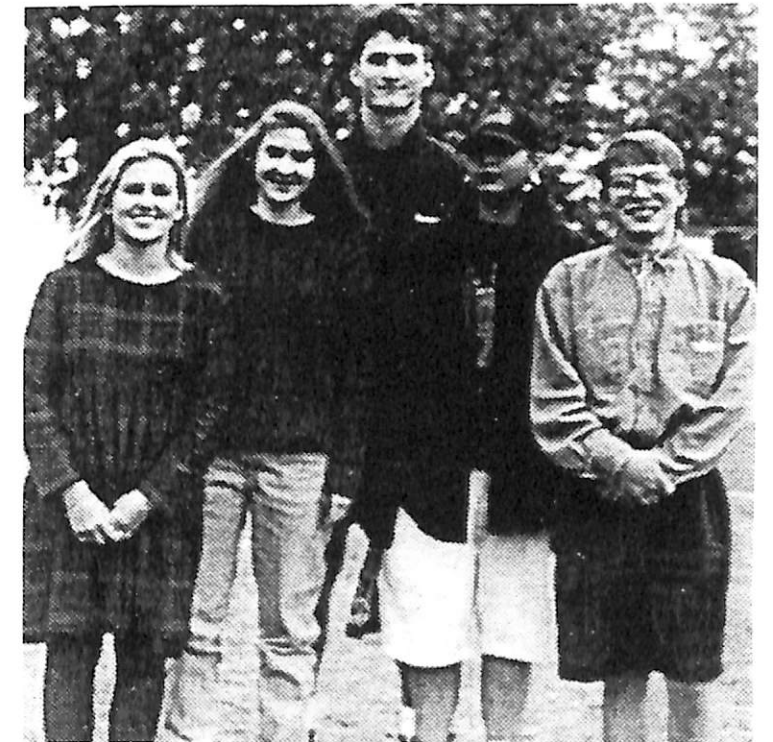

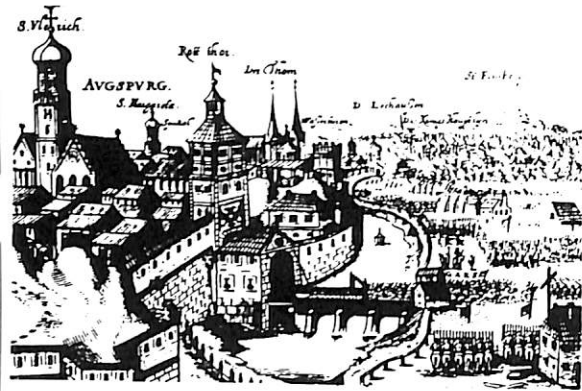

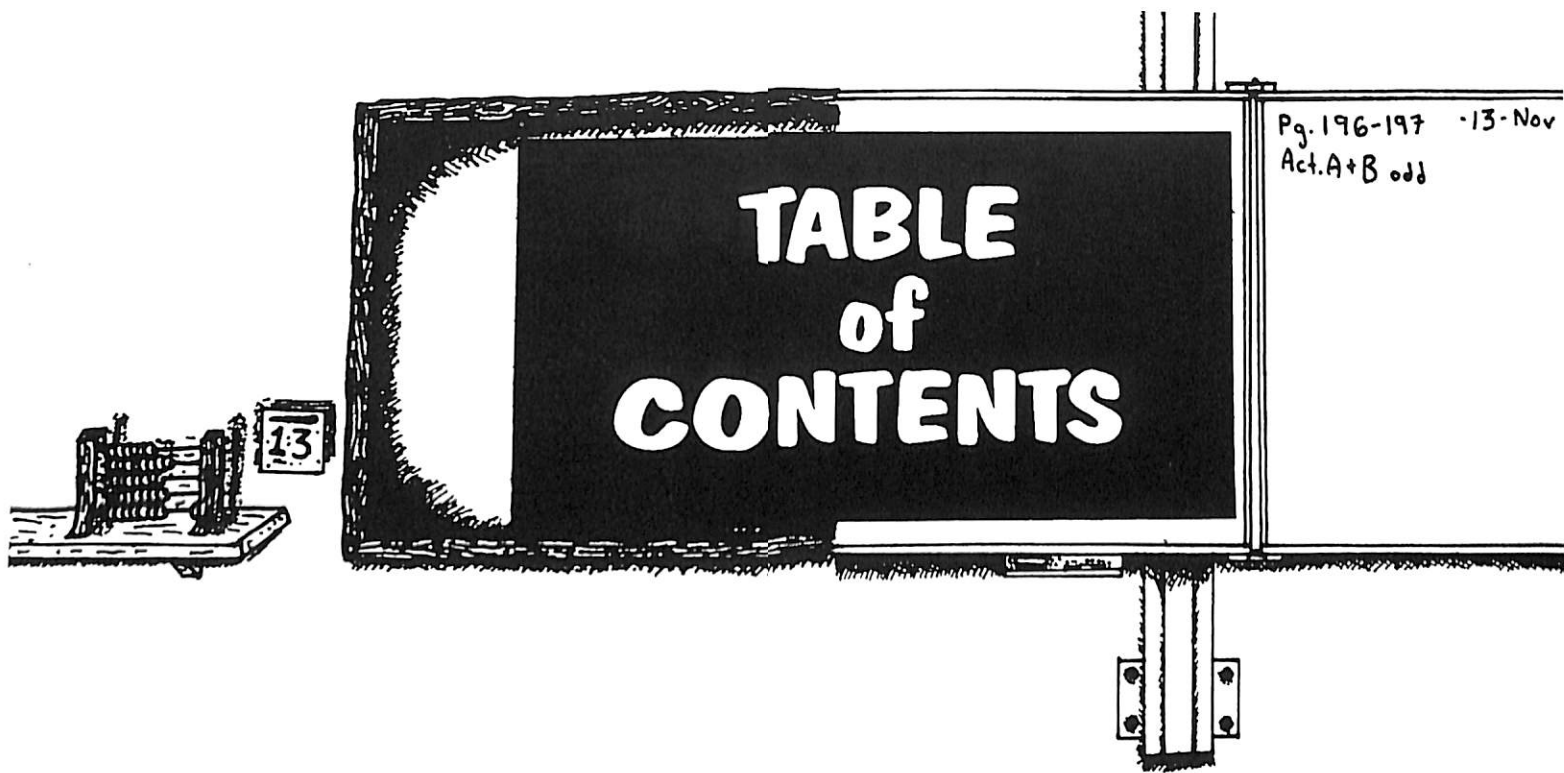
