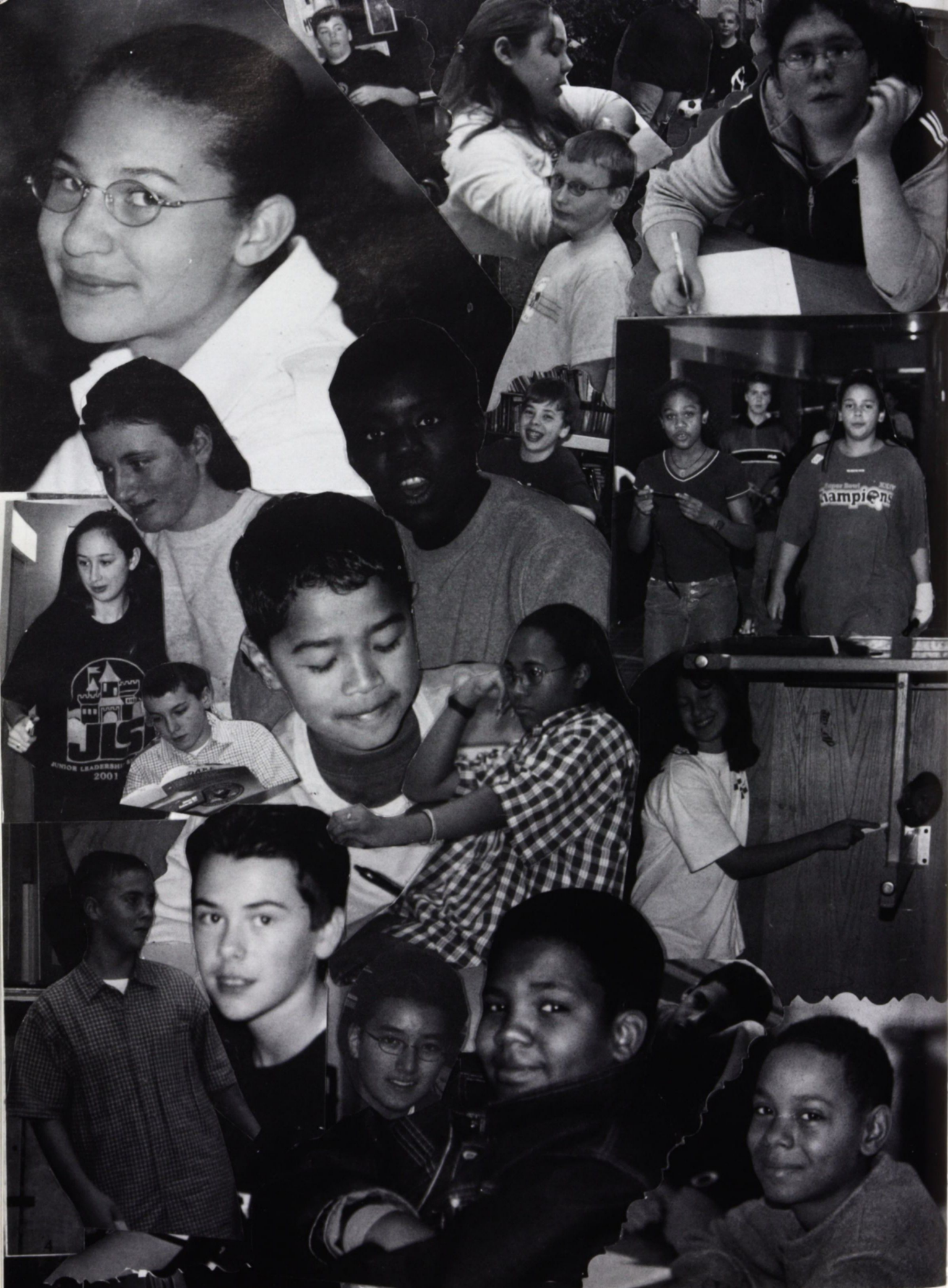

We can no longer daydream.

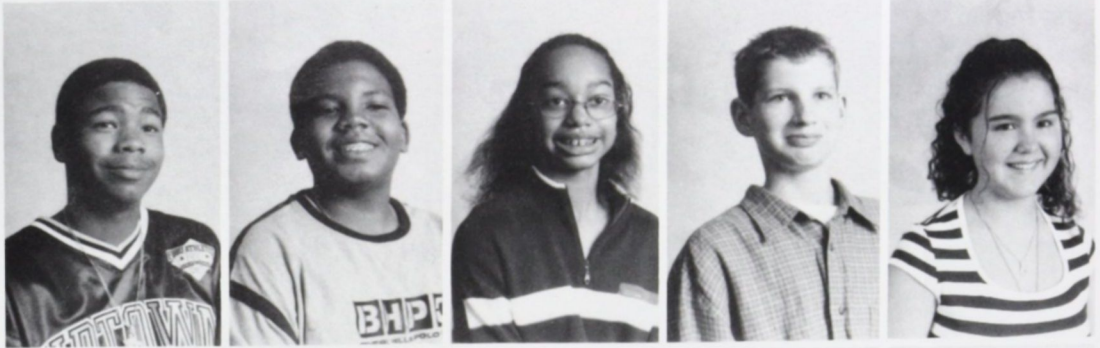

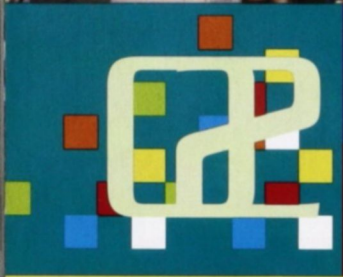

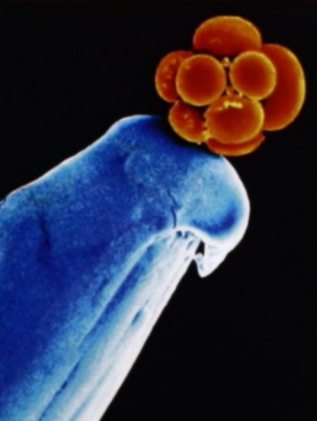

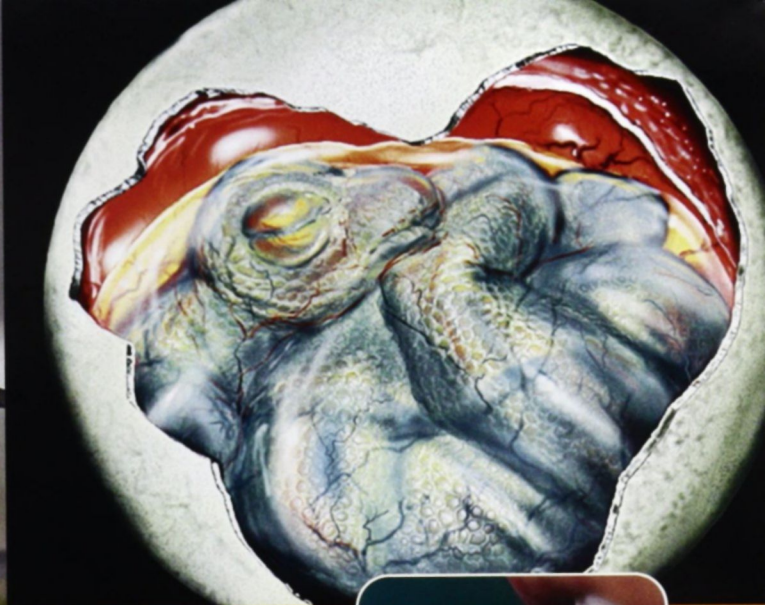

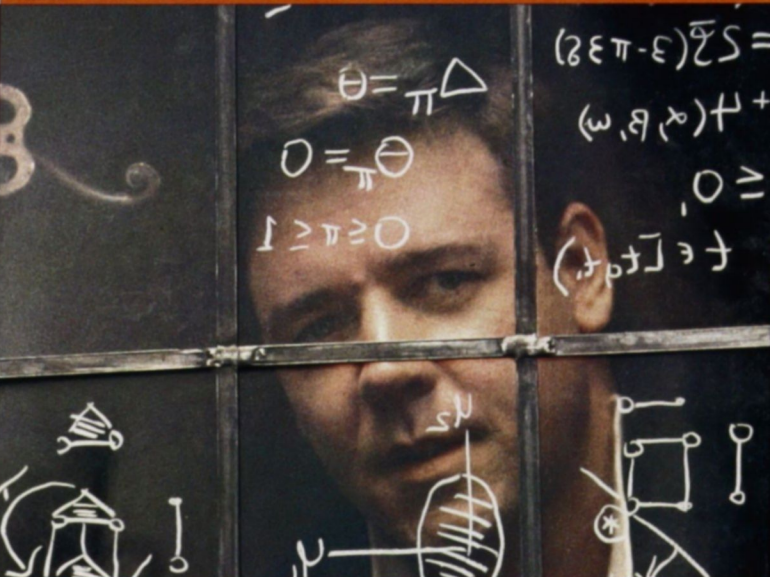

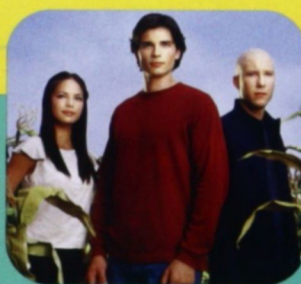

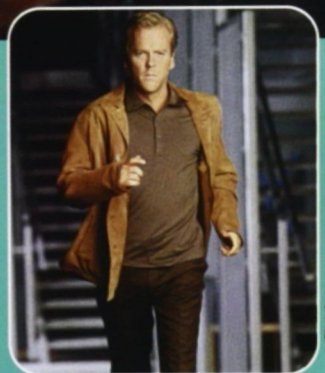

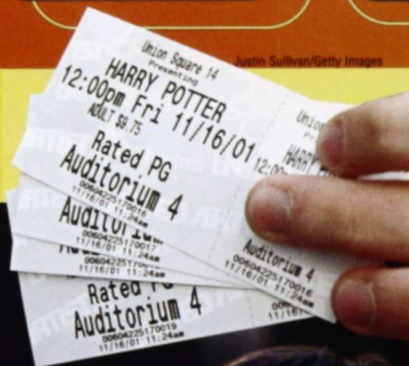

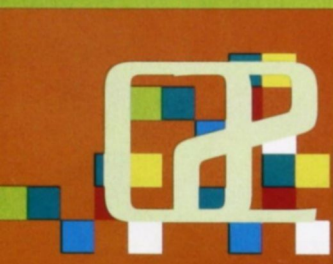
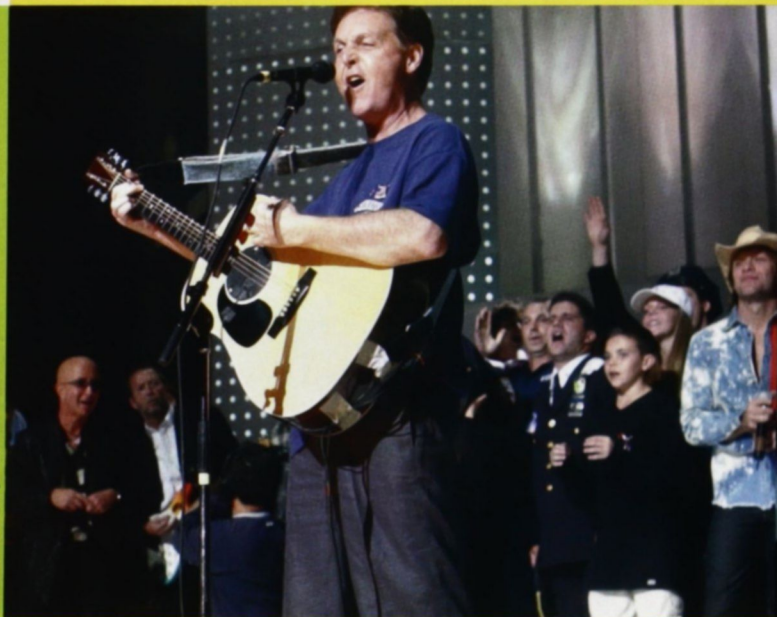

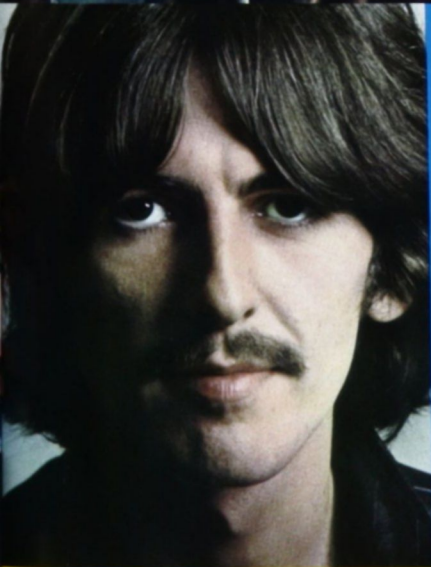

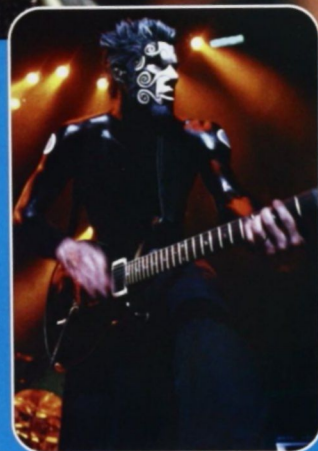

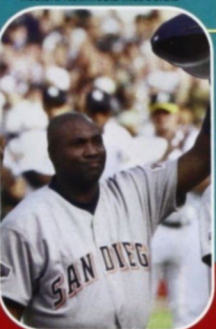

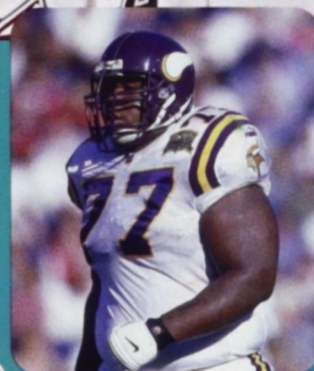
