Chimps are learning to help people too! In fact, sometimes they can do more than dogs because they supply handZ on help — they have fingers and a thumb for picking things up.

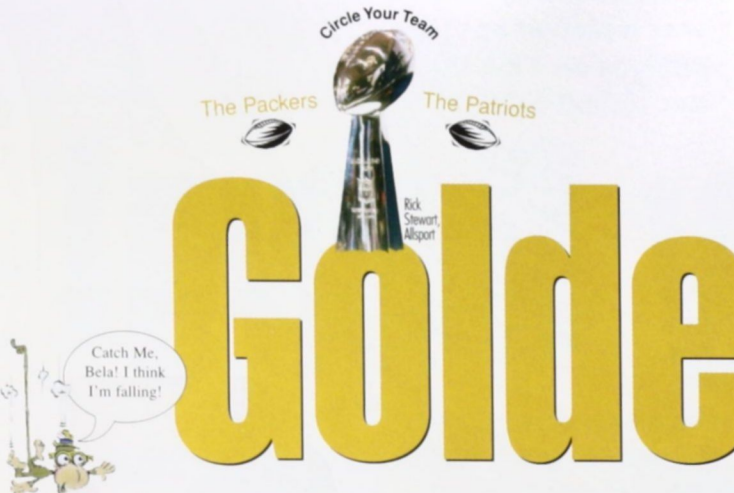

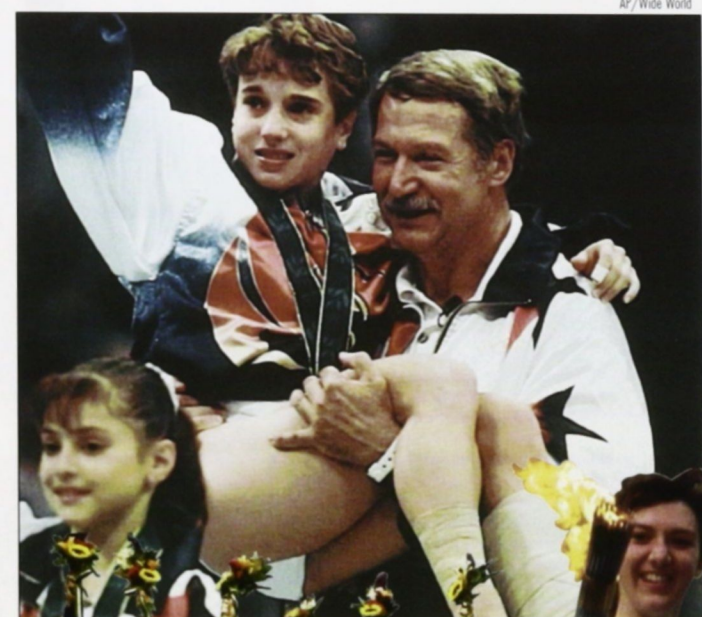


Golden Glory

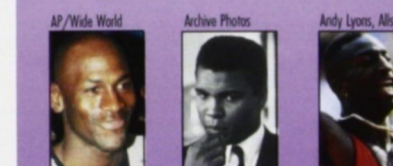

- Shannon Lucid performed experiments on the Russian space station Mir in 1996.

Are YOU up for an orbital adventure? In 2005, you could be cruising the galaxy aboard X33 — a new shuttle design that will transport 100 people to space at one time.

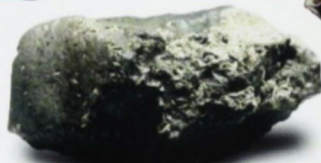


It's in Your HandZ
