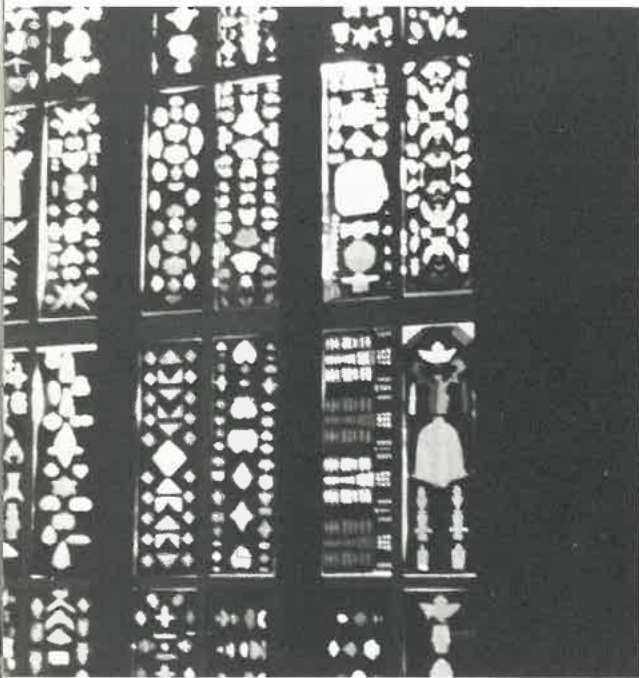
## Bowlers In Berlin—Bravo!

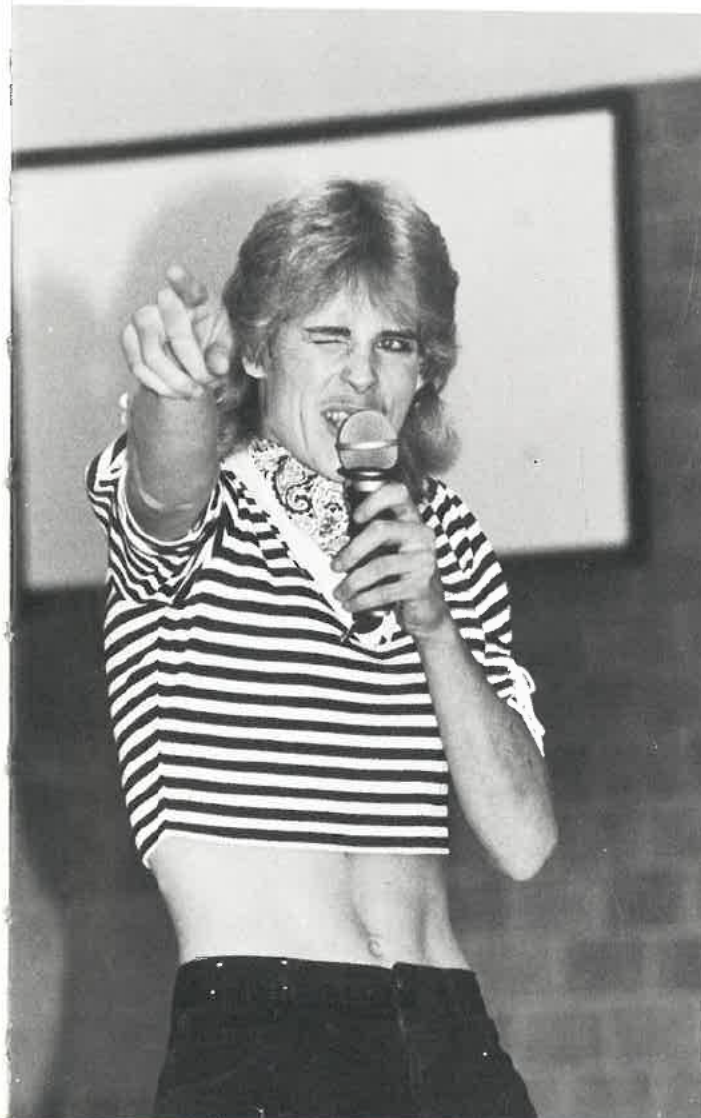

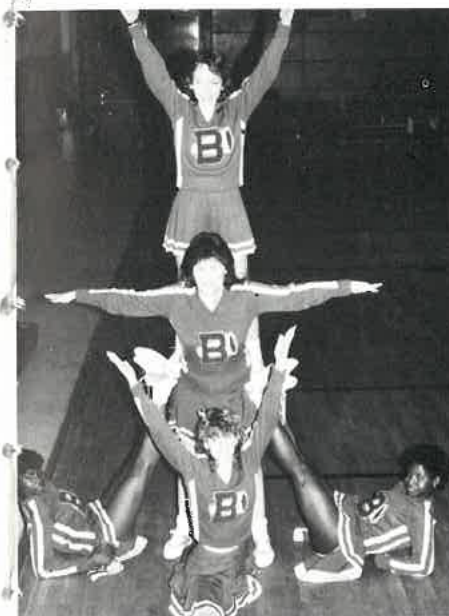


## Model United Nations

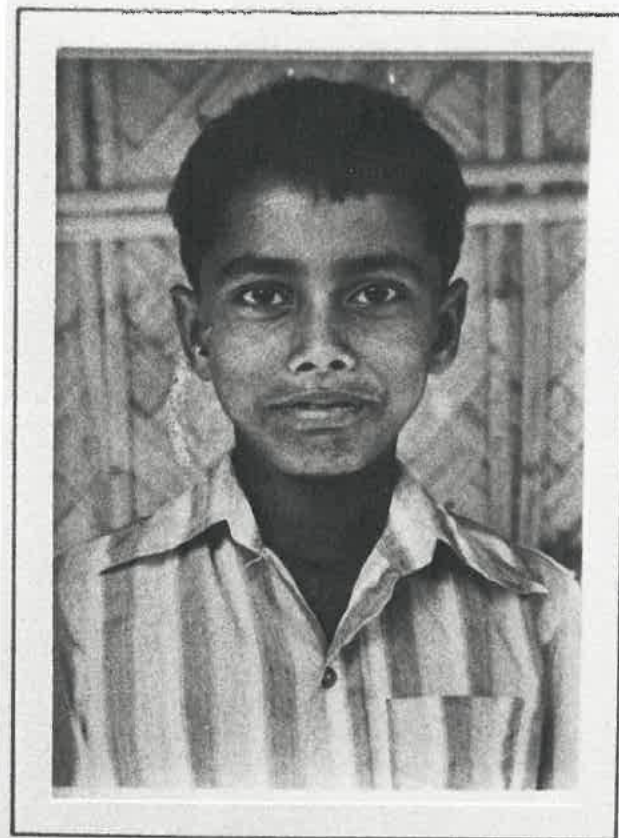

As a reward for this hard work, the RCY went on a ski weekend to Austria.

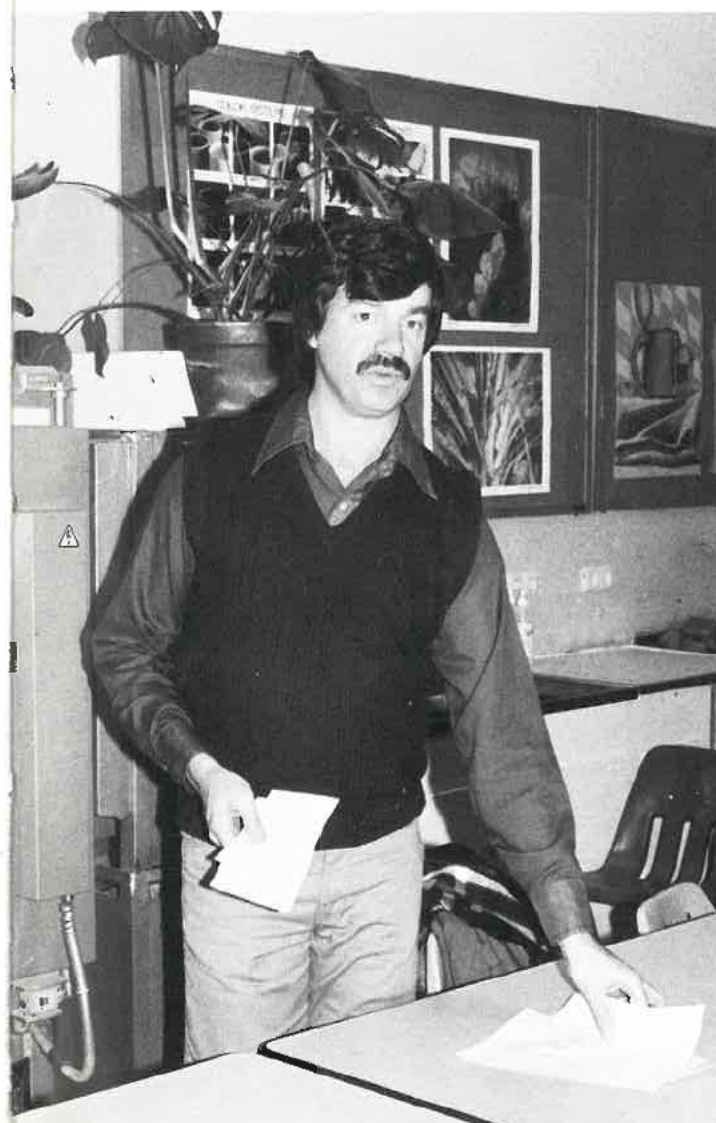

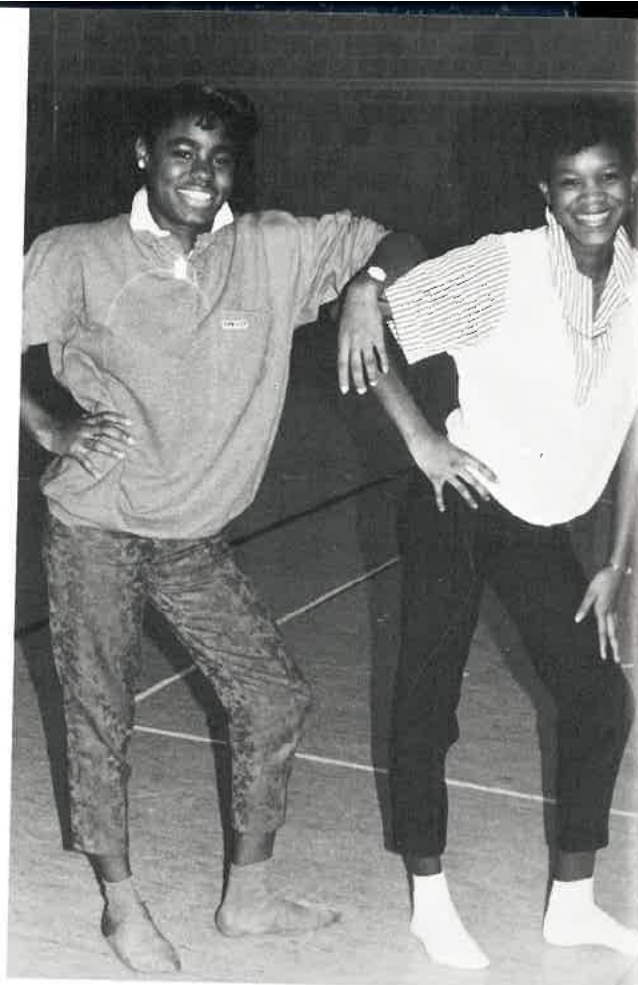

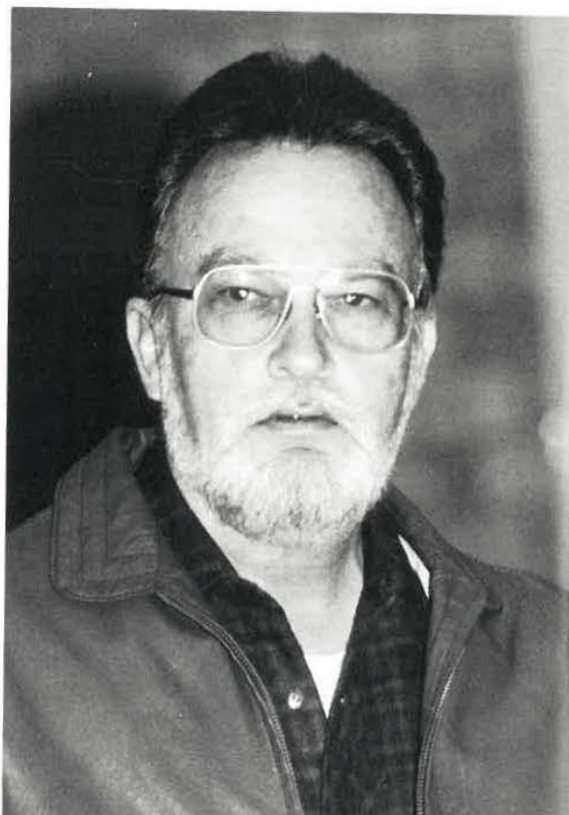


## The National Honor Society

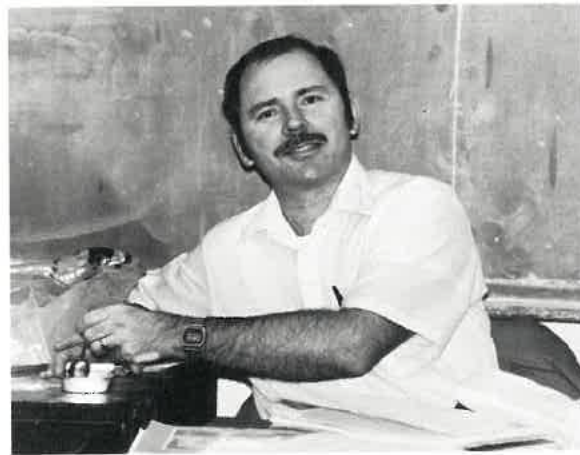




## Math And Computers/The Arts

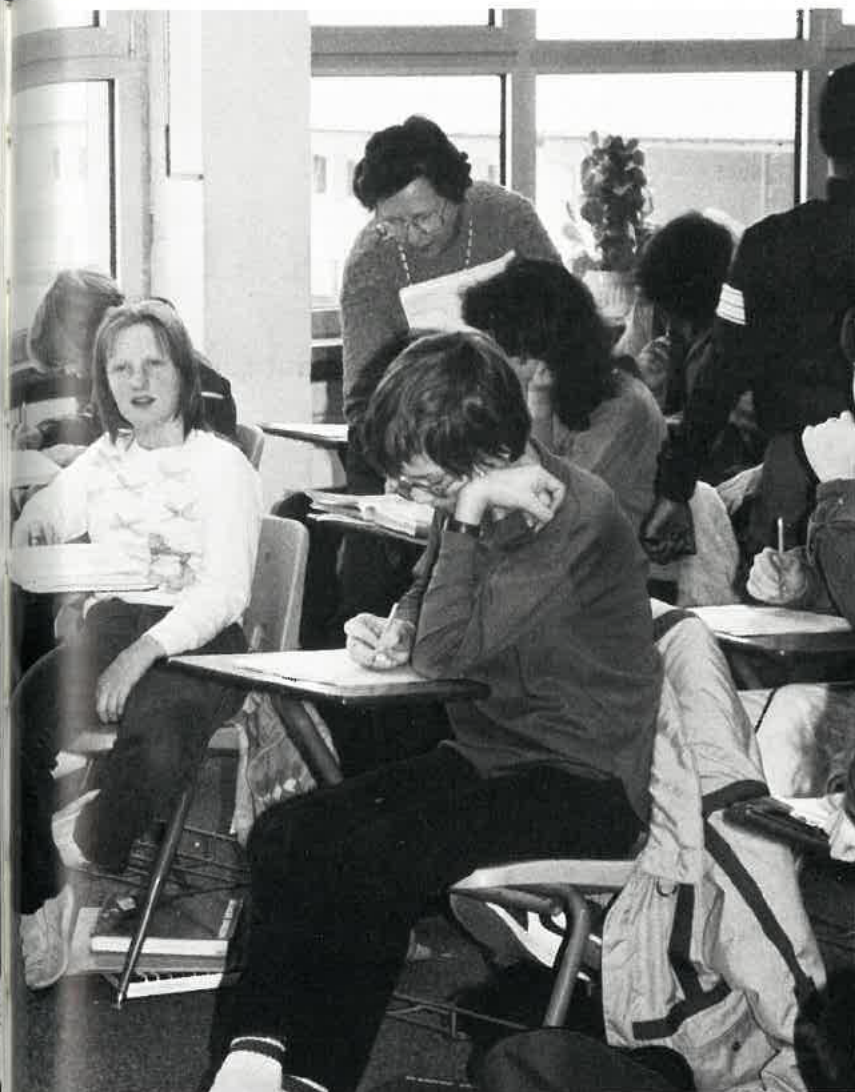

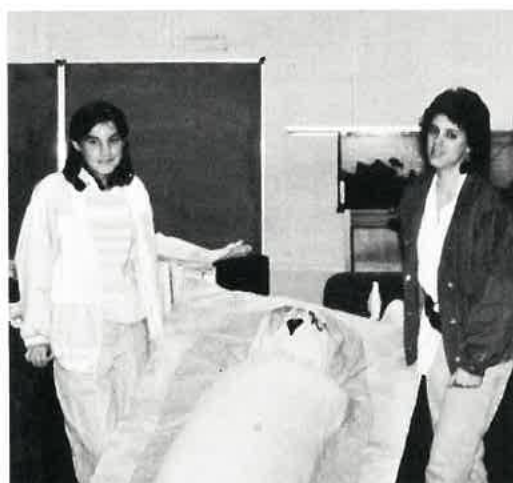

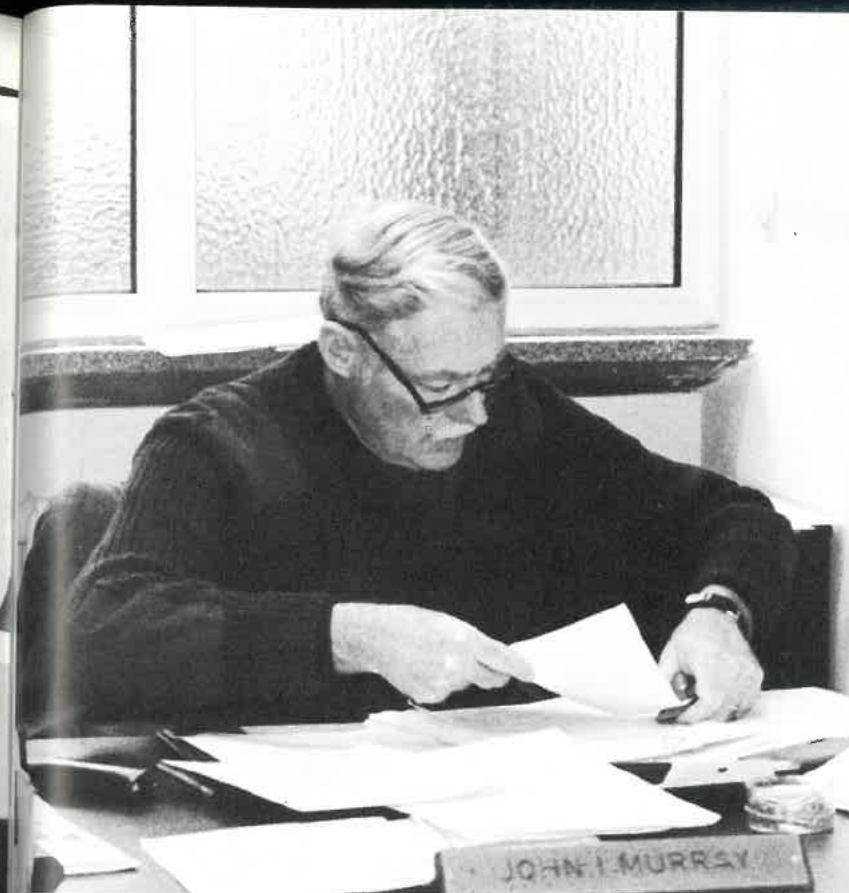
## Specializing Is The Name Of The Game

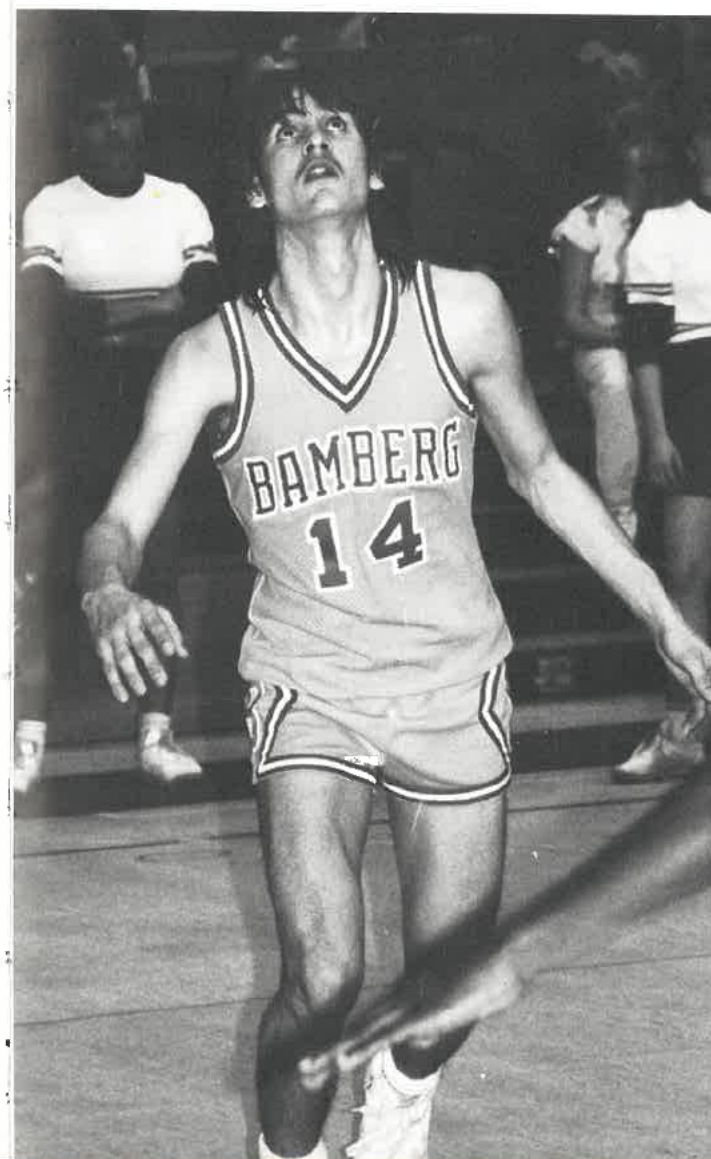




## Baron Boys Are Rough And Tough

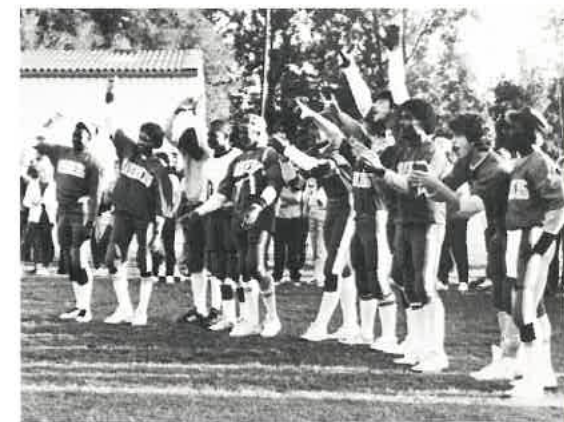
The Bamberg American High School Boosters' Club is comprised of many parents, community personnel and faculty.
