#### A WHALE OF A PROJECT


The Whale Project and study of Whales came from a new course in Science, Technology, and Society. The class was studying endangered creatures. The whales were featured to the students first, followed by other creatures. Lee Hasselbring, Teacher













When the whales were first introduced to us the class was not very interested. However, as we started to compare the different whales with each other and became more educated with the actual size, it seemed like a whole new class.

We took various steps leading up to the actual construction of the wind tunnel whale which Junior Sims built. First the class chose the whale we would duplicate, the Sperm Whale. Second we compared the size of the whale to things we were already familiar with, like a school bus. Then we painted the actual size on a hill behind the school. More background research and studying was done before we could construct the whale, which Ms. Youngblood, art teacher, assisted us with. Following our research we began to assemble our whale. The whale was put together by two sides cut out exactly the same, then taped together. A lot of props were made along with more art works and the whale was completed.

Invitations were made for people to come and experience the whale, such as A.F.R.T.S., teachers, and Chaffee Elementary School students. All went very well for an educational experience.


