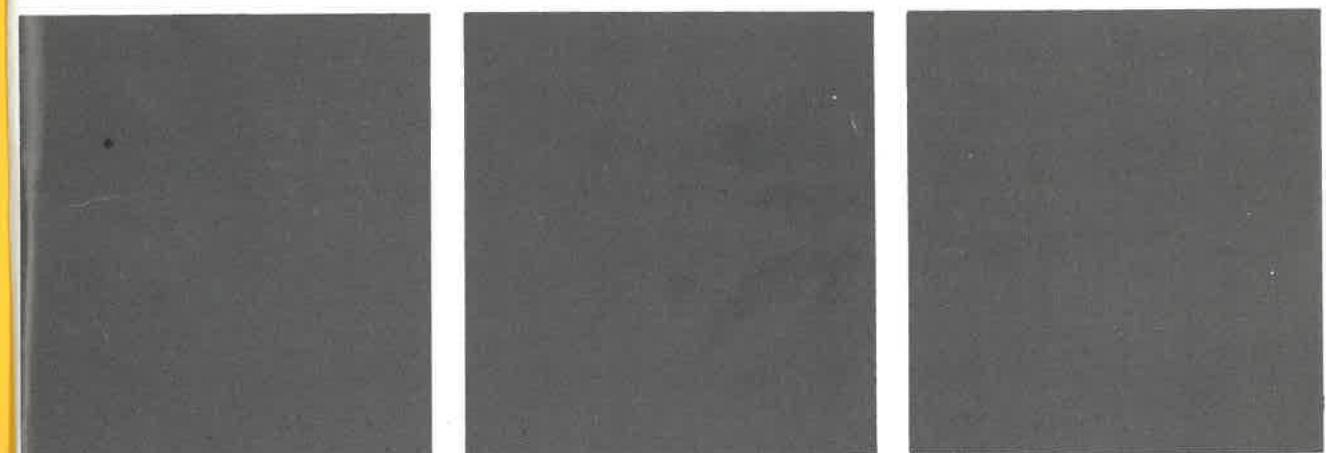

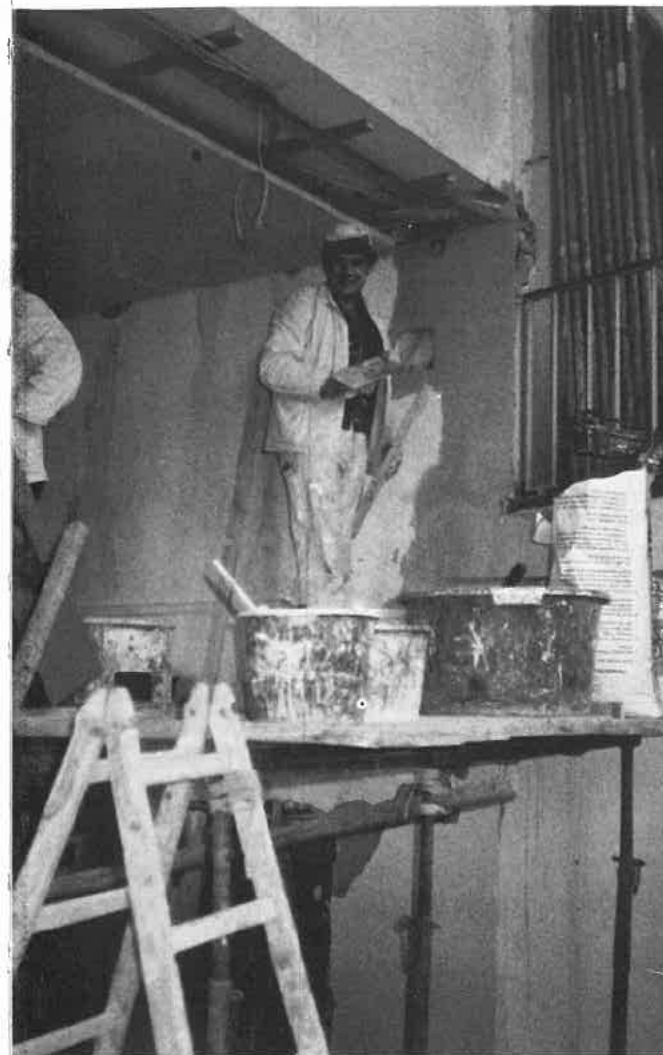

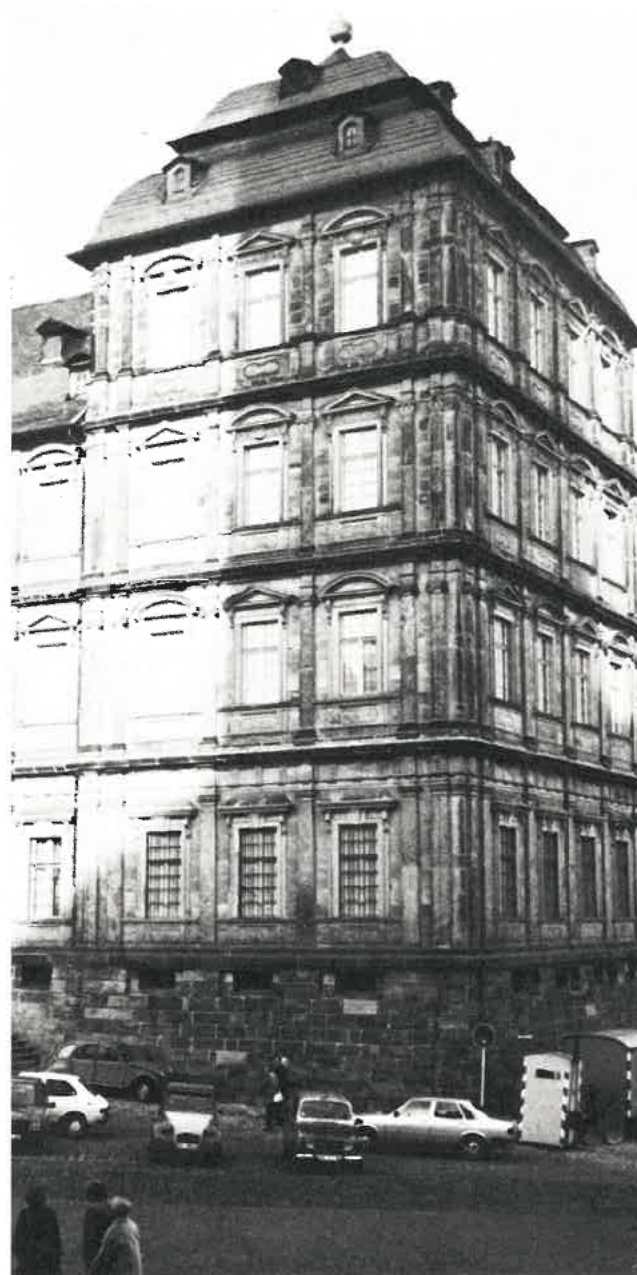


## Construction And Reconstruction

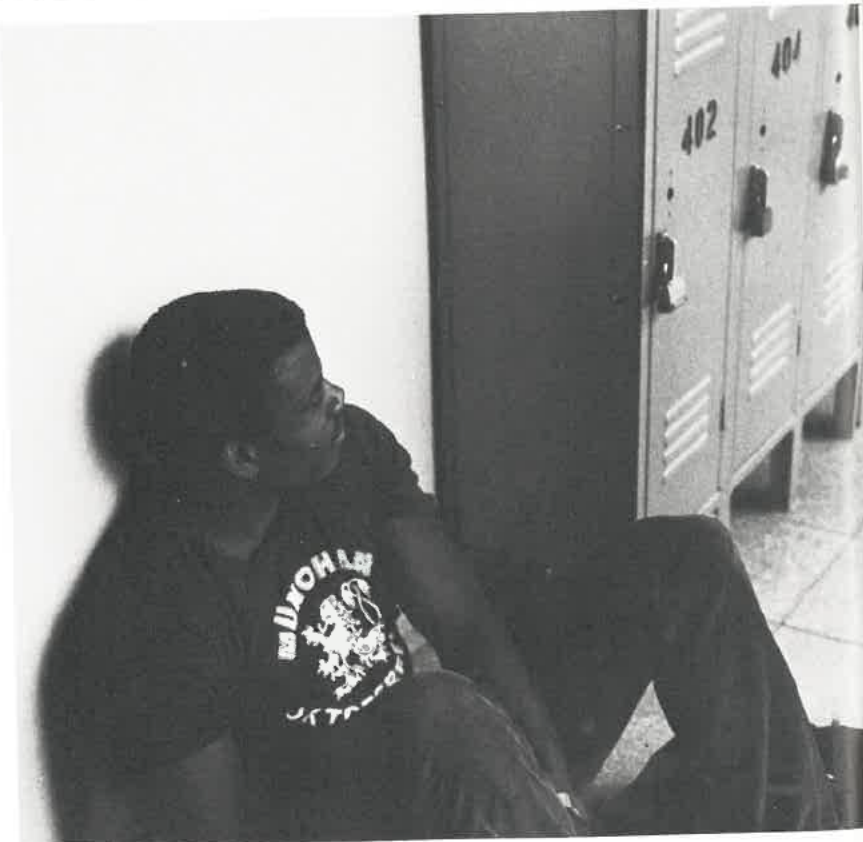

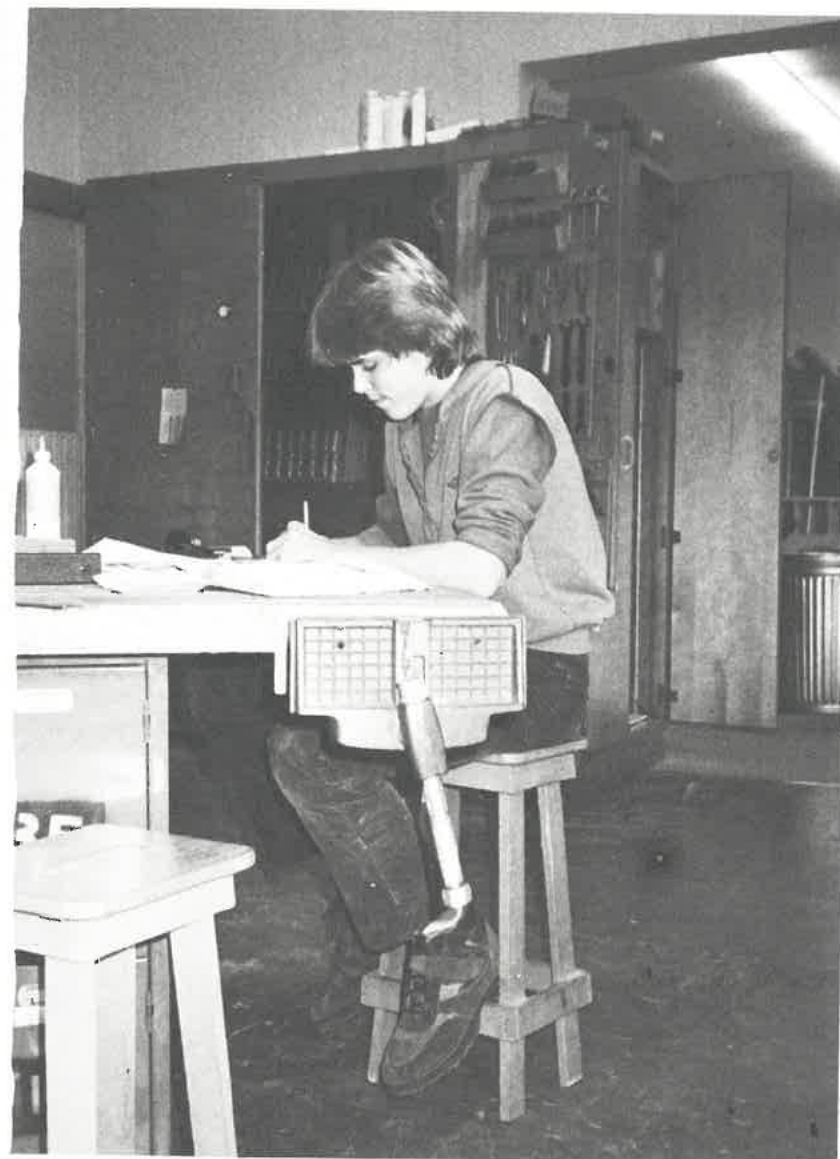






## The Baron's Bamberg

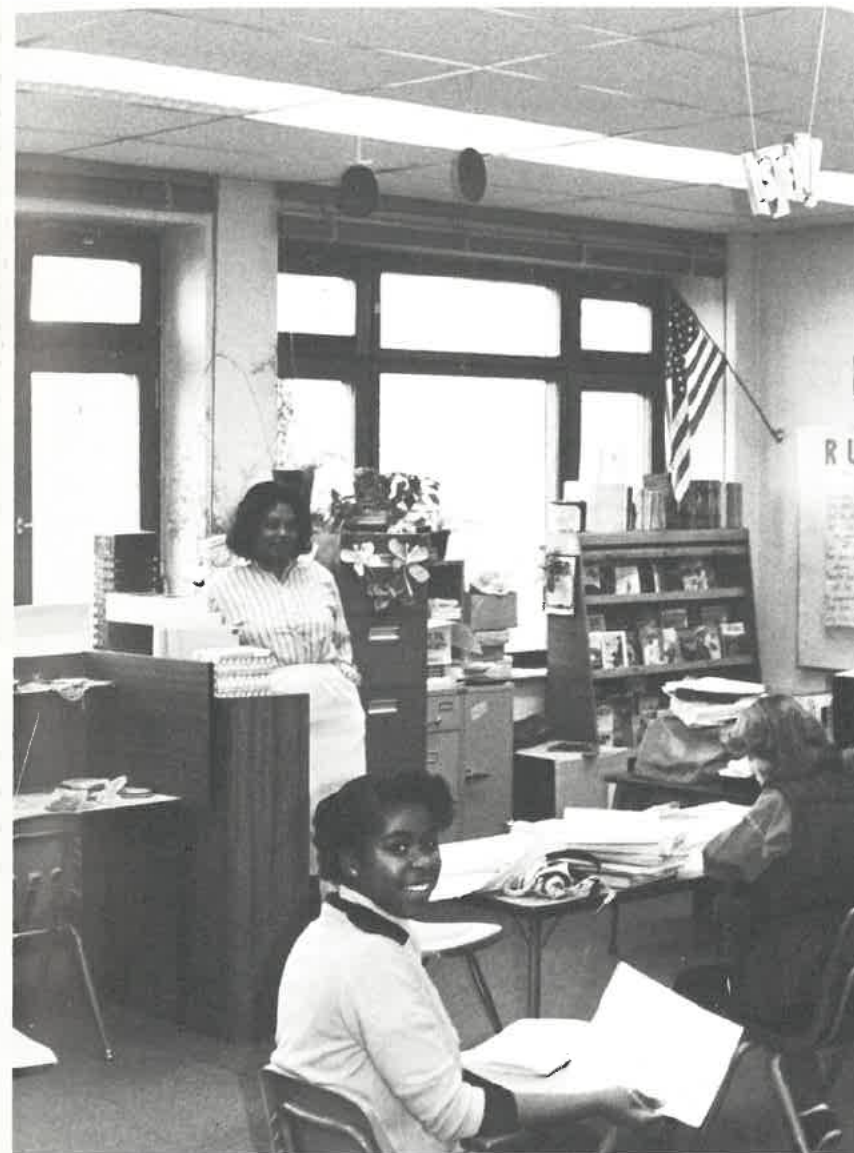

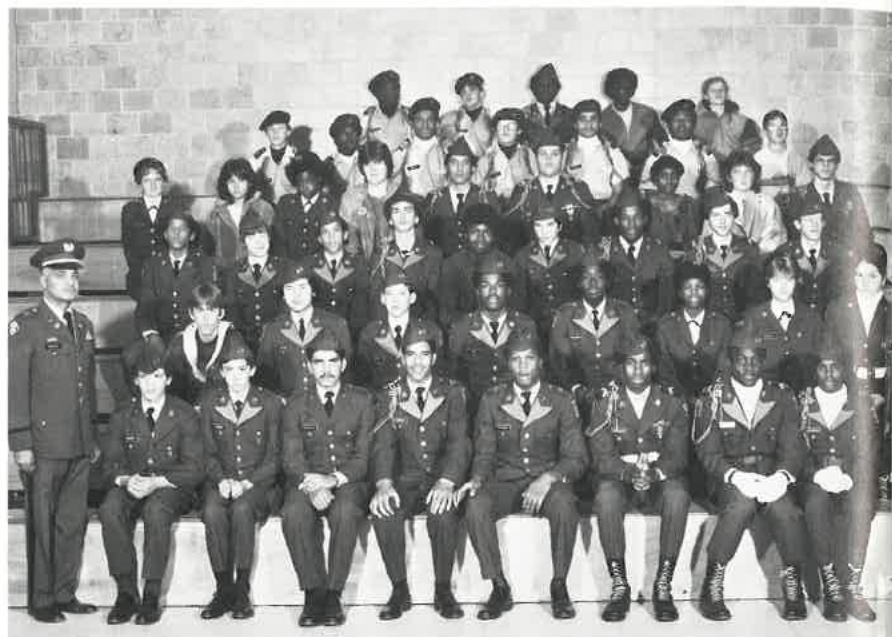

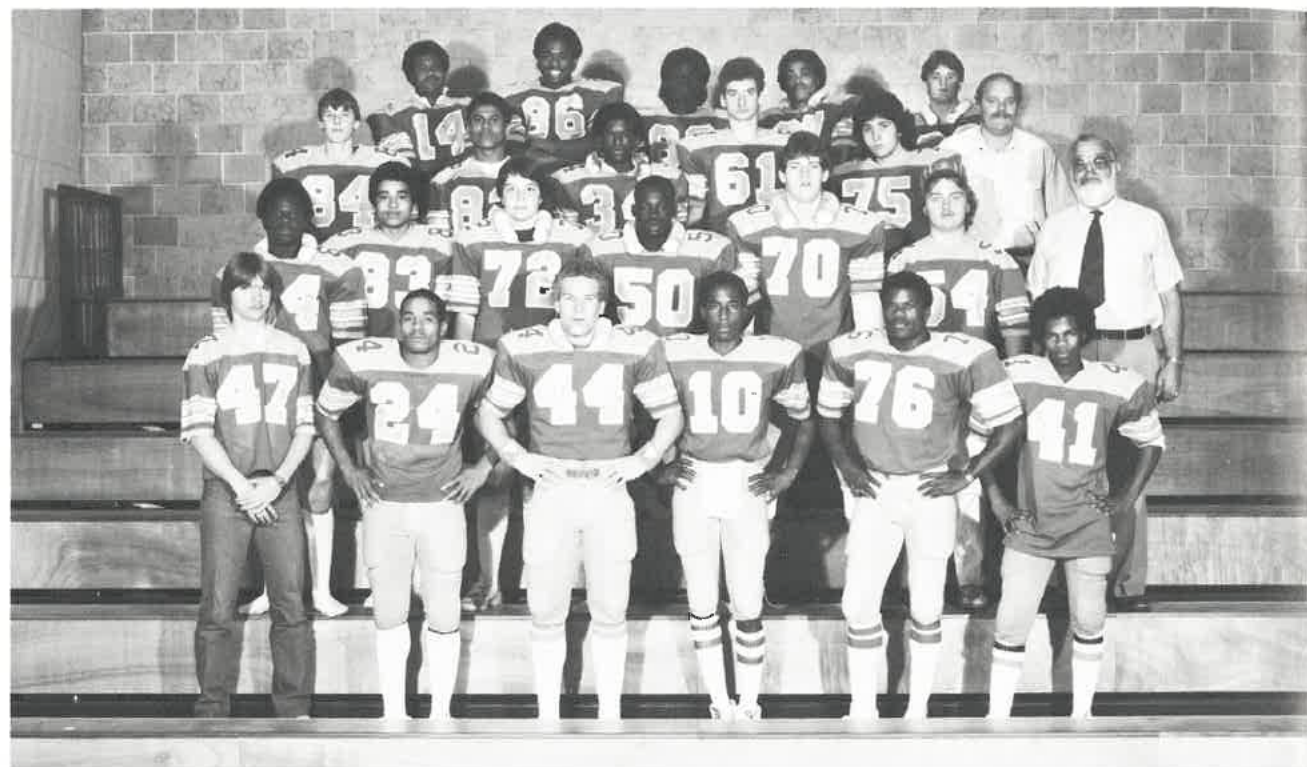
