








Mrs. Cavanaugh, School Nurse


Did you always want to be a registrar? "I never really thought much about being a registrar until I was offered the job. However, I did want to work at a school."

What is the hardest part of your job? "When everyone wants reports or info at once."



Russian School **Hostage Crisis**

An estimated 30 Chechen militants raided a school in Beslan, Russia, and took more than 1,000 people hostage. A bomb accidently went off and some 339 hostages were killed, half of them children.

Flu Vaccine Shortage

The United States lost nearly half of its anticipated influenza vaccine supply due to contamination. British regulators found widespread problems at the manufacturer, Chiron Corp. The CDC suggested only "high-risk" people should be able to receive a vaccination.

Devasting Tsunamis \Rightarrow

The Indian Ocean earthquake that occurred on December 26th produced tsunamis that were among the deadliest natural disasters in modern history. The death toll was over 150,000 people in at least 11 countries. Indonesia, Sri Lanka, India and Thailand were hardest hit. Many people including tourists were missing and thousands left homeless. Relief agencies warned of thousands of more deaths as a result of disease and starvation. The magnitude 9 quake prompted a widespread humanitarian response.


Basketball Brawl
