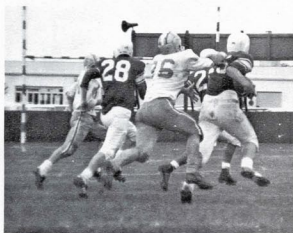
BAD KREUZNACH

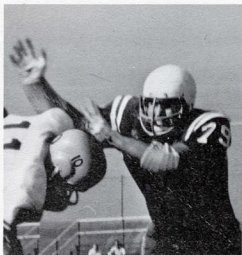
BAUMHOLDER

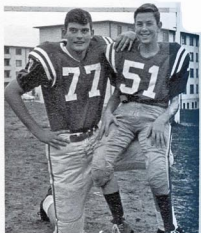
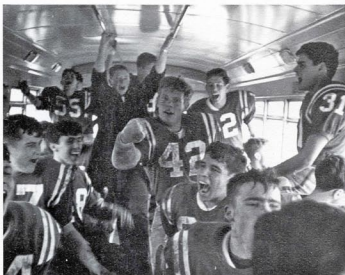

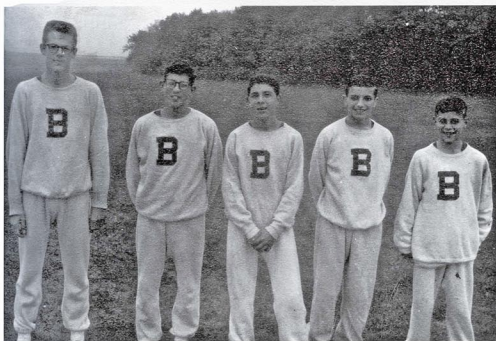


AUGSBURG

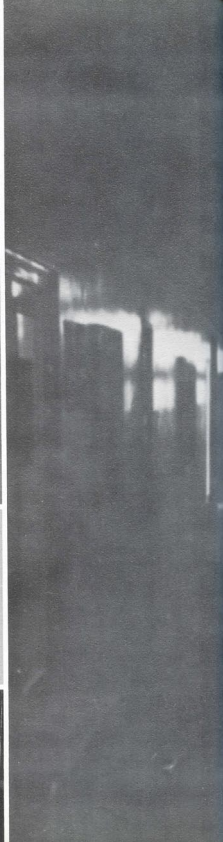


DRAMA CLUB
