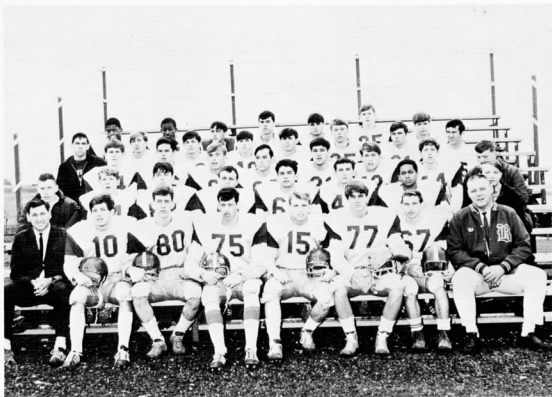

Coach Bill Houston's Barons opened the season away at Brunnsun for an exhibition game and rolled to an avalanche score of 54-0 to set the theme for the 1968 football season. Despite a loss at Berlin and a dismal Homecoming loss at the hands of Baumholder's Bucs, the Bitburgers were one of the top-scoring teams in USDESEA as they rolled up 222 points to the opponents' 56 for the season. The Barons placed five on the All-Conference squad and three on the USDESEA eleven, with three members of the All-Conference going both ways. With a 5-2 record overall and 4-2 in conference standings, the Barons finished the year in a tie for second place.

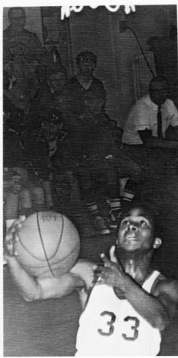

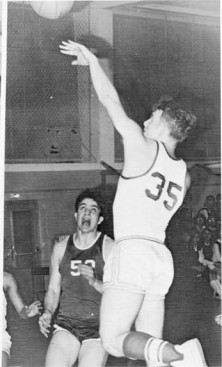

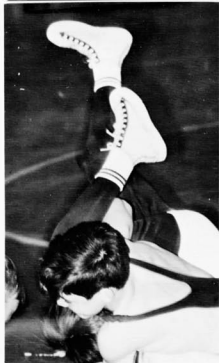

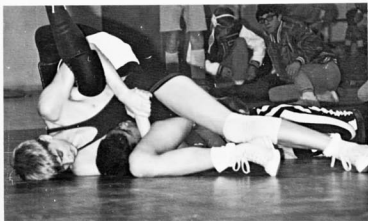
Class B Regional Champs

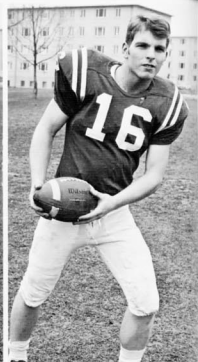

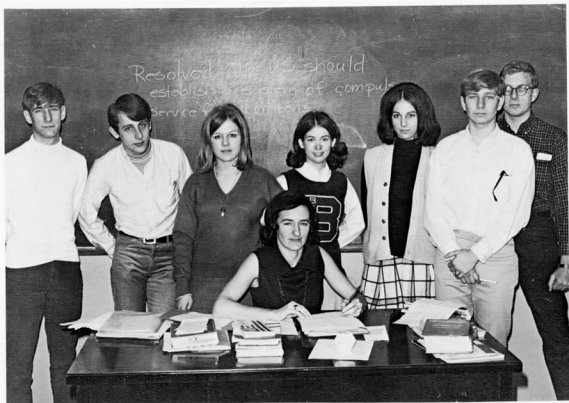

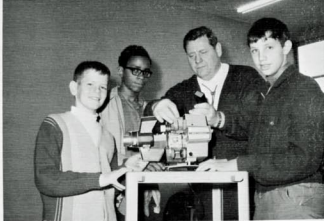

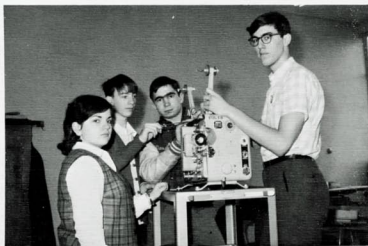

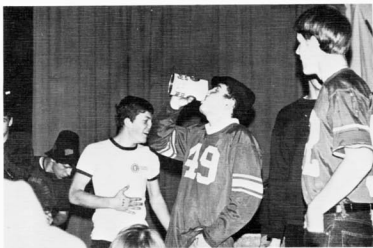

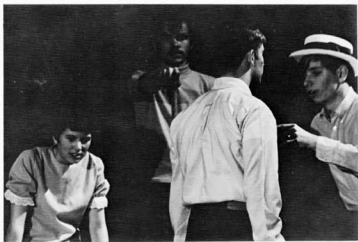

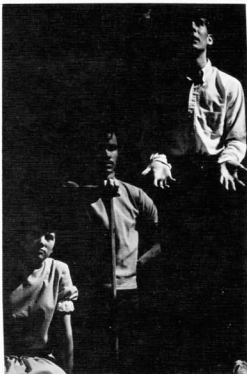
