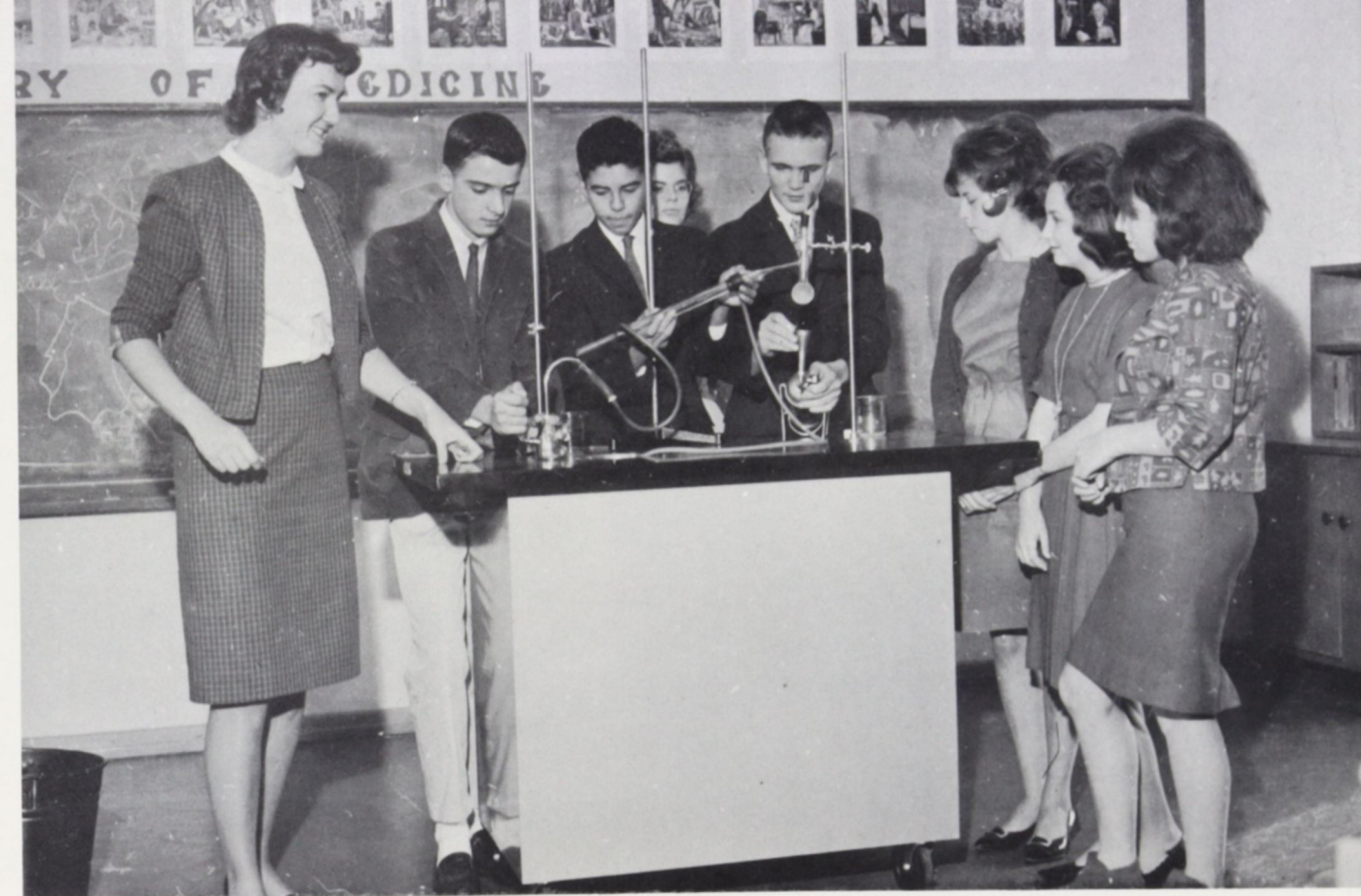
## Junior High Activities

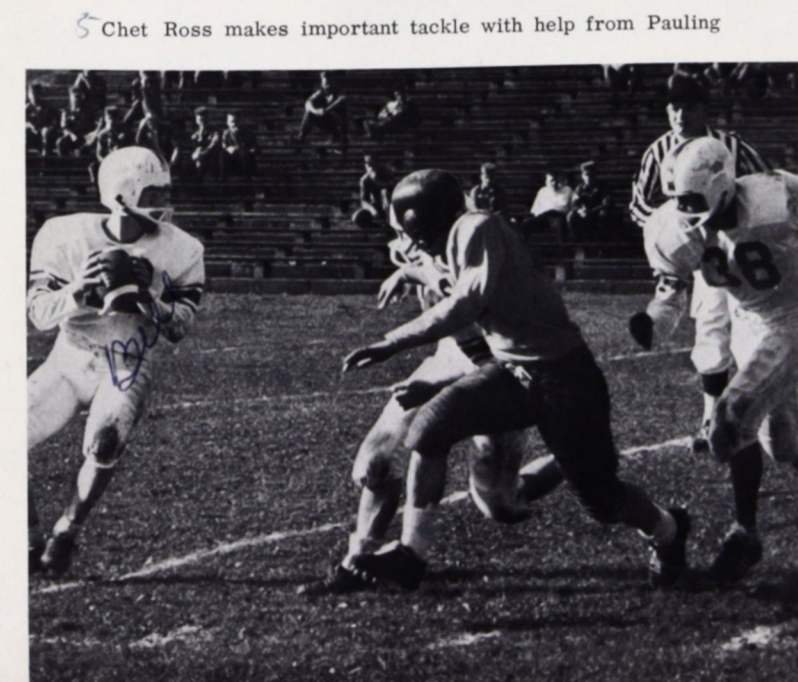

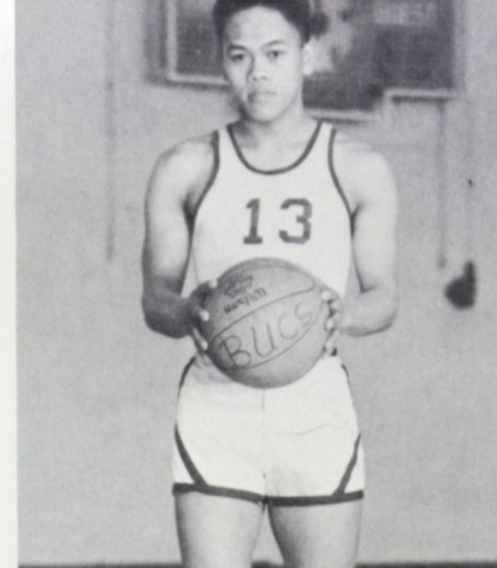
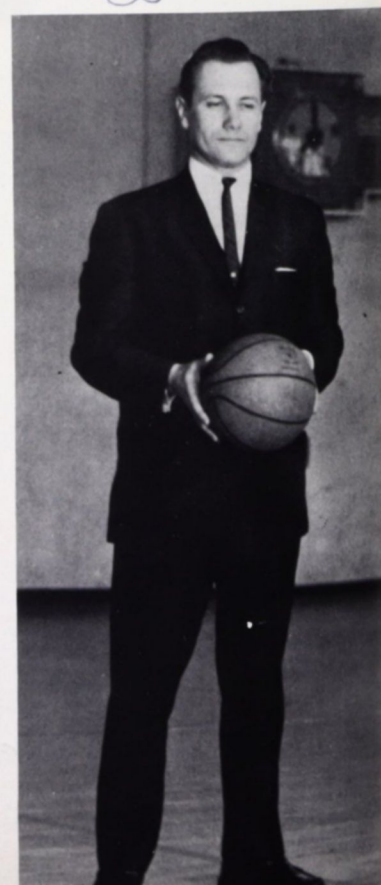


For the second year in a row the mighty Buccaneers of Baumholder became co-champions in the Class B Conference.

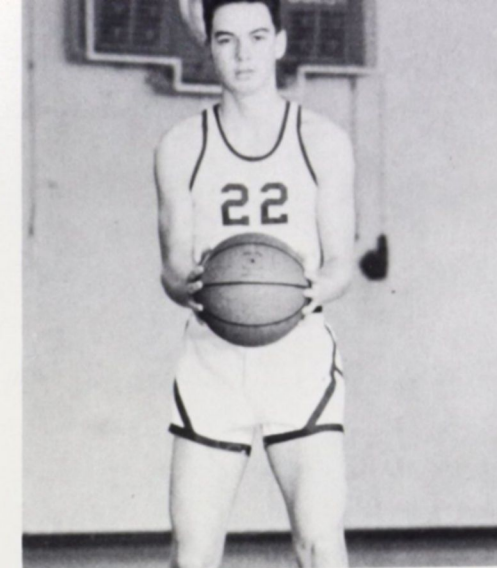
