
















Student Council

As the season progressed and individuals dropped out, the number of wrestlers was reduced to 13 warsity wrestlers. - 22 Rita hits the Louisiana coast and heads for Texas.
- 23 Thousands evacuate eastern Texas and the 9th Ward of New Orleans floods once again after levees are overrun.

24 Hurricane Wilma hits southwest Florida.






















Study Trip
