#### NEW RELEASES AT FHS

















# HOMECOMING DANCE 1981







#### STAR SPANGLED GIRL

#### YEARBOOK DANCE








## BAND IN ACTION







#### HARMONY HOUSE
































## COSMETOLOGY CLINIC

The honor of All-Conference went to Gretchen Daily and Erika Walker and the well deserved MVP of the season went to Andrea Jones.








#### IN MEMORIAM

From 1967 to 1981 there was a very special presence at Frankfurt American High School. We all knew him as "The Maestro," and he brought a wonderful feeling of old-world elegance into our lives — a kind of elegance which hardly exists anymore. The way he carried himself, the wonderful deep bass voice, the cat-like alertness and the falcon eyes were things we came to take for aranted.

His patience in trying to bring along beginners in the art and sport of fencing, which he breathed as a kind of rarified air, was something that will always be remembered. His faithfulness even when it was a real burden to him reflected the fact that the respect, admiration and fondness for him was returned: We were "his Americans."

The fencing program which Maestro Amilcare Angelini made possible at Frankfurt High School was unique in our whole school system, and when the last of a long series of heart attacks took him away at the age of seventy, a great fencing master, a great man and a dear friend was lost.

We suspect, though, that he's still somewhere in the halls, saber in hand, looking for a worthy opponent. He won't find one though: there aren't any.

This year's class innovated the "Birthday-Gram," which was very well received by students and teachers alike. No doubt the Birthday-Gram will become a tradition for the class.



Mr. Ried left us unexpectedly in late January. It is to him we dedicate this yearbook.


In a memorial service to him, Mr. Hugh McGinnis offered a poignant tribute to this great teacher, who for years injected music into the souls of FAHS students:
