Losing only one game the entire season, Baumholder's varsity football team edged the Hanau Panthers by one game in the Silver Division North final standings.


On November 8th they played Silver South champion Augsburg for the Silver Division title. (see page 76.)

The only All-Europe selection was Bud Ornburn at center.







Led by Doug Brinson (BELOW), the Buc defense dominated Augsburg most of the afternoon.










Varsity Improves Record



Playing inconsistently the whole season, the boy's junior varsity basketball team finished with an even 7-7 record.


The team started off strongly with two wins over Ansbach by 25 and 45 point margins; however, they never seemed to regain their early season form to finish at the .500 mark.





Wrestlers Capture Third




The team finished the regular season with a third place against Class B schools.





Junior Gymnasts Finish 19-1



The students participating in the field trip were required to research one aspect of the French culture or one of the sites they visited.








Baumholder Students Attend Model U.N. At The Hague







