Each Apache dummy was judged and the moment of truth arrived — out on the floor the seniors ap-

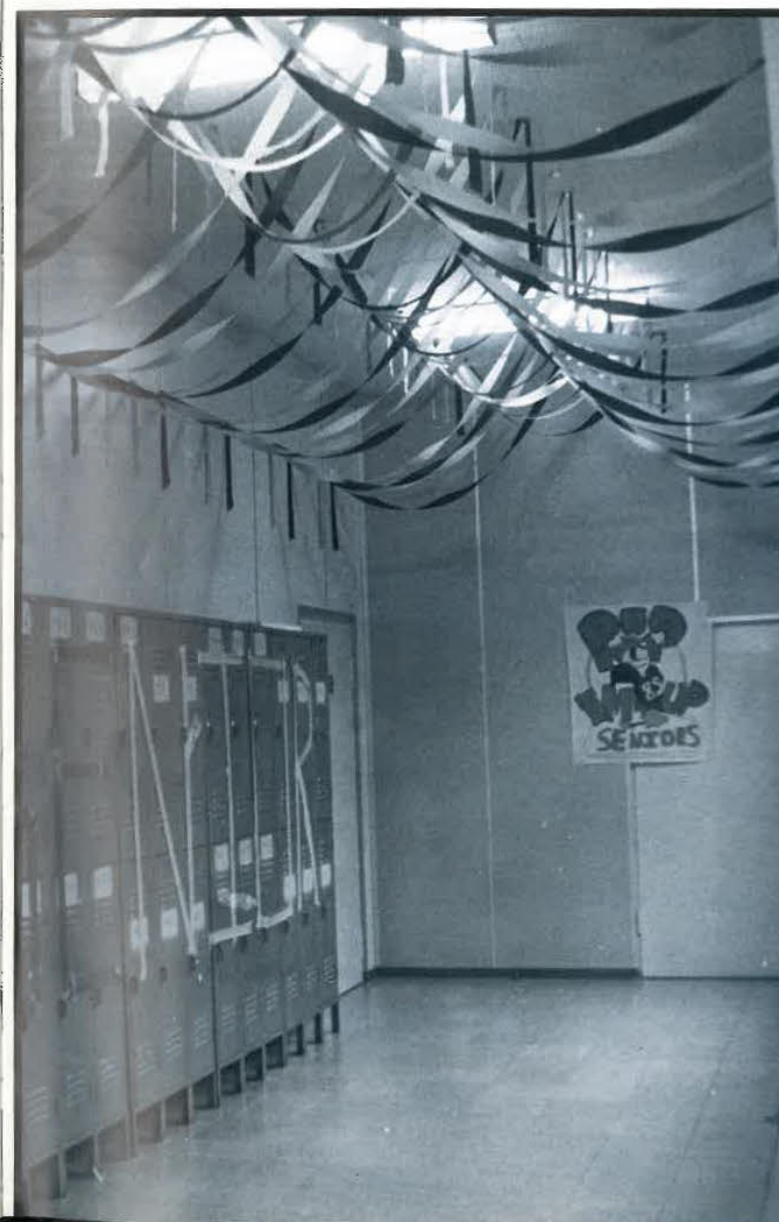
peared carrying the casket of the "winning" dummy. This dummy received the "honor" of being burned at the bonfire that night.

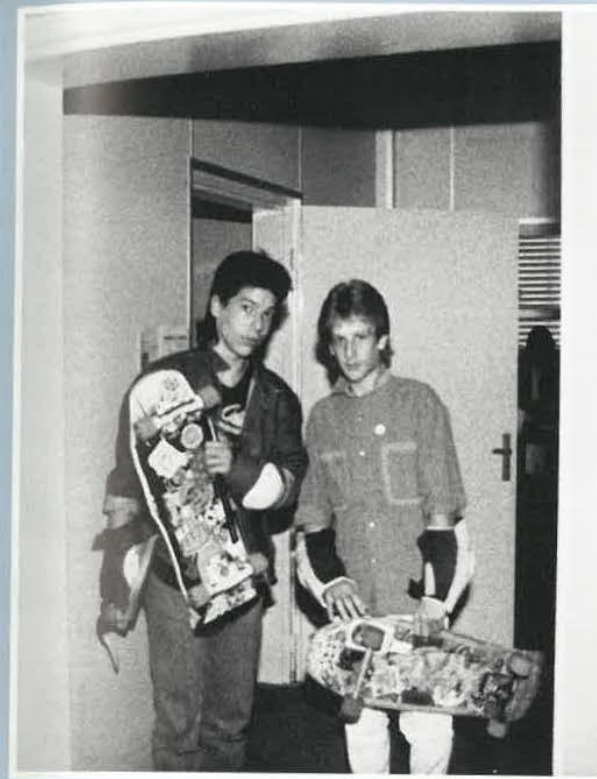

They are strange. They are weird. They are . . .



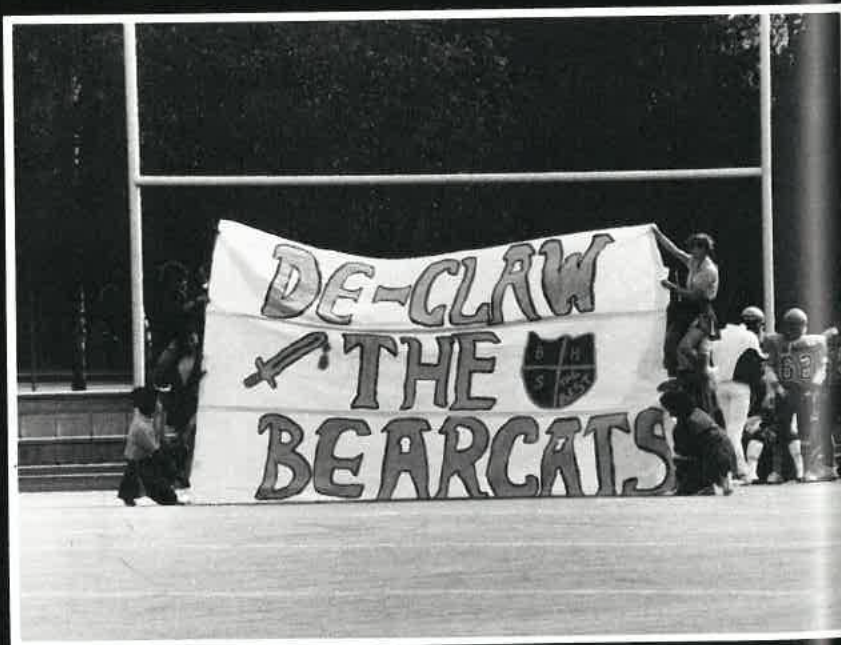

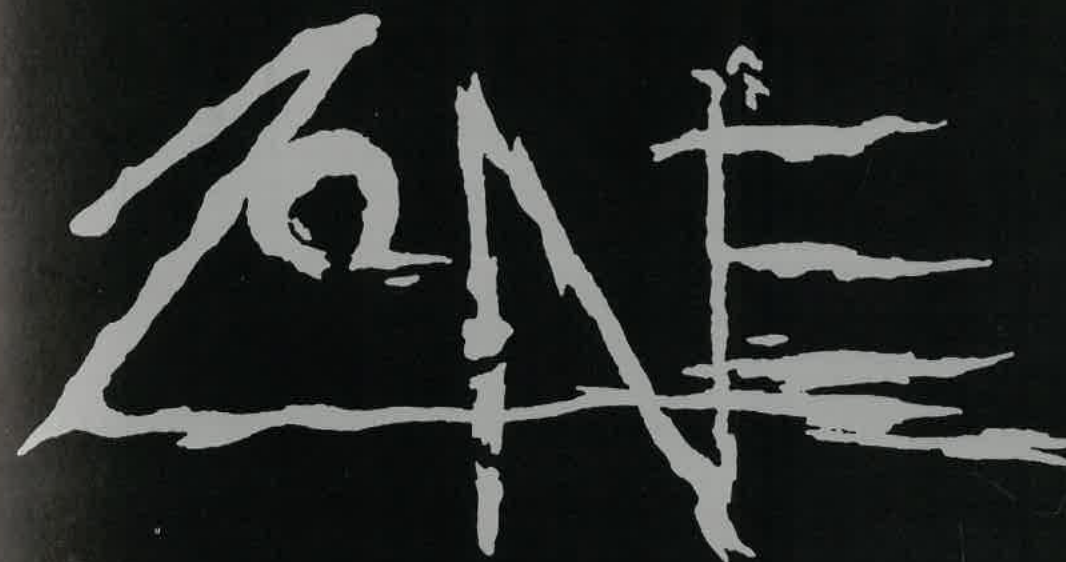

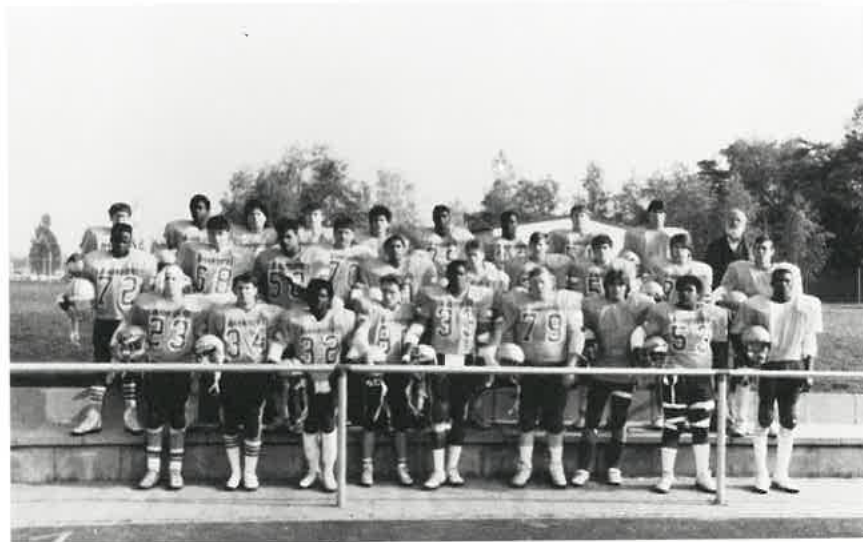

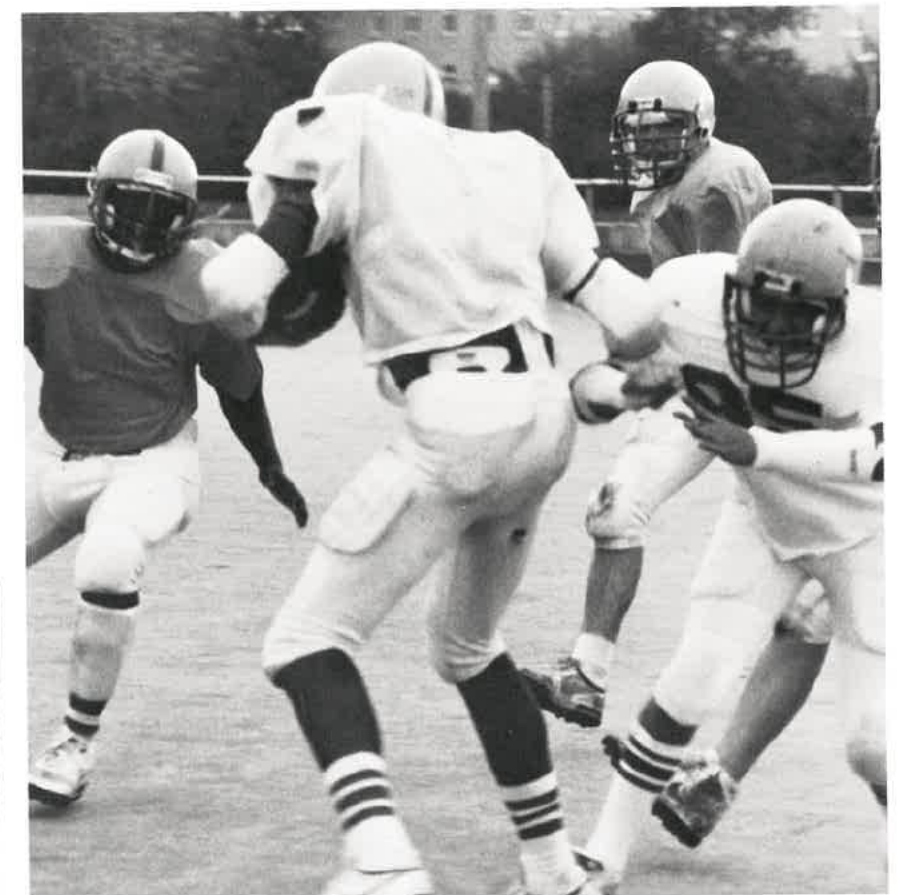
JOURNEY TO THE "END" ZONE

Throughout it all, Coach Giachino and Coach Jordan were behind the team and gave their support . . . as the Barons survived their trek through the Baron Zone.



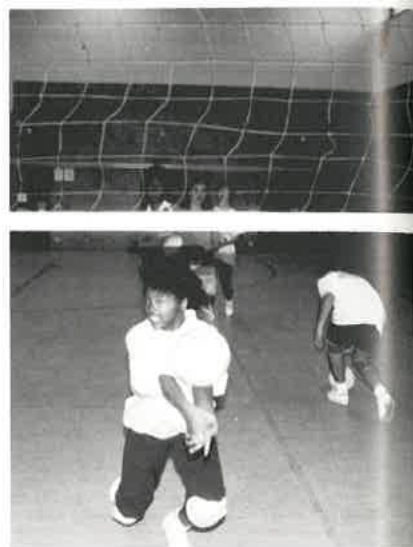
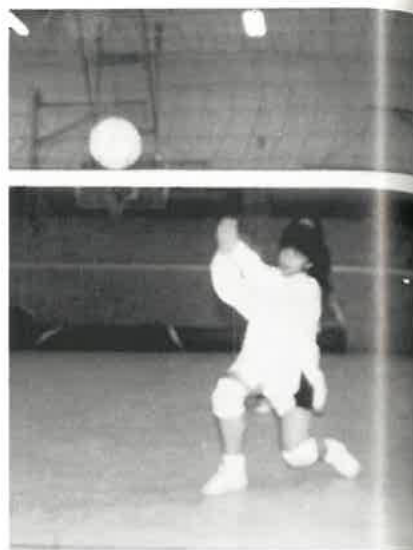
Volleyball Sets the Boundaries

A JOURNEY ACROSS THE COURTS

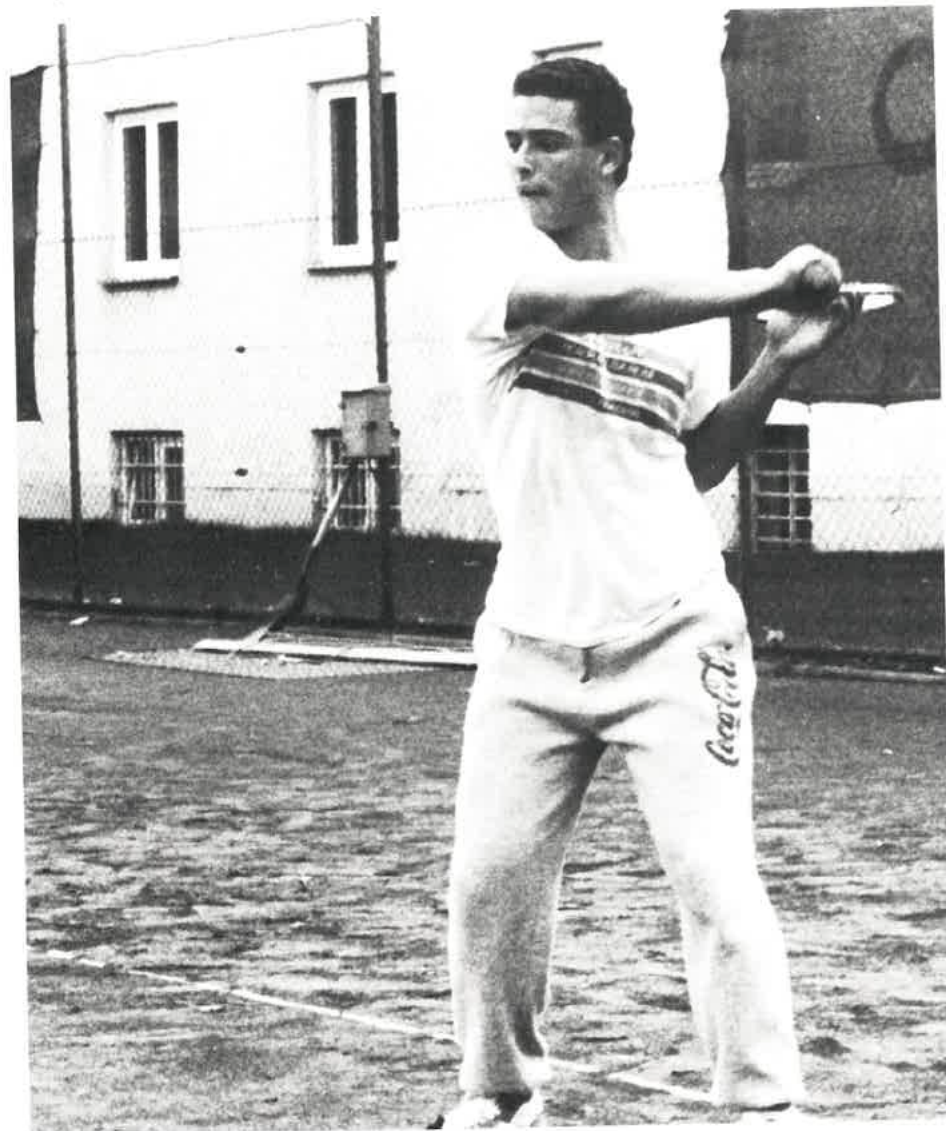
A road of turf, plastic, clay, and concrete, full of the classic mixture of victories and defeats, was traveled down by the Baron Tennis Team.

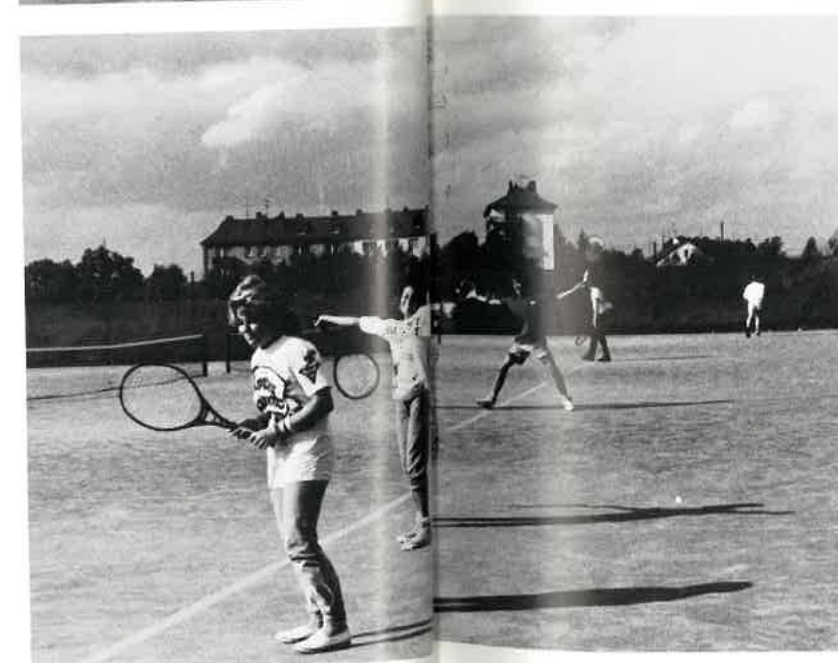

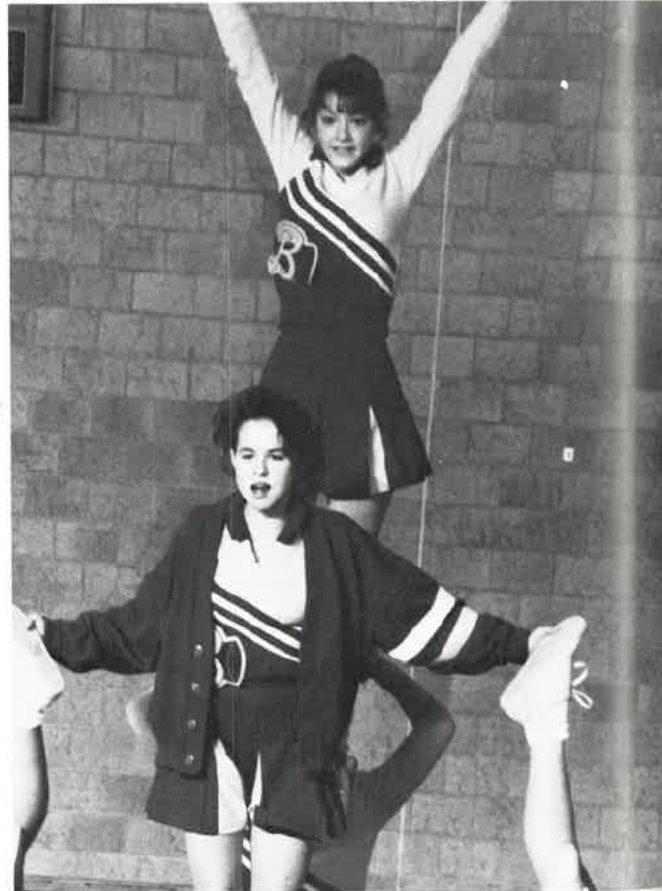

Cheerleaders Boost School Spirit

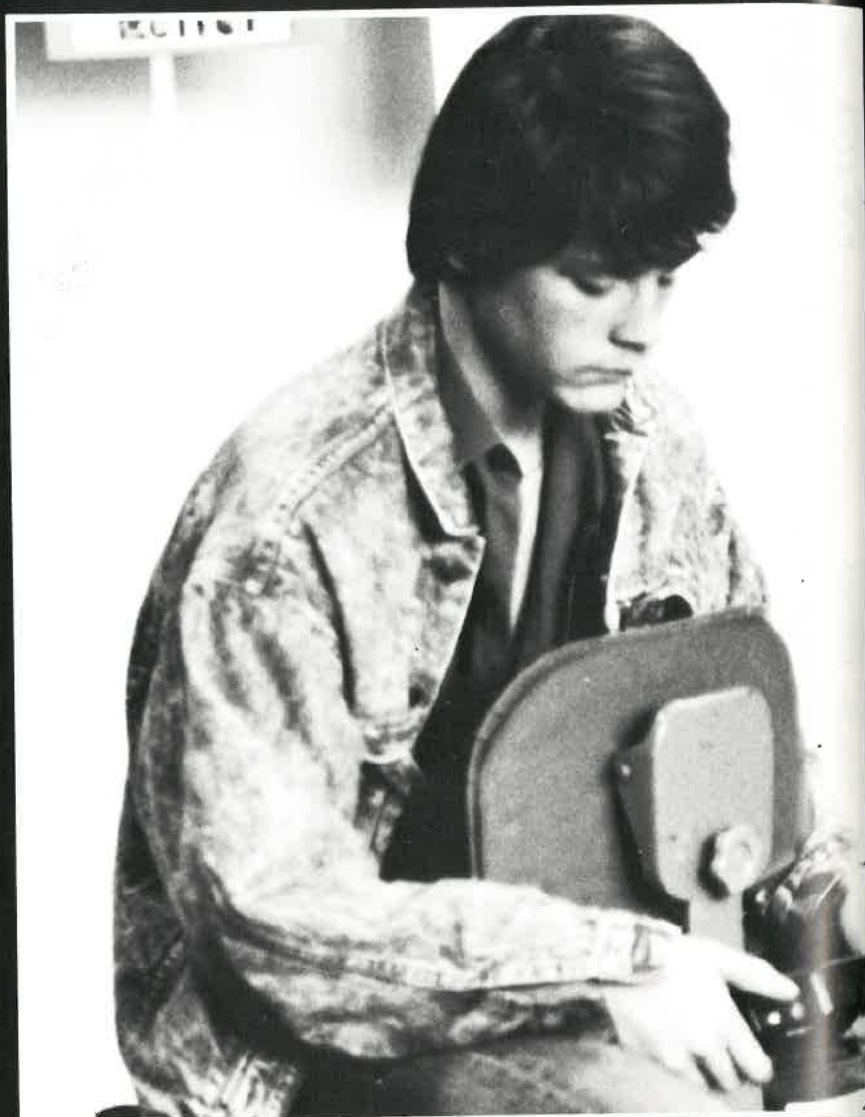

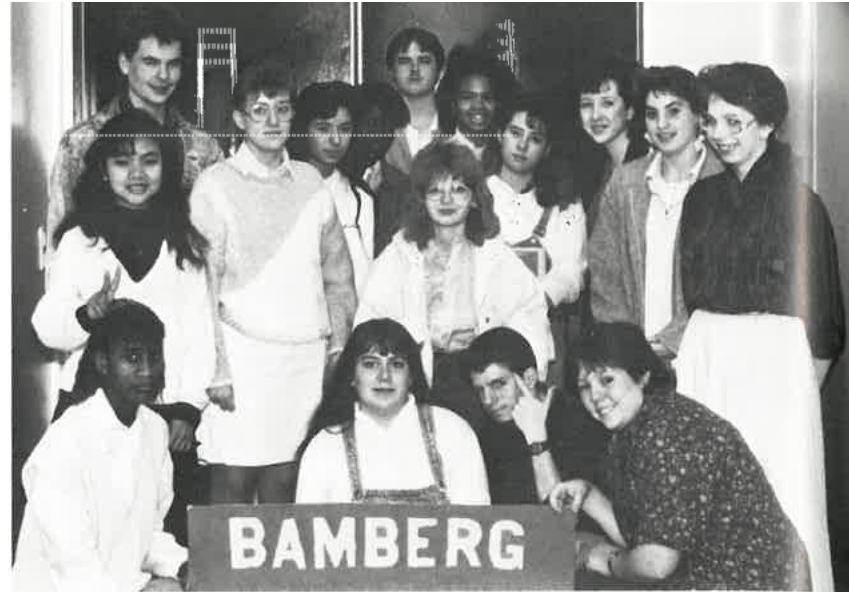
FBLA Promotes Leadership

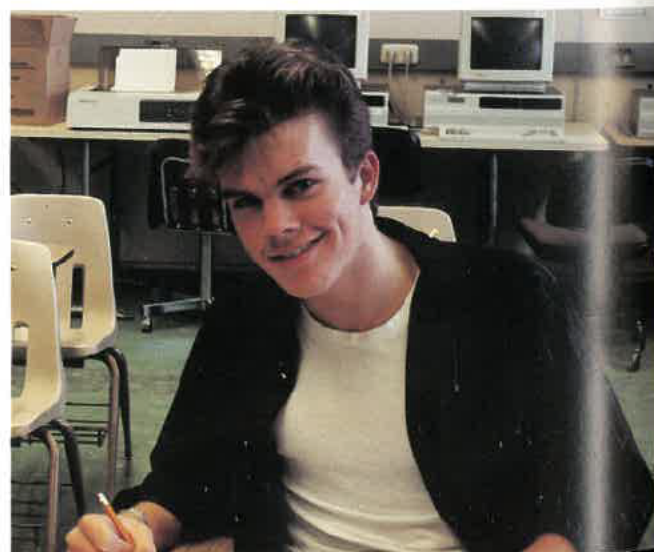

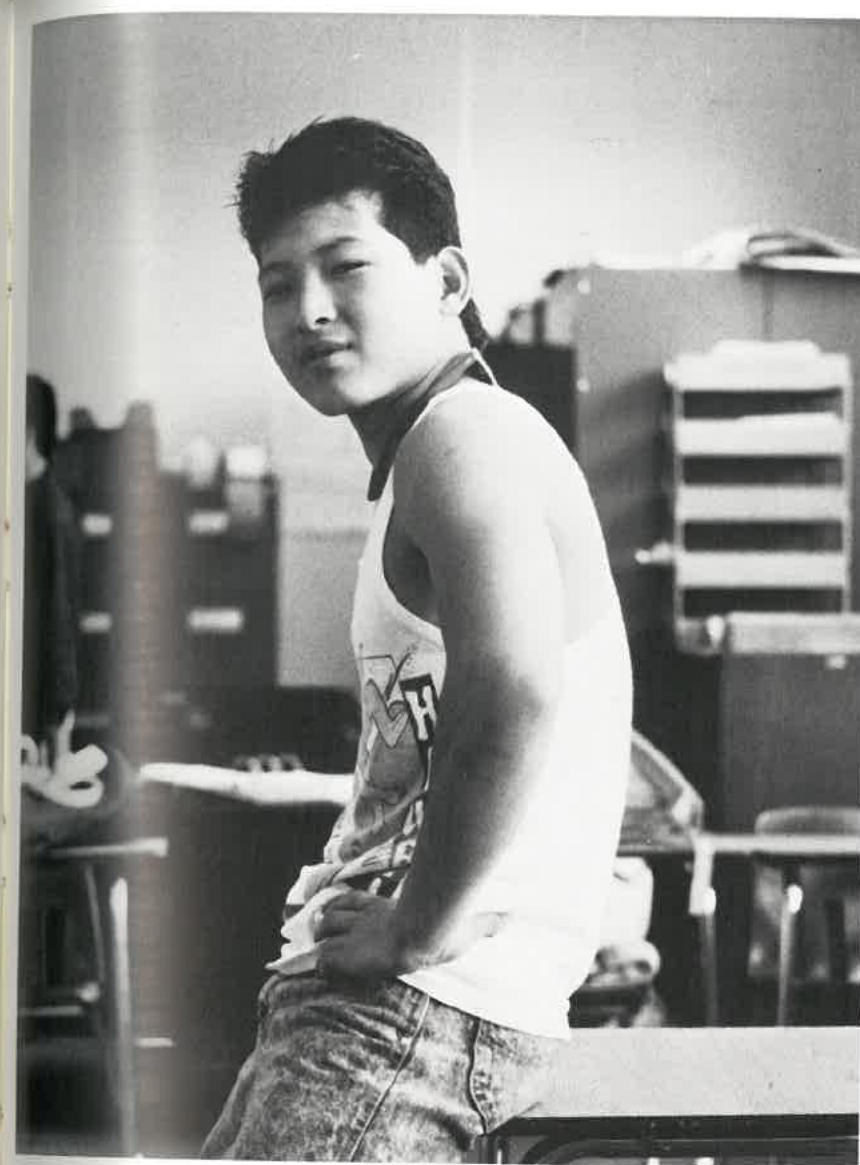

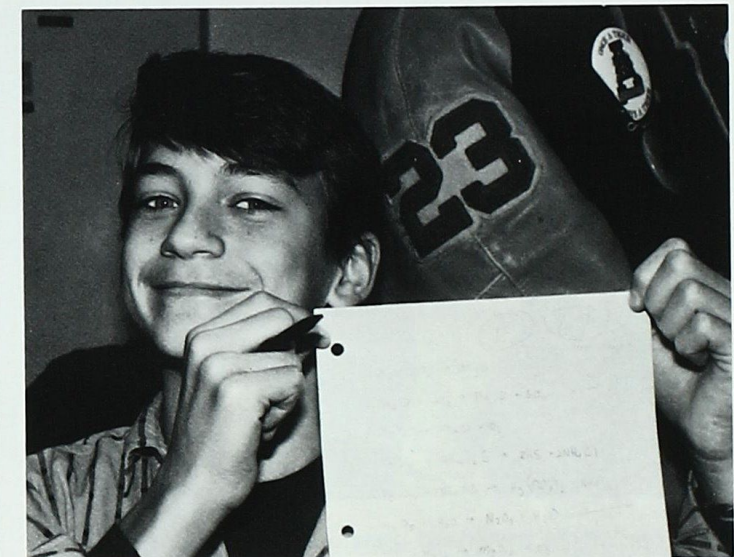

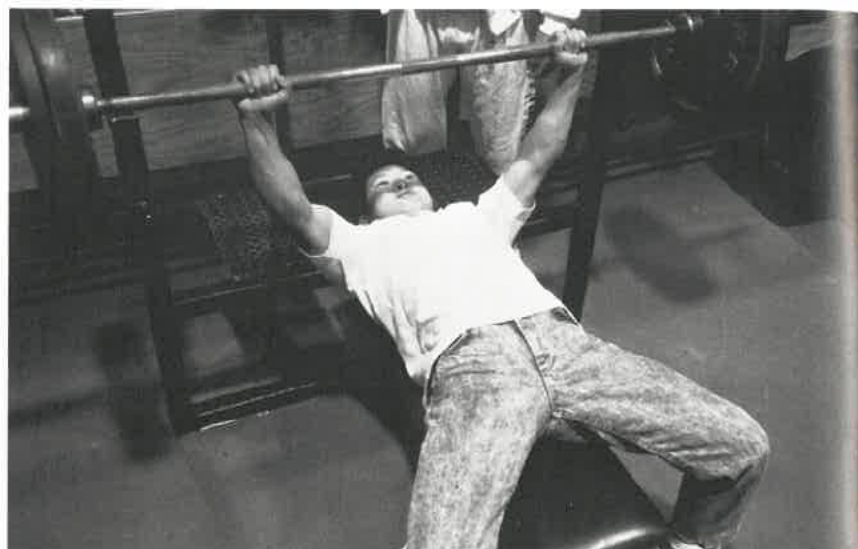

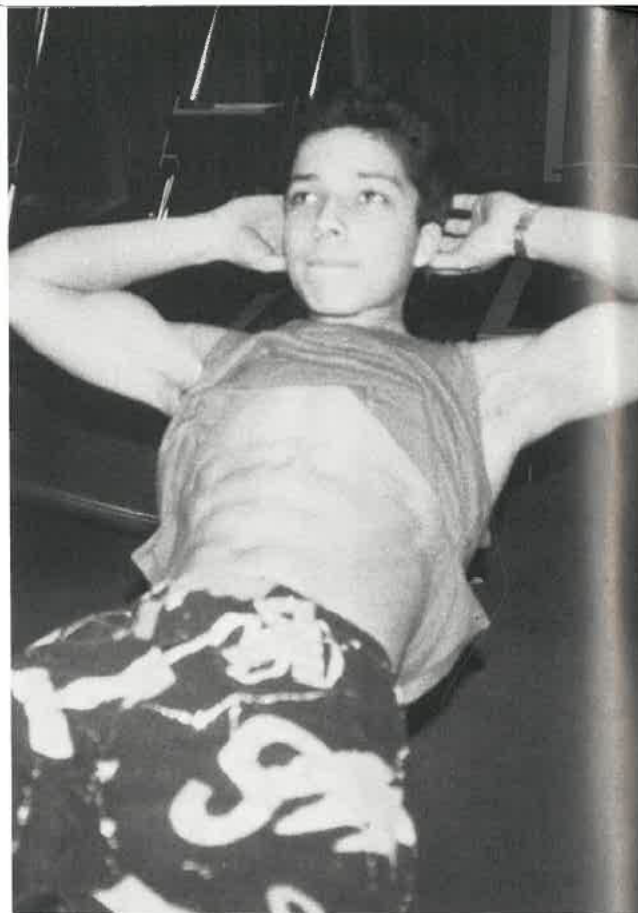

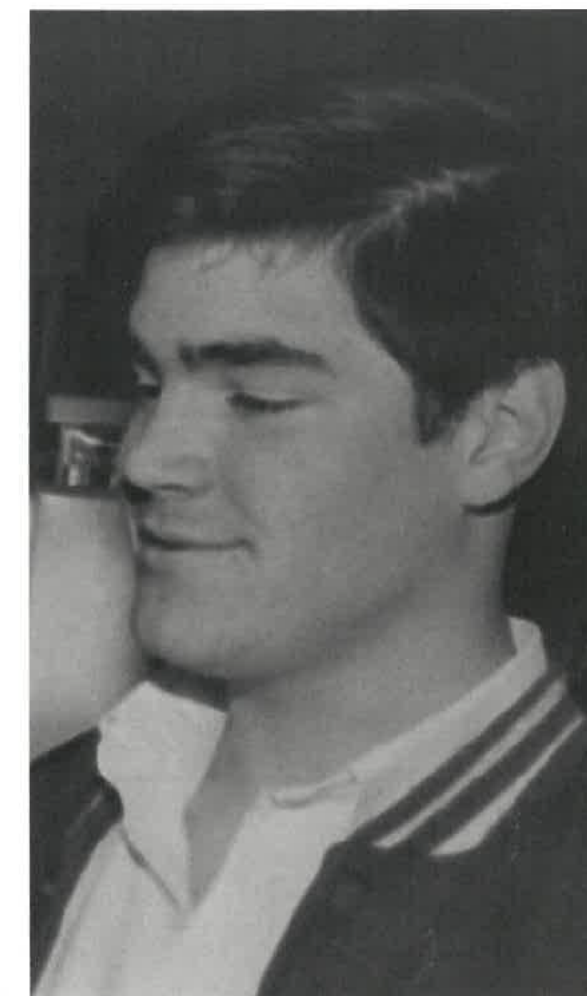
