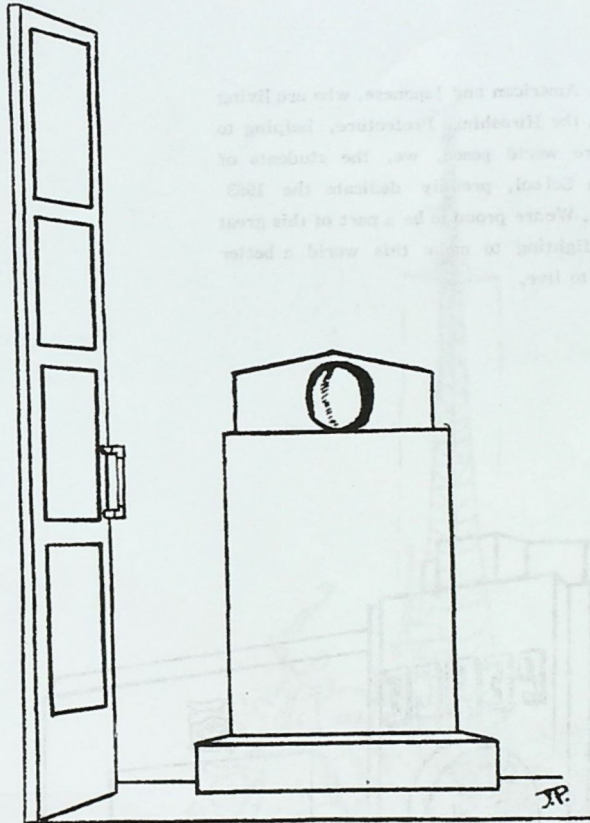

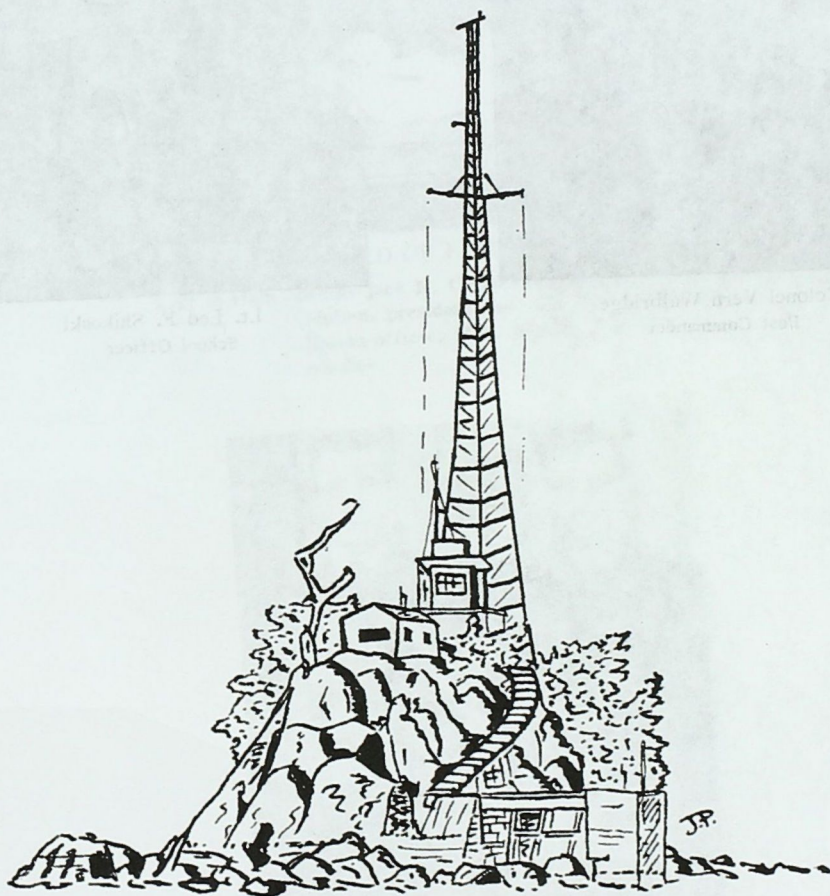
# DEDICATION

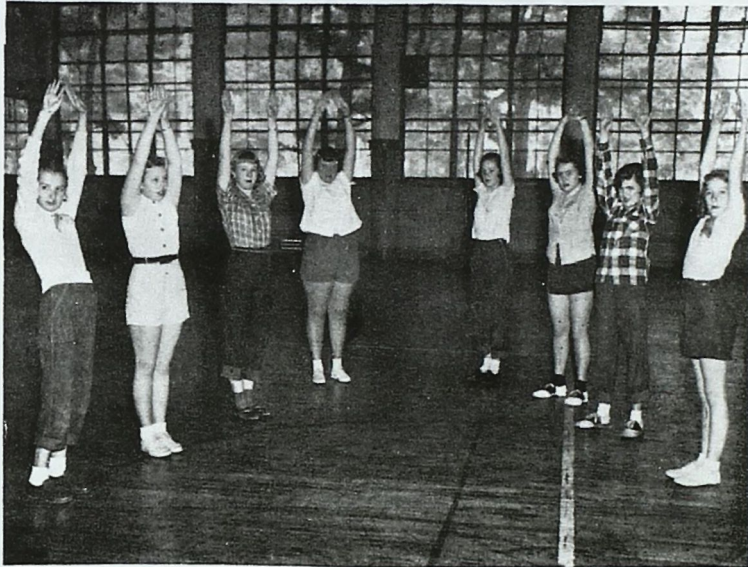

Al Bahr

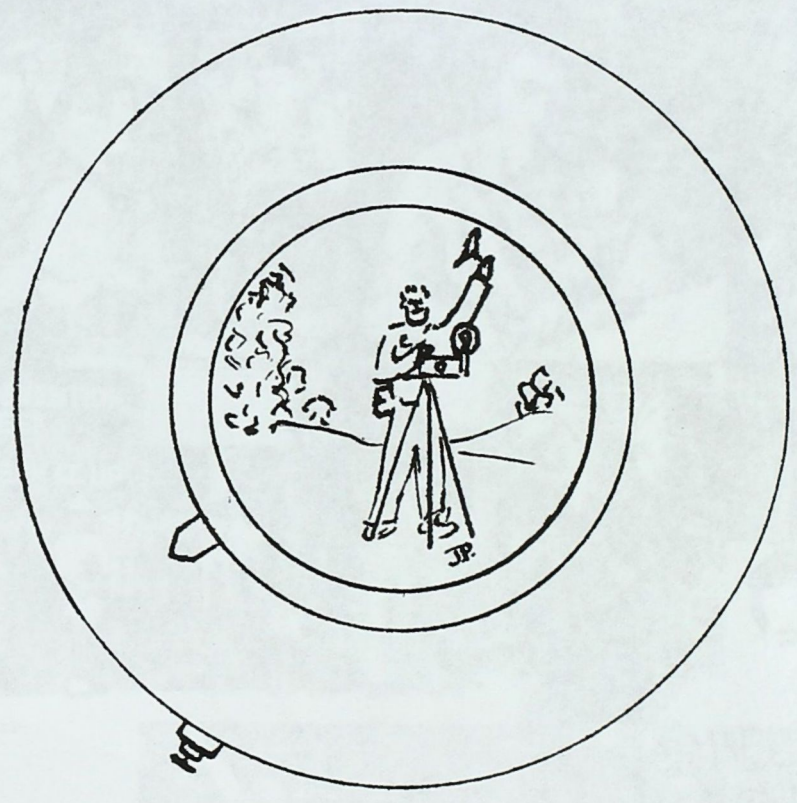

Ginny Severeid

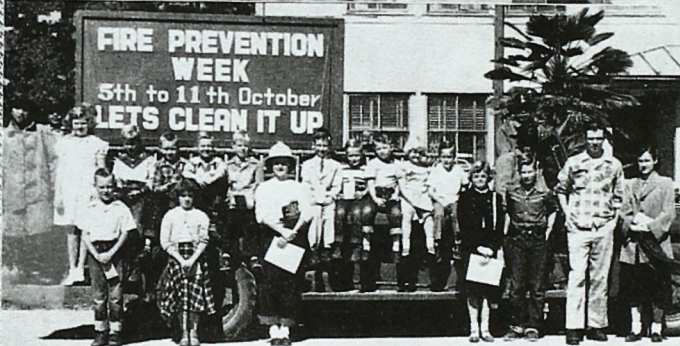
