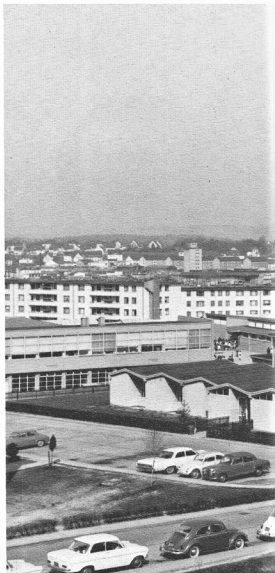

Nineteen Sixty-eight marks the 14th birthday of Bitburg High School. Situated in the Eiffel Mountains of Western Germany, the school boasts a total enrollment of 909 students; 530 in the senior high and 379 in the junior high. Since 1955 the graduating class has grown from seven to 89. Students who attend BHS are from base housing at Bitburg, Trier and Spangdahlem. They also live in towns around the area: Prum, Kyllburg, Luxembourg Ville, and others. The faculty this year has a total of 39 teachers, three guidance counselors, and three principals. Bitburg is accredited by North Central Association and is financed by the Department of Defense.

Bitburg is growing in more than just size. School tradition and pride, individual character, and accomplishments are on the increase, too. In the following pages these accomplishments of individual spirit are portrayed through the activities of members of Bitburg High School.

The Mannheim Bisons beat the Barons by a narrow margin of 20-26. The larger and more experienced Mannheim defense held the Barons to only three TDs, but the spirit was certainly there!

In their first away game, the Barons were defeated by the Augsburg Apaches by a score of 14-8. It was very disheartening because the Barons went into the game rated over the Apaches. Mike Barnhill and Harry Minard starred

on offense.

In the third game of the season, the Berlin Bears met the Barons on Pioneer Field at Spangdahlem Air Base. We matched TD for TD and were leading 18 to 20 when, with only three minutes remaining the Bears scored. Al Lindsay starred on offense with a 96 yd kickoff return for the last Baron TD.

The Barons' next victory came when they met the Wuerzburg Wolves. The only score in the game came three minutes after the opening kickoff, on a safety made by Gary Wilson. It was the best defensive Game Bitburg played all season with Gary Wilson and Sonny Rasar (who made three interceptions in the game starring on defense.

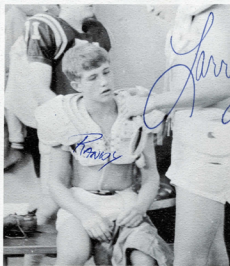


Stronger than dirt!

Traveling to Baumholder, the Barons upset the Bucs by a score of 20-6, to hand them a defeat for their homecoming. Adverse weather conditions hindered the Baron drive but Harry Minard and Mike Barnhill starred on offense with Harry scoring 14 points and Mike six points.

November 4 was a dismal day when Mannheim beat the Barons again by a score of 40-8, for their homecoming victory. Carter and Jackson, the Bisons' crack offensive combo ran TD after TD. A pass from Mike Barnhill to Wendell Pryor accounted for Bitburg's points, with the conversion successful thus ending the season, with an overall record of two wins and four losses in official games.
