DIVISION III NORTH CHAMPIONS

After what appeared to be an omen for a disastrous BearKat season, Bad Kreuznach rose from the grave to storm back into the Division III hunt behind the speed of All-Conference and All-Europe senior running back Charles Dukes (#44), the crushing power of All-Conference linebacker

Junior Moore (#34), and the steady play of junior quarterback Drew Garrett (#24) and sophomore Junior Ayala. The opening game of the season seemed to spell doom as Dukes went down with what looked like a season ending knee injury. However he didn't leave before picking up 150 yards on ten carries. The BearKats fell to Brussels 20-24 that day, but the prediction was made- if Dukes came back healthy for the conference games, BK would take the crown. The BearKats dropped the next two games 0-21 to Baumholder and a heartbreaker to Hohenfels 6-13. But Dukes was back the fourth week and began his All-Europe run. The BearKats defeated Giessen 13-3, Baumholder 21-8. They stumbled to a 18-21 loss after a transportation mix-up got them started fate against Glessen, and they fell after Dukes went down injured fate in the game. So with BK at 1-1 in the conference, Giessen and Baumholder mathematically out of it; one game would decide the championship - BK versus undefeated Brussels. The contest was over early as Dukes, Moore and Garrett ran all over the Brigands and grounded them for the season 40-8. Next came the regional championship against Rota. Dukes ran yard for yard with the Admirals Ail-Conference running back and the Kats prevailed 52-28. One week later and 10 hours by bus, the BearKats were in the championships against Vicenza. Although they stopped the BK Express, Dukes still stole the show with a 80 kick-off return in the second half of a 18-29 toss.









Mike Newsome's returned to coach his 1999 European Champions having lost an All-Europe player as well as graduating one starter, a sixth man off the bench, and a sophomore with a los of playing time. He came back to a core of three starters, senior Junior Moore, junior Kawarski Harris, and sophomore Keith Walker. He added a transfer senior Terrell Garth, sophomore newcomers 'Chello Fields and Junior Ayala, and he had the toxic ingredients of another European Championship. Probably, according to many who saw them play, the best overall team in Europe during the Millennium year. The team was never truly tested throughout the year. They mercy ruled many of their opponents in their preparation for the European tournament. The ran up and down the court like stallions owning the wild. They played tough "in your face defense". They were everywhere, doing everything before teams could even realize they'd not only been scored on, but they'd been robbed of the ball on the throw in and were down by four instead of two. BRIDGEHOUSE SHOOTERS


