


## 1946-1976

Frankfurt American High School opened in 1946 in a former German Elementary School in a section of Frankfurt known as Bornheim. This building was glass enclosed for natural lighting and was situated on the top of a hill in a pleasantly wooded area. It was only natural that it was called the "Eagles Nest" by the students.

The enrollment soon outgrew the Bornheim building and in 1955 the school was moved into the present building. The school has grown from an enrollment of 146 to its present size of over 1,400 students.

In 1957 "Silver City," the complex of Quonset Huts adjacent to the main building, was erected to relieve the bulging enrollment already being experienced at Frankfurt High School. These additional eight classrooms soon became inadequate to handle the ever increasing enrollment. In September 1961, "Annex A," a five-minute walk from the main building, was opened to accommodate six additional classrooms which has since expanded to over 40 rooms. The Industrial Arts building with laboratories, electronics, drafting, and auto mechanics was added in 1970.






### FRANKFURT V. WIESBADEN


## **Tournaments**






**TENNIS 1977**
