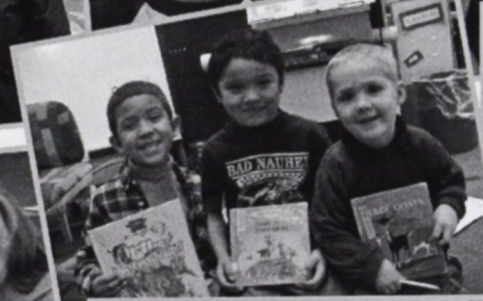
# Yearbook Maniacs!

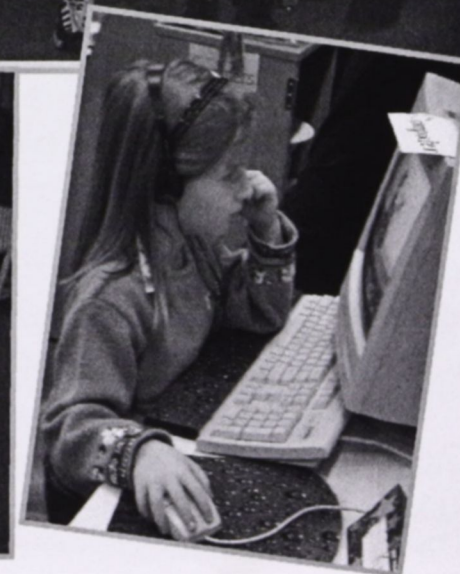
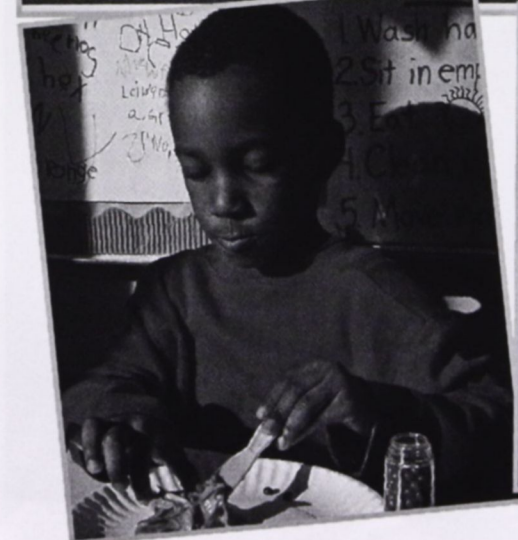
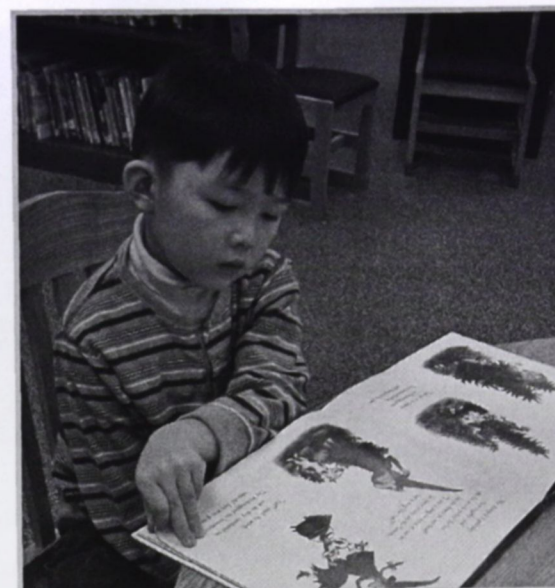
Oh wow! These kindergarteners are very cute! They are also very playful, little, and interested in learning.

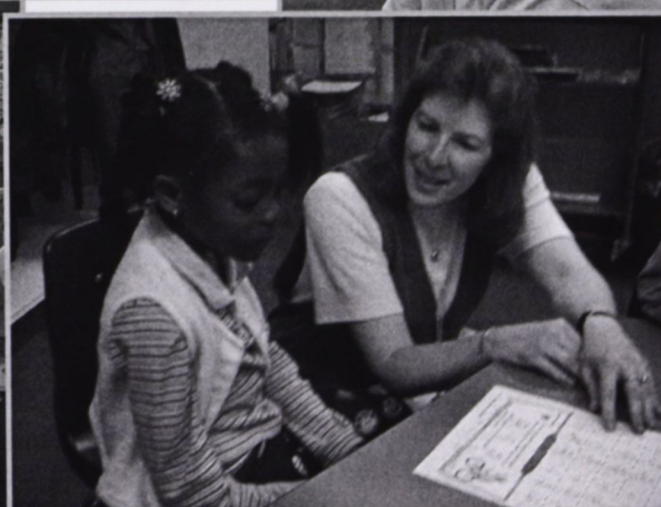
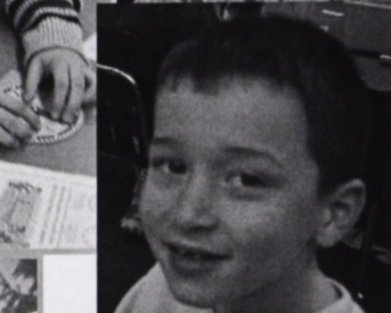
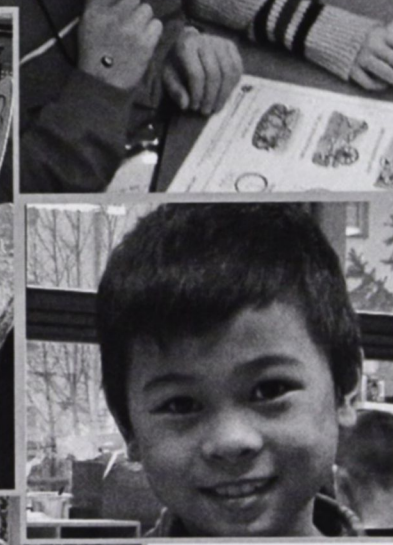
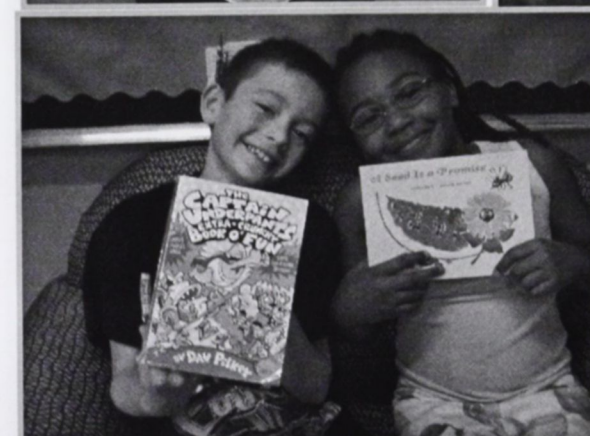
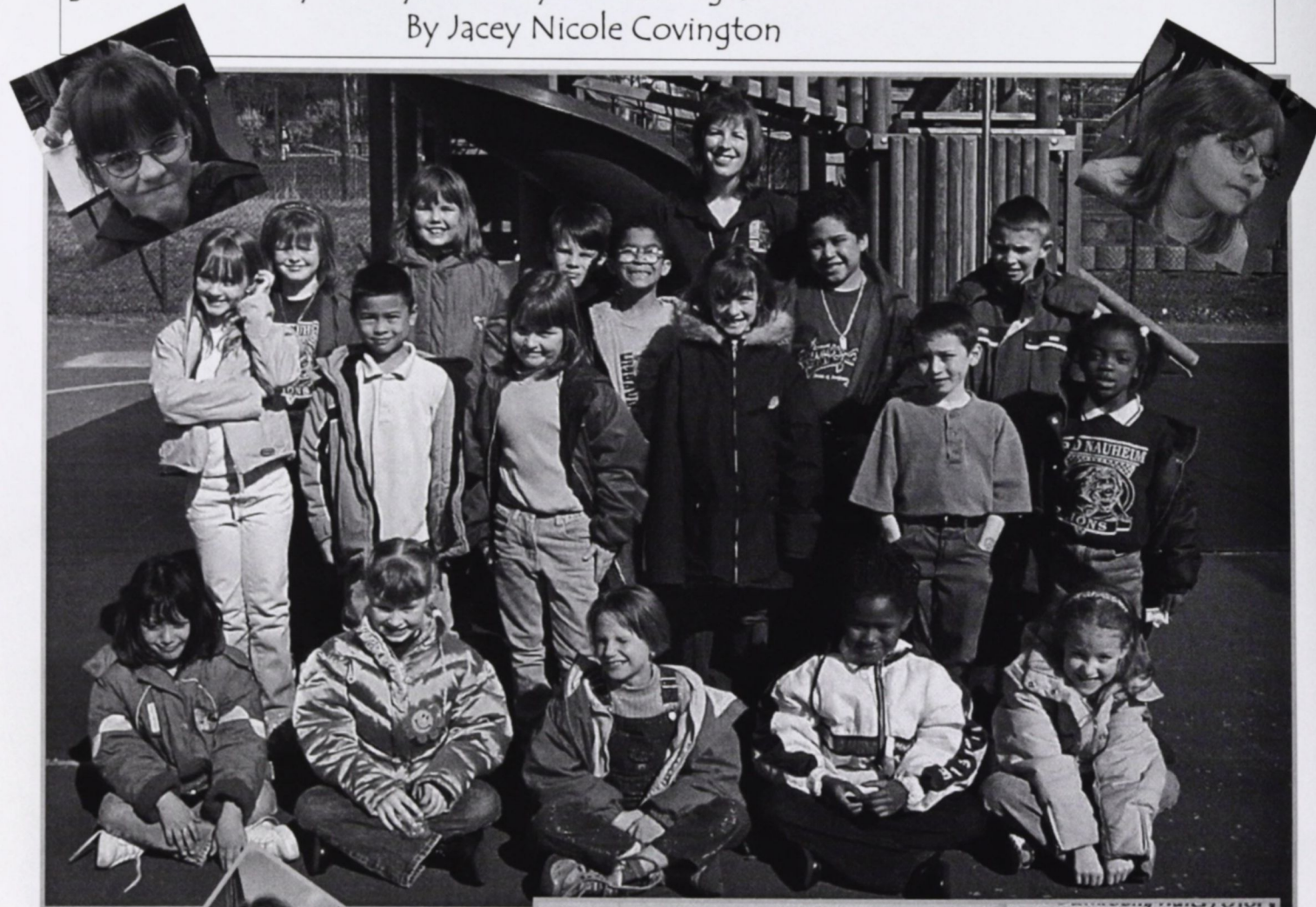




# SILLY SECONDS

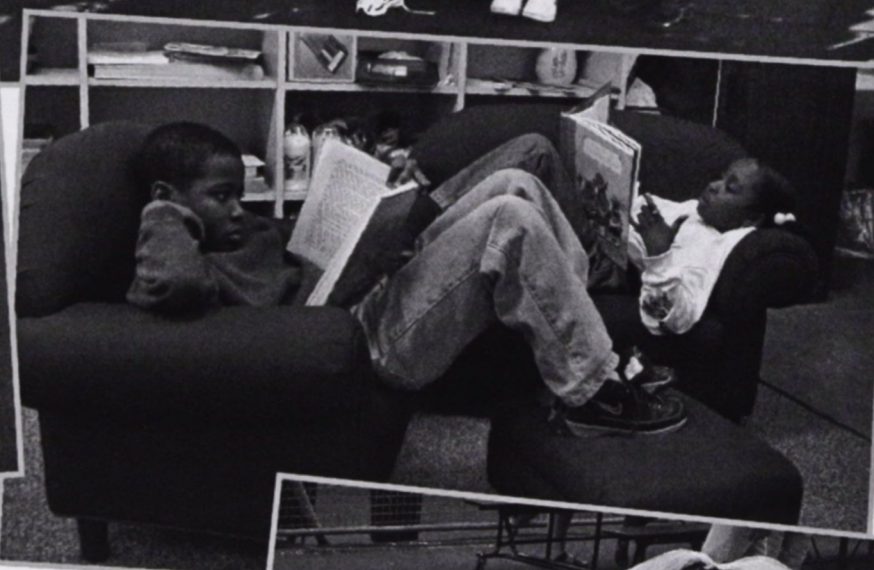
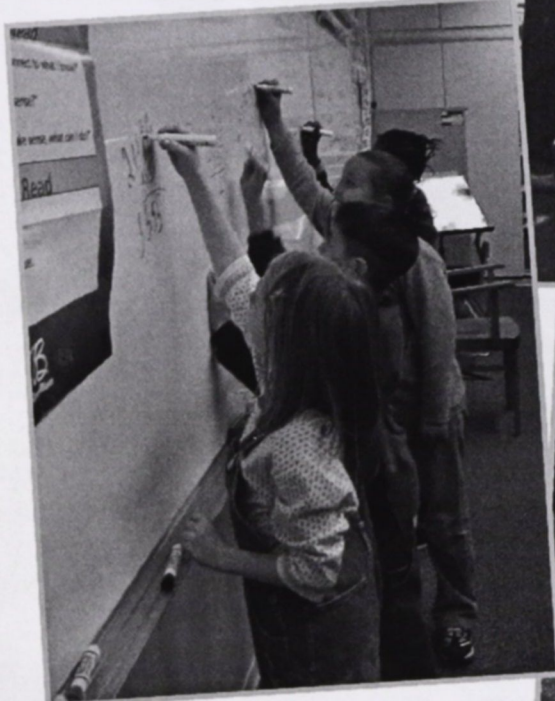

# THE FABULOUS FOURTH GRADERS!

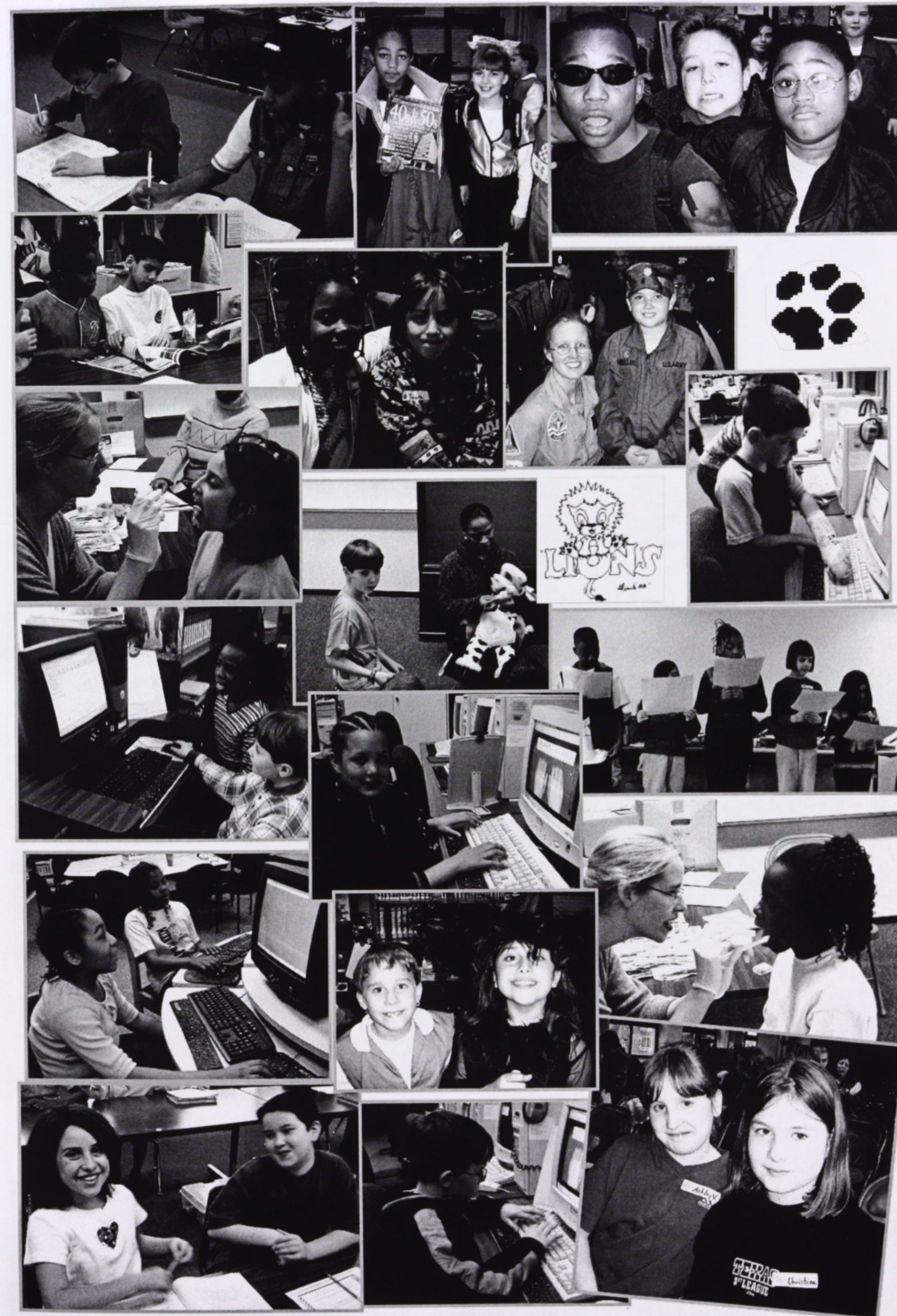


Man! These 4th graders are smart, big, and interested in learning. Their goal: to get ready for 5th grade.

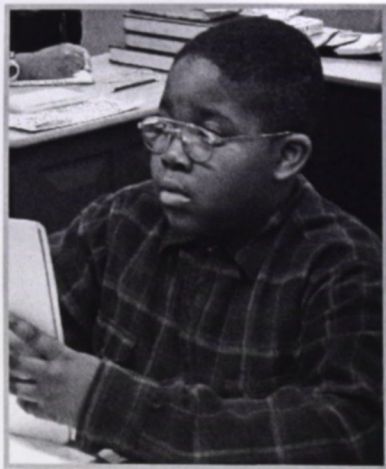

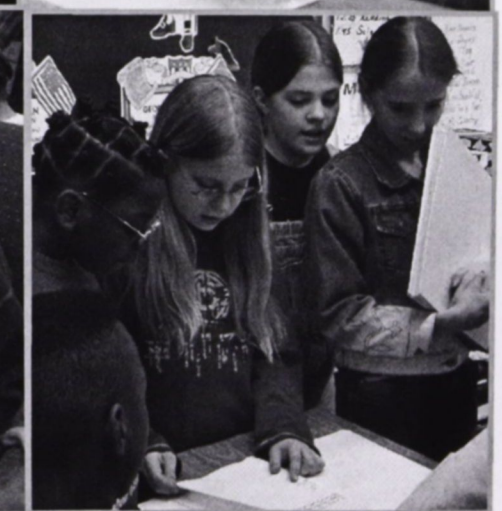
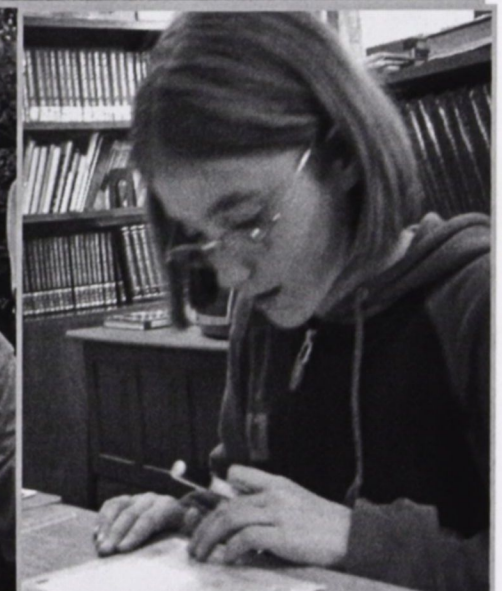
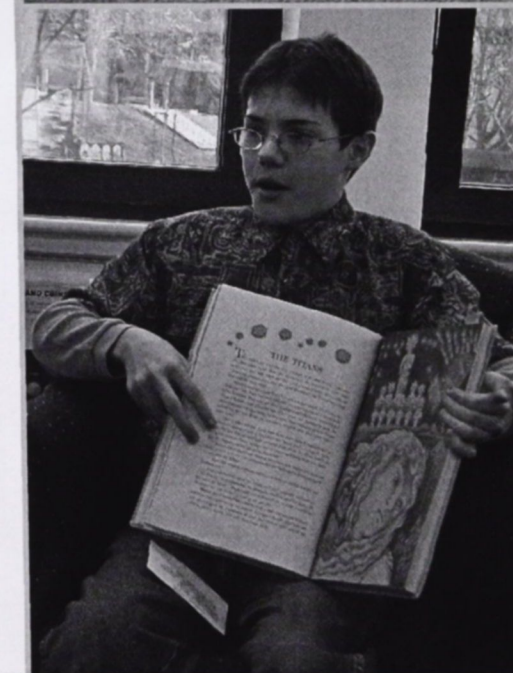
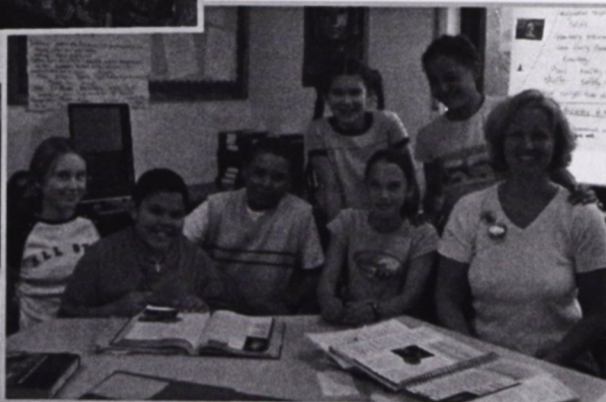
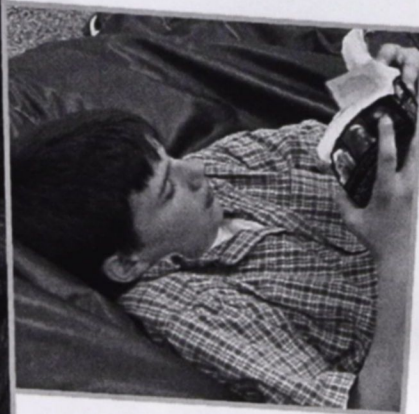
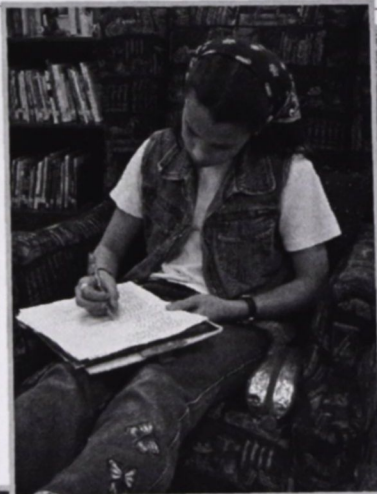


# The Oldest Cubs of Them All

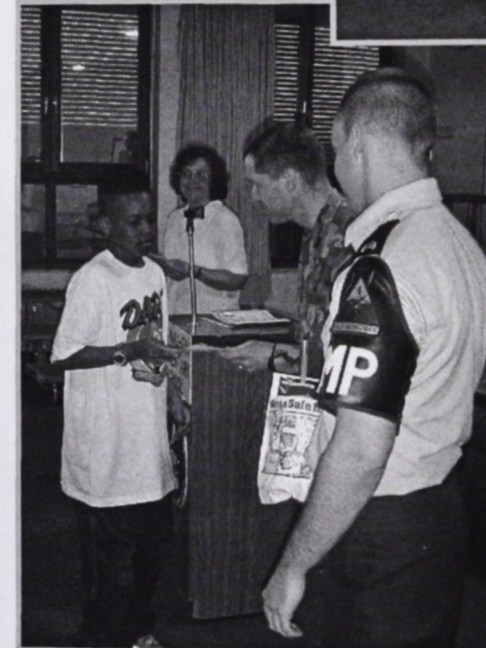
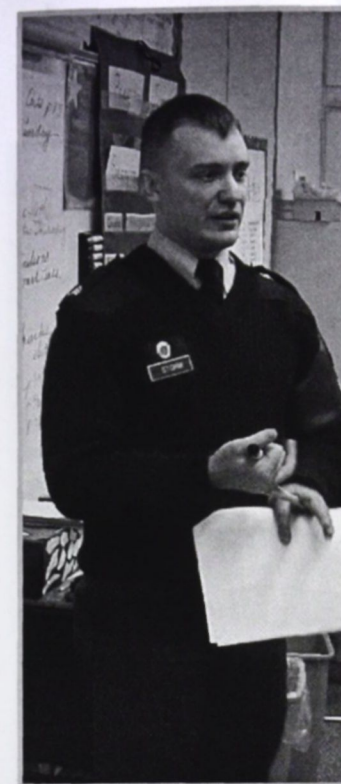




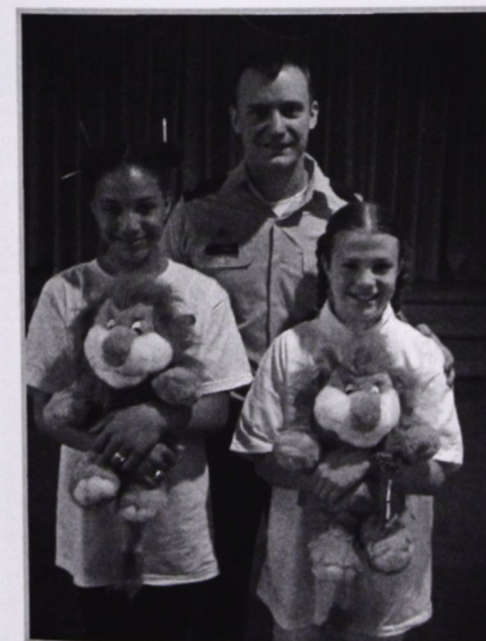
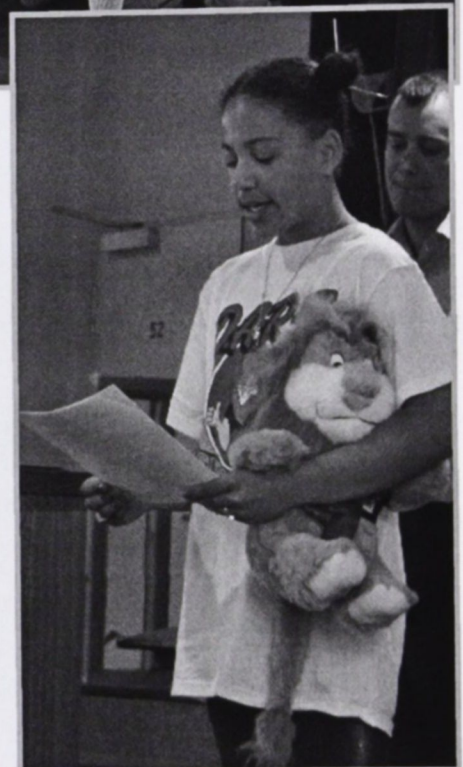
## Exceptional Classes for Exceptional Students

## Drug Abuse Resistance Education

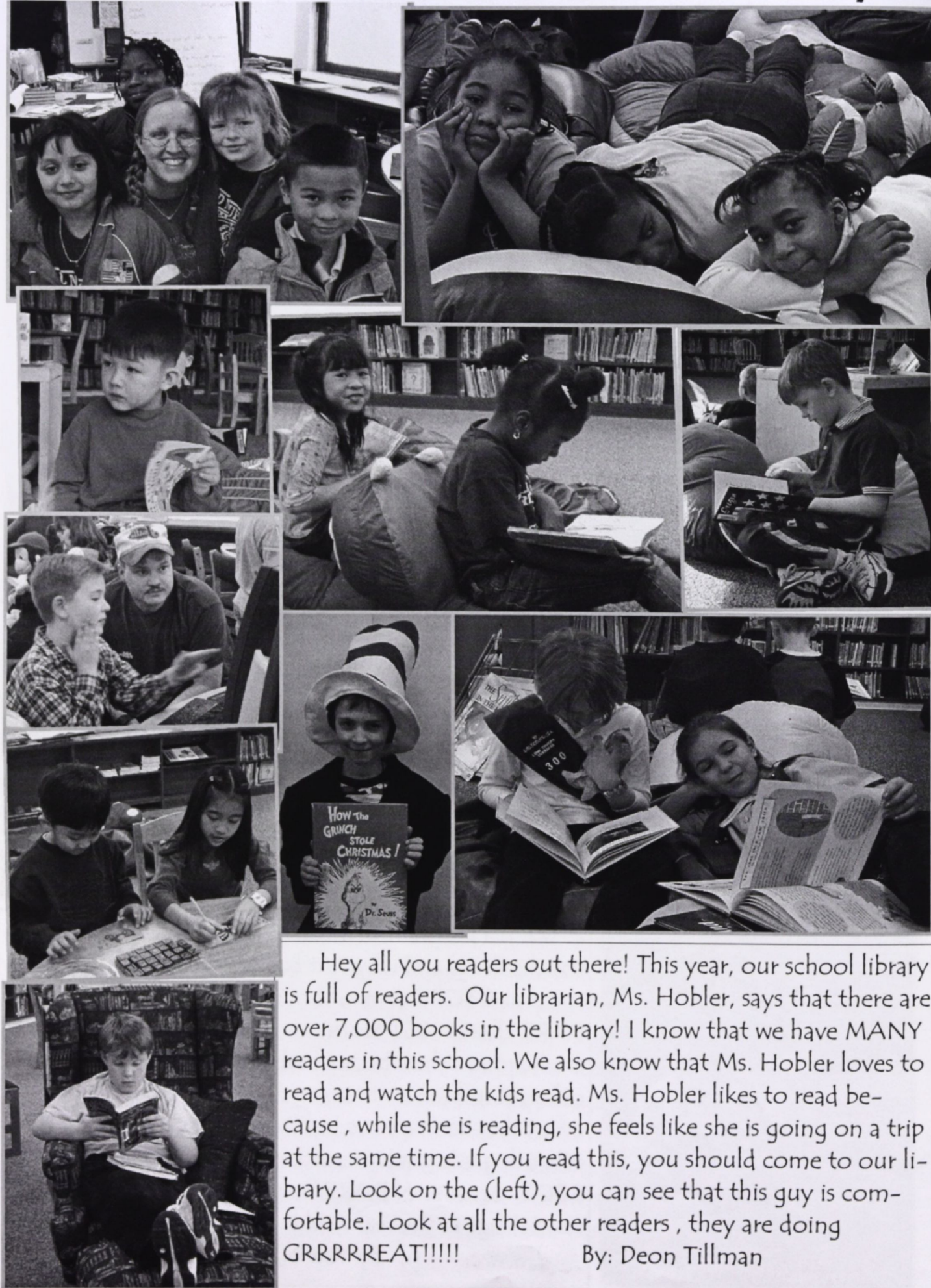

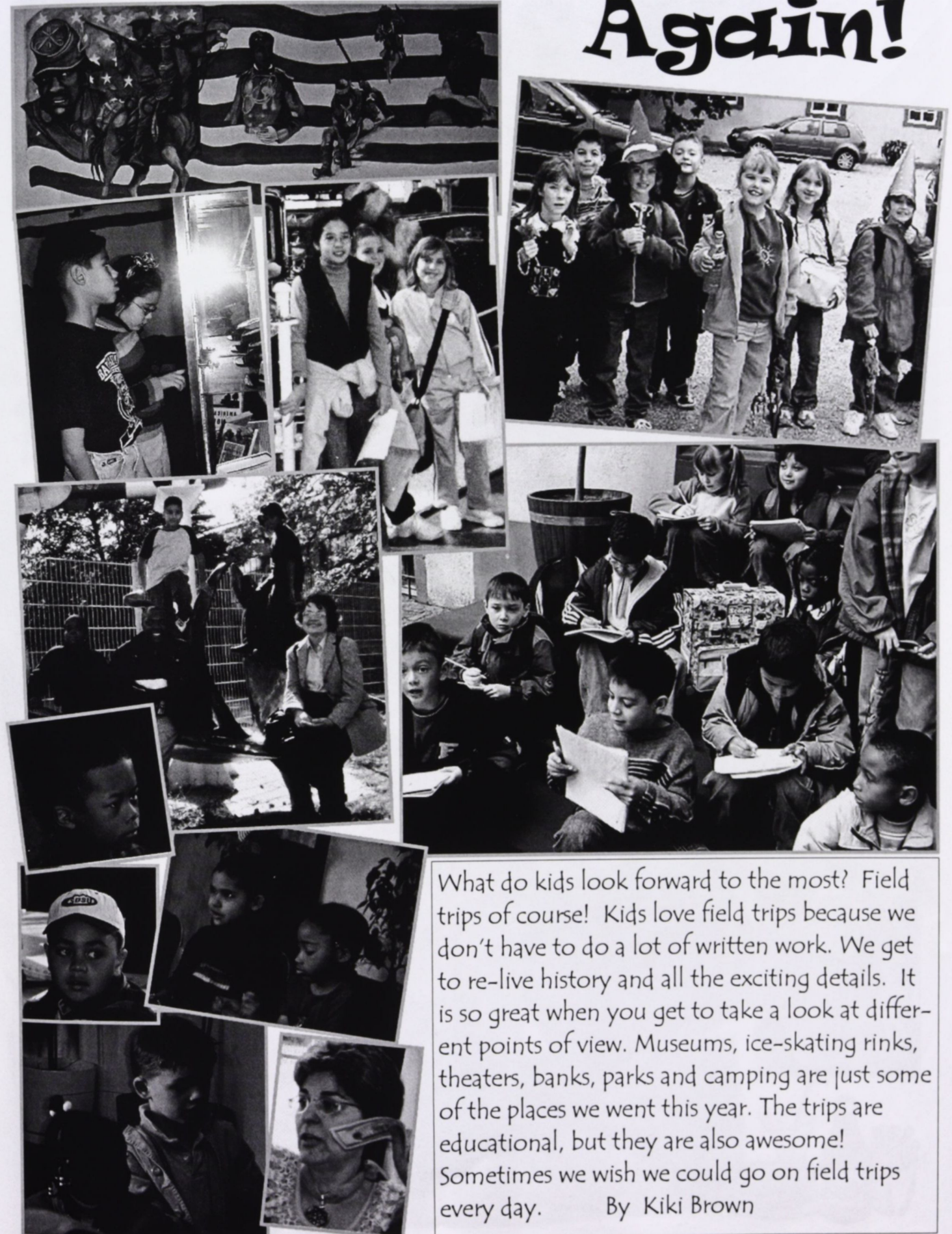
# The Lions Of The Library!

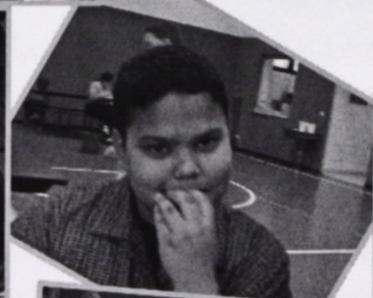

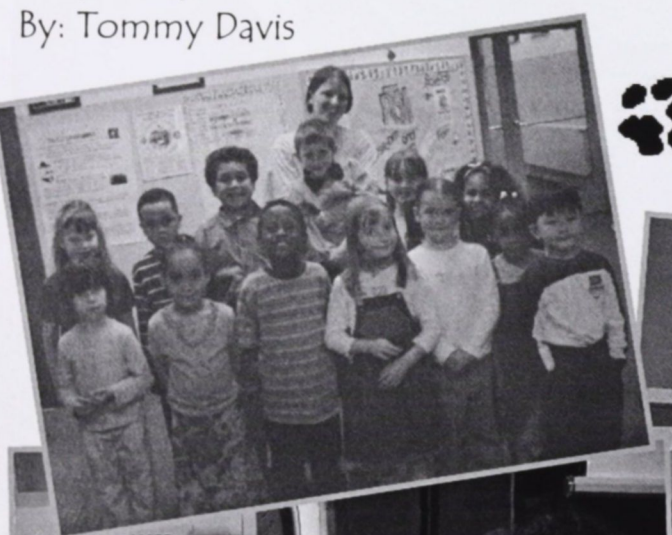
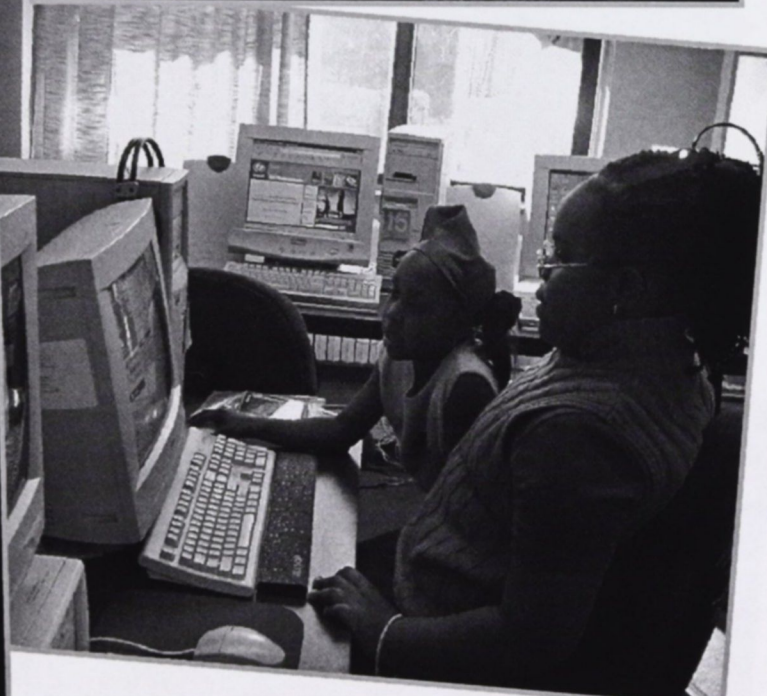


# Lions on the Web

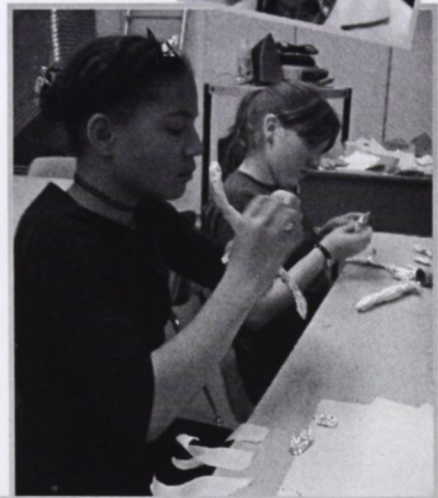




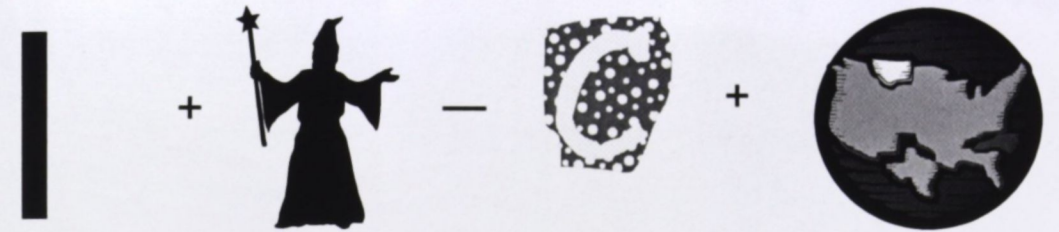
# \*Young Van Goghs\*

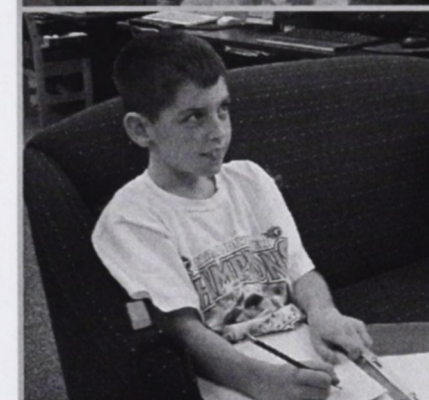
# In the Spotlight

# Vote For Me!



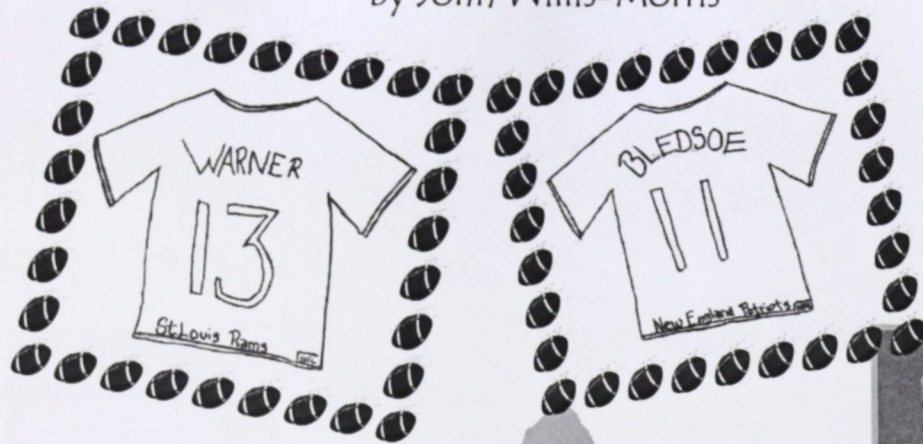

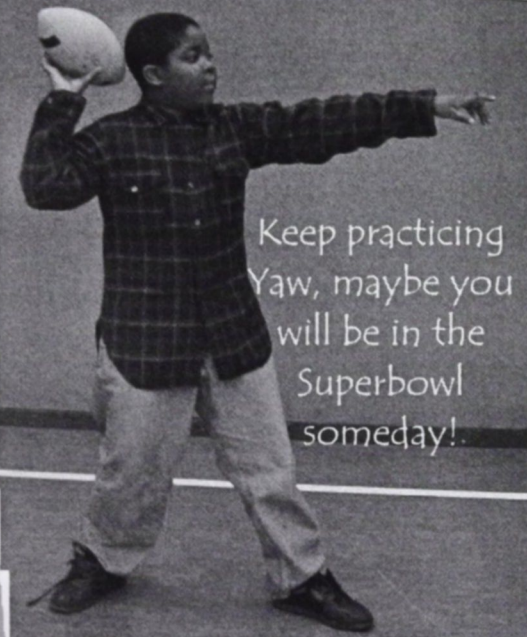

Winter Olympics: The Olympic were held in Salt Lake City, Utah. The American teams won 34 medals this year! Go USA!

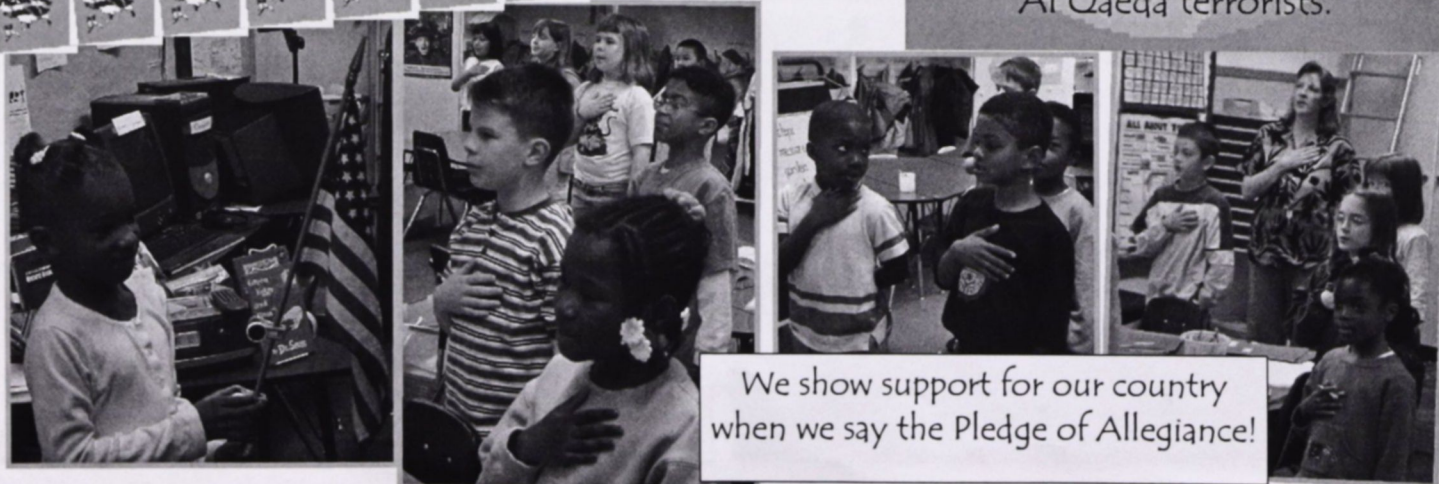
Superbowl: The Superbowl this year was the St. Louis Rams against the New England Patriots. With two seconds left in the game, the Patriots won. What a game!!

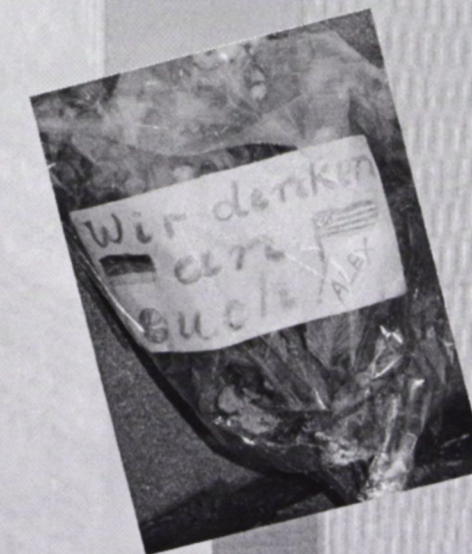
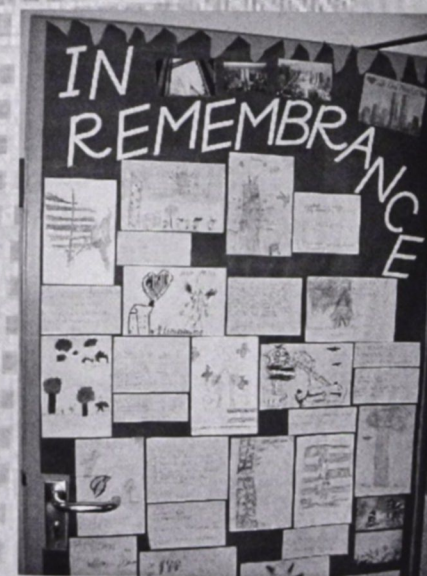

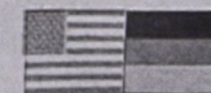
# SEPTEMBER 11TH
