
BARON SHIELD 1968



Nineteen Sixty-eight marks the 14th birthday of Bitburg High School, Situated in the Eiffel Mountains of Western Germany. the school boasts a total enrollment of 909 students: 530 in the senior high and 379 in the junior high, Since 1955 the gradnating class has grown from seven to 89. Students who attend BHS are from base housing at Bitburg, Trier and Spangdahlem. They also live in towns around the area: Prum, Kyllburg, Luxembourg Ville, and others. The faculty this year has a total of 39 teachers, three guidance counselors, and three principals. Bitburg is accredited by North Central Association and is financed by the Department of Defense.

Bithurg is growing in more than just size. School tradition and pride, individual character, and accomplishments are on the increase, too. In the following pages these accomplishments of individual spirit are portrayed through the activities of members of Bithurg High School.






Stronger than dirt!
