Jr. High Officers



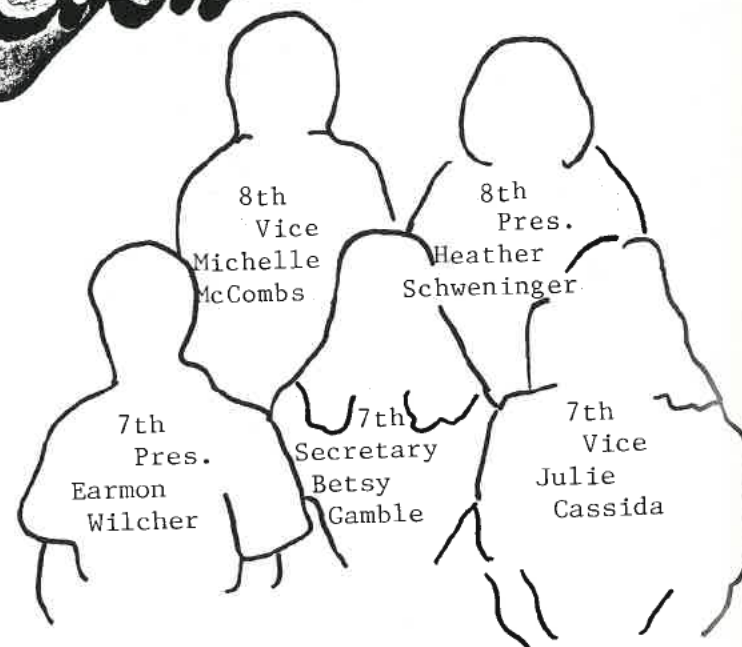

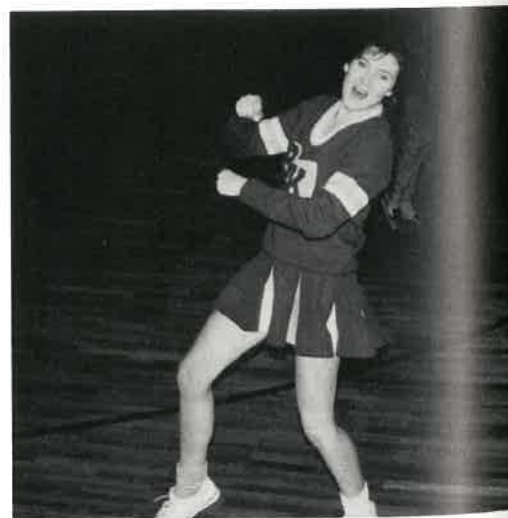
The Winter Cheerleaders are Alive with Energy

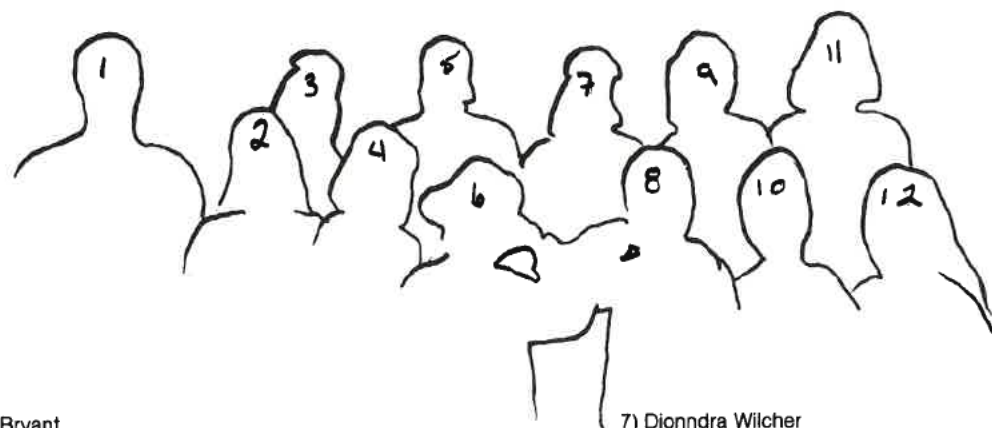

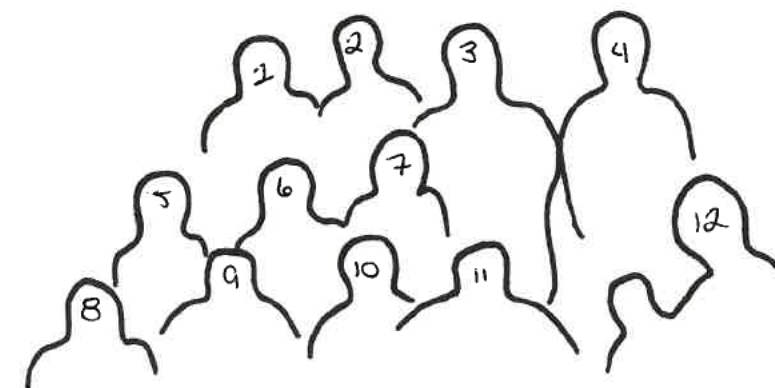
Biggest Team Ever

Thanks to Mr. Palmer, the head coach, the guys proved to be in pretty good shape for the first meet, here at home.

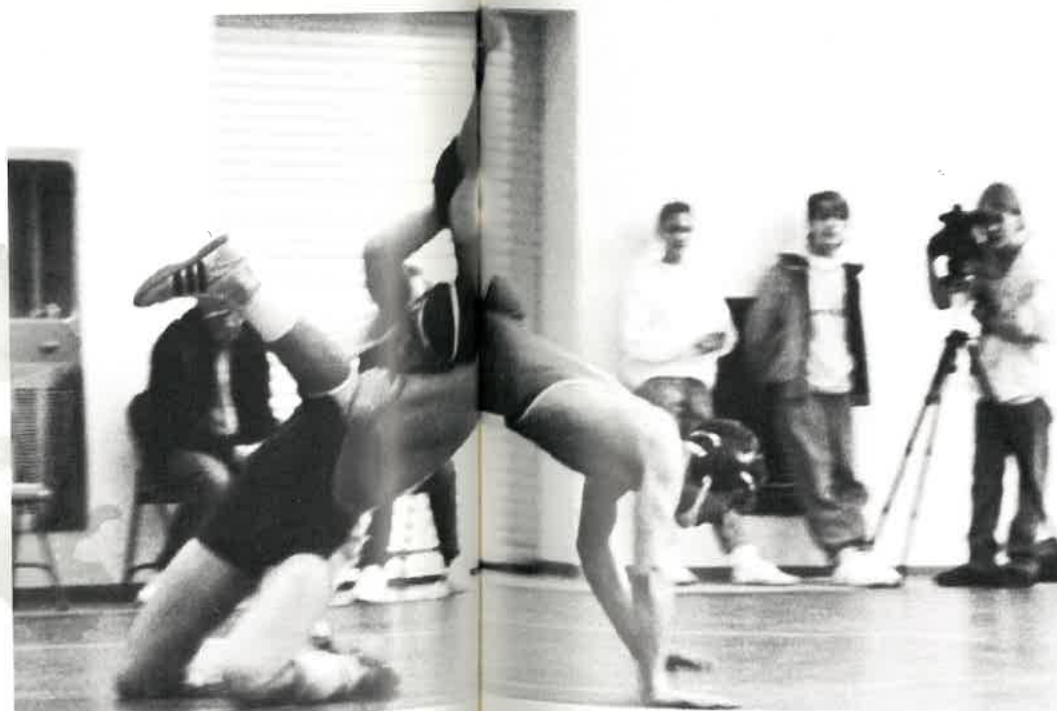

Health Fair

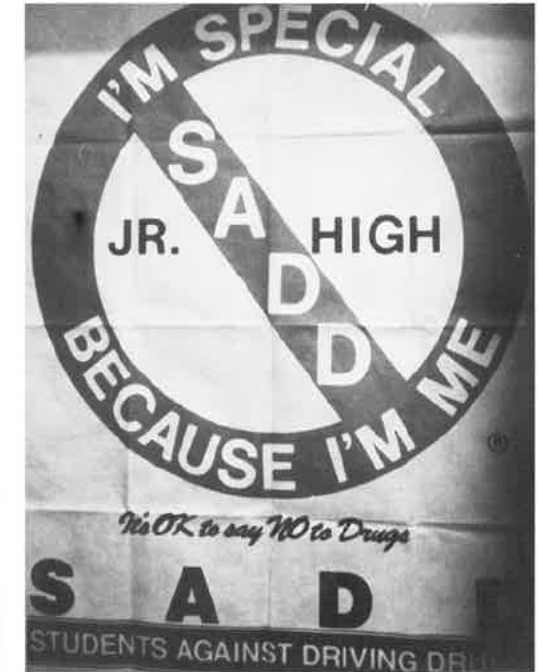
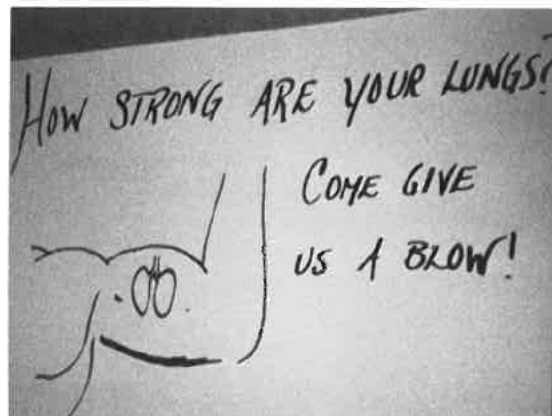
