
Upperclassmen could choose several places to eat at. from Anthony's


Their next concert was the Christmas one on December 5th, 1996. They respectfully brought in the spirit of Christmas singing songs of the season.




## The Lady Saints can't be stopped



including Regionals before the A.S.I.L Championships, the team worked extra hard to have a successful season. All in all with team spirit the Saints flew high!



















### Ready To Roll




