


## **FOREWORD**



Kreuznach, or Bad Kreuznach, is a town and watering place of Germany, in the State of Rhineland-Palatinate, situated on the Nahe, a tributary of the Rhine River, lying 9 miles south of Bingen. Its population in 1959 was 35,000.

Kreuznach was evidently a Roman town, as the ruins of a Roman fortification, the Heindenmauer, and various antiquities have been found in the vicinity. In the 9th century it was known as Cruciniacum, and had a palace of the Carolingian kings. In 1065 the emperor Henry IV presented it to the bishoporic of Spires; in 1290 it obtained urban privileges and in 1437 it became part of the Palatinate.


The town was ceded to Prussia in 1815. It consists of the old town on the right bank of the river, the new town on the left and the island Badeworth containing the chief spring. The chief industries are marble polishing and the manufacture of optical instruments, chemicals, leather, Celluloid and tobacco.
