After a hard fought season, the B. K. Bear Kats placed third in the Class C Conference with a 2-6 record.

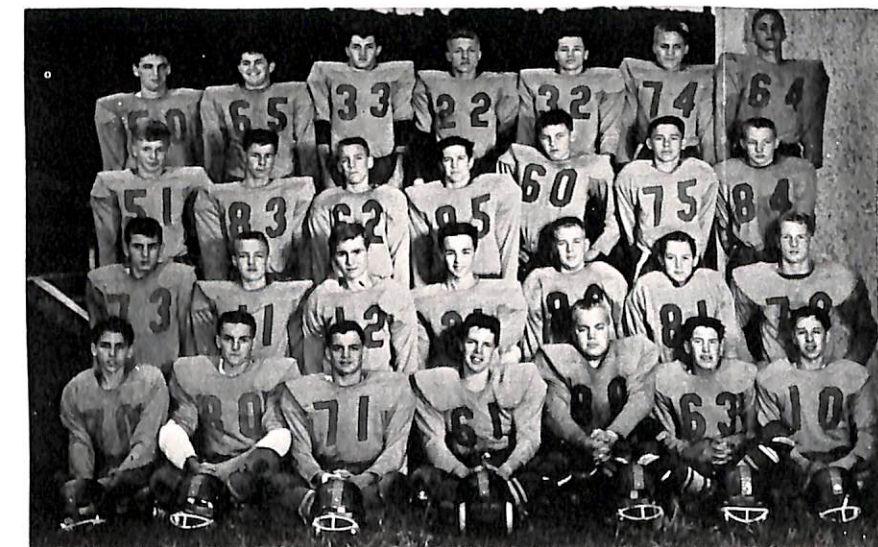

Missing from the scenes next year will be four noted lettermen. They are: Jim Barry, Bob Beetle, Jim Harris, and Howard Johnson.

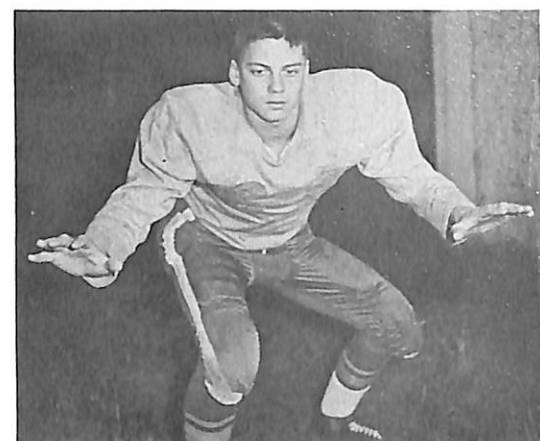
The games are over, the battered bodies mended, but the spirit and sense of fair play which characterized the Bad Kreuznach Bear Kats will live on as an unbroken tradition.



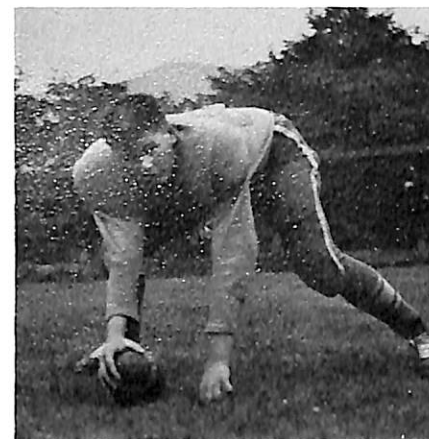

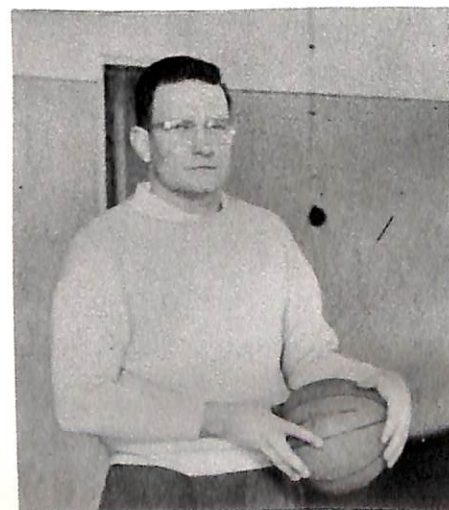
Basketball

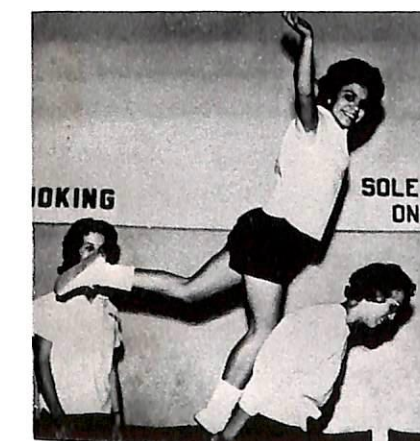

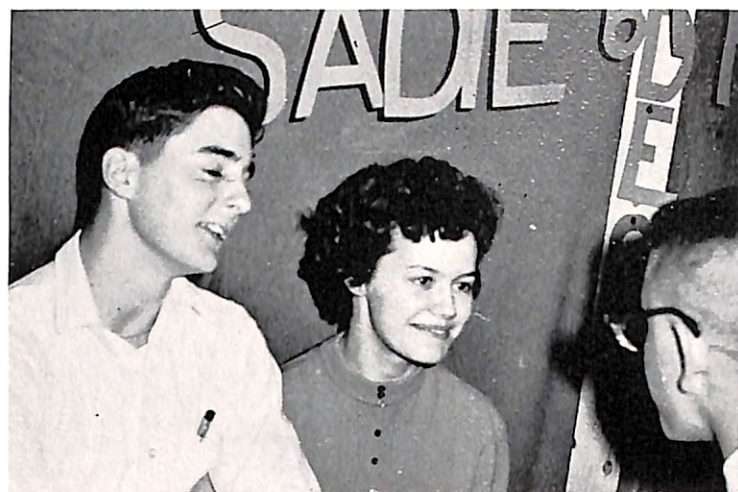
