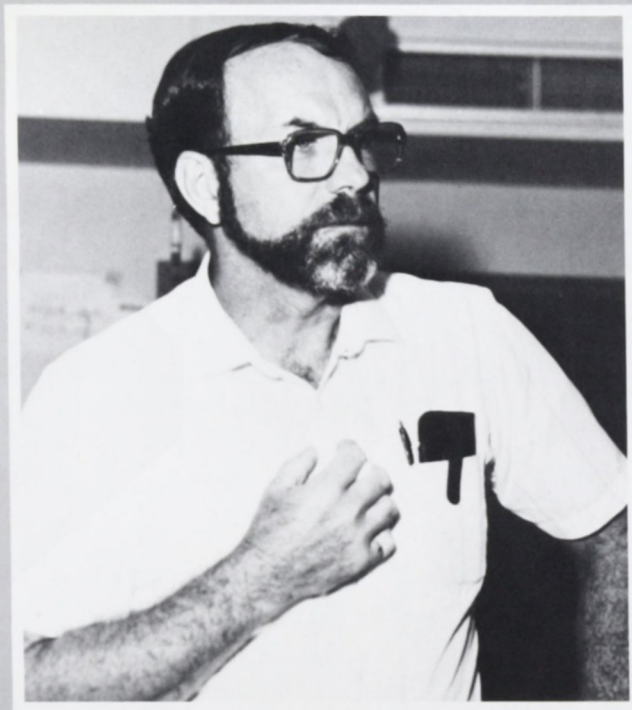
Dear Students,

At the end of this year we bid farewell to the class of 1988. We wish them every success as they meet the challenges and make their mark in the world as productive citizens.

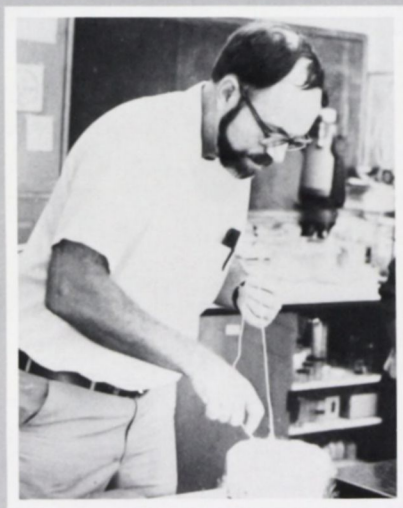

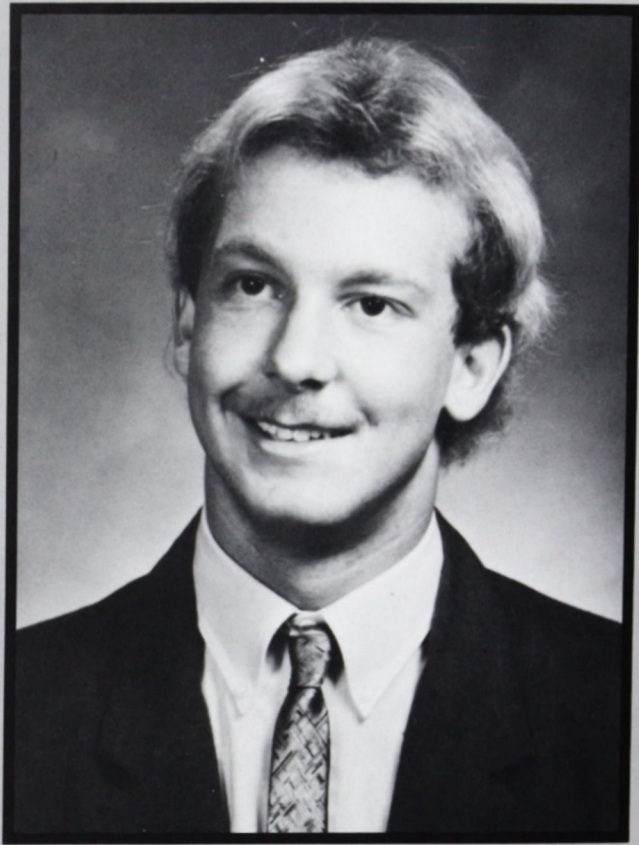
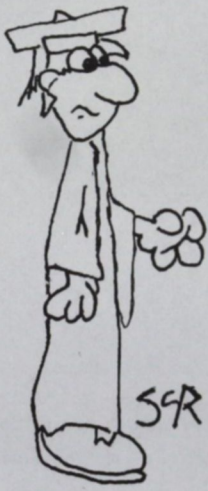
CLASS OF 1988 PREDICTS ...
