

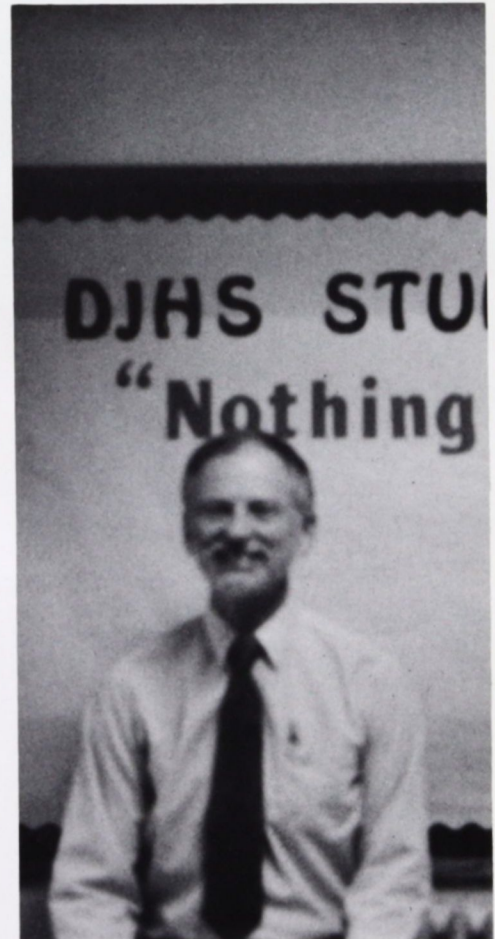
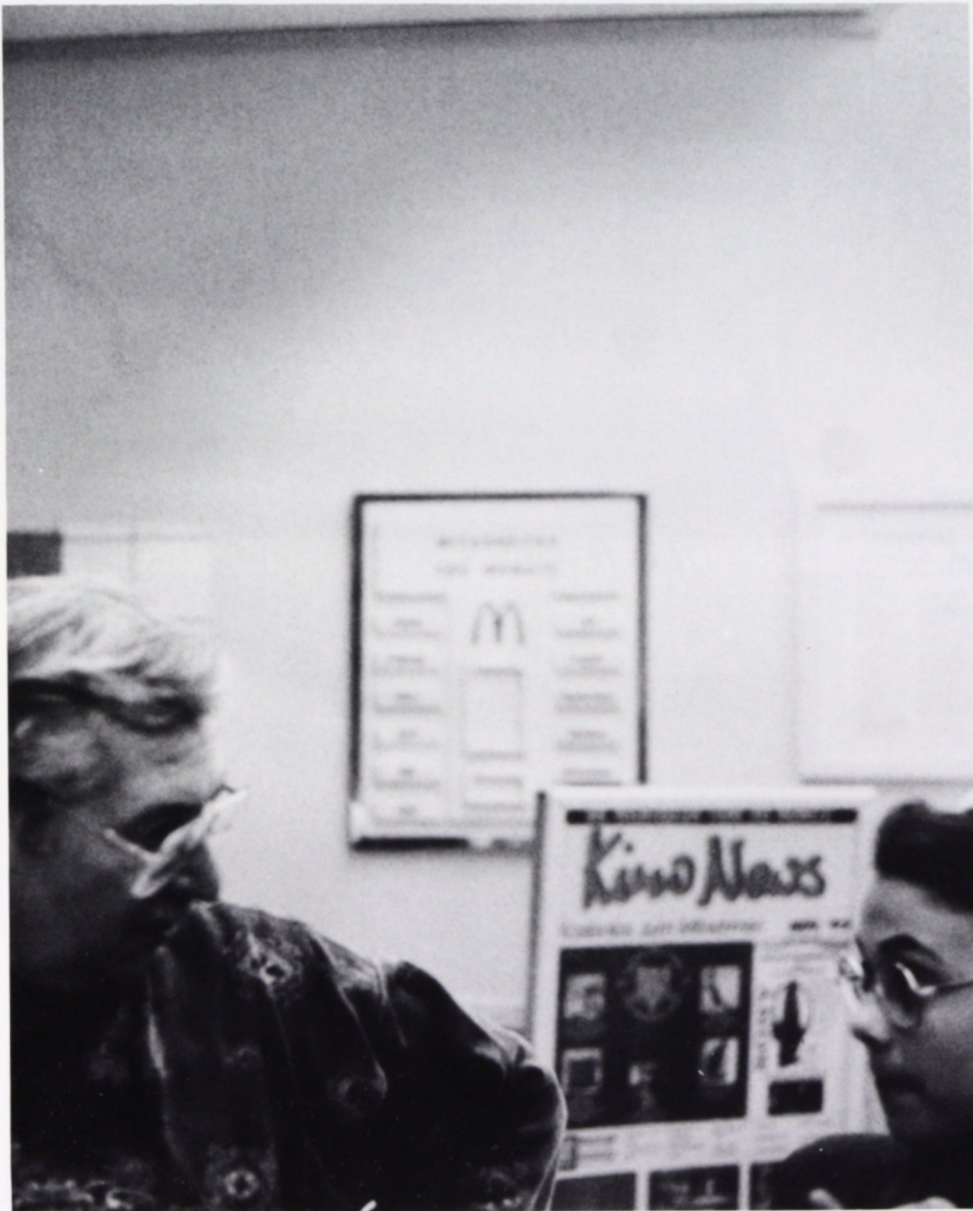
Mr. Basarich and Mr. Hendrick are Two super principals. They work as a team to get any job done. Shown above, they get a little recognition on Bosses' Day.






Mr. Basarich leads this lively group through their version of the "Star Spangled Banner", just before an exciting basketball game.



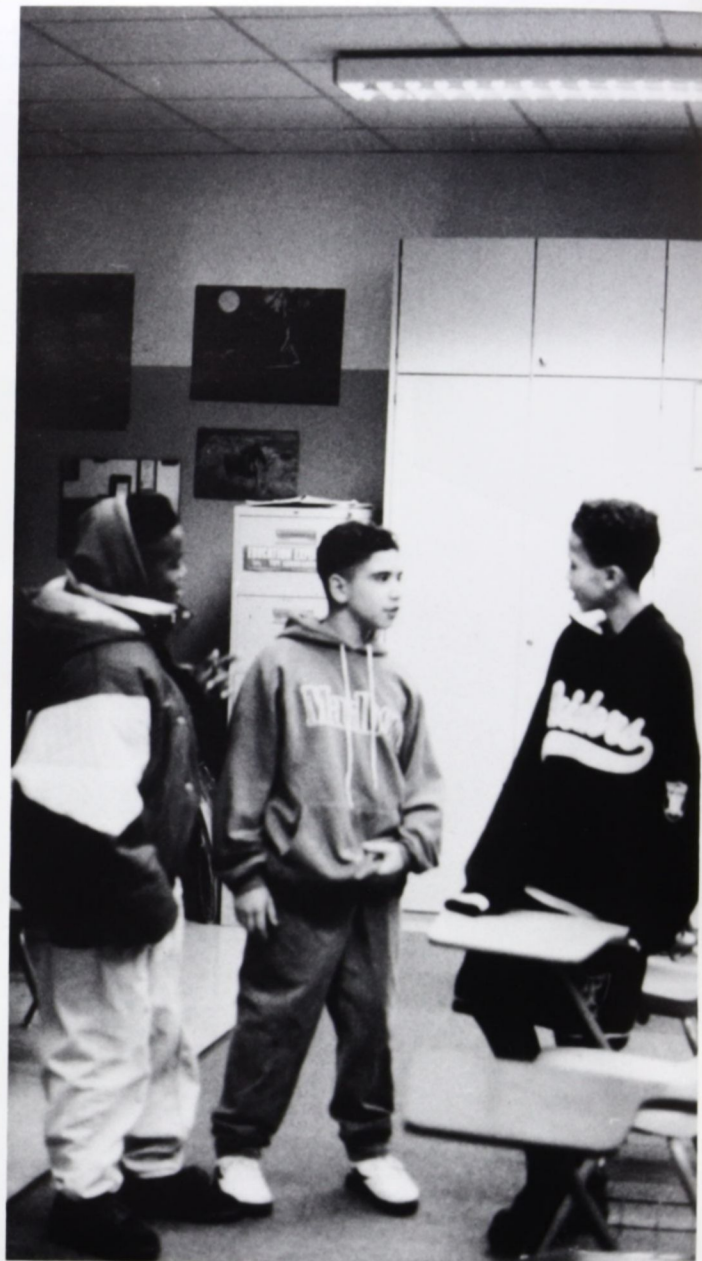
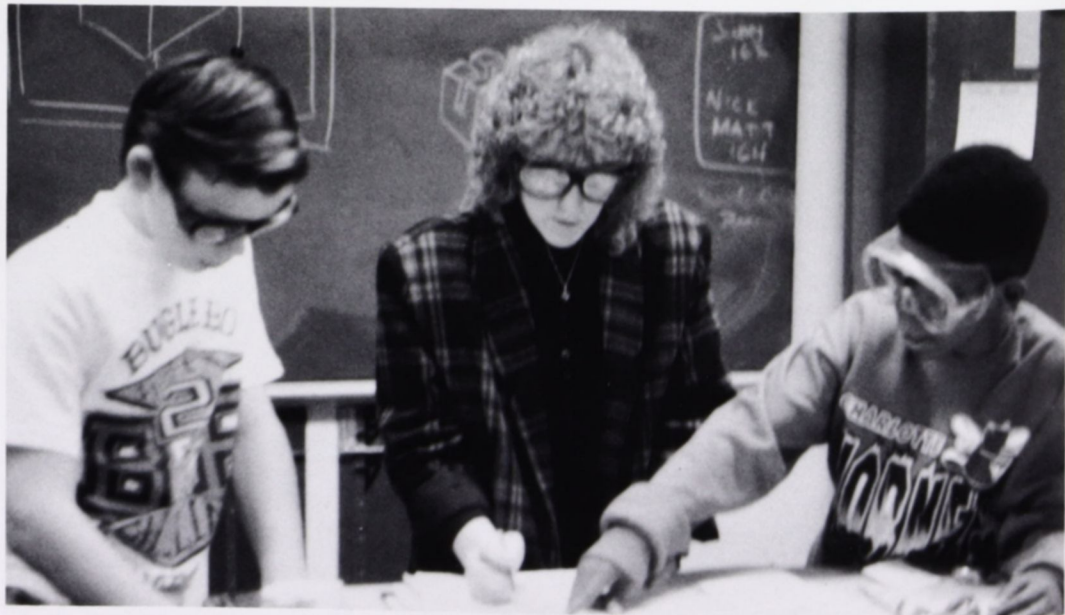


Kiara takes a break after skating a few laps around the ice-skating rink. She was one of the many 6th graders having fun at the reward trip!

Ms. Hicks really keeps the 6th graders busy. Today, these two students worked on cutting wood.

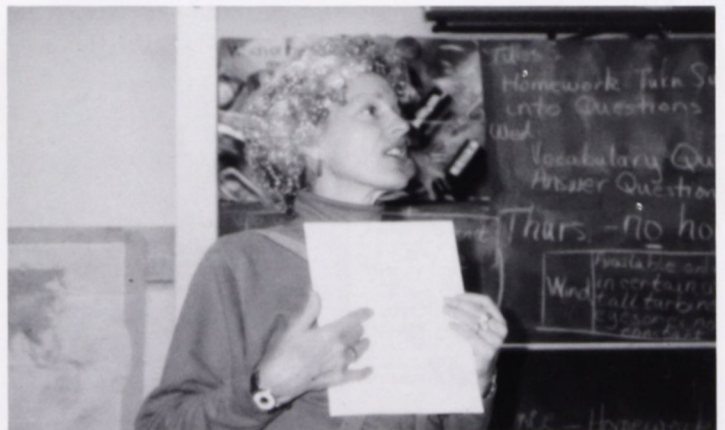

Sixth Grade Teachers Give The Students Their All!



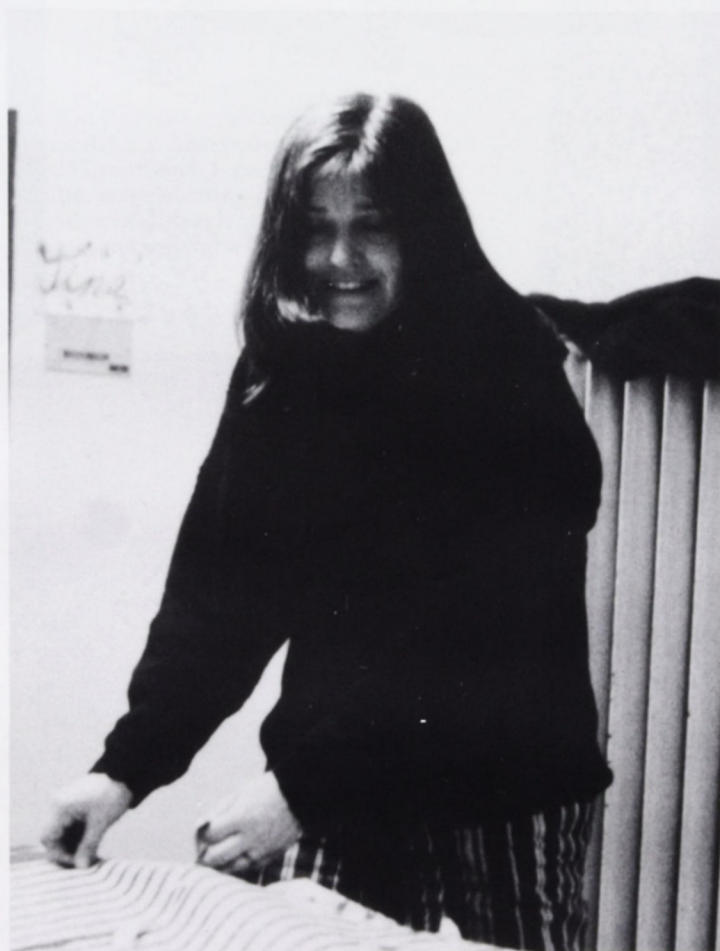



This is Ms. Drumm's 8th grade science class. As you can see, most of them are working hard. As you can also see, most need her help!

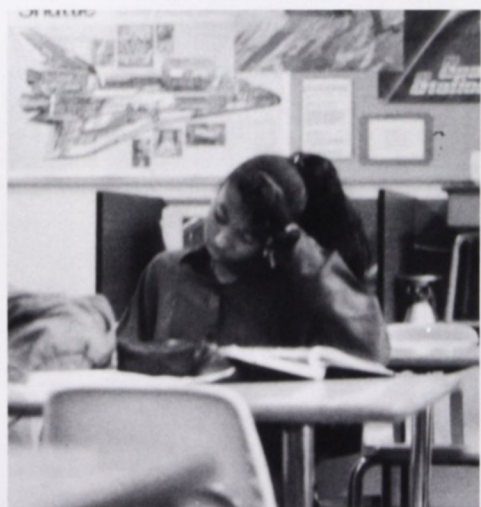
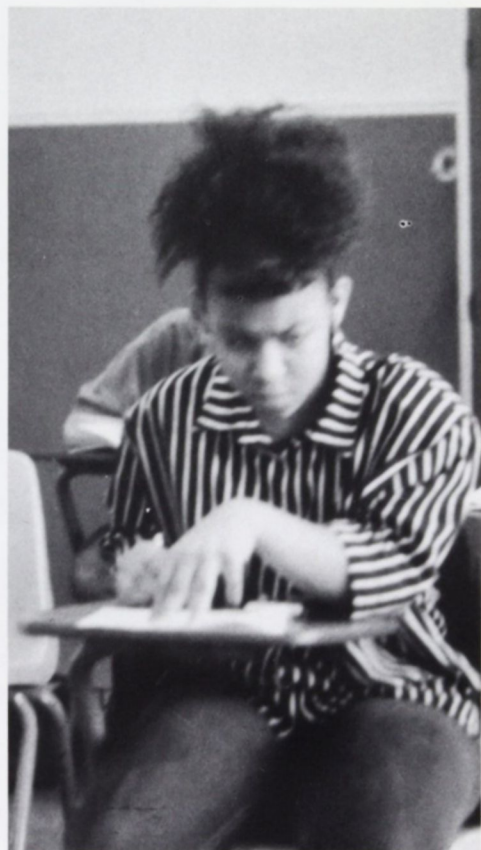
This is Mrs. Schaefer's 8th grade math class. Millie and Janine are such good math students because they concentrate very hard.

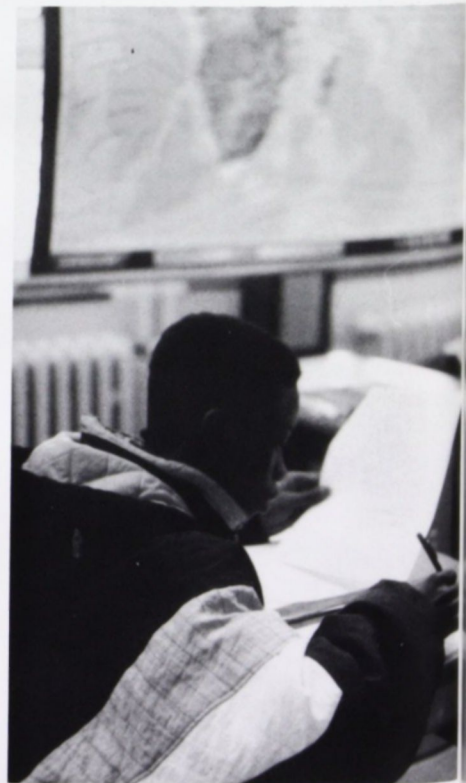


9th Graders Always Think About Life

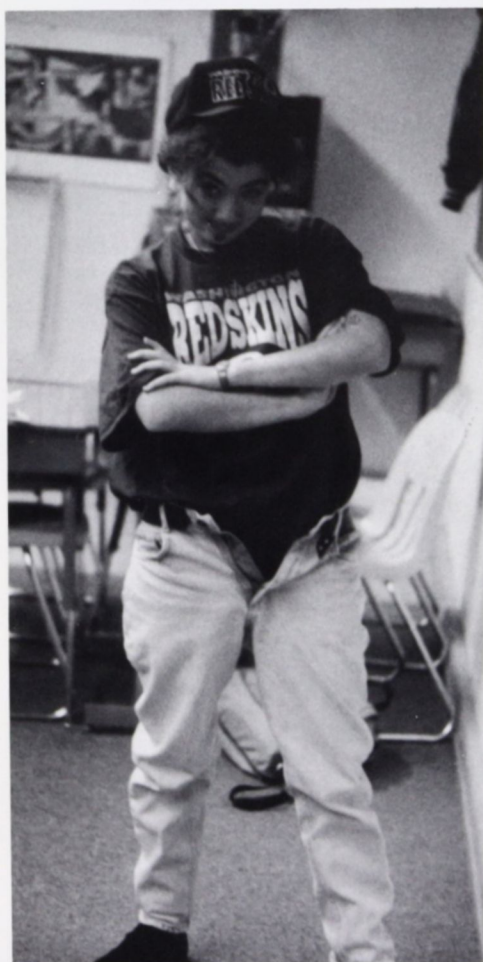

This group has on pajamas, but they don't look quite as sleepy. As a matter of fact, Ursula and Simira look perky!

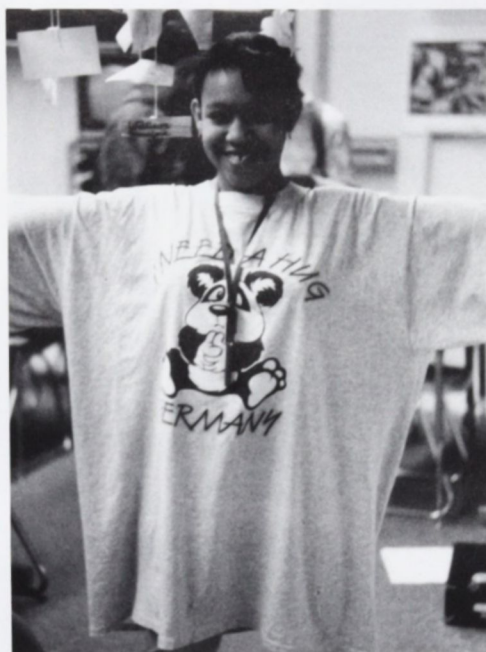


SCHOOL COLORS DAY AND GET UP AND GO DAY


Now who wouldn't mind seeing these cheerful faces in the morning. They all look adorable. Those fuzzy slippers look soooo comfy!

Shayla Keller sang a beautiful version of "The Best Time of the Year." Her vocals were a highlight in the program.

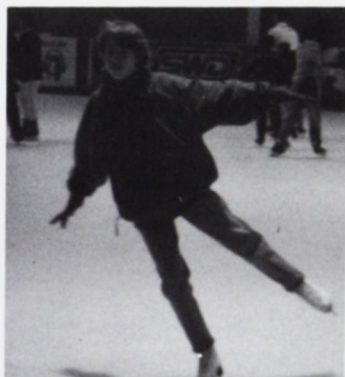
These are the 7th grade members of the After-school Chorus. This select group of students enhanced the choir.

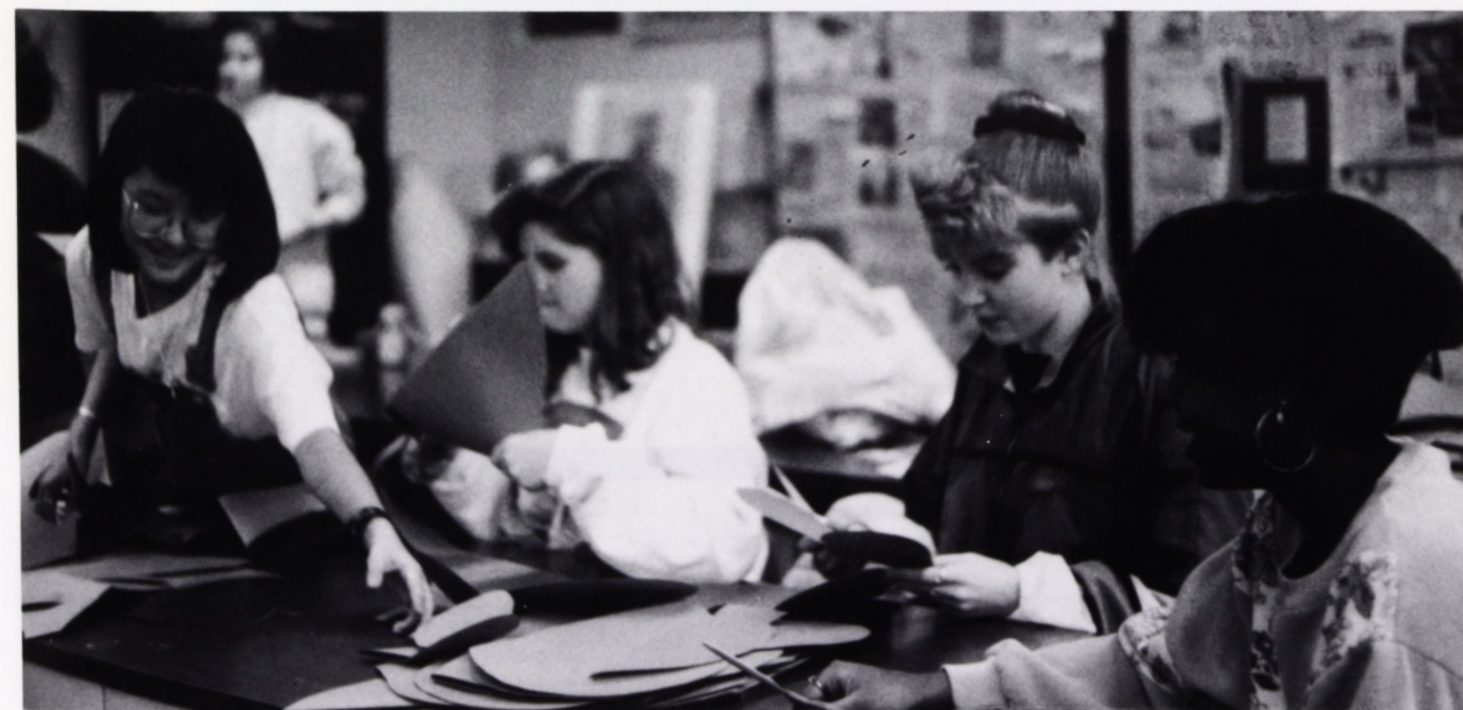
