 gone.

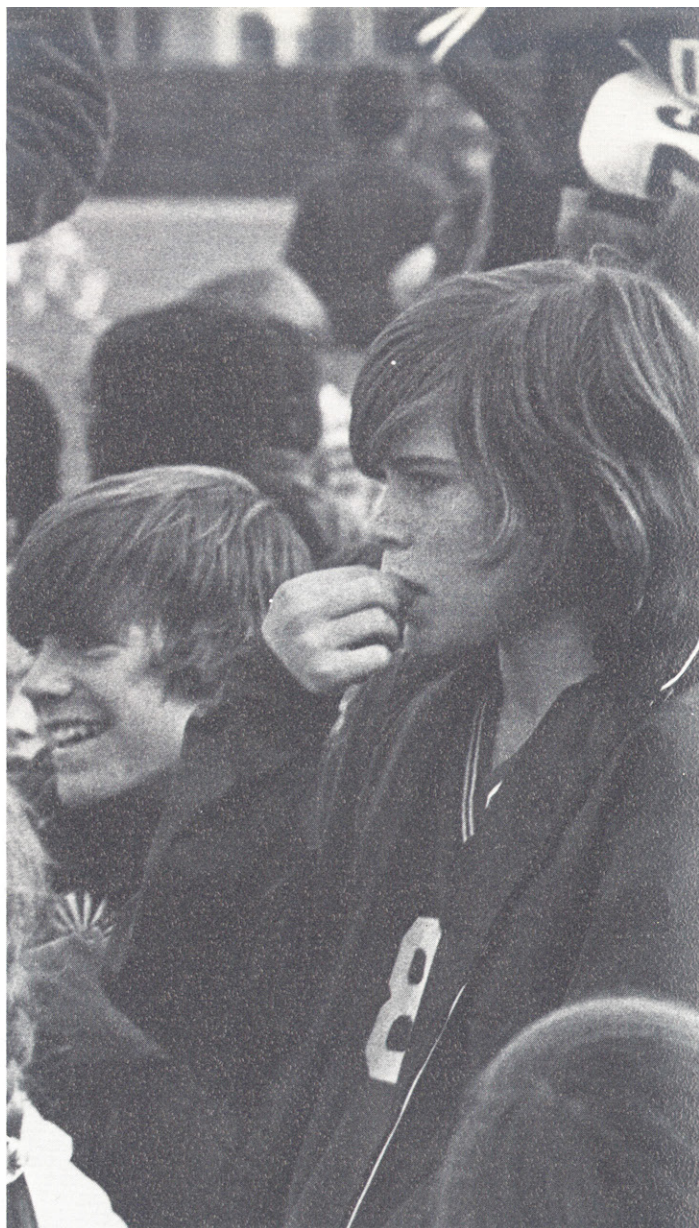

Man b-ball is some kind of game. Its beautiful, its just too much. You got to admit b-ball is fantastic.





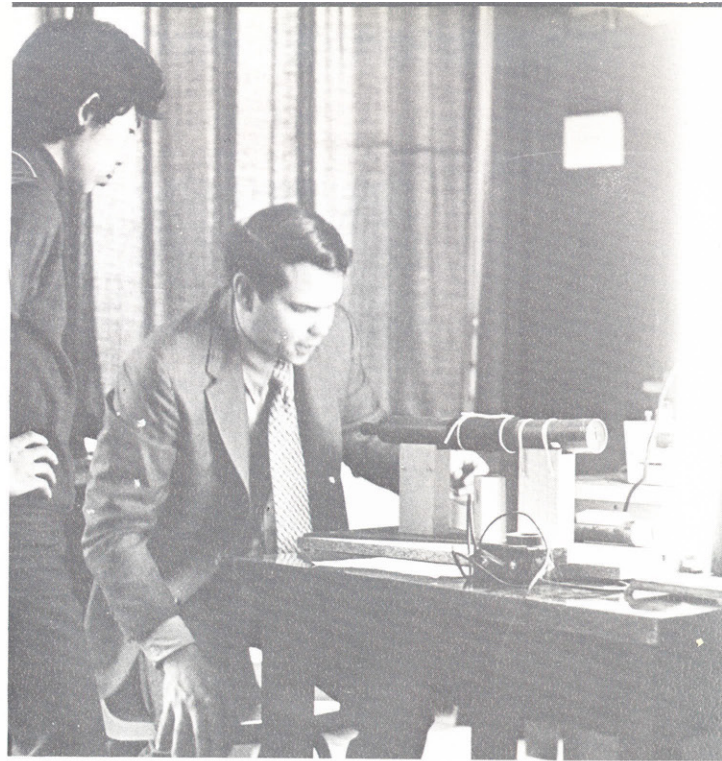

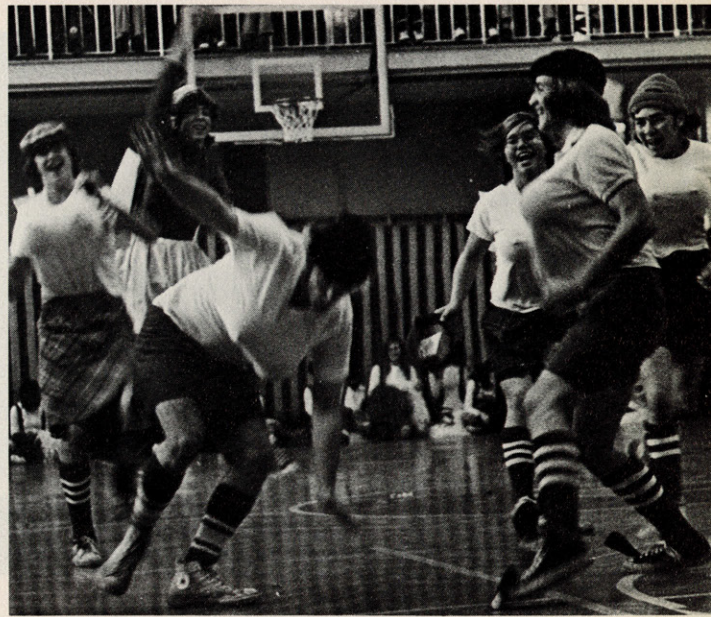
What is Student Life here at Bonn?
