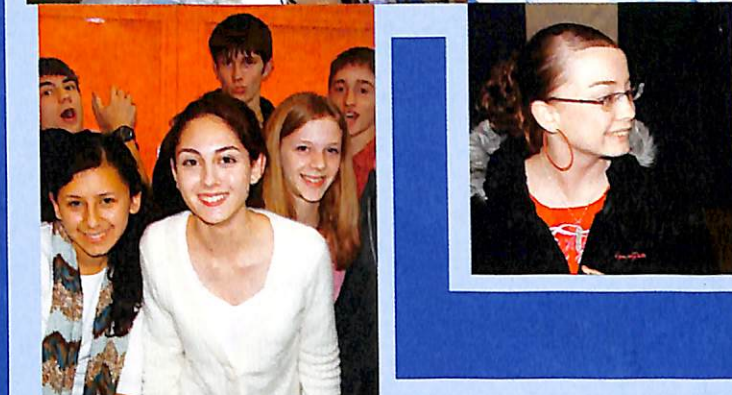
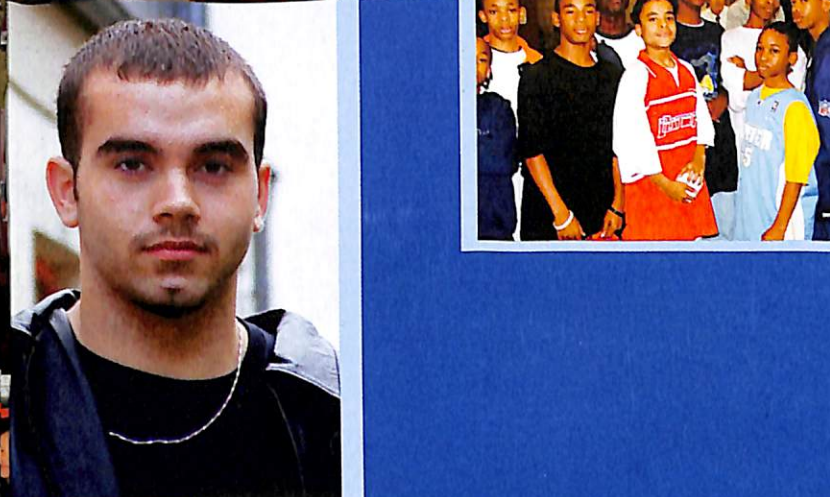
Dear Students,

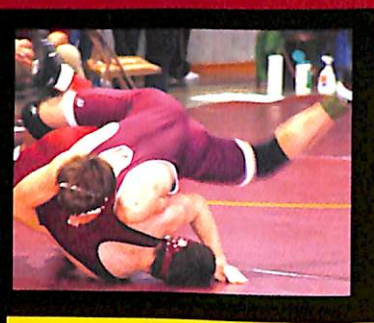
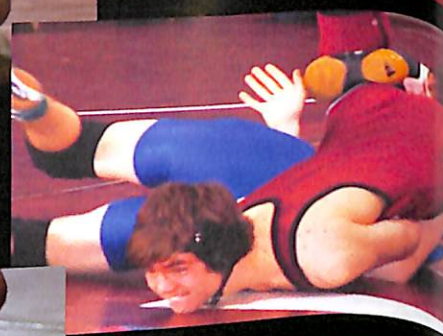
Masters of the Mat

The 2005-06 BAHS wrestling season began on 15 November 2005 with 19 wrestlers. The coaches were Michael Kieta, Tom Hinz, and William Raymaker. As the season progressed and individuals dropped out, the number of wrestlers was reduced to 13 varsity wrestlers. Daniel Carrier at the 103-weight class; Rashad Palmer 112; Michael Walker 119; David Crow 125; Casey Wojcik 135; Michael Smith 140; Mavonte Johnson 145; Josh Emerson 152; Derek Mundt 160; James Lampe 160; Jimmy Zadra 189; Clayton Eng 215; Jason Stanley 275.

Near the end of the season, an 8th grader, Ethan Montang, joined the team after transferring from Pennsylvania. Ethan won both of his exhibition matches in his only meet.

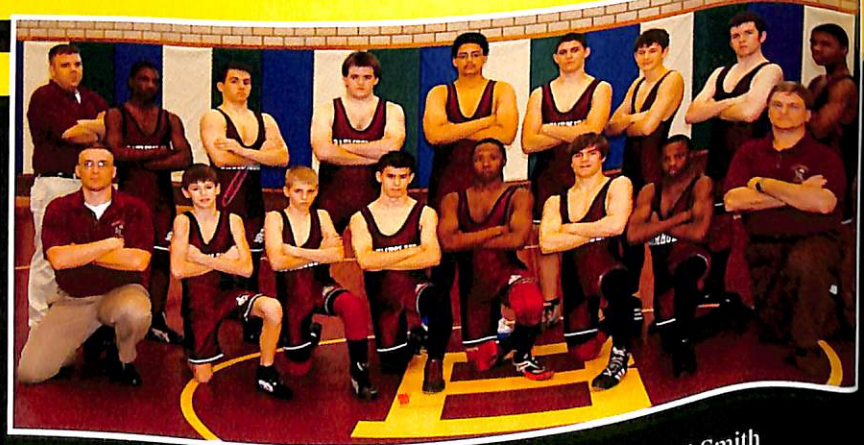
It was the first year of wrestling for Carrier, Palmer, Wojcik, Johnson, Lampe, Zadra, and Eng. Walker and Zadra were the only seniors. Despite the team's youth and inexperience, the 05-06 season may have been the best in BAHS wrestling history. Competing against teams from Division I, II, and III schools, the Baumholder wrestlers finished in the top three in every tournament. BAHS wrestlers took 3rd place in our first tournament at Ramstein, 2nd place at Mannheim, 2nd place at the Ramstein Holiday Takedown tournament, 1st place at our home meet, 2nd place at Giessen, 3rd place at Shape, and 2nd place at Bitburg.

In the post-season, at the West Sectional in Ramstein, David Crow won first place, Rashad Palmer placed second, Michael Walker, Jimmy Zadra, Clayton Eng, and Jason Stanley placed third, and Michael Smith and Josh Emerson placed fourth. David Crow's win in the final was one of the matches of the year when he defeated a Ramstein wrestler who was the defending European champion, and undefeated for three years. Seven of the wrestlers: Palmer, Crow, Walker, Smith, Emerson, Eng, and Stanley advanced to the European Championship. At the European Championship the wrestlers continued to wrestle hard and win, with four wrestlers earning medals. Rashad Palmer and Michael Smith placed sixth, Josh Emerson placed fifth, and David Crow placed third. As a team, Baumholder placed third among Division III teams and brought home a plaque for the trophy case.

- 6 President Bush and Congress pledge to investigate the flawed disaster response.
- 9 Government-issued debit cards are distributed to evacuees. The program fails and is ended days later.
- 12 Michael Brown, head of the Federal Emergency Management Agency, resigns. Flooding is down to 50 percent in New Orleans.
- 14 New Orleans Mayor Ray Nagin announces a phased repopulation plan.
- 15 New Orleans begins to reopen. Katrina is named the most destructive hurricane in U.S. history.

- 20 Louisiana Governor Kathleen Blanco declares a state of emergency as Hurricane Rita strengthens off the coast.
- 22 Rita hits the Louisiana coast and heads for Texas.
- 23 Thousands evacuate eastern Texas and the 9th Ward of New Orleans floods once again after levees are overrun.

October

- 24 Hurricane Wilma hits southwest Florida.

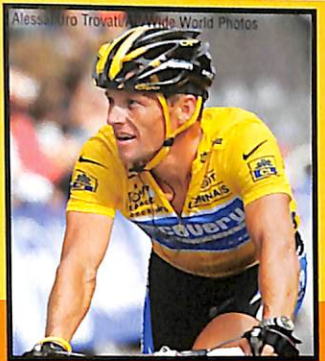

European Champs & All Conference

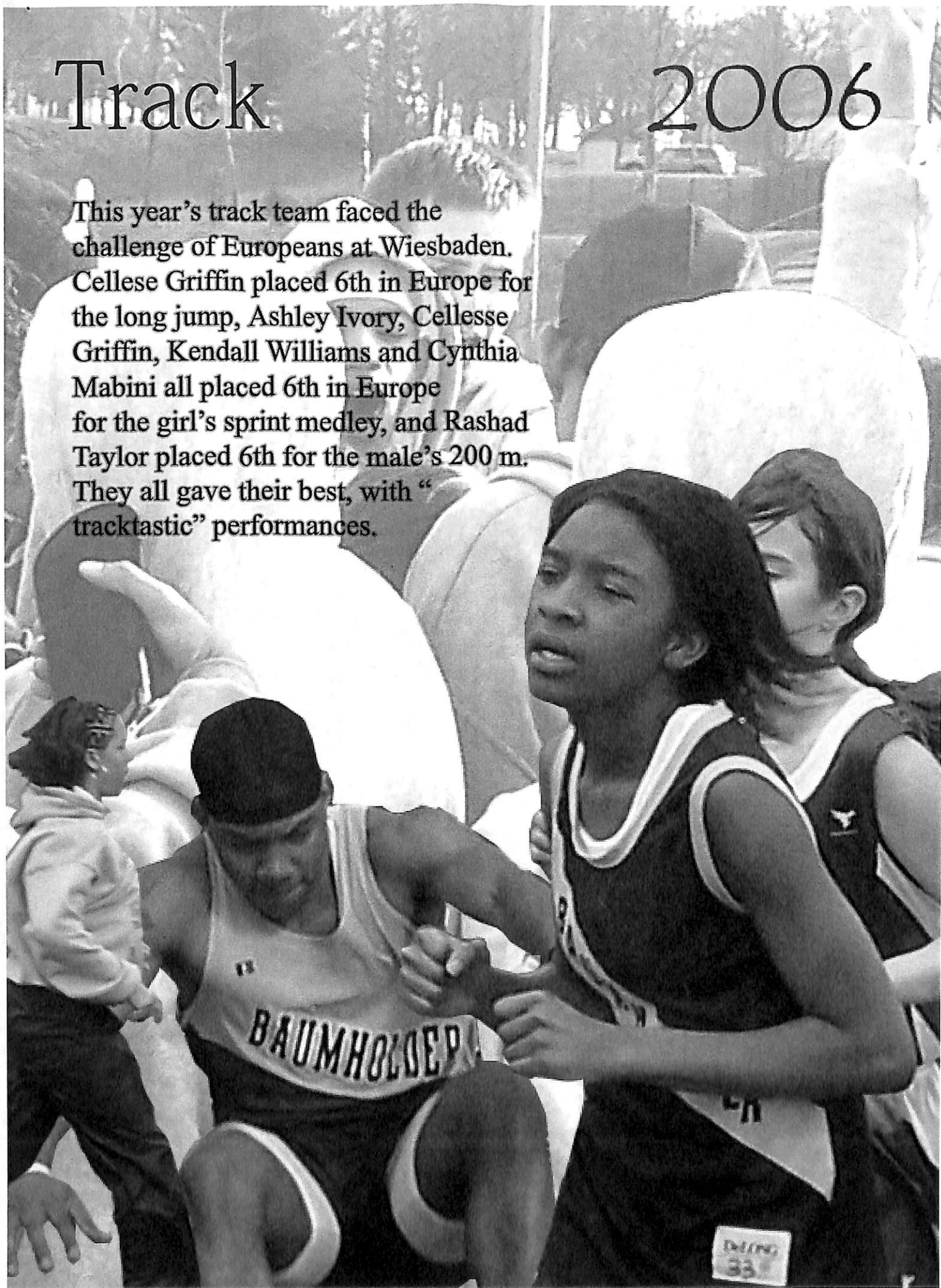

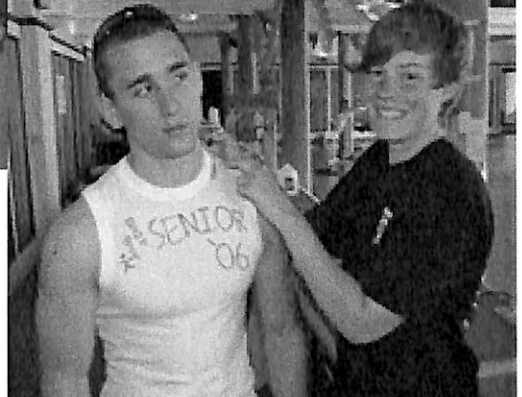
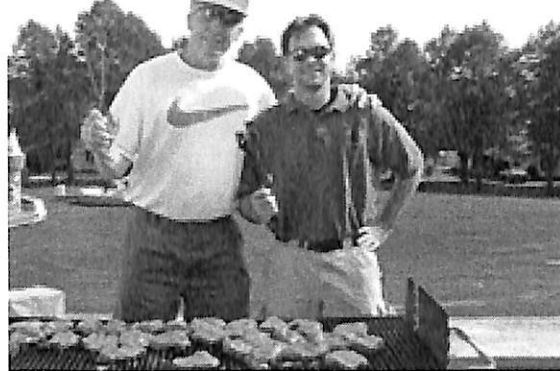
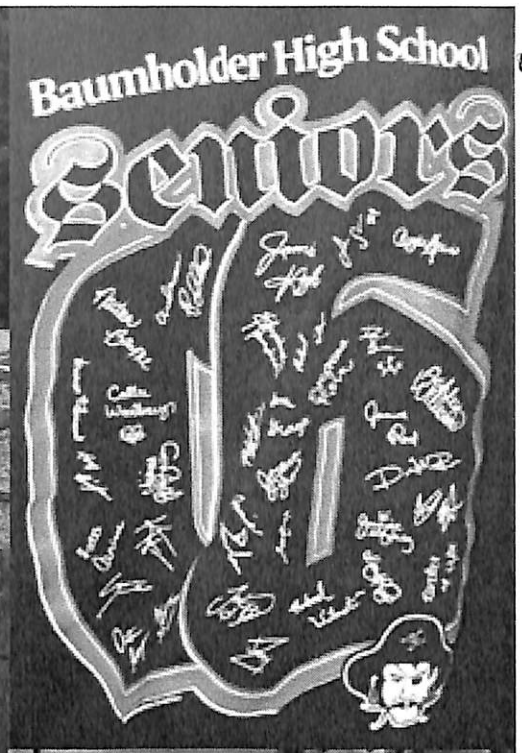
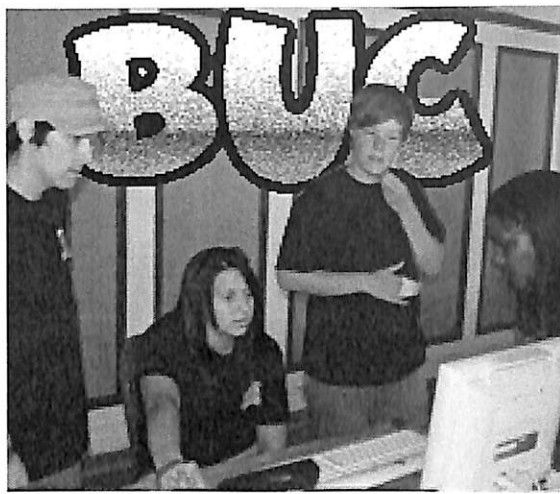




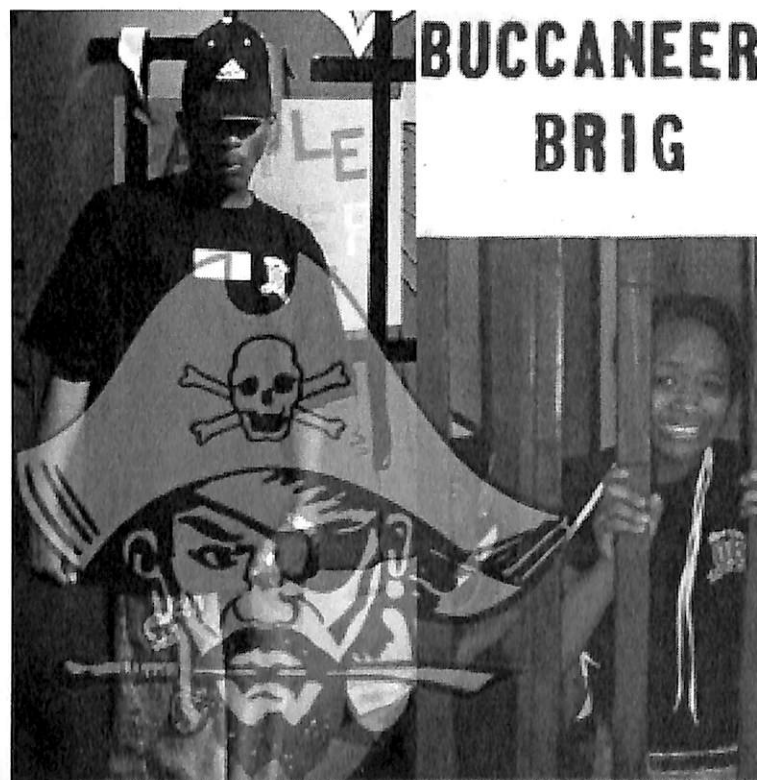
Holocaust Study Trip
