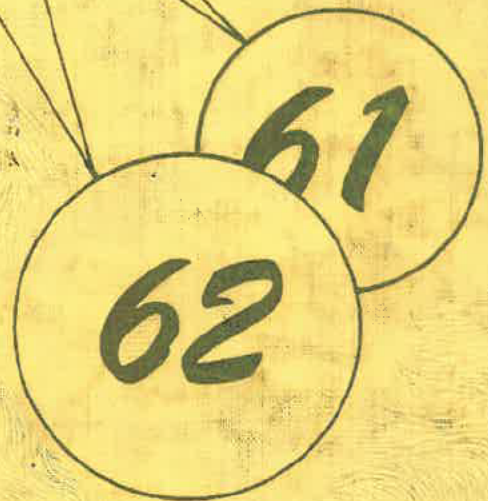

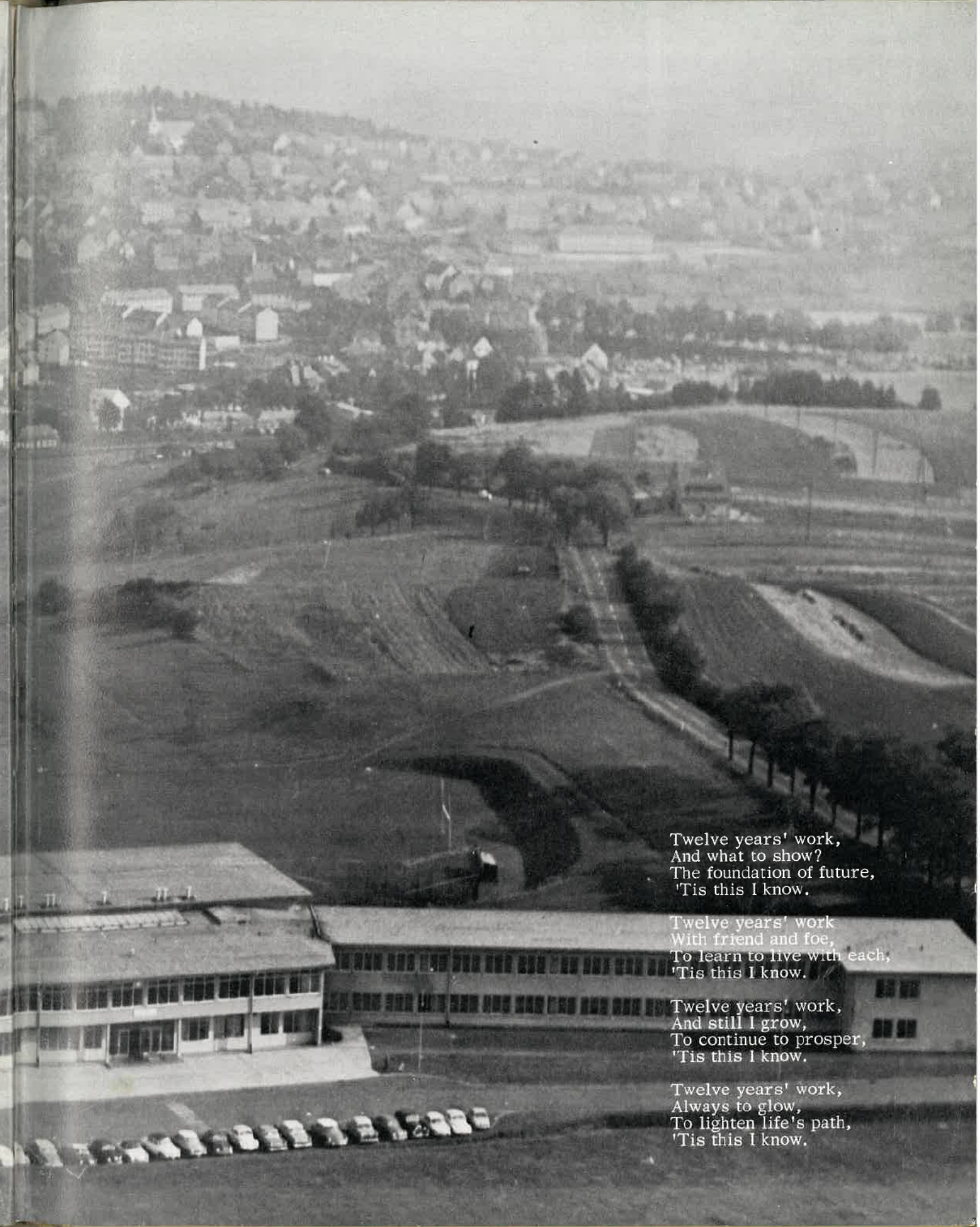

Mr. Wood Speaks

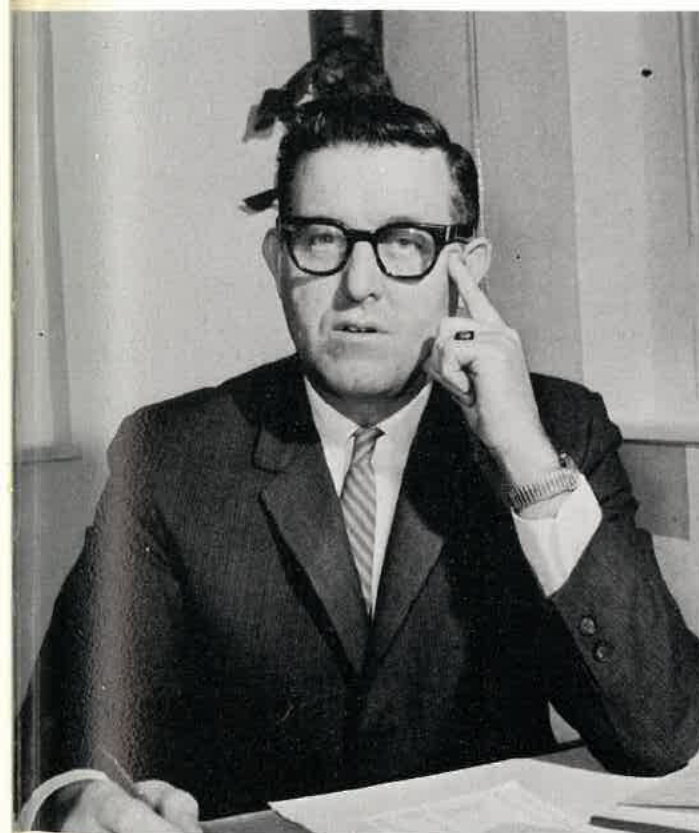

Then came the long-awaited moment. The Home-

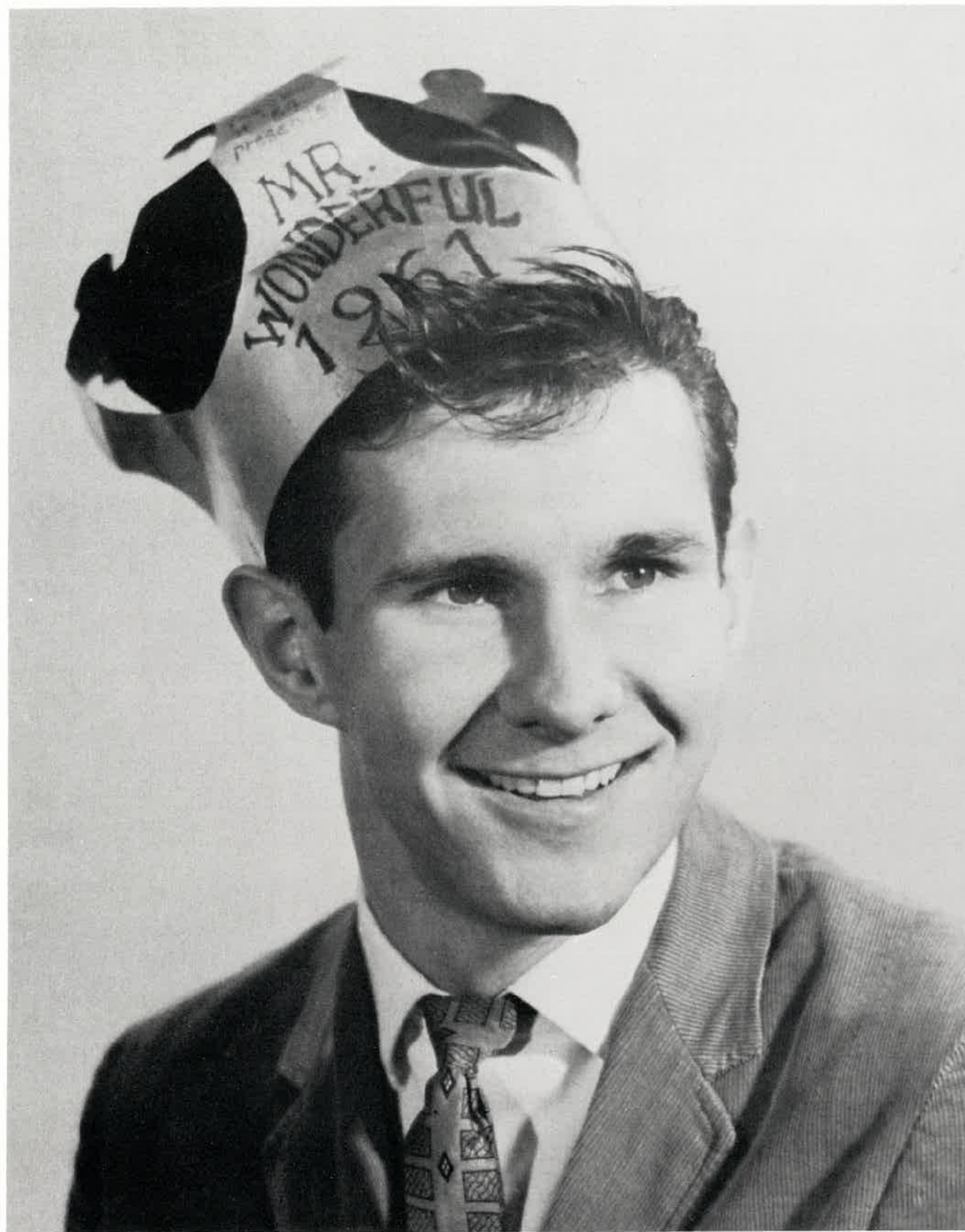

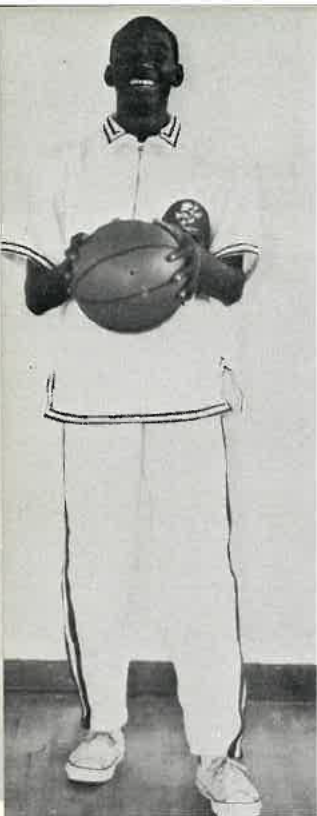

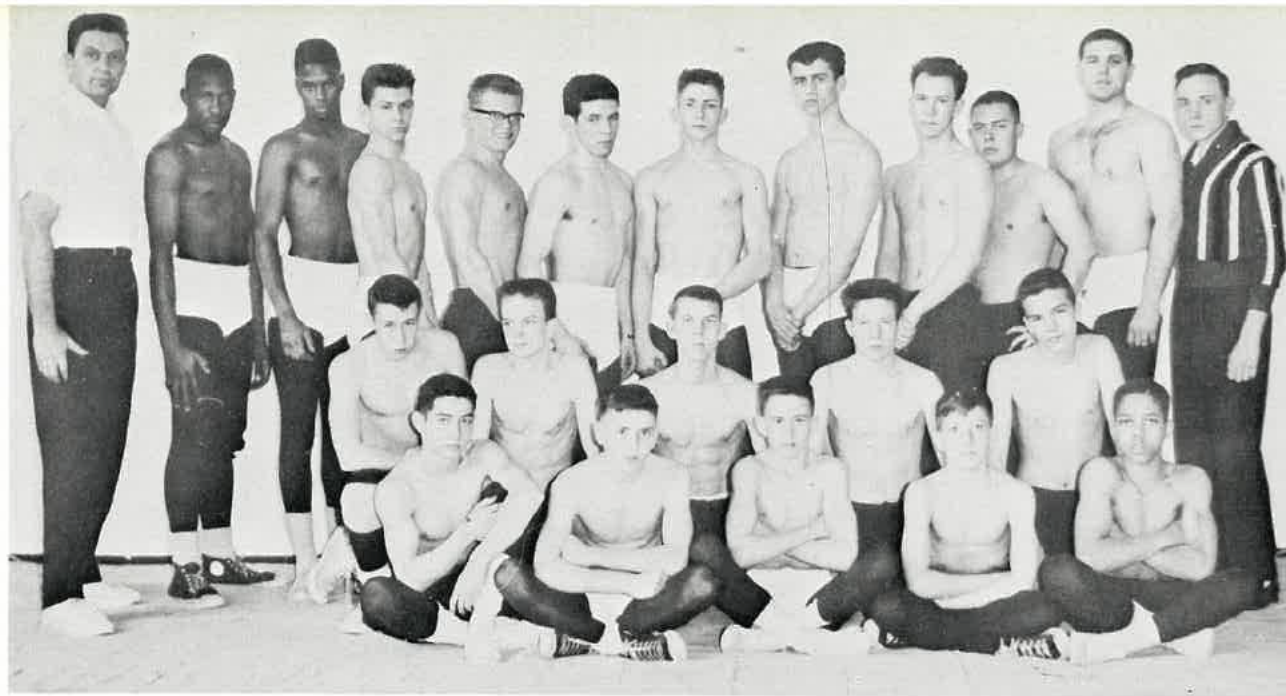

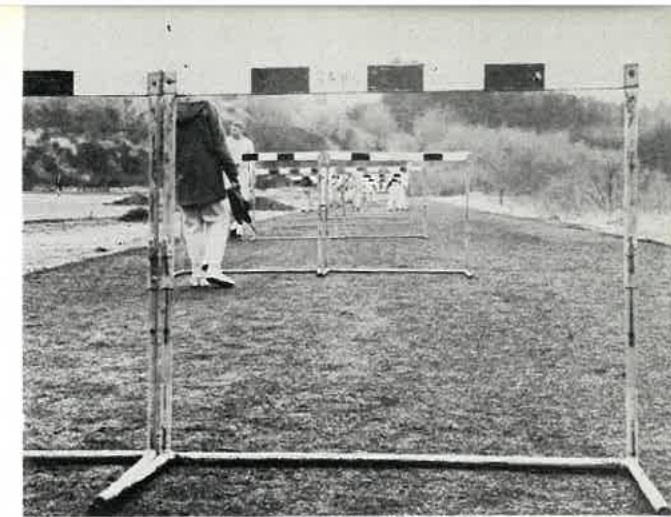

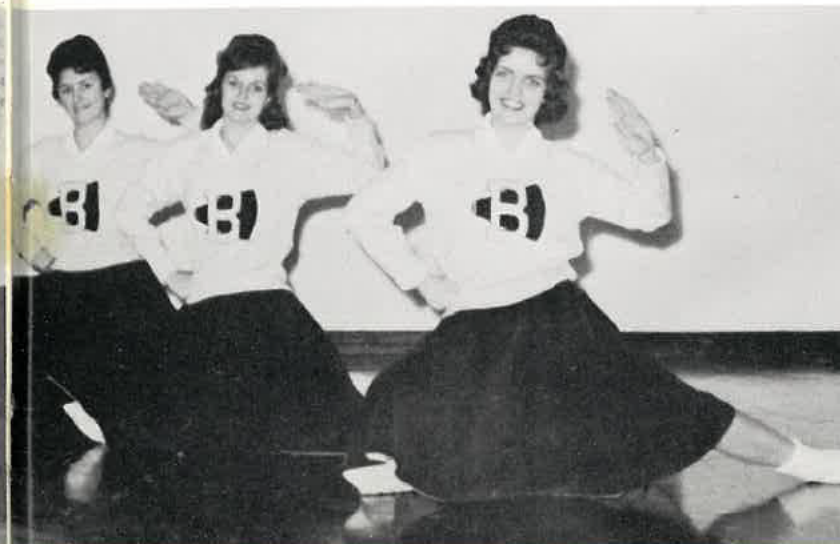

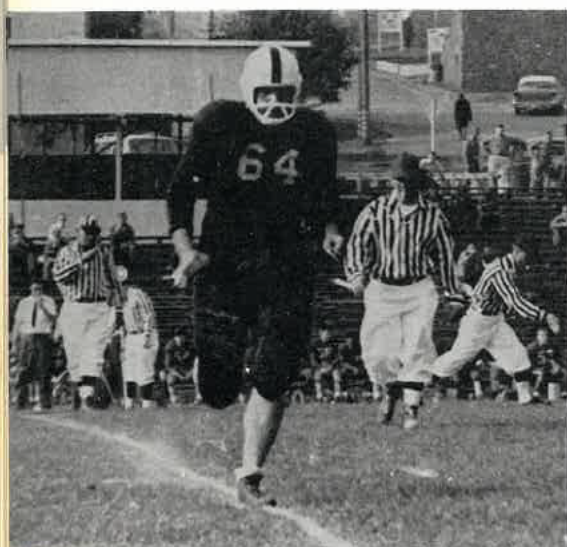

Baumholder lineman Ed Traylor charges off the field in Nuremberg contest.



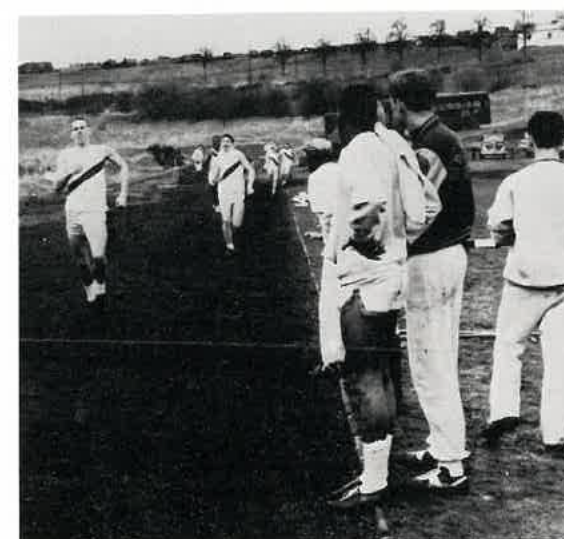

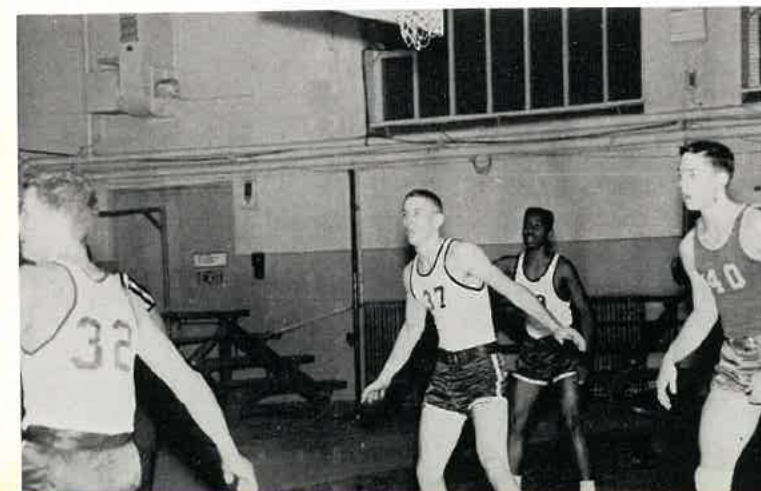

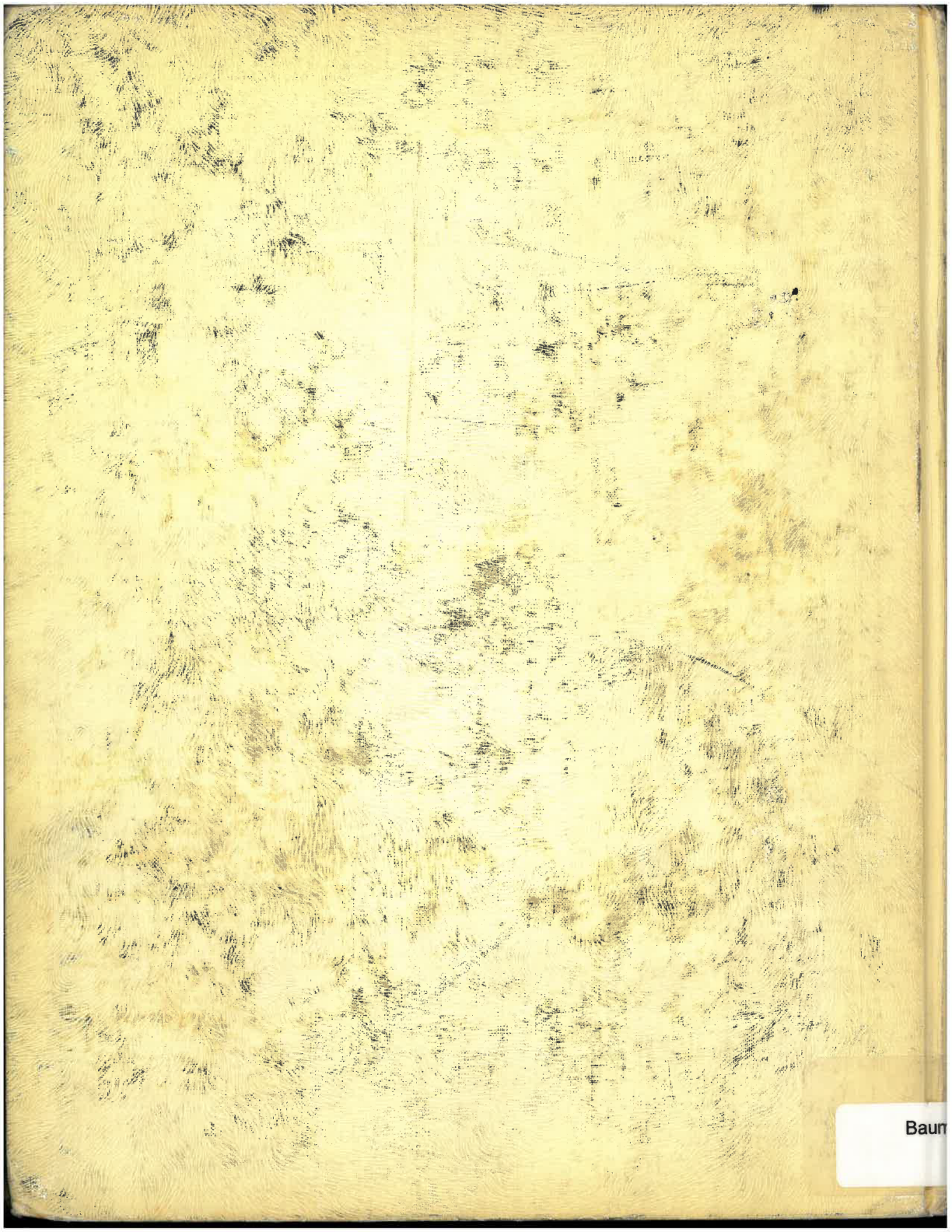
