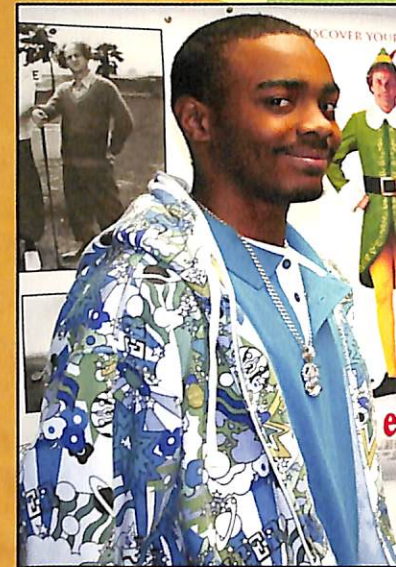
Point of Pride.

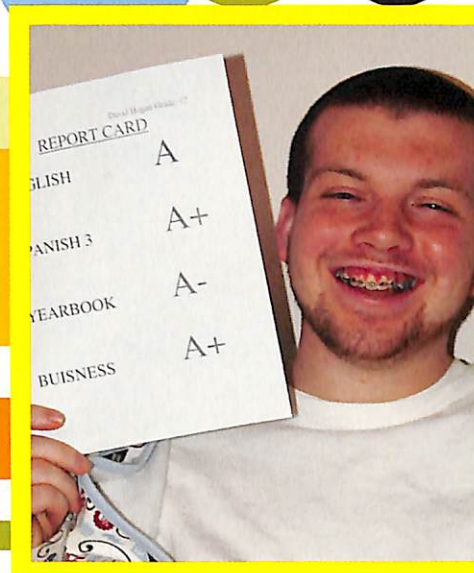
When asked how they'd improve the school, 43% of BAHS students stated that better food should be offered for lunch; 21% wanted to nix certain rules (e.g. the tardy policy, iPod restriction) and make the environment less strict; 14% recommended a greater number/variety of school activities and more, different classes. An increased number of pep rallies and dances, more sports (especially baseball), and a longer lunch were each proposed by 10% of the student body. Other significantly scoring suggestions included off-campus-lunch for upperclassmen and a renovation of the school, particularly the MPR. Three students out of the 42 questioned made the moot suggestion they'd like more classmates.



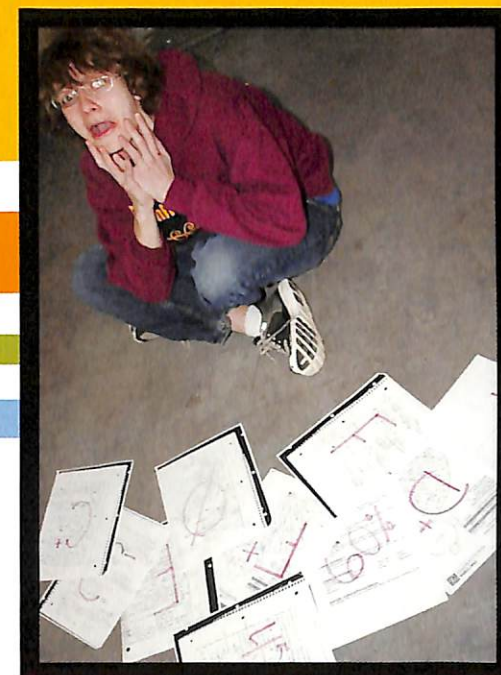

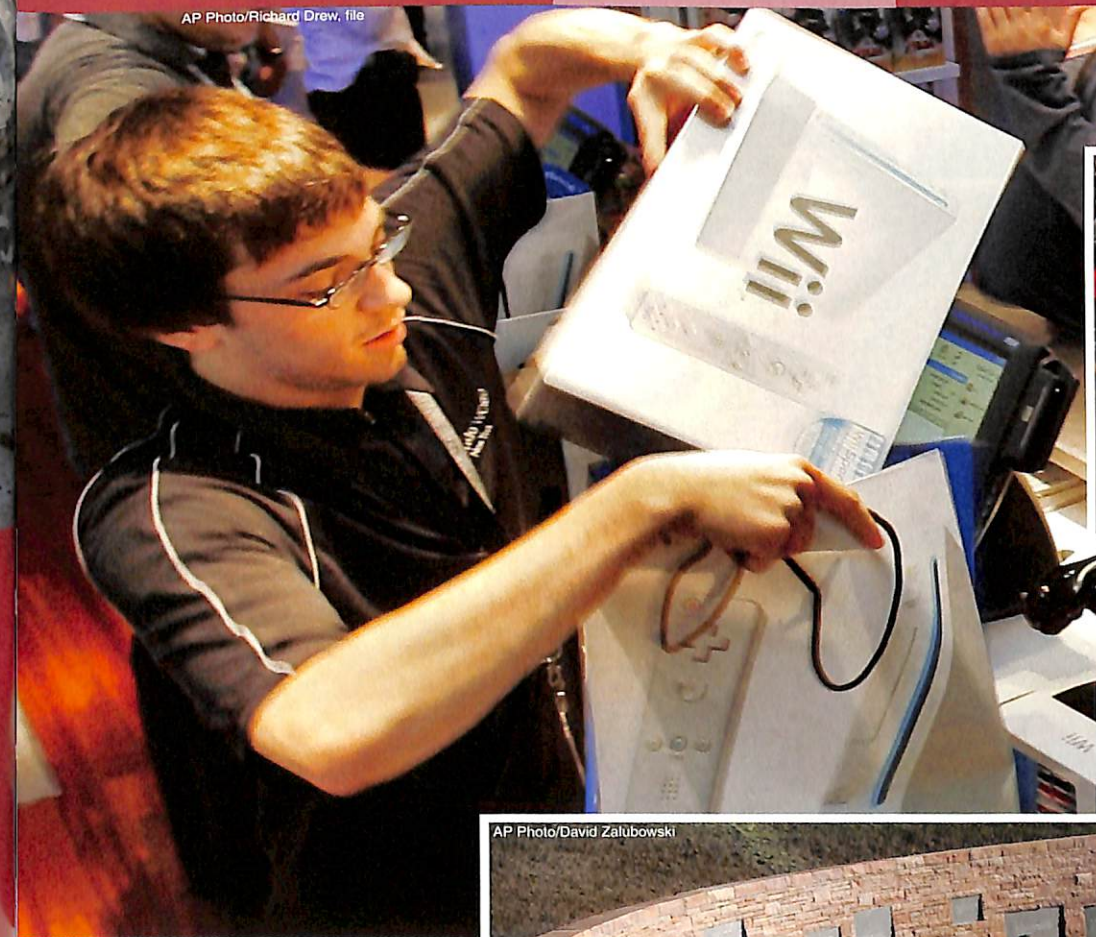

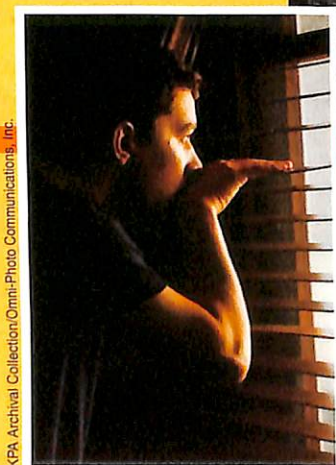

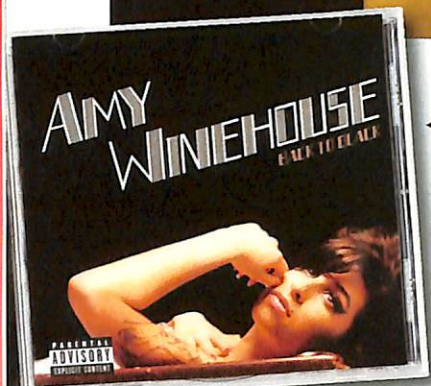

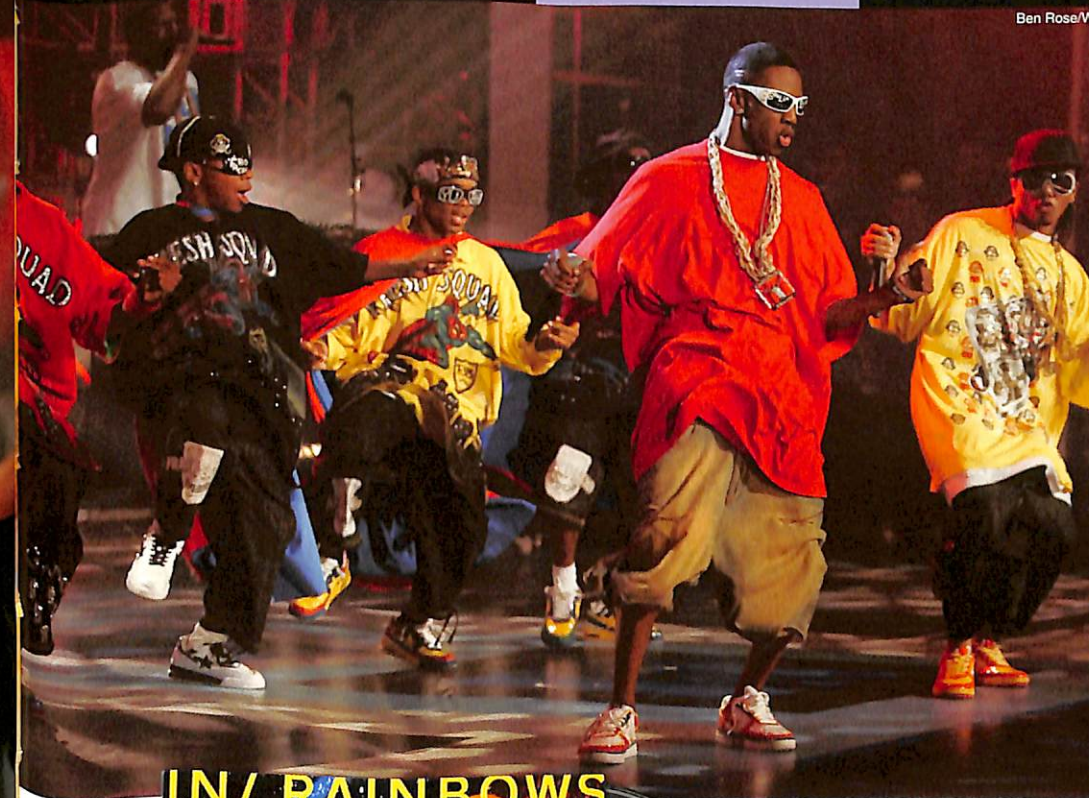

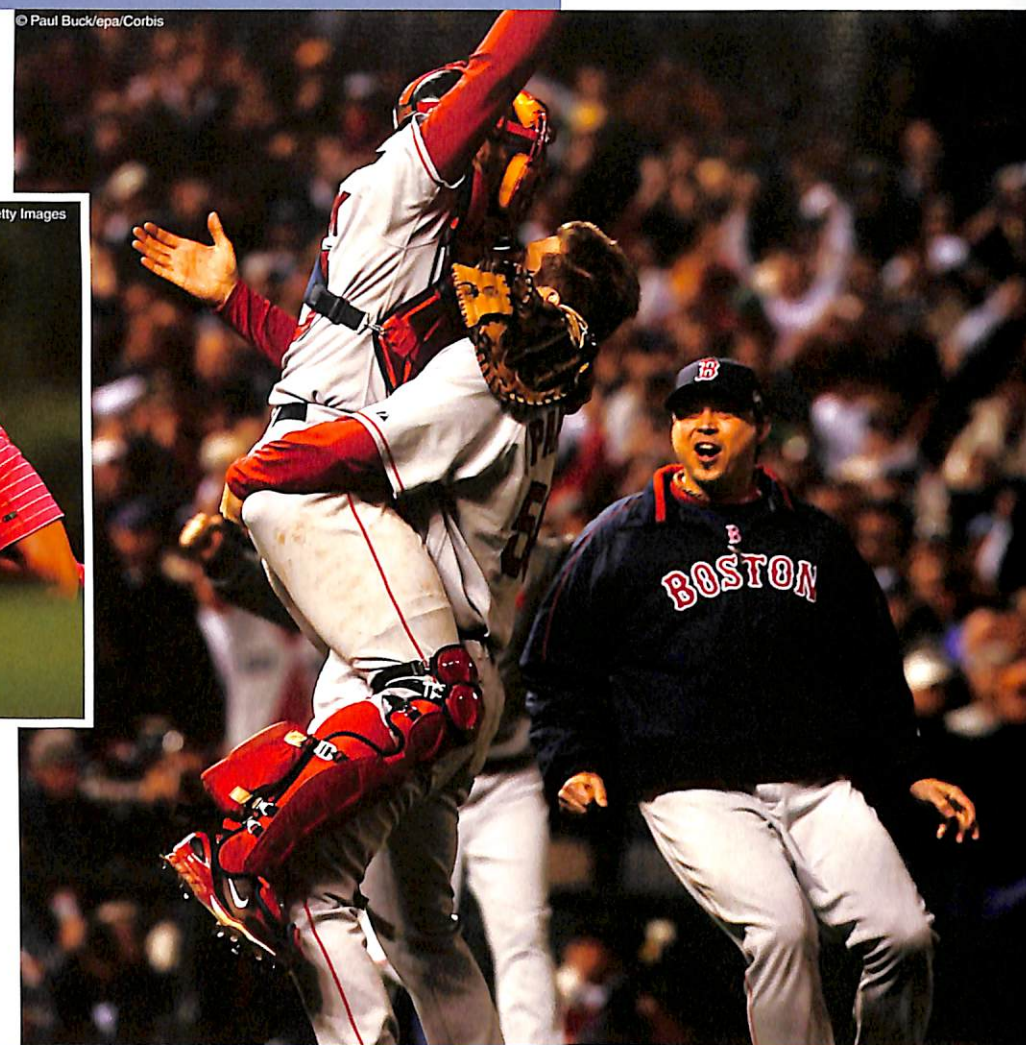

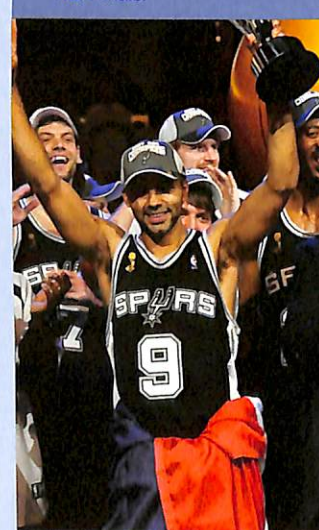

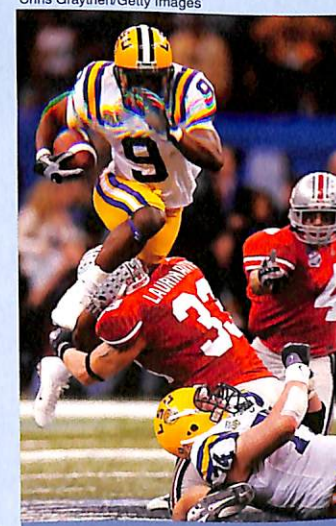

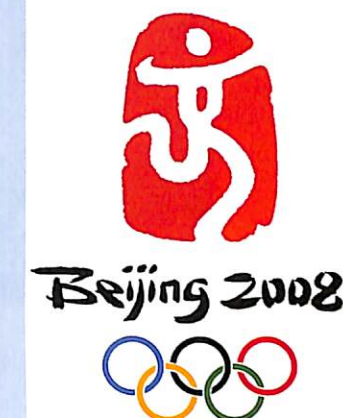

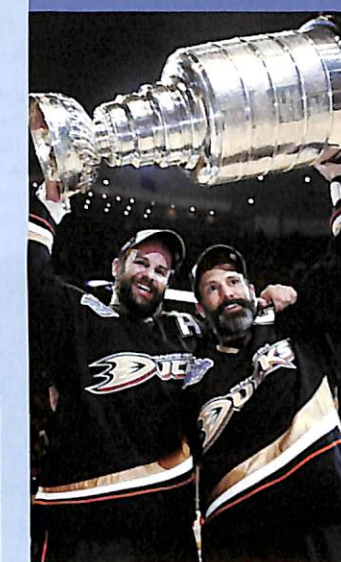

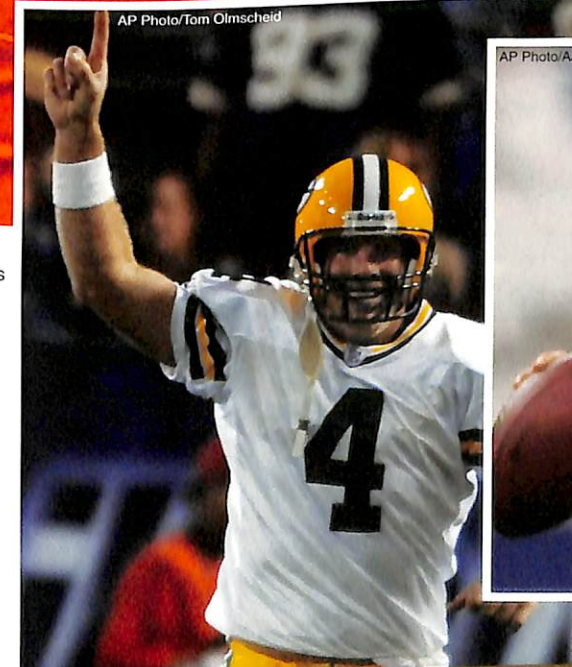

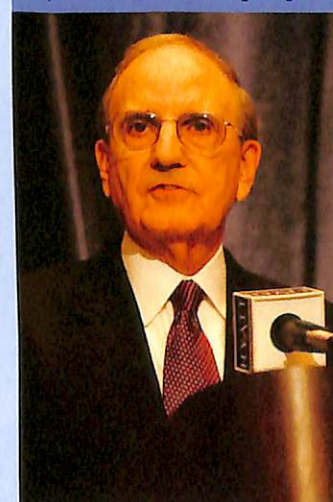

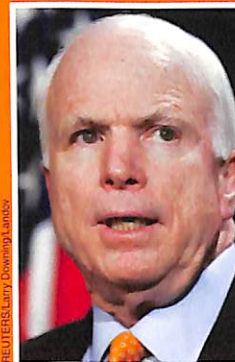

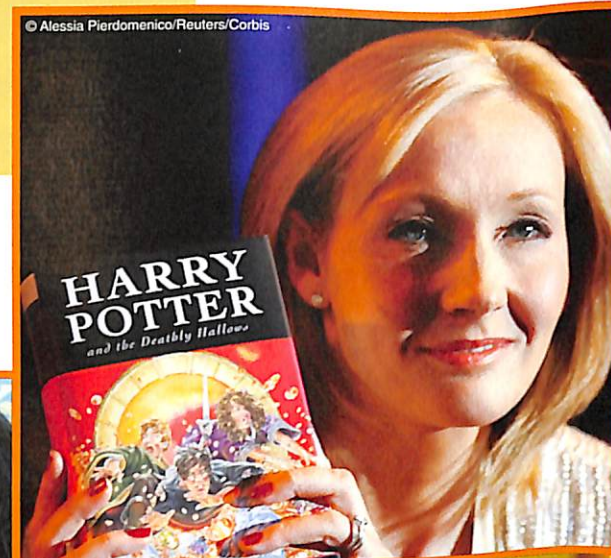

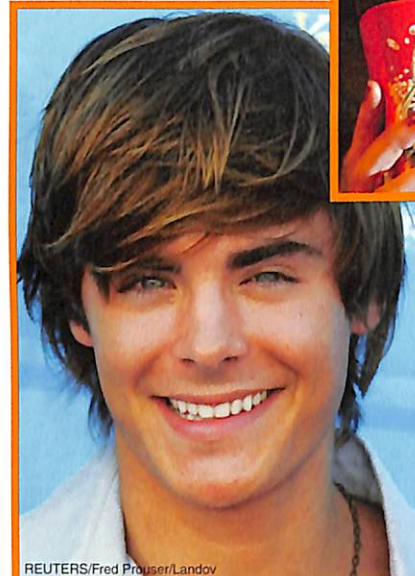

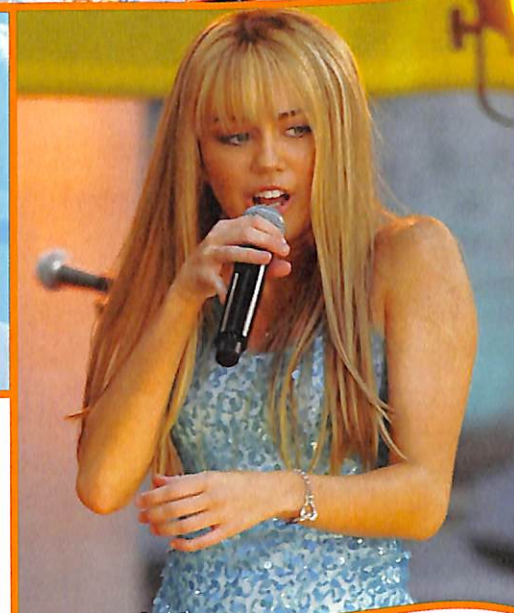

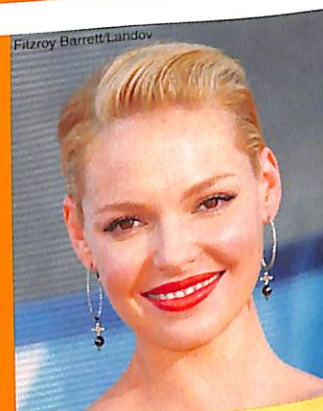
