The sophomore class of this year is looking forward to becoming the jazzy juniors of 1983-4 and the snappy seniors of 1984-5.



Family Life is a class that virtually all seniors take. In this class students do the following: marry, hold a reception, do job applications, rent an apartment, figure budgets and shop at the commissary; apply for credit, write checks and balance the checkbook, buy insurance, draw up a houseplan, get instruction on pregnancy and birth of a child, deal with a major crisis in life and, for the grand finale, get a divorce. While not all people have to go through all of these things, they are considered normal, everyday things which most people have to suffer with in their adult lives.

The parenting section of the course makes the students look very carefully at the production of children. Each student becomes a "parent" by caring for an egg. They must name the "baby", provide a safe mode of travel and carry him or her with them everywhere they go — basketball practice, Winter Formal and to classes.

Some students find being a parent is not such a lark as they thought. They forget their "child" in the locker, on the window sill — some children are kidnapped and held for ransom. If the baby becomes injured or cracked, the parents must take care of him in the appropriate manner. One baby was left on the table overnight and in the morning he was made into scrambled egg (whoops!)



In ceremonies at which the military and civilian German community attended, the poles were dedicated.














