

Eligibility/Registration Requirements

Eligibility for Fort Benning Schools requires residency in permanent family housing. If housing is not available upon your arrival to Fort Benning, but will be available within 180 school days, the housing office will provide a written statement for registration purposes. Please bring this statement along with the other required documentation for registration.

Sponsors of RETURNING STUDENTS will need:

- To update and sign DoDEA Student Registration Form 600 for ALL students, preschool through 7th grade, who presently attend a Fort Benning school and who will be returning to Fort Benning for the upcoming school year.
- Verification of Active Duty Status (i.e., current orders if not on file in the school office, deployment orders, sponsor's active duty ID card, or letter from military command verifying active duty status on the first day of the 2009-2010 school year).
- Verification of on-post residency will be verified through housing by school registrars prior to the start of the new school year. Sponsors will no longer need to provide a current billing statement.

Sponsors of TRANSFER (NEW) STUDENTS will need:

- Lease Agreement for verification of on-post residency OR Memorandum from Housing Office verifying permanent family housing assignment within 180 days.
- Sponsor's Current Orders.
- Verification of Student's date of birth (i.e., student's government issued birth certificate or passport - a copy will be retained, student's name and DoB listed on Sponsor's orders).
- Previous school records and previous school's mailing address.
- Georgia Certificate of Immunization and any additional immunizations required by DoDEA (must be on file in the nurse's office within 10 days of starting school). Certificates are available at Martin Army Community Hospital (706.544.CARE).

Students entering school for the first time (Preschool, Pre-K, Kindergarten) will also need an Eye, Ear, and Dental Examination (must be on file in the nurse's office within 10 days of starting school). Exams are available at Martin Army Community Hospital.
