like waking up from a night's dream.

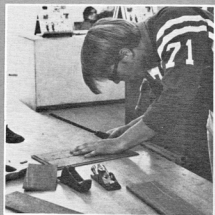

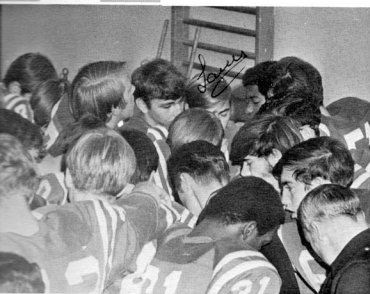
Lee Mawby's and Jack Nicholson's Blue Machine easily cut through this years competition to finish undefeated in seven encounters. Beginning with a four team scrimmage at K-Town the Barons showed their ability. After defeating Shape, Berlin, and Augsburg the Blue Machine reached a peak by pulling through in the second half to defeat Mannheim 15-8. This year saw a lot of teamwork -- the Barons being the most prolific team in Europe pointwise -- scoring 219 pts. Defensively the Barons held their opponents to only 83 points.

Individual performances were outstanding. At the end of the season three men were to be top scorers in Europe -- Roy Young with 88 pts. and the number one spot. Chuck Lindsey and Pete Budde also made the grade. Nine men were to make all conference teams including Wayne Duncen and Phil Ruffu both ways. The others were Mike Caldwell, Mike Lindsey, Chuck Lindsey, Roy Young, Pete Budde, Mike Mawby, and Keith Boyce. Certainly this year's Barons showed it was a time to win.

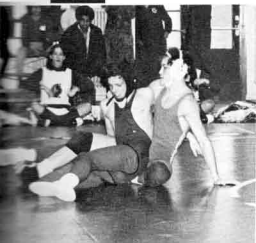

Finishing the first day, the Barons had seven men in the finals, out of those, four took firsts and three second. Bitburg defeated all competition in the Regionals including the Class A schools to become Northern Regionals Class B Champions. Nine men in all wrestled their way to the USDESEA European Finals in Wiesbaden.
